2024 review

The Tulane Green Wave finished the 2024 season with a 9-5 record (7-1 in conference play), ending on a disappointing three-game losing streak. The skid began with their final home game against Memphis, continued in the AAC Championship loss to Army, and concluded with a bowl game defeat against the Florida Gators. Despite this there were many positives from last season that will be great building blocks rolling into the 2025 season.

Jon Sumrall enters his second year at the helm, bringing back most of his coaching staff. Offensive coordinator Joe Craddock returns after receiving interest from Power Four programs for the same role. Under Craddock, Tulane's offense ranked 20th in the nation in scoring, averaging 35 points per game. The passing attack finished 89th (209 yards per game), while the ground game ranked 26th nationally, averaging 195 rushing yards per contest.

Defensive coordinator Greg Gasparato also returns for his second season. His 3-3-5 Tite defense was one of the best in the nation, allowing just 20 points per game (24th nationally). The unit ranked 25th in total defense, surrendering an average of 323 yards per game. The pass defense was particularly strong, finishing 15th in the country by allowing just 177 yards per game, while the run defense ranked 60th, giving up 145 yards per contest. Their defensive line pressure was a little slow to start the year but as the season progressed, they finished with 36 sacks. That pressure allowed them to gather 14 interceptions with 5 of them going for scores.

Tulane led the AAC with 17 players earning All-Conference honors.

2025 Preview

Looking ahead, Tulane faces a major transition year, especially on offense, where nearly all key positions will have new starters, including quarterback, running back, wide receiver, tight end, center, right guard, and right tackle. The defense will also undergo significant changes, with new starters needed at both cornerback spots, nickel/spear, defensive end, defensive tackle/nose tackle, bandit, and linebacker—where they must replace fan favorite Tyler Grubbs.

In total before the spring portal, 36 players have left the program, with 16 entering the transfer portal and 20 departing via the NFL Draft, graduation, or retirement. However,

Tulane has a solid foundation, with 50 returning players and 46 newcomers—17 high school recruits and 27 transfers—bringing the roster total to 94. Things changed quickly after the Spring portal opened, with 12 players leaving and 10 new players joining the Green Wave, they also had 2 late additions to the class of 2025. That puts the final roster of scholarship players at 94. Under new NCAA rules, teams can now have up to 105 scholarship players.

Jon Sumrall has stated that the team was looking for offensive playmakers and they may have found some after the Spring portal opened. While they have three new transfer quarterbacks (Semonza, Sullivan, Leary), we probably won't find out who the starter is until week 1. Running back appears to be set, but wide receiver, tight end, and offensive line were areas where Tulane aggressively pursued reinforcements, and they may have by finding a playmaking WR, a do it all TE, and a promising offensive lineman. Remember last year, they added seven players after the spring portal opened, including defensive lineman Adin Huntington and FCS standout Terrel Allen.

In my season preview, I'll break down the Tulane Spring Game, transfer portal departures and additions including the spring window, the 2025 recruiting class with scouting reports, an updated positional breakdown and position battles to watch before the season starts, projected offensive and defensive depth charts, Tulane's recruiting class of 2026 commits with scouting reports, a look at more 2026 prospects with almost 200 featured players with scouting reports, and we will take an early look at the class of 2027.

2025 Spring Game Review

Defense, Defense, Defense

QB- It was a rough day for the quarterbacks with 3 interceptions between the two potential starters. It's still spring with plenty of time for one of these guys to develop into the starter.

They also brought in former Iowa QB Brendan Sullivan after the spring game to battle with Semonza and Leary.

RB - Tulane has five guys in the room who all can run the ball efficiently. Jamari McClure had a couple of breakaway runs on the day while true freshman and early enrollee Javin Gordon proved he's college ready by having a strong spring and even finding the endzone for a touchdown in the spring game. New transfer Zoberi Mobley found the endzone as well. Arnold Barnes was out about half of spring camp but came on late. They didn't play him just to be safe.

WR - Didn't really get to see what the receivers could do during the game, but Anthony Brown-Stephens made a couple of plays. Garret Mmahatt a now scholarship player and

former QB was making some plays for the wave late in the game. Shazz Preston looked strong all spring during practices and looks to be the main guy while Bryce Bohanan the do it all wide receiver and chain gang mover, also had a very nice spring camp as well. New transfer O'Mari Hayes was hurt most of spring camp look for him to be a threat in the slot position.

TE - Anthony Miller got in for a touchdown from a pass from walk-on QB Dagan Bruno

OL - Had some off snaps in the beginning of the game but it was cleaned up fairly quickly. Overall, for three new starters and it just being spring they played ok. They have all summer and up until week one to build some chemistry. I'm not worried about this unit at all.

DL - This room is stacked, deep, and the strength of the team. UAB Transfer Derrick Shepard Jr had a very good spring game and will be a key contributor for the Green Wave defense. Bandit Harvey Dyson, a transfer from Texas Tech had a sack on the game. He will be a key rotational piece or maybe even more. I'm really high on Dyson. Geordan Guidry a RS Freshman who has been impressing the coaches got a sack during the game as well.

LB - Sam Howard and transfer Dallas Winner-Johnson both had interceptions. Dallas had been steadily improving each day in spring camp. One of my favorite portal gets this off-season.

CB - Isaiah Wadsworth looks really good at the boundary position and will prob be this year's Micah Robinson. In my opinion I think he may be even better. Jayden Lewis moved from the spear/nickel position to boundary corner and made some plays during the game. Transfer Tavare Smith Jr played very well in the spear/nickel position, he took advantage of his moment with sophomore spear Javion White missing most of spring camp. Armani Cargo was starting to get 1st team reps by the end of the spring and Jaheim Johnson was playing pretty decent as well.

S - Jack Tchienchou may be the best player on this year's defense. Had a very strong spring and during the game he was flying around and making hits, his counterpart Kevin Adams had an interception. With Jack, Kevin, and Bailey Despaine at the back end of the defense they may have the best Safety tandem in the AAC.

Quarterbacks - 3

Kadin Semonza (Ball State) - RS/Soph (5-11/196) -

275/426, 64%, 2904 passing yards, 6.8 avg, 25 tds, 10 int, 72 long, 136.5 rating, 33 sacks, 17 carries, 10 yds. Was Ball State's biggest leader in the locker room and hardest worker. Showed toughness, grit and the "IT" factor stated by many Ball State coaches and players. Has the ability to be a threat in the run game with his speed. He is my favorite to win the QB battle.



Tj Finley (Western Kentucky) - Senior (6-7/238) – LEFT TULANE IN THE SPRING PORTAL - Career 510/810, 61.1%, 6128 passing yards, 37 tds, 20 int. Got decent playing time at LSU, Auburn, Texas state (started), and Western Kentucky. Really thrived at Texas State putting up his best numbers. 3439 passing yards, 24 tds, 8 int,

67%. Was also a threat on the ground with 78 carries for 81 yards and 5 touchdowns. Last season transferred to Western Kentucky named the starter then got hurt and eventually replaced by Caden Veltkamp. Has a rocket of an arm but needs to improve his accuracy if he wants to make a serious run at the starting job. Could be a real threat in the ground game like Ty Thompson was last year running the ball.

Donavan Leary (Illinois) -Junior (6-2/215)- 2 for 5 with 29 yards last year. A bit of an unknown besides his brother. Jon Sumrall stated that they did their homework on him. Has some good tape in his practices throwing some really nice passes but has little to no experience.

Runningbacks - 2

Zuberi Mobley (FAU) - Senior (5-10/196)- 93 carries, 487 yds, 4 tds, 5.3 avg. 72 long, 11 rec, 87 yds. Has decent speed and shiftiness to him. Can come out of the backfield and be a receiving threat when needed. Injured most of last year and his stats reflected that. Look for a bounce back year. Started to come on late during the spring.



Maurice Turner (Louisville) – RS Junior (5-10/190) - Career 154 carries, 734 yds, 2 tds, 48 long, 4.8 avg. 24 catches, 167 yds, 7.3 avg. Maurice has never fumbled in his entire career so far. A good receiving back that can help out in the passing game with some speed. Runs hard and fast. Looks to be the RB 1 after the spring.

Wide Receivers -3

Jimmy Calloway (Louisville) - Senior (6-0/190)-Outside Receiver- 29 rec, 366 yds, 1 td- Was a 4-star (94) prospect out of high school. Went to Tenn for three years then transferred to Louisville. Got hurt last year and missed most of the season and trying to reset at Tulane. Jimmy has some true speed for the outside position, look for him to take over Dontae Fleming's spot on the offense. True deep threat guy.

Omari Hayes (FAU) – RS Sophomore (5-9/170) Slot - 39 rec, 590 yds, 3 Td- Went from scout to FAU top receiver. Potential is sky high for Omari, really excited to see his development with Tulane. Always does the right thing and is a tough and gritty player. Should plug right into the slot position. Is capable of taking handoffs out of the backfield on jet sweeps and handoffs.



Anthony Brown-Stephens (Kentucky) - Junior (5-10/176) -Play Making Receiver- Career 10 rec, 121 yards, 2 td, 7 carries, 31 yds. Nephew of John Legend. He's logged 363 offensive snaps dating back to the 2023 season, according to Pro Football Focus. Not much production at Kentucky so looking for a hard reset. Has the ability to help out in the backfield with his speed.

Tight Ends - 2

Leron Husbands (Maryland) - Junior (6-3/246) -All around tight end- No stats. Buried on the depth chart in Maryland, trying to make a name for himself at Tulane. WR converted TE. Leron has the potential to be an all-round tight end receiving and blocking, also has great athleticism. Could be a big surprise if he puts it all together for the wave.

Justyn Reid (Southern Miss) - Junior (6-5/255) -Receiving Threat- Will Hall, new passing game coordinator and former offensive coordinator for Tulane, helped secure the tight end from his former head coaching spot. Very capable big body and athletic tight end who could help out the wave immediately on offense.

Offensive Linemen - 5

Jack Hollifield (App State) - RS Senior (6-4/300) Center - Started all 11 games at center, with a total blocking grade of 73.6 that ranked No. 2 among Sun Belt centers and No. 6 among Sun Belt starting offensive linemen during the regular season. Played key role on an offensive line that protected the Sun Belt leader in passing yards while ranking No. 2 in the league at just 15 sacks allowed and contributing to a streak of five straight 100-yard-rushing games to end the season. Allowed no sacks on the season and run-blocking grade of 73.6 ranked No. 2 among Sun Belt centers. Should take over the Center position immediately.

Robbie Pizzolato (Nicholas State) - RS/Junior (6-4/320) Guard - 2023 Phil Steele FCS Freshman All-American Third Team. Played in 10 games and started at guard. Helped the Offense average an SLC best 33.2 points per game in conference games. Nicholls had the top two rushers in the Southland as the offense averaged nearly 220 yards on the ground in league play. Will be a key backup but could battle for some playing time at the Right Guard position.

Jude McCoskey (Indiana State) - Junior (6-8/300) OT - Was named to the Phil Steele 2023 Freshman All-American team. Lined up at offensive tackle and played in 22 games in the 2023 and 2024 season. In 2024 was a part of a unit that blocked for 196 total first downs, 1,799 rushing yards, and 1,768 passing yards. Sycamores averaged 149.9 rushing yards per game and 147.3 passing yards per game on their way to posting 297.3 yards of total offense and 33 touchdowns. Will battle for the starting right tackle position or could be a key swing tackle if anyone goes down.

John Bock II (FIU) - Senior (6-3/288) Center/Guard - 2023 Phil Steele Preseason All-CUSA Team (Third), 2023 Athlon Preseason All-CUSA Team (Fourth), 2022 Conference USA All-Freshman Team. Made seven starts at Center and Guard. Looking for a fresh start at Tulane and should take over the Right Guard position. Can fill in at center if Jack Hollifield or Gabe Forston go down.

Jordan Hall (UAB) - Senior (6-3/345) OT - He had total ankle reconstruction surgery during the offseason, and it took him a little while to get full speed this past fall for Liberty. He eventually became a key member of Liberty's rotation on the offensive line, working primarily at tackle. Look for him to battle for the starting right tackle position with Jude McCoskey.

Defense

Defensive Tackle - 3

Eliyt Nairne (Liberty) - RS/Soph (6-1/305) DT - 25 tackles, 1 sack. A strong rotational piece for Liberty last year. Should help slow down the run game as a rotational piece for the wave, very disruptive.

Trevon McAlpine (Texas Tech) - Junior (6-3/305) DT/3-Tech - 21 tackles, 1.5 sacks, 2 tackles for loss. Big bodied do it all Defensive Tackle to help stuff the run with a pass rushing skill set. Great first step off the line.

Derrick Shepard Jr (UAB) - RS Sophomore (6-3/310) Run Stopping DT/NT - 34 tackles. Should help out immediately on the defensive line and play a pivotal role in key running downs.

Defensive End - 3

Santana Hopper (App State) -J junior (6-2/265) DE - 36 tackles, 5 sacks, 8.5 tackles for loss, 20 QB pressures, and 2 FF. Tulane's highest rated Transfer Portal addition according to 24/7. Do it all Defensive End that can help stopping the run and shows an impressive pass rush skill set. Hopper was an All-Sun Belt first team. Ranked 1st among Sun Belt defensive linemen with a defensive grade of 82.7 by PFF. 20 QB pressures ranked 1st in the Sun Belt defensive linemen category from PFF. Pass-rush grade of 79.1 ranked 2nd among Sun Belt defensive linemen by PFF and run-defense grade of 80.1, 3rd among Sun Belt defensive linemen. Ranked 6th in the Sun Belt in sacks per game and 8th in forced fumbles per game. Named a national defensive player of the week as well.

Harvey Dyson III (Texas Tech) - Junior (6-3/250) Pass Rushing DE/Bandit - 12 tackles, 2 sacks, 1 FF, 1 FR. Dyson has been able to show flashes of being an effective pass rusher. Despite being hampered by nagging injuries in 2024, he came up with 2.0 sacks which was tied for third on the team. Has the potential to be a key player.

Jordan Norman (South Alabama) - Soph (6-4/249) Power Rushing DE/Bandit - 25 tackles, 2.5 sacks, 25 QB pressures and 2 PD. Tulane D-line coach Landius Wilkerson played a pivotal role in getting Norman to Uptown. Was his D-line coach at South Alabama. Will be fighting for a rotational piece in the lineup.

Bandit - 2

Maurice Westmoreland (UTEP) - Senior (6-2/250) Power Pass Rushing Bandit - 46 tackles, 8 sacks, 9.5 tackles for loss, 1 FF. In my opinion this is Tulane's best get in the portal. Should immediately come in and start at the Bandit position. Has the tools to play anywhere on the line. Held offers from major P4 programs and visited Nebraska. Ohio State, Georgia, and Colorado showed interest.



TY Cooper (Miss State) - Senior (6-4/245) Power Pass Rushing Bandit - 29 tackles, 1 sack, 2.5 tackles for loss. Not much production at Miss State and looking for a change of scenery and new scheme. I think Ty could thrive at the bandit position for Tulane as a pass rusher and helping out in the run game. He is a very violent tackler when he gets his hands on a guy. Guiseann Mirtil - Former 3-star TE that Jon Sumrall and Co recruited. Couldn't find his way onto the field.

Offensive Linemen – 3

Gabe Fortson - (Arkansas State) Center- Came over from last year's portal window from Georgia Tech. Was not able to crack the roster and was a depth piece

Robbie Pizzolato - (Nicholls) Guard- The New Orleans native was looking for a starting spot and couldn't secure one so he decided to leave.

Zach Billings - (Charlotte) 5-10/195. Third best Long Snapper in the Transfer Portal.

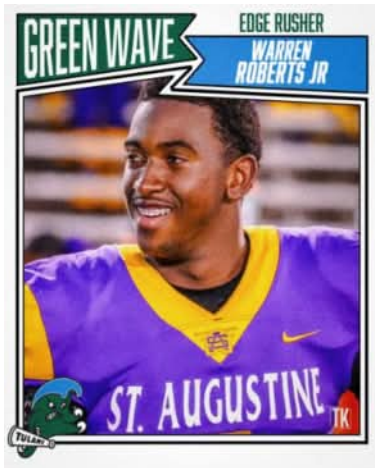
Tulane Recruiting Class of 2025 (19)

Running Backs

Two transfers come to uptown Z. Mobley and M. Turner look to battle for serious playing time with returning backs A. Barnes and J. McClure. Barnes excelled in short yardage situations being the big bruising back but looks to get a more prominent role. Redshirt freshman J. McClure looks like the next great Tulane running back by displaying his skills in 4 contests. Could very well be better than M. Hughes and a complete package every down back for the Wave. All of them will be fighting for the CB 1 and CB 2 spots. Look for 2024 4-star recruit Jayden Lewis to make a step this offseason and Armani Cargo. The Wave bring back another from the 24 class E.
