"The Art Spy: The Extraordinary Untold Tale of a WWII Resistance Hero" by Michelle Young

What would you do for art? This is a World War II story of intrigue, danger and one woman's commitment to art as a cause. The Monuments Men is by now a familiar story. The Art Spy is a little known tale about France's Rose Valland, who infiltrated the Nazi leadership to save some of the world's most treasured masterpieces. The book is based on troves of previously undiscovered documents, and follows this key resistance spy into the heart of the Nazi's art looting headquarters in Paris, where she faced death while trying to save a cultural heritage and pass along information to fighters in the resistance. The book atmosphere goes through the glittering days of pre-War Paris which was home to people like Picasso, Josephine Baker, Coco Chanel and Frida Kahlo. It will make a great movie.

"Your Brain on Art"

by authors Susan Magsamen and Ivy Ross

We get involved in art for a variety of reasons. Research is proving that it provides more than just satisfaction and a sense of accomplishment. The Authors show there are actual physical and psychological benefits from participating in art. Engaging in an art project for as little as forty-five minutes reduces the stress hormone cortisol. It can also extend your lifespan

by ten years. Doctors have been prescribing museum visits to address loneliness, dementia, and other physical and mental health concerns. Your Brain on Art is described as an 'authoritative guide to neuroaesthetics'. The book cites breakthrough research, insights from multidisciplinary pioneers - all without getting too technical. It shows that all forms of art (painting, music, dancing, writing) are a vital part of healthy living.

SACRAMENTO FINE ARTS GOES ON SF BUS TRIP TO THE DEYOUNG MUSEUM AND THE LEGION OF HONOR *sally Durante*

It was 8:30 a.m. and the big white tour bus was full with excited members and supporters of the Sac Arts Center on the way to San Francisco to see not one, but two incredible exhibits. The weather was clear and sunny and the traffic was not that bad - a good omen. First stop on this wonderful day, The de Young Museum to see the photograph exhibit of Paul McCartney Photographs 1963-64 : Eyes of the Storm- (yeah, yeah, yeah, yeaaaaah)!

A blast from the past with a different outlook because these photos were rediscovered in 2020 from Paul McCartneys' archives. This true Beatlemania is back in the bay and you really want to see it! There are 250 personal photographs by Paul McCartney showing a journey of four young Englishmen on a journey to world-wide stardom from the perspective of a very young Paul McCartney. The display is amazing with some floor to ceiling enlarged photos showing the huge screaming crowds and then very personal quiet moments when they were just together as friends and everything in between. Also, airing on a loop, the TV performance of the Beatles on the Ed Sullivan show and other film coverage.

Next, we got back on the bus and went back on the road to the beautiful Legion of Honor to see another breathtaking exhibit : Wayne Thiebaud : Art Comes From Art (thru August 17th) Wayne Thiebaud art is so colorful, and pure and inspiring. People from our tour were so inspired that they were saying things like, "I can't wait to go home and start painting like Wayne"!



Did you know that he was at one time a member of our very own NCA , Northern California Arts, inc. ! It's true !

Wayne Tiebaud was a very humble person who called himself an "art thief" and who openly took ideas from and then reinterpreted old and new European and American artworks into his art vision. His paintings of American confections and buffets made him world famous. During his sixty

year career he created art and believed and taught that art history is a continuum that connects artists of the past , present and future. He taught at both Sacramento City College and UC Davis. There are 65 works by Thiebaud - still lives of cakes, tabletops, and other ordinary objects; cityscapes featuring soaring buildings; and mountain landscapes that offer an in-depth exploration of one of the most important and overlooked aspects of his creative practice, his passion and engagement with art history. This is an exhibit you won't want to miss.

The De Young was a fun time travel trip for many of us as it featured the photography of Paul McCartney during 1963 and 64. It was extremely well attended and found many of us going down memory lane. Particularly those of us who turned 80 this year and graduated from high school in 1963. We then proceeded to the Legion of Honor for the headline show of Wayne Thiebaud and his influences. Many of the paintings we know so well were paired with his art history influences in such a way that one could see Wayne's creativity, but also his inspiration. His comment that "art comes from art" was clearly on display.

Most of you know that I am not a painter or an artist in the traditional sense - I make jewelry and my own beads (which many of you supportively remind me is an art form). I got involved with Sac Arts because my husband was an excellent painter and a NCA signature artist, which is why I stayed in Sac Arts, where my friends are. However, I am an avid art history fanatic. Recently, I embarked upon an achievement journey through the Smithsonian called a certificate in world art history. I would recommend this to anyone - great long and short classes, all online. I have taken courses in African art, Chinese painting, the Renaissance, etc, all culminating in my recent graduation. I recommend this to anyone! There are also online studio classes for practicing artists in a wide-ranging selection.

WELL HERE IT GOES... Dana Davis

At Sac Arts we have created a new program to help artists obtain quality photos of their art.

Photographs of your artwork have never been more important than in today's media. With so much sharing of information and viewing of art being done on screens, good photography is important to showing your work in its best light.

I will photograph your pieces to show them most clearly and descriptively. I balance the color of the light to the capture in the camera to produce the most true rendering of your pigments. Some works need to show a bit of their texture and surface and that can be done by adjusting the lights. Works under glass can be photographed too (Please let me know if that is the case).

Our decision at Sac Arts has been to divide the sessions into Flat Art and 3-D art so that we can be the most efficient in making your photos. Each session will be promoted as being for flat or 3-D artworks.

I have been photographing artists' works for 15 years or more and look forward to making your artworks look their very best in photos.

SCSEP PARTICIPANTS Angelia Gordon

You might be used to seeing the friendly faces of Aziz and Walter around our center. They were assigned to our center from The Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP). SCSEP is a community service and work-based job training program for older Americans. Authorized by the Older Americans Act.

SCSEP participants gain work experience in a variety of community service activities at nonprofit and public facilities, including schools, hospitals, day-care centers, and senior centers. The program provides over 40 million community service hours to public and non-profit agencies, allowing them to enhance and provide needed services.

On July 1st, 2025, all SCSEP participants were placed on furlough until further notice due to unsecured federal funding. At this time, the U.S. Department of Labor (USDOL) has not released notification regarding the renewal of the Program Year 2025 SCSEP funding.

We hope the program will be renewed in the future, but until then we wanted to thank Walter, Aziz, and the past participants for all of their hard work and wish them all the best on their future endeavors.

HOMEMADE CAMERA OBSCURA Paul Dessau

Next year, the oldest surviving photograph will be 200 years old, having been taken in 1826. I have a picture of it here: (pic 1) it is of some rooftops. A lens camera obscura was used and the photo, on a pewter plate coated with bitumen of judea, was exposed for days to create it. I have reenacted this process with modern sun print paper from Amazon. As a schoolkid, I used to enjoy trying to recreate inventions as a hobby.

This is my homemade camera obscura (pic 2 and pic 2a), made with a cardboard box, from Michael's Craft Supply, and a plastic plano convex lens form Walmart. The first lomograph (primative photograph) is finished, seen here, (pic 3). I have exposed it for about 12 hours and this is the maximum. I plan on making a lomograph with kids NON-FADE-PROTECTED construction paper, true homemade primative photograph, where a positive image of the scene will show as "Faded" areas on the paper.

Each member was guaranteed to have 1 artwork exhibited, with no more than 2 exhibited per artist. There were 90 works in the show. The judge for acceptance and cash and gift awards was Sarah Solis Mattson. After the art was hung, Sarah selected the awards. She was amazed at the quality of our art. Best of Show was a very deep and interesting painting by Byron Tripp. The 2nd and 3rd place awards, the Florence Ferrario Award and the Myra Steward awards, were won by Tom McGee and Penny Hanscom. There were 7 best of category awards and 11 Honorable Mentions. Almost 20 artworks received votes for Peoples Choice which was won by Paul Dessau. The show was held at Sac Fine Arts May 27- June 14, 2025, with the Second Saturday Reception and Awards Presentation on June 14th. A large crowd attended the reception and enjoyed the art, and the music by Susan and Del. -Show Chair David Peterson.
