JESUS AS THE CENTRE OF HISTORY

As we celebrate the Nativity of the Lord, it is fitting to meditate on the significance of Christ's birth. To this end, I would like to reflect on Jesus as the centre of history. By "centre of history," I do not mean that he stands at the temporal midpoint of the universe's timeline. Rather, Christ is the decisive turning point of salvation history, marking the fundamental boundary between what comes before and what comes after his entry into the world. This truth is hinted at in the traditional division of time into B.C. (Before Christ) and A.D. (Anno Domini, "the year of our Lord"), but it is worth exploring more deeply.

To speak of a "centre," one must consider what lies on either side. As God, the person of Jesus - the eternal Son - is both the beginning and the end of history, the Alpha and the Omega. Regarding his identity as the Alpha, we read in the prologue of John: "All things came into being through him" (John 1:3). The whole Trinity creates, yet Scripture reveals a particular relationship between the work of creation and the Word, the Logos. Through the divine Word, creation comes forth from God's will. This movement outward from God has traditionally been called the exitus. But God created the world in order to share his own divine life. Human beings, made in God's image and likeness, are capable of knowing and loving God - and thus capable of entering into union with him. The Catechism expresses this succinctly: the purpose of human existence is to know, love, and serve God in this life and to be happy with him forever in the next. Thus, the exitus exists for the sake of the reditus - the return of creation to its Creator. In short, creation proceeds forth from God and is ordered toward returning to God.

This twofold movement signifies the deepest meaning of human life: to be drawn back into union with the One from whom we came. However, through sin, this purpose was disrupted. Instead of unity with God, humanity fell into division - separated from God and fractured within itself. The return to God, which is the goal of creation, became unattainable from the human side. The rift had to be healed for the *reditus* to be possible again.

To accomplish this healing, the eternal Word became flesh. In the Incarnation, God the Son unites humanity to himself by assuming a true human nature. He remains fully divine, consubstantial with the Father, while becoming fully human,

consubstantial with us. Through the grace of the hypostatic union - the union of two natures in one divine person -Christ's entire earthly life becomes the instrument of our recreation. His birth, life, passion, death, resurrection, and ascension are all efficacious for our salvation. In him, our sins can be forgiven, our wounded nature healed, and our destiny restored. Through Christ we are saved from eternal separation and led toward eternal beatitude, where we shall see God face-to-face and be united with him completely. Thus, Jesus Christ inaugurates the great reversal of history. Without Christ, the human race was moving inevitably toward death and alienation from God. Through Christ, the direction changes: a path is opened from separation to communion, from death to life, from exile to home. Joseph Ratzinger (later Pope Benedict XVI) once described this as the "great circular movement" of all reality - flowing forth from God and, through Christ the turning point, being led back to God. Later, as pope, he drew on St. Bonaventure to underline this truth: Christ is not simply the end of history but its centre. History does not simply culminate in him; it begins anew in him.

The centre of history, then, is not a point in time but a person. In Jesus, God enters history not merely to act within it but to transform its very structure and meaning. He stands at the juncture where the movement away from God is halted and the return to God is made possible. Everything before Christ looks forward to him; everything after Christ depends on him. In his divinity, he is the origin and goal of all things. In his humanity, he becomes the mediator through whom creation is restored and brought to fulfilment.

For this reason, Jesus should also be the centre of our own lives. Just as salvation history turns on Christ, so too does our personal salvation. Union with him brings about union with God, and separation from him leads away from our ultimate destiny. To place Christ at the centre of our lives is to align ourselves with the deepest movement of history-the return to God that Christ himself inaugurates and completes.

In celebrating the Nativity, then, we celebrate not merely the birth of a child, but the entrance of the world's centre into the world's story. The one through whom all things were made and for whom all things exist, comes among us to restore creation's path and lead us home to the Father.
