Let's have a round of "Thank You's" for last year's donor support from members and clubs! Total Donations for FY2024-2025 totaled \$79,188.53, which was the 6th highest total out of the 14 districts in MD4 California. District 4-C3's total was \$30,037.52 more than FY2023-2024, thanks to more than \$26,000 donated by the Moraga Lions Club. Of the 41 clubs in the district, 23 clubs donated at least \$20 to LCIF.

Key Aspects of LCIF

- **Funding:** LCIF is a grant-making organization funded entirely by donations from Lions, the public, and partners.
- **Mission:** To empower Lions clubs and their members to serve their communities through grants for vital humanitarian efforts.
- **Impact:** LCIF has awarded over \$1.3 billion in grants to support projects in nearly 200 countries and regions.
- **Focus Areas:** Key areas of impact include vision programs (like <u>SightFirst</u>), hunger relief, disaster recovery, and youth initiatives such as <u>Lions Quest</u> and the <u>Special</u> Olympics Partnership.
- **Empowering Lions:** The foundation provides financial support that allows local Lions clubs to undertake ambitious local projects they might not otherwise be able to fund, significantly increasing their local impact.

LCIF Leo Presidential Supporter Pin

The Leo Presidential LCIF Supporter Pin is a special recognition item made available for individual Leo members who wish to show their support. This pin serves as a visible symbol of commitment to the Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF), allowing their dedication and pride in supporting the foundation.

To qualify for the Leo Presidential LCIF Supporter Pin, a Leo must make a minimum donation of \$20.00. This contribution signifies the member's support for LCIF and its initiatives.

Update to LCIF Grants in District 4-C3

Lions of 4-C3, your generous contributions to the Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) have provided our district with valuable opportunities to serve our communities more effectively. Through your support, we have been able to access the LCIF District Community Impact Grant, which has made a significant difference in our outreach efforts.

District and Club Community Impact Grants (DCG) empower Lions to support humanitarian activities in their communities. Funded by contributions from clubs and districts to LCIF, these grants incentivize Lions' donations and service projects that align with the foundation's key areas of focus. A percentage (15-20%) of qualifying, unrestricted donations is made available for DCG grants.

Enhancing Community Visibility with Vision Initiatives (\$18,222)

At last year's cabinet meeting, members recognized the importance of increasing our visibility within local communities, with a particular focus on vision care. Responding to this need, the district purchased two Welch Allyn Spot Vision Screeners. These devices enable all clubs in District 4-C3 to conduct vision screenings, whether in schools or throughout the community, ensuring wider access to eye care services.

Expanding Vision Screening Capabilities (\$28,195)

In addition to the District Community Grant, our district was awarded a special grant dedicated to advancing vision care. This grant supports the establishment of vision screenings, provision of eyeglasses, and follow-up for specialized treatments and surgeries when necessary. The screenings specifically target low-income school districts, helping to address unmet needs among children and families. With this funding, the district has acquired two more Welch Allyn Spot Vision Screeners, further expanding our capacity to serve and support those in need.

The LCIF Mission

Our mission is to empower Lions clubs, volunteers and partners to improve health and wellbeing, strengthen communities, and support those in need through humanitarian service and grants that impact lives globally, and encourage peace and international understanding.
