



BMFP is in its 45th year of service to local churches and their missionaries. The Lord has blessed us with a great heritage of faithful leaders and missionaries. We have over 120 families serving in a Jonathan & Rachelle Lyons wide variety of places and ministries. We could not do what we do if it were not for

local church pastors having a heart for worldwide missions. We realize a mission board is not for everyone but it supplies the need to assist the local church in getting their missionaries to the field, adjusting, and staying on the field. Here are some reasons to consider supporting BMFP every month.

- 1. Because of the Missionary Undertaking: The pastor sets the vision for the church concerning missions. The missionary carries out this vision and mission but needs assistance in completing his goal. BMFP brings the vision of the pastor and the call of the missionary to reality and fulfillment. It is a group effort to complete the Great Commission.
- 2. Because of the Missionary Understanding: Understanding all that goes into preparing and sustaining a missionary is very important. - 3. Because of the Missionary Undergirding: BMFP has the purpose of aiding missionaries in securing support and encouraging others to surrender to the cause of missions. It provides watchcare, accountability measures to ensure biblical, ethical ministry, and a wealth of spiritual counsel and advice from experienced, godly people. BMFP desires to produce Lord-honoring, lifelong, levelheaded missionaries who lead with purpose as they prepare the next generation for missionary service.

"And Joses, who by the apostles was surnamed Barnabas, (which is, being interpreted, The son of consolation,) a Levite, and of the country of Cyprus" (Acts 4:36). word translated consolation comes from a root word that means to implore, to Europe Field Administrators solace, to comfort, and



to intreat. Put it all together and one clearly understands that Barnabas was an encourager.

It was Barnabas who encouraged Saul, introducing him to the apostles at the outset of his ministry (Acts 9:27). It was Barnabas who was sent by the church in Jerusalem to encourage the saints in Antioch (Acts 11:22). It was Barnabas and Saul who were sent from Antioch to encourage the suffering saints in Judea with gifts from the believers (Acts 11:30). And it was Barnabas who encouraged John Mark even though Paul was vehemently opposed to the idea of his continuing with them (Acts 15:36-39). Personally, I can't think of another Bible character who even remotely approaches Barnabas when it comes to embodying the trait of encouragement!

Now comes the question: How does Barnabas' ministry of encouragement relate to those of us who serve as BMFP administrators?

When past BMFP president, Gene Burge, developed the ministry of the field administrator, he was resolute that they would be encouragers first and foremost. Toward the missionary, the administrator serves not to tell them how to do their ministries, but to encourage them as they do their ministries. When asked for advice, the first question an administrator asks in turn is, "Have you spoken with your pastor yet?" because we always want to encourage the missionary/sending church relationship. When missionaries share difficulties, whether personal, family, or spiritual with their administrators, a key response is, "Can we pray together about this?" This is because we want to encourage missionaries that it is the Lord who has the answers. (Continued on next page)

Even when asked about ministry challenges with other missionaries, BMFP administrators seek to encourage by pointing them to the Word of God.

Another equally important aspect of the administrator's ministry has to do with the

encouragement he receives from the missionaries to whom he is responsible. Most BMFP administrators have ministries of their own, and many of them are still serving around the world. Just like those they invest their time into, they also receive encouragement as others minister to them. In other words, theirs is a two-way ministry where they give of themselves, and where the Lord encourages them to remain faithful through the help, prayer, and loving support of others.

One of the key elements of this ministry is seen in our daily administrator's prayer time, where the BMFP leadership team meets each weekday to pray for the needs of missionaries as they have sent in their prayer and praise requests.

Amen" (2 Peter 3:18). Not only was this a command and earnest plea from Peter to the move forward in what vou know to be entirely the will of the Lord." - John G. Paton believers he was addressing, but it is our command to obey. To "grow in grace" is to grow in Divine enablement, fostered by the Holy Spirit, and "to grow in . . . knowledge" is foundational to growing in obedience in our Christian walk. We must know what we are to do and then lay hold of His power to accomplish it. This is the charge we have as Bible institute planters and trainers, to equip believers to walk in the Spirit and walk the holy walk.

It was with this goal in mind that I returned to India, February 27 – March 17, to teach the second module of Methods of Bible Study, reinforcing the skill of meditating on the Scriptures and, building on the Passage Study Method in our last

module. I taught them how to study the Bible verse-by-verse and the Word Study Method to aid in understanding the meaning of words they encounter. Then we focused on how to study historical narratives, a skill especially helpful in a story-telling culture so common in Southeast Asia, South America, and Africa.

While I have many things for which to praise and thank God from this trip, my greatest

joy was to witness the spiritual and practical growth that has taken place.



Exciting things are happening at BMFP! For several years now our leadership team has been burdened of the Lord to get more involved in supporting local churches and pastors as a necessary part of supporting missionaries

and furthering the Great Commission. We have added 3 new administrator positions - Church Planting, Pastoral Care, and Leadership Programs.

We also created 2 new intitiatives we would like you to be aware of, and if the Lord leads, participate in. The first is BMFP publishing. We currently have 3 books published that are posted to our website with links to securely order them. Along with these 3 there will be other self-published books added there that were written by BMFP missionaries.

All of the books are intended to edify the body of Christ through Bible-centered discipleship in relevant topics.

Hello Friends,

Thank you for your continued support as we seek to exalt Jesus Christ in a very religiously lost culture. It has been a hard couple of months in some ways: more than \$4000 spent in major vehicle motor and air conditioning repairs, and a lot of sickness in our ministry team. But we are really encouraged by the growth we are seeing recently in some of our older Christians. We have seen a shift in our church, where more and more of our members are ministering in and to the body of Christ. Our constant refrain is, "we are saved to serve, not to sit."

The good news doesn't stop there. A few years ago, after years of searching, I finally found story-based discipleship material. The public education system of the DR is not very strong. Reading comprehension is a particular area of struggle. But the culture is extremely relational. Evenings are spent outside with your neighbors talking, playing dominos and drinking. So story-telling is a natural strength for many Dominicans. We have found story-based discipleship to be very effective. Some of our strongest believers are those who have been discipled through this story-telling. We are excited about the next generation of Christ-followers that are growing up in our church.

We are privileged to serve Jesus Christ in the DR. We count it an honor to represent all our supporters as missionaries, and we hope you consider it an honor to partner with our ministry as well. We hope you Had a great Resurrection Day!!

Lastly, we have some exciting news. Our daughter Heidi graduated from Cairn University in December, with a degree in Elementary Education. Last week, she said "yes", to an invitation to become the wife of Ethan Meiers, a soon to be graduate of Cairn as well. Ethan is a youth ministry major. 

Dear Partners;

I trust all of you had a wonderful Resurrection Sunday. Spring is a very busy time of the year for ministry in West Africa. From late May to September is rainy season so travel is restricted. The Lord has given us many wonderful victories this past few months. In Niger and Sierra Leone, we have seen a significant increase in churches planted. We have taken the church planting teaching to new areas of the countries and the Lord is opening doors to new unreached tribal people. In Sierra Leone we went to Kabala and Kono where church planting movements have started among the Koronko and Kono people. In these two areas alone, there are 12 new churches. In Niger we took the teaching to Maradi a four-hour drive east of our headquarters. Our new church plants have grown from 42 to 84 over this past year. Many Fulani and Hausa have come to Christ during this blessed period and those two tribes are the largest two tribes in West Africa. Please continue to lift Niger up to the Lord as conditions on the ground are getting worse with growing government restrictions and radical Muslims gaining power.

A team of 3 will be leaving early May with two weeks will travel to Togo, Senegal and Niger. We will be doing several trainings with growing movements in each country. Pray for souls to be saved and for Devine appointments to occur. The Lord is organically brining strategic spiritual people into our lives. News about West Africa is not making a splash in America but Islamic terrorist is gaining ground in Mali, Burkina Faso and Niger. Westerners are being forced to leave by their organizations for security reason so our work with national partners is urgent now more than ever. Our works in Burkina Faso and Niger are growing we are only limited by the budget restrictions based on available funds.

I appreciate every dollar given to make my work possible. From June to August, I will be available to report on my work. In Senegal we are having to trim our number of students from 30 to 15 for a lack of funds. If you can help with this need message me at 8173681129 or lighttwentyfour@gmail.com. We provide transport, housing and food. It's about 1,000.00 for 3 days.








Clubs

Dear Team Member,

THE BIOSPHERE DOORS HAVE BEEN DELIVERED TO THE MUSEUM!!! They are made of heavy metal, and each door weighs 800 pounds. This is a monumental accomplishment! Designing and building these doors - for the main chamber and the air-lock - has been of extreme importance. They had to be built with absolute precision for the operation of all the physical constraints and the complete safety of our scientists and techs who will be carrying out experiments in the Biosphere. It took two-and-a-half years to design and build the doors correctly. This represents great personal and financial sacrifice on the part of dear people who cared enough to "stay in the boat" until this phase was complete. The next phases will be to (1) professionally install the doors, (2) complete the pressurization safety tests, (3) install the water and lighting systems, (4) populate the Biosphere with plants and animals, then (5) re-introduce various plants into our current environment for the benefit of mankind. And we are now moving forward!

Accomplishing this task required the efforts of a professional *Engineering Firm*, a nationally-known professional *Machine Company*, a registered *Structural Engineer*, a NASA-experienced *Operations Engineer*, and a career *Safety Compliance Engineer*. This was no small task!

In the first photo, I'm shown kneeling at the end of the second door. Behind me, from left-to-right are, (1) delivery supervisor, (2) Safety Compliance Engineer *Sergio Pastrana*, (3) Field Supervisor *Carson Hastings*, (4) Electrical Engineer *Jim Hoff*, (5) Biosphere Operations Engineer *Mike Herlacher*, and (6) delivery driver.

In the second photo, I'm shown with our Resident Biologist *Dr. Ronald Pew.* One of his first contributions was to lead his engineers in Detroit to build our large Field Generator that provides the pulsed electromagnetic energy in the Biosphere. This energy will simulate the Earth's energy before the Biblical Flood.

There is no way to estimate the sacrifices and contributions that have brought us to this happy day. And as you know, we will need to "stay in the boat" and continue to sacrifice until this unique mission is accomplished. WE'RE IN THE GAME TO THE END FOR THE SAKE OF OUR WONDERFUL LORD WHO SACRIFICED HIS ALL!!!

We have been seeking God to expand our reach, and so the demand for radio programs is up, but at the same time, we have been in need of at least one more radio teacher/preacher to help us facilitate adding these new radio programs.

God has been faithful to supply...once again! I would like to introduce to you our newest radio preacher/teacher: Hermano Sergio Garza!



Here is his testimony, in his own words:

"My name is Sergio Nahum Arriaga Garza, I am 26 years old.

I was born in Monterrey, Nuevo León, Mexico into a Christian home. I had the great blessing of belonging to a good church founded by missionary Daniel Jones in Monterrey, where I received Christ as my Savior and was baptized as a child.

I studied nursing and then continued with medicine, but since I was little, I always had the desire to serve God; a desire I couldn't control. One day, while listening to my pastor preach, I couldn't resist the urge to give my life to the Lord. I left my secular studies to prepare for the ministry. At the age of 18, I left my home in Monterrey and went to San Luis Potosí to prepare at the Bible Institute. For four years, I spent time interning, learning and serving in San Luis Potosí, Mexico. There, I had the opportunity to take several missionary trips to Central and South America. I confirmed my calling to be a missionary.

After completing my institute, I traveled to Texas to serve as an assistant at New Horizons Baptist Church. For the past two years, I have been serving and learning about the ministry, continuing with summer missionary trips.

Two years ago, I had a terrible accident, a fatal fall from 8 meters, fracturing my cervical spine and damaging my bone marrow. God performed a miracle in my life, giving me a new opportunity. By the grace of God, I have greatly

recovered, and although some things in my body have changed, the desire to serve God with all my strength continues to burn, and I am convinced that God never makes mistakes in our lives.

I am grateful for the opportunity to share with you God's blessings in my life through His precious Word."

Pastor Garza is currently preaching in our :30 minute radio program format. Very soon, we plan to utilize him in our soon-to-be :60 second radio spots which will be airing on secular radio with the gospel.

Please continue to pray for Gospel Radio Latin America and for Pastor Sergio Garza, as we continue to reach the lost and dying in this world with the gospel of Jesus Christ, in the Spanish language.

The mission-field is so large, but our Lord is far greater!


In closing, here are some of the responses we have received from abroad, because of your financial support of Gospel Radio Latin America:

"Delight thyself also in the Lord: and he shall give thee the desires of thine heart" (Psalm 37:4).

TEN YEARS AGO THIS DAY, I PRAYED

ANSWERED PRAYER







Paul Arruda and his wife Elinana several years ago started a school for the children of lepers in Manaus, Amazonas. Since then he was asked to start a church in the area. The location of the work is in the subdivision called *Alexo*, but is better known as Buração. Buração means *Big Hole*. The school and the work has grown and the Lord has sent a couple from the church in which Paul also helps to accompany him in the work. Recently it has been discovered that Paul's wife has a serious case of cancer. With the help of missionary Mark McCutchin we have been able to help the Arrudas with the medical bills incurred. Please pray for the Arrudas and the work in the leper colony. I hope be able to relate to you soon of a new church plant in southern Brazil.

One of our new students has been working in a very difficult area of São Paulo. He has found a piece of property but is having a difficult time in persuading the owner to sale or even rent the property. We related to him that is has never been easy to carry out the Great Commission. 

The War!

In March 2024, I had security escorts in the south of Israel where the war started on October 7, 2023. I met with Israelis who personally experienced the horror of the invasion of Hamas, and was shown surveillance videos of the evil brutality – Words cannot express the demonic activity I saw.

In November 2024, we provided food for Holocaust survivors as dozens of rockets were raining down on Haifa from Hezbollah.

We were then introduced to Yarden Bibas through a friend. For 484 days Yarden was held captive in Hamas dank tunnels.

Yarden was released from captivity on February 1, 2025. The bodies of Shiri, Ariel, Kfir, who were brutally murdered, were released February 20, 2025, and buried together in a single casket.

"I want to <u>use my demons</u> to preach the Gospel." This is a statement I heard in one of my recent one on one Bible studies.

A young man called me and said he met someone from our church and wanted to know how to be an evangelist. I was a little taken back and said let's meet and talk. We met up about 30 minutes later and I wanted to make sure he was a Christian first before talking about anything else. He had typed out his testimony on his phone and sent it to me. He also stated "God would use his demons" to show people that demons are real and they need to follow God. The visiting preacher who watched the church while my dad was visiting me in Saipan during covid, told them not to come back. Satan is working so hard to blind the eyes of the

lost and to try and discourage Christians. We have to remember that Greater is HE that is in us then he that is in the world and to not be weary in well doing for we shall reap if we faint not. (Gal. 6:9) We are continuing to carry the Light of God's Word to these dark islands. Please continue to keep us in your prayers. Also please pray for safety as we make a medical trip to Philippines for checkups and dental work.

Our flight arrived in the middle of the night with 12 suitcases, 4 kids and us! Customs was, thankfully, easy to get through and we were greeted by members of Palau Baptist Church. With my dad and mom (Terry and Gloria McClure) on medical leave, we have access to their house and cars, for now.

Since my parents were unable to return back to Palau since Covid and health has prevented them, maintenance on the house and cars has not been kept up. Every day...two or three hours a day it rains, monsoon rains...gully washers!

The house has its own problems with no stove, a broken fridge, and everything packed in boxes. Thankfully, the church members had the beds ready for us for the first night. So, the first week begins! Fixing cars, finding a stove, a fridge and a washing machine. Did I mention it is the rainy season? Lots of rain! The ditches around the house were also not maintained. Digging ditches was a priority to keep the water at bay! Termites (always a problem in Palau!) were discovered in dad's bookcases. Another task to be addressed.

Church was an exciting time of renewal and fellowship! We left Palau as a couple and returned as a family of six. Everyone was thrilled to meet our family and welcome us back.


The ditches at the church also needed dug out again to prevent water flowing in front of the church door. (Did I mention it is rainy season and there is a ton of rain right now?) While assessing the church property and what needed to be done there, we discovered a secret garden had been planted on a hill behind the church. The marijuana was taller than me. We want to do right regardless of the consequences, so we called the police. Pray there are no repercussions to our church from whoever planted it, but if there are, we will still do right!

Culture shock still exists even if you've been raised on the mission field; or maybe I should say, sticker shock! A quart of milk sells for \$11.50; a dozen eggs is \$9. We will adjust, it just takes time. Meanwhile, we will be more creative with breakfast for us all!

The kids are loving it here, even the rain which creates lots of mud and lots of dirty clothes. We are thankful for all of your prayers and support as we embark on the ministry the Lord has for us here in Palau.



Although our physical church building is over 125 years old, sadly, before our family arrived, it was closed for two years with only eight members meeting in a home. Amazingly, this past February marks seven years we have been part of this wonderful church replant where people are being saved, baptized, and discipled. All the ministries are thriving and growing, and we have run out of space. We praise God for all that He has accomplished, but there is still much more to do!

We are excited to see our church people continue to lead others to Christ using our in-house evangelism materials (Cornerstone). Recently, Emmanuel led Jack and Anna led Louisa to the Lord. We are so thankful for their life-changing decisions! We are also thrilled to see those that came to Christ earlier on now coming forward for baptism. Natalie, Naa-Dei, and Harry all got baptized in February as their friends and family watched them take their next step in following Jesus.

As the cost of living continues to soar in London, we're always needing new partnerships. We've never had 100% support, and we lose about 2 to 3% support a year (mostly due to pastoral change). To simply maintain our support, we must constantly find new churches with whom to partner or ask

existing partners to raise our support. Thankfully, at the end of February and in March, we gained new partners during several missions conferences across the U.S. all while sharing all the amazing things happening in London. Please pray that we can continue maintaining our support levels.

APRIL 2025

Greetings from Ireland! Spring is finally here, and we are being blessed with the kind of weather that Americans dream of when they come to Ireland:) Let us share with you all that God is doing here!

Our kids have been enjoying the extra sunshine and the chance to get outside and play with friends in the warmer weather. As the days grow longer, we have been able to spend outdoor time taking walks, gardening, and freshening up the backyard with a coat of paint and some lawn care. Emily and the kids are working hard to finish their school on time, as their home school schedule experienced a lot of changes during furlough. But due to their hard work and diligence, they are right on track!

We have been working hard in preparing for the many groups who will be joining us from America to help with summer camp, holiday Bible clubs, a family conference, and evangelistic outreaches. We have to plan about one to two years in advance of any group, which includes planning itineraries, securing lodging, arranging transportation, and developing programming. It takes a significant amount of man hours and brain power to accomplish all of this, but we remain convinced it is worth it as we have seen the Lord work in and through these groups time and time again. We are so thankful for all those who are giving up their time and finances to make this year's events successful.



We were privileged to have several special services over the past two months. The children's leaders have been working hard to prepare the kids to sing several special songs during a morning service, and their exuberant voices and fervent worship were an inspiration to our congregation. A family whose children grew up in our ministry invited their friends and neighbours to a special baby dedication for their oldest daughter's first child; our building was as full as it had ever been, with 150 in attendance! We also celebrated our mothers for Mother's Day (which happens a bit earlier here in Ireland), and we had 20 mothers join us, a great turn-out for our church!

Several teens new to our church attended for the first time thanks to the invitation of excited teenagers, and they are looking forward to future activities already.

One of our most fruitful events of the year is rapidly approaching. Since we began running teen camp in 2014, over 40 teens have been saved, and scores of teens have received excellent biblical preaching and spiritual guidance. Camp requires a tremendous amount of effort from volunteers, as well as a significant amount of money to finance. Dear Friends,

A little over a week ago, we learned that a massive earthquake struck Myanmar and Thailand, with Myanmar bearing the brunt of the damage. Our Founder, Niranjan Sundararaj, has been in contact with some of our national missionaries and pastors, and urgent needs have arisen. Please read his letter below and consider contributing to an offer of assistance.

April 8, 2025

You maybe aware that the people of Myanmar have experienced immense hardship and persecution over the past five years. We are grateful for the 10 Independent Baptist missionary families serving in that country, and 28 national pastors we support in Myanmar through Ministry Asia. In March, we locally printed and distributed 40,000 copies of John and Romans in the country's Burmese and

Falam Chin languages Burmese and for the first time. This catastrophic earthquake on March 28, has further crippled the country and resulted in much hardship and pain.

We are in regular contact with our missionaries in Myanmar, offering support and prayer. Tragically, the death toll has exceeded 3,400, with over 4,500 injured and hundreds still missing. The destruction and suffering in the affected areas are profound. We have been assessing some of the immediate needs, and here is what we know at this point.

Five churches/mission works in Naypyitaw, Pyinmana and Lewe areas have incurred building damages ranging from cracks to the foundation, buildings sinking in some sections, damaged walls or considered unsafe for use. There are over 30 church families that the missionaries and pastors aware of at this point that have been displaced from their homes and living in makeshift tents. Aid from many NGOs is primarily

reaching Buddhist communities, leaving non-Buddhist communities in dire need.

I sincerely hope we can raise some funds quickly to provide humanitarian aid, support displaced church families and others in the community, and assist with rebuilding the damaged churches. We have a reliable system in place to transfer funds to Myanmar and trustworthy individuals on the ground to support proper distribution and accountability, with 100% of the funds going directly towards

meeting these needs.



I was blessed to be asked to preach at Iglesia Bautista Los Lirios on Sunday. I had the benefit of a translator as Pastor Pablo's wife, Monica, does an excellent job. Crystal and Kyndall sang the special, in Spanish, as Chloe played her guitar. Again, God was able to bless people through this time and all the glory belongs to Him.

I was most blessed to witness God work through changed plans, and an opportunity He provided in which some guys on the job site ended up hearing God's Word and receiving a Spanish Bible because God works through the 'whatsoever' we do to the glory of God.

The Mexican culture has produced some very religious people who are believing in works and idolotry instead of the true gospel of Christ. We have seen a real need for the love of Christ and His finished work to be shared with the sweet people of Mexico.
