Think of it as guiding youth to explore questions like:


- Who is God to me?

Parishioners Steve and Libby Fields Circumnavigate over 15,000 Miles

American's Great Loop is an approximately 6000 mile trip circumnavigating the eastern portion of the US and Canadian Waterways. But Parishioners Steve and Libby Fields actually completed over 15,000 miles during their nearly six years of "looping" the waterways in their 405 Carver (40 foot) cabin motor yacht named "San Souci" which they purchased in 2019. They also joined that American Loop organization. But their first two years were greatly minimized due to COVID. Then high diesel fuel prices (\$7 per gallon) were prohit out two more seasons. But voila! In 2023 they were back on track--or -- on water.





They wintered in Marathon where they are familiar with the local Catholic Church, the marinas and the boaters. Cruising up the east coast was interesting. Prior to arriving in New York Harbor they saw a number of war ships off the coast. It was "Fleet Week" with various ships parading in the Harbor. Cruising up the Hudson River, and the Erie Canal, they arrived in Kingston, Ontario. Unfortunately the navigation system took them the wrong way and they hit rocks in Northern

Bay causing damage to San Souci. Soon, they arrived back in the good ole' USA which completed their America's Great Loop. for them. Over the six years of their adventure, they used 6,000 gallons of diesel fuel averaging in cost from \$1.45 -\$7.00 per gallon.

Steve and Libby's adventure did not stop them from attending Mass. They have visited numerous Catholic churches and cathedrals, getting there by walking, Ubers and bicycles. When there was no church available, they were able to utilize the You Tube broadcast from Terre Haute. They actually attended a Mass that was in Portuguese.

They met many friends during the years of their adventure. While waiting for a taxi, they met former Loopers at San Pablo Catholic Church. They immediately became great friends! Another Looper friend unfortunately passed away unexpectedly.

In looking back over their adventure, Steve and Libby have seen beautiful sites and met wonderful, helpful people along the way, making lifelong the friends of many. San Souci recently sold and Steve and Libby are looking forward to their next adventure.

WHAT ARE THE PRIMARY BELIEFS OF CATHOLICISM?

Catholicism has a rich history and a set of core beliefs that guide the faith of its followers. These beliefs encompass various aspects of theology, morality, and practice.

Belief in the Holy Trinity. God is one being in three divine persons: the Father, the Son (Jesus Christ), and the Holy Spirit. This belief emphasizes the unity and diversity within the Trinity. Faith in the Incarnation. Jesus, the Son of God, took on human flesh, lived among us, and ultimately sacrificed himself to redeem humanity.

The Authority of the Church. The Pope, as the successor of Saint Peter, holds a special role as the visible head of the Church on Earth, guiding the faithful and interpreting scripture.

The Sacraments. Sacraments are important rituals in the Catholic faith and are outward signs of God's grace and play a crucial role in our spiritual journey.

The Eucharist. Jesus Christ is the Real Presence in the Eucharist. During the Mass, the bread and wine used for Communion become the actual body and blood of Christ.

The Virgin Mary and the Saints. Catholics have a deep devotion to the Virgin Mary, the Mother of God. They also honor and seek the intercession of saints, considering them as powerful allies and examples of holy living.

Belief in the Afterlife. Catholics believe in the existence of heaven, hell, and purgatory. They believe that those who die in a state of grace will have eternal life with God in heaven, while those who die in a state of mortal sin will be separated from God in hell.

The Role of Good Works. Catholics believe in the importance of good works as a response to God's grace. While they emphasize that salvation is a gift from God, they also believe that good works, performed in faith, are an essential part of their Christian discipleship.

Social Justice and Care for the Vulnerable. The Catholic Church places great emphasis on social justice and caring for the vulnerable and encourages us to seek the welfare of others, promote human dignity, and address social issues such as poverty, inequality, and injustice.

Hope for the Second Coming. Finally, Catholics believe in the Second Coming of Christ anticipating the return of Jesus at the end of time, when he will judge the living and the dead and establish his kingdom in its fullness.
