What comes to mind when you hear words like sunshine, the smell of pine trees, roasting marshmallows, hiking, swimming in the lake, and singing around a campfire?

Summer camp, of course!

Now think about these words: love, healing, strength, new life, and hope. You might not usually connect those with camp — but for orphans and disadvantaged children, that's exactly what they find at Allies summer camps.

Our camps are all those things combined: laughter, friendship, encouragement, and the chance for a new beginning.

## Can you make a gift today that will provide all this for a child in need?

Many children in our programs come from heartbreaking situations — abuse, abandonment, poverty, and trauma. **They carry burdens far too heavy for a child.** But camp gives them something beautiful: a break from that pain, a safe place to heal, and the life-changing message that God loves them.

Masha, from Ukraine, said:

"At camp, I learned about God and my life changed. I repented. I thank God every day I was able to go. I really want to go again — to be with my friends, the best leaders, and to grow closer to God."

Wendy, 8, in Colombia, said:

"I learned God will always be with me. I wish this camp would never end."





In Costa Rica, our local leader described it this way:

"This camp has been transformative for every child and young person who attended. The love of God was evident — healing wounds and strengthening hearts. A 13-year-old girl shared how she spoke to God by the bonfire and felt heard. Another girl found self-acceptance and confidence in her identity. One child said camp was life-changing, and they connected with God in a way that left a lasting mark. It was more than a camp — it was a journey of healing, growth, and faith."

Do you see what is possible through summer camp?

When you give, you connect children with compassionate volunteers and provide time outdoors, fun with friends, the gospel message, and a lighter heart.

Think of children like Diana who lives in war-torn Ukraine. She told us:

"During this time of war, I really want to be on this island of happiness as before, like in childhood...I will never forget how [at camp] we woke up to loud and cheerful music, did exercises, danced, and learned stories from the Bible. We were like a family. I grew up spiritually and escaped the harsh reality."

Diana calls camp an *island of happiness*. And for just \$100, you can send Diana back to her happy place this summer.

And the impact of camp doesn't end when the week is over. Through the Allies Mentoring Program, our in-country volunteers continue visiting these children every month. I know your heart aches for the hurting children whose stories we share with you. You care. You want to do something — and we are so grateful for that.

## From the Landfill to Lasting Hope

You are Helping Us Go Where No One Else is Going



This spring, we traveled to the Dominican Republic to visit children in the Allies Mentoring Program (AMP) – some of whom live near a massive landfill, surrounded by poverty that's hard to put into words. Piles of trash stretch across the horizon, where homes are made from scraps, and children find their food, clothing, and even toys in the garbage. Many are Haitian refugees with no legal status or access to basic services. Their community is unrecognized by authorities – but it is not unseen by God.

When our team arrived, the children ran toward us, eager for connection. "Water, please give us water!" They begged, their hunger and thirst written on their faces. They devoured the sandwiches we brought and asked for more – not just food, but love. The children were so hungry for human interaction.

That's why AMP is so important in places like this. These children need more than food – they need

hope. And people like you are sending them hope through volunteers in this community. These caring mentors accepted Christ and pursued education, and they want to serve the children in their own neighborhood. They are changing the future of their people from within.

These children are longing to be seen, known, and loved – but we can't reach them without your help. At Allies, prayer is our number one strategy. # A Joy Journey: RuthEllen's Story of Sponsoring Melinda

RuthEllen Campbell from Trophy Club, Texas never imagined that saying yes to sponsoring a little girl in Peru would change *her* life, too.

"I had no idea I lived in a sort of bubble," she shared.

"But then I saw Melinda's sweet little face and thought,
I want to help her. I had to do something."

What started with a monthly donation quickly blossomed into a meaningful friendship through letters, drawings, and tiny gifts. "She sent me back this beautiful little letter and a bird-shaped whistle. I don't even speak Spanish, but I loved looking at her handwriting." The translated letter and thoughtful gift reminded RuthEllen of the personal connection sponsorship creates. Through Allies, sponsors don't just give – they build a relationship with a child in need and receive unexpected joy in return.

RuthEllen's eyes were opened – not just to another part of the world, but to new joy and purpose in her own life. "It's an honor to be part of this. Melinda may be miles away, but not from my heart. I stepped outside my comfort zone, and I'm so glad I did. It's a win-win for Melinda and for me."

Now RuthEllen is thinking of creative ways to do more. She wants to sew dresses for girls in Peru, gather friends for blanket-making parties, and dreams of helping even more children. "I'm just a regular person who has found purpose in helping someone else," she said. "We're just getting started."

Her encouragement to others?

"If you're thinking about it – just start.

These children don't have the opportunities we have, and \$50 a month to support a child isn't much. Once you get started, the blessings come back to you tenfold. I wanted to help this darling little girl but, in the process, I found she's doing just as much for me."

## AMP Launches in the U.S.

We're excited to announce that the Allies Mentoring Program has officially launched in the United States starting right here in Granbury, Texas! During one of the very first visits, 70 children joined in learning about teamwork and communication through fun, hands-on activities like Telephone, 20 Questions, and a group "Dance Off." Students also created keepsake bookmarks reminding them of a core value: "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you."

One volunteer shared that in her 10 years with the school's extended day program, she's never seen a group consistently show up like this to invest in students' character and emotional growth.

Fifth-grader Sophia, who comes from a single-parent home, proudly taught her mentor a special game from her culture. Moments like this show how powerful it is when children feel seen, heard, and valued.

Dear church and friends,

Greetings from Mérida! We are excited to share with you the many things that have been going on in the ministry here over the past few months!

On May 22nd, we had our seminary graduation. Two students graduated with their Bachelor's Degrees in Biblical Studies. Several others were recognized for reaching milestones in their academic program. Right now, we have several new students filling out enrollment forms as we prepare to start another school year next month. It's always a relief to make it to summer break, but by the time August rolls around, we're itching to get back to classes!

In the meantime, all four churches will be doing Vacation Bible Schools and Youth Camp. These will all take place over the next few weeks. Please be praying for every child, young person, leader, and teacher involved in these events. Every year, we see children, youth, and their families come to know the Lord and commit to follow Him more faithfully through these activities. Please pray for much fruit again this year!

In June, Ciudad Caucel Baptist Church celebrated its 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary. It hardly seems possible that ten years have gone by already! Pastor Erick Rico is doing a great job leading the church. They have grown to over 100 people, they are financially self-sustaining, their church building is paid for and they are paying their own pastor, there is excitement and unity amongst the members, they have vibrant children and youth ministries, the adults are involved and active, a few of the members are already studying in the seminary, and four more are enrolling this year.

Pastor José Yam continues to lead the San José Tzal Baptist Church. Their members are also growing and excited. They do regular outreach events in the villages surrounding San José Tzal and have started home Bible studies in several of those villages.

South Mérida Baptist Church is doing great! We have 35-40 in attendance on Sundays. In addition to our leadership team, we have had five other church members going out with us every Saturday to evangelize. A few weeks ago, Santiago got baptized. After his baptism, Emilio recognized his need to get baptized as well. So, we baptized him the following week. After his baptism, two others who had been coming to church for only a few weeks told us they wanted to get baptized too! One small group has finished the first two discipleship classes: "Membership" and "Evangelism." Another group just finished their "Membership" class last Sunday and will be starting "Evangelism" classes next week.

Please continue to pray for the North Mérida Baptist Church's building project. I hope to share some exciting news with you soon about that!

The Mares family, our missionaries in Argentina, have been working on a new project called the "7/20 Project." Their goal is to plant 7 new churches in 20 years in cities along the southern tip of Argentina. They recently left the first church plant in the hands of their son-in-law and have moved to start the second church. Please pray for them as they continue to work in the "uttermost part of the earth."

Thank you for your moral, prayer, and financial support! May the Lord bless you and prosper the work of your hands as we labor together in the fields!

## You Helped Valarie Heal

When Valarie, 61, reflects on the journey that brought her to today, what stands out is her unwavering resilience.

"I always knew if something didn't work out, I could find another way forward," she explains.

Valarie's childhood was tumultuous, an experience she later recounted in a selfpublished autobiography detailing her experience in the foster care system.

Nevertheless, Valarie was determined to build a stronger life. She earned an undergraduate degree in psychology and a graduate degree in education, then put her schooling to work in a career focused on

mentoring and advocating for young adults.

When Valarie made the courageous decision to leave an unsafe relationship, she came face-to-face with homelessness. But thankfully, friends like you stepped up to help her find a new day, home and life at the Arlington Life Shelter.

"I always knew if something didn't work out. I could find another way forward,"

Here, Valarie had access to a computer lab where she diligently applied to new jobs, as well as many more needed resources. Soon, her case manager let her know about a promising housing program.



"I was so relieved when they told me I qualified," Valarie says.

Now, Valarie has the fresh start she needs to continue healing from her past and building a future focused on stability and happiness!



## Kirk Shares Hope Through Meals

Some of Kirk's youngest memories are of his

mother cooking in the kitchen. Fast forward, and Kirk has returned to his love of food and cooking through volunteering in the kitchen at the Arlington Life Shelter. "I just wanted to do something to help," he said.

Our mission is especially meaningful to Kirk, who experienced homelessness himself. For him, homelessness was tied up in a substance abuse disorder. Thankfully, Kirk has

regained stability. He dedicates his sobriety to his late father, Donald Oldham, as the reason he is thriving now.

Kirk has gone on to found a nonprofit, Meals with Meaning, to further his personal passion.

"One day, I was out serving food on a cold, rainy day, and I saw a pregnant woman with no shoes. That moment stuck with me," Kirk shares, speaking on why he continues to donate time.

With each meal he creates for our guests, Kirk partners

with a different local chef or farmer. "It's farm-to-shelter," he jokes.

Now, the nonprofit is approaching 11,000 total meals donated. With each one, Kirk hopes to instill the value service in his children, ages 10, 5 and 4. "I want them to understand the importance of giving back."

If you're considering volunteering, Kirk encourages you to try it. "People think they're too small to help, but that's not true," he says. "If I can do it, anyone can!"

## A New Mom Shares Heartfelt Gratitude


For any new mother, the transition to motherhood is hard, but rewarding. For Virginia, it was a transformation that would lead to new hope and a stronger future.

"Two weeks
postpartum, I went
through domestic violence,
and I was homeless,"
Virginia remembers.

"I'm grateful. It really feels like the sky is opening."

It's hard to imagine the stress of not having a safe, stable place to land — having to hop between friends' houses just to survive. When you add in a newborn child to care for, the pressure only mounts.

Thankfully, your partnership showed Virginia that there's always a helping hand. She called our number from a list of resources. "It was one o'clock, and they



were like, "we just started intake. If you come right now, we have a family room available," she says.

Here, Virginia and her son, Veridian, had the stable space needed to decompress, heal and begin planning for the future. Virginia secured a job in childcare at the YMCA, a job that lets her bring Veridian to work.

"I want to get my CDA and become a teacher," she shares excitedly of her longterm plans.

To friends like you, who are helping her on the path to getting her driver's license and an apartment, Virginia says, "I'm grateful. It really feels like the sky is opening!"

### Life has a lot of unexpected trials!

We are grateful and blessed to know that, we serve a Great God. Our God sees and knows everything that is ahead on our journey. During the 2nd week of March. we were attending a missions conference at Faith Baptist Church, Franklin, Ohio. We noticed our vehicle had a problem. It was not shifting right. We drove back and forth for the conference with this issue. Until end of the conference, our vehicle was barely shifting at all. Finally we took it to the shop, and realize transmission was bad. Thankfully, the shop was able to get it fixed. It has cost us about \$3,800.00 to fix it. Thank you, for those who reached out to us with special love offering and prayers. Thank you for helping us getting our vehicle fixed.

# Open Opportunity.

We are so grateful for every ministry opportunity we had these past several of months, from March - May. God has been good and very gracious in every aspect of our journey on deputation. 

Dear faithful friends and supporters,

I hope you are enjoying the summer season, especially the outreach opportunities. We just finished Vacation Bible School with our church here in Arlington. Julie and I taught 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> grade again. It was a joy to be a part of such a great team of volunteers that poured into the lives of young people for several days. We pray some of those children grow up to be missionaries one day!

A couple of weeks ago, we received a call that our youngest daughter, Mallory, would need emergency laproscopic surgery. Julie and I headed straight to Tennessee and arrived the morning after surgery. Thankfully, Mallory is now home and recovering well, the doctors were able to diagnose things, and she was prescribed medication to hopefully prevent any surgeries in the future. We are thankful for the timing of things, in that she had just finished her first year of teaching and we did not have appointments scheduled, so we were able to be there prior to VBS.

# Furlough and More...

Furlough has been a tremendous blessing as it has allowed us to visit many churches and rekindle many friendships throughout the United States. The majority of our travels have been focused on the New England area, the upper Midwest, and Texas. We have put several thousand miles on our vehicle and still have many more to go. We recently had the opportunity to speak at a youth camp where the focus was on missions. It was an informal time where around 80 youth had the opportunity to listen to Tiffany's and my testimonies, and they were given the opportunity to ask questions. You could see God was working as many of the questions were not the typical everyday questions, but rather, thought-provoking questions about how to do ministry in other countries and how to reach the lost. Pray with us that God would call several of these young people into ministry, including missions as the need is so great today.

I would like to share another prayer need on the health front. In November of last year, I had to have surgery, and unfortunately, I have had a complication from that procedure and now require another surgery Stateside to fix the issue. Pray that God would guide the surgeon and that He would heal me quickly as there is a lot of pain associated with this procedure. The first surgery required almost 8 weeks to fully recover with the first three weeks being in bed dealing with pain relief. The doctor has told me that this time it should only be about 2 weeks for pain relief as the surgery does not have to be as invasive as the previous one.

On the Chilean front, thanks to modern technology, I have been able to have several video meetings with the leadership. And so, even though we are not physically in Chile, we can stay very involved with everything going on. The ministry continues to move forward. The leaders in Chile have been doing a wonderful job week after week. New people have been stepping up to serve when needed. You might remember that in our last letter, I shared with you Rayen's testimony of salvation and baptism. She has been living with a man for several years and they have two children together, but are not married (which, unfortunately is very common in Chile). She recently wrote to me and expressed the desire to get married. It is wonderful how the Holy Spirit works in the lives of new believers. When we return to Chile, I will begin pre-marital counseling with them as they plan their wedding.

In the coming days, our furlough travels will once again take us into the upper Midwest along with the desert Southwest and the Plains states. Please continue to pray for our safety and health. Pray that God would continue to use us as we visit churches. Pray also that God would provide us with a small amount of new support to combat the rising costs of inflation in Chile. Thank you for all you do to help us reach the unreached in the country of Chile.

## "Science in Scripture—Part 1"

Introduction... We often hear the statement, "The Bible is not a book of science." There is a shadow of truth in this oft-repeated overture, because science is the work of man, and Scripture is the revelation of God. In truth, the Bible is the **Book of Redemption**—far above our ultimate scientific exploits. Science is "performed" by clever men, but Scripture was "revealed" to holy men by the Holy Spirit. At its best efforts, science represents the systematic analysis and highest use of the domains of God's creation.<sup>2</sup>

However, as the revelation of God, Scripture speaks with authority in all areas addressed: origins, history, morality, divinity, eternity ... and science. We saw in an earlier lesson that Scripture introduced the overall areas of scientific research (Feb. 2025 CEM Lesson Sheet), and man was given the mandate to "have dominion" over the physical domains of Earth.<sup>3</sup> So it would naturally follow that man would develop the methodology of science.

The Scriptures simultaneously introduce the comprehensive description of the world and universe that requires scientific research on the part of Adam and his descendants to analyze and dominate. "And God said, 'Let us make man in our image, after our likeness: and let them have dominion of the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creepeth upon the earth'."<sup>4</sup>

## A. Scripture Announced the Scope of Science in Advance...

Supporting the Scriptures' universal scope in matters of science is the fact that the opening verse of the Bible encompasses the entire universal realm that science has to work with. The Scriptures encompass the design, origin, and function of the entire universe from the outset: "In the beginning (Time) God (Force) created (Energy) the heaven (Space) and the earth (Matter)"—which together comprise universal information.<sup>5</sup>

Interestingly, physicists recognize that we are losing information and order in the natural decay of universal processes ("entropy"); which means that the farther back in time astronomy observes physical conditions, the more "structured" and "refined" the universe appears to be. Discoveries by the James Webb Space Telescope confirm this

observation to the amazement of modern astronomy.<sup>7,8</sup> The obvious inference is that the original creation appeared at its ultimate highest order of information! "And God saw everything that He had made, and, behold, it was very good."

### B. Scripture Described the Intricate Balance of the Universe in Advance...

Physicists and astrophysicists recently discovered that all physical properties in the universe are so interrelated that none can be changed without adversely affecting the rest. Over 800 parameters have been discovered to date. In science, this is known as the "GOLDILOCKS ENIGMA"... the Anthropic Principle. The Scriptures stated this phenomenon all along!: "Mine hand also hath laid the foundation of the earth, and my right hand hath spanned the heavens: when I call unto them, they stand up together." 100

### C. Surprising Science: Unseen Source of Physical Elements

Well in advance of modern physics, the Scriptures clearly stated that light and substance were formed by acoustical vibration from God, and that the result is a physical domain undetectable to the human eye. "Through faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that things which are seen were not made of things that do appear." The science of sonoluminescence has verified that sound can produce full-spectrum light. Additional mainline scientific research discovered that intense laserenergy focused on a small area of powerful electromagnetic energy can produce matter.

## D. Surprising Science: Nuclear Components...Capable of Chain Reaction

The Scriptures also stated that "unseen" elements are composed of nuclear components that are capable of chain reaction explosion. "...the heavens being on fire shall be dissolved, and the elements shall melt with fervent heat..." In scientific records, nuclear fission was discovered in December 1938 by chemists Otto Hahn and Fritz Strassman, and physicists Lise Meitner and Otto Robert Frisch. Hahn was awarded the Nobel Prize in 1944.

It is with great joy that we send this mission's report to you. Gospel Connect International is experiencing our most exciting time of ministry to date. We enjoy visiting churches here in the States, preaching, singing, sharing testimonies about life and ministry, while meeting with old friends and forming new relationships. The most exciting part of what we are doing is sharing the ongoing ministry opportunities in Eastern and Central Europe. What a joy it is to see people connect with us through their commitment to pray, to come and minister with us, and to invest in churches and the lives of both church leaders and the people they disciple.



Our first phase of ministry in Slovakia took place this past March, with our return to the States after April 2nd. We ministered in three great churches, led a one-day regional Evangelism Conference, and taught and shared our story at the bi-annual Ambassadors for Christ School of Evangelists. This training was for over 30 young adults and ministers who are leading the charge of Gospel proclamation in Slovakia. Please pray for these evangelists as they strive to live their lives and ministries to boldly proclaim salvation to the lost in their culture.

It was also great to connect with new friends who pastor or lead churches where we are planning to minister in the very near future. This leads me to our next bit of news and our immediate preparations to head back to Slovakia from May 27 to June 19. Upon our arrival in Budapest, Hungary, we will be met at the airport by Vane, a Macedonian brother in Christ. He has served for the past 16 years with YWAM (Youth With A Mission). Over dinner, we will discuss possible future ministry involvement in Hungary. After our first short night's sleep, we will take a train from Budapest, arriving in Nova Zámky, Slovakia at 11:05 AM. From there, we will drive 12 miles to the township of Nesvady, where at 3:00 PM, we will share art, music, testimonies, and the gospel with 30 to 40 kids at the local YMCA. YMCA clubs are supported and sanctioned by Baptist churches. What a great open door to reach youth and eventually their families!


The plan is to do intentional outreach on the streets of Nesvady for a few days before driving 3 1/2 hours to the mountain town of Revuca. There, we will participate in several outreach events being planned by a young church planter named Richard. We are excited to partner for two days with this young Slovakian man in his growing church. From Revuca, we will head southeast to the Ukraine and Hungary borders, where an incredible revival is taking place among the Roma Gypsy churches. Hundreds of Roma people are coming to faith in Christ, and we have the privilege of enjoying the harvest with them.

After three days, we will return to the historic and mountain city of Banská Bystrica to work with Pastor Rene, a church leader who was born in the Congo and has been in Slovakia for over 30 years. Pastor Rene has a small Assembly of God congregation with a huge heart for lost people. Please pray for our events in the city center, that many may come to Christ! From this city, we will travel west and minister with some of our Evangelism School students in the Bratislava region. The conclusion of our time in Slovakia will be three days of community ministry with our dear Macedonian-born friend and brother, Pastor Stevo, in the Baptist Church of Hurbanovo.

Please pray for Debbie and me, Tristan and Peyton Davis (our two oldest grandsons), Stephanie Warren from Texas, Jordan Stoilov (possibly his son Jakov) from Macedonia, and Samuel Cekov, who is our Slovakian/Macedonian host. Pray for protection, Holy Spirit guidance, and provisions for the ministry. Pray for our continued ministry in Macedonia, Albania, and Kosovo from July 27 - October 11, 2025.

In closing, we can't wait to see God's great plan at work in the lives of the people we are soon to encounter! Thank you for your continued prayers and ministry partnership.

Thank you for enabling us to celebrate our 63<sup>rd</sup> wedding anniversary on Sunday, June 1, here in Brazil, continuing our work with our multi ministries. Our missionary son and co-worker, Harold Ralph, snapped the new picture in our letterhead on our anniversary after the morning service at our sixth church, Vila Guacuri, where Linda accompanies the singing on the keyboard piano and I, Tom, am involved in diverse areas.

A thumbnail sketch of recent results in a long process of praying and working with different people, modifying areas of ministry:

The deaf ministry at our first church, Templo Batista de Indianópolis (TBI), is now functioning under the leadership of Pr. Lucas, a young Brazilian pastor whose wife's father pastored the deaf ministry for many years. They give Sunday mornings to a church for the deaf that was started by former missionary John Spitt in Arujá, a satellite city of São Paulo, with a family from the deaf ministry at TBI. Sunday afternoons and evenings are dedicated to the deaf ministry at TBI. Another man from the deaf ministry at TBI is beginning a deaf work at the church in Vila Guacuri, which Harold Ralph started with others, and which will be the base of his church planting ministries.

Thank the Lord our fifth church, Jardim Ingá, which was begun with the hands-on work of Harold Ralph and Missionary Sean Lunday, and new missionaries learning Portuguese and adapting to Brazil, will now lead the revitalization of Parque Bristol, a church that is about 60 years old, founded by a missionary friend, Clifford New, who is now with the Lord, It had a good, fruitful history but ended up with a handful of elderly people needing comfort and a fresh start, The Brazilian pastor, José Amâncio, has fallen ill and is unable to carry the work forward. Missionary Pastor Seth, the son of Missionary Sean Lunday and pastor of the Jardim Ingá church, has assumed rebuilding the Parque Bristol church.

Medical update on Linda: Diagnosed with erysipelas, a bacterial skin infection in her lower right leg, which resulted in many doctors' appointments and exams (about 15 total), Linda was finally introduced to a specialist outside our hospital plan. Thank GOD she can work at her desk with her leg elevated, attend church services, and do basic household chores--even permitting me to help! She will have preventive medication for possibly six months. The need for foot and knee surgery will be delayed until the infection is totally healed.

Medical update on Tom: A follow-up routine exam alerted the dermatologist to request biopsies of a lesion on Tom's left leg and a small place on his right earlobe. The results revealed no problem with the leg but Bowen's disease (squamous cell carcinoma in situ), a pre-cancerous condition, which must be removed from his right earlobe. Thank the Lord our Brazilian insurance covers all our routine doctors' visits and will cover the small surgery on the right ear. May the Lord continue to bless.

Dear Prayer Warriors,

May - June 2025

Thank you for your faithfulness in praying for Gloria and me. Our return to the field after our medical furlough has been very fruitful. We were met with joy and excitement from our church folk and as soon as we got over our jet lag, we immediately jumped into the work. Gloria and I are currently working with 3 families. Six family members have already accepted the Lord as their Savior while the others are still learning and considering. Often we have to go all the way back to Genesis to explain the proof of who God is and the origins of our sinful world before they will even understand their need for a Savior.

I met the **Borja family** at the Saturday market and started witnessing to them as we were eating the goodies we bought there. The dad said that he had "done that" several times before but it never worked on him, however he encouraged his son and nephew to listen carefully. They both prayed and got saved that day! Frank (Dad) is Chamorro and Heather (Mom) is Palauan and we immediately began home Bible studies with them twice a week. I brought another young man from church to be my silent partner and he found it amazing how hungry the whole family was for the Word of God. I reminded him that this is what we'd been praying for. He agreed but sadly admitted that he'd never seen this kind of response. Please keep the Borja's in your prayers as we hope Frank (the Dad) will understand what he did wrong the many times he prayed as a younger man when "it didn't work". Simply put he didn't get truly saved, yet. Also pray for families like the Borjas who are from two different cultural backgrounds. This makes explaining away their wrong ideas they've grown up with seem like a competition in the family (it's a spiritual battle) with "he says" and "she says" leading to long explanations to help them understand clearly what the Bible says and means.

Here in Saipan, we are trying to get our folk in church over their nervous fear to go soul winning. After dividing everyone into teams of two to three members, we have started going house to house to introduce ourselves to all of the neighbors in our village on the south side of the island. None of our folk are from this area so their inhibitions rose due to the stigma and reputation of the village around us. This is where I met my second family who we've started home Bible studies with, Mary and her family. She is Catholic but that's just because the family she's married into is Catholic and as a lady in a wheel chair she relies on them to take her everywhere. When I showed up, she begged us to come back weekly to help her read and study the Bible. Please pray for Mary, James, John and Mario because all but her were "high" on drugs during our first two visits. Now they're having a "Custom" for the death of a family member so we won't be able to return for about 6 weeks. Traditionally lots of people have the names of many of Jesus' family and followers, but their addictive habits may keep their hearts and minds from truly getting to know Him. Please pray for their soberness during the days we visit.

May - July 2025 Prayer Letter

#### Reverse Culture Shock

We have been back in the United States for three months at this point. It has taken us some time to reacclimate back to living here. With so many differences, both culturally and practically, we have, at times, really felt like foreigners in our own country. One of the biggest adjustments has been driving larger cars very quickly on a different side of the road. The large size of grocery stores and the overwhelming options of food to eat has been really exciting but, also, quite overwhelming! We have also enjoyed many things that we have greatly missed, such as playgrounds and wide-open spaces for the girls to run and play. We are finally starting to feel comfortable and settled.

#### **Health Update**

Thank you very much to everyone who has prayed for my (Jonathan) dad and his battle with cancer. My dad has been undergoing intravenous and oral chemotherapy in addition to hormone treatment to halt the spread of cancer and irradicate it simultaneously. He has just finished the 4<sup>th</sup> of 6 chemotherapy treatments. The bloodwork tests show that the cancer markers have come back down from over 4,000 to the normal range. This is huge and means the cancer is no longer spreading! The doctor was not able to give any clear answers regarding the long-term impact on my dad's lifespan until this first set of treatments is finished. The future is uncertain, but we know that God is able to heal. We are praying that He will completely heal my father. Praise the Lord, Dad has been able to continue working his secular job at FedEx while pastoring. He is in good spirits, but the first week following his treatments have been the hardest for him. Please continue to pray.

#### **Bible College Graduation**

The third week in June was the graduation at the Bible college in Central Java. I was so thankful that I had the opportunity to return to Indonesia on a quick trip to be there for that and manage a few other important things at our house. It was a huge blessing to see **five graduates** walk across the stage and receive their diplomas. We are excited to see how God will use them. **Please pray that God will bless the college and bring in new students for the upcoming semester.** 

Some of the existing buildings on the college campus are in **great need of renovation and repairs.** We are also working on plans to add some additional workspaces for the teachers and additional dormitory space. These upgraded facilities will provide space to house up to 60 students. Some of the renovation work will be started at the end of July so that it can hopefully be completed before classes resume in the fall. The school is planning to add some additional teaching and office staff to ensure that everything continues to run as effectively as possible. We are praying that God would meet these financial needs for the Bible college.





#### **Updating and Encouraging Churches**

Starting in July, we have begun our scheduled time of visiting and updating our supporting churches. We have enjoyed being able to stay with Danielle's parents through all of June and July as we have been visiting supporting churches in Tennessee. At the beginning of August, we will be traveling to North Carolina where we will get to stay with my folks for all of August. We have been able to schedule meetings at almost half of our supporting churches to give an update during this furlough time. We have a few limited open times in our schedule. If you would like for us to come by for a visit, I will do my best to try to fit it into our schedule.

We are extremely grateful that at this time we do not need to raise any additional monthly support for ourselves. We have had some churches asking so far about any needs we may have in the near future. We will be looking for a large freezer and a generator/backup power system for our new house when we return to Indonesia. We will be living in a bit more remote area where some foods are hard to come by, and the power is often unstable. I will be getting some prices on the cost of this equipment for anyone who would like to help with this need. Also, I would like to make the opportunity available for any church or individual to sponsor one of the Bible college students. The students are required to pay a very minimal fee for their registration, courses, and lodging. Though this fee does not fully cover the expenses, it is sometimes a challenge for the students. The total cost for 1 student's full expenses for an entire year comes to about \$500. These funds will function as financial aid/scholarship for the students. The students are not able to work while studying, but they are all required to be involved with maintaining the campus and caring for the garden, catfish ponds, and goats that have been prepared to supply some food supplies for the college and cover some of the expenses for the Bible college. If you have any questions about supporting the Bible college, please feel free to ask. Any funds specifically designated for the Bible college students can be earmarked as "Bible college students."

Please pray that God will work in hearts through our church visits here. We greatly desire that God would move and call new laborers to Indonesia. I had the chance last week to share about Indonesia at Camp BIMI, missions camp at BIMI, and I will also be sharing again next week. During our next term, we want to be ready to host and assist prospective missionaries in survey trips or mission internships in Indonesia. There are many opportunities here for families and single missionaries. Pray that God will send new missionaries!

#### **Prayer and Praises**

Please pray that God will give us safety in traveling here in the US. We are so thankful that He has provided us with a good reliable vehicle to use for our furlough. Pray that our house and property in Indonesia will remain secure and intact while we are gone. Pray that home renovations go smoothly. Praise the Lord we have several people looking out for our property in the old and new places. Pray for our friend, Dinno, as he we will traveling back soon from visiting family. Pray for our physical health.



and do not return there but water the earth, making it bring forth and sprout, giving seed to the sower and bread to the eater, so shall My word be that goes out from My mouth; it shall not return to Me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and shall succeed in the thing for which I sent it." (Isaiah 55:10-11)

We are entering the rainy season here in Japan and as I considered the rain, it reminded me of this Bible verse. This passage of Scripture is so encouraging because it gives me confidence when sharing God's Word with those who have never heard. His Word will not return empty but will water the hearts in which the gospel seeds have been planted! And God is the one who brings the growth (ref. 1 Corinthians 3:6-7).

It's for this reason why I'm so excited to share with you that recently I've been able to start a couple of one-on-one Bible studies with my friends, **Hikaru** and **Amelie!** The Lord has put these two in particular on my heart, as they have been soft-hearted and actively seeking to know more about the Lord. At the church plant I attend, they have an introductory Bible study for seekers called "First Steps." It's written in both Japanese and English and walks through what we believe as Christians, using key Bible verses and helpful explanations, contextualized for the Japanese.

When I asked both Hikaru and Amelie if they'd like to start going through this book, they each eagerly agreed. I have been meeting with both of them one-on-one every other week. Last week Amelie and I went through the first lesson, which teaches on "What is God like?" Amelie, who I met originally in our language school, is a bright young woman who loves learning Japanese. To my surprise when I showed her that the book was bilingual, she excitedly asked, "Can we do this Bible study in Japanese?!" I chuckled and replied, "Sure!" As she read each section in Japanese, I'd ask her to translate into English to make sure she understood, then we would check by re-reading the English together. She learned that there is only one true God, God is the Creator, and that God loves us and that we were made to be in a relationship with Him. When I asked her what her thoughts about what she learned were, she said, "I think this is good and makes a lot of sense." Praise God! Please continue to pray for Amelie. Our next meeting will be May 28th where we will discuss "Who is Jesus?"

Steps. God has really been blessing our friendship and each time we hang out, she trusts me more and more and expresses her thoughts with me more clearly. When we hung out last, we attended church service and then headed to a local family restaurant to have our Bible study time. Hikaru has been attending church for a while now and has always remained open, yet I have sensed a hesitation in putting her faith in Jesus wholeheartedly. So we decided that it might be best if we walked more thoroughly through the gospel to make sure we were on the same page.

In one of my previous newsletters, I shared that she wouldn't really give me details about why. But more recently, she opened up more as we walked through the gospel again in the First Steps book. She told me that while she believes that Jesus died on the cross for her sins, she is not ready to change her lifestyle and commit fully to Christ yet. I came to realize that while she affirms Jesus as Savior, she hesitates to trust Jesus as her Lord. Yet, I was so thankful to God that she remains soft-hearted and is willing to continue our discussion of the gospel. The next time we meet, we are going to pick up where we left off and talk a bit deeper about what it means to be a disciple of Christ and that we can trust Him with our lives. Actually, would you please commit to praying for Hikaru for the next 7 days? We will attend a women's retreat together this coming weekend (May 31-June 1) and I truly believe the Lord will work mightily in her heart during this retreat. I know that with your prayers, God will move her heart even closer towards Him!

During a language tutoring session with **Seko-sensei**, our lesson transitioned very easily into a spiritual conversation when a simple and honest question was asked, "Is God silent?" You might be wondering, "How did your conversation turn to that topic in the middle of a language lesson?" During our Zoom meetings, my teacher usually gives me topics to discuss and through this she helps me practice my Japanese speaking. Oftentimes our conversations will take a turn I never expect! For this particular lesson, Seko-sensei was asking me about books I had read. At first we discussed childhood books that I read growing up, and then she asked me, "Have you read any books written by a Japanese person?" To which I answered, "Yes, the book *Silence*." She replied, "Oh! I've read that book also! The one by Shusaku Endo, right?"

To give you a bit of background, the book *Silence* is about 17th century Catholic missionaries bringing Christianity to Japan for the first time. It shows both how quickly the Japanese readily accepted Christianity and also the swift persecution that came about by the governing authorities. It's a story of the persecution of Japanese Christians and the author wrestles with the topic of the silence of God amidst such suffering. I'm so thankful that I had read that book and that God provided a wide opening for yet another chance to share about God's goodness. I shared with her that God is not silent and that He reveals Himself in nature (ref. Psalm 19; Romans 1), through His Word (Bible), and that God is not far from any of us and wants us to reach out for Him (ref. Acts 17:24-28). I encouraged her again that if she seeks God with her whole heart, He would be found by her and she could hear from the true and living God if she wanted to. He was only just a prayer away and God is eager for us to talk to Him. Would you please join me in praying for Seko-sensei's desire to seek the Lord and for her salvation?



# Language Studies Progress

Language learning continues to progress and I'm now in Intermediate 1 class. At this level, my communication has continued to grow and I am able to construct sentences with fewer grammatical errors. When I first arrived I could barely make a full sentence, but now am able to carry on basic conversations and do more daily tasks, like asking a store clerk a question or ordering something on a menu. I truly feel like I cleared a plateau that I was on when I entered into the intermediate level! There have been many victories in language learning! However, I wish I could say that it's been an easy process and that I'm catching on quickly, but I must confess that I struggle with the Japanese language often and can get discouraged easily. In the classroom environment I am more comfortable to try and make mistakes, but in a real world setting I tend to shrink away from conversations due to fear. Would you please pray for my language learning process, that the Lord would give me wisdom for my studies and also help me to overcome my fear of speaking to native speakers in a real world context?



My Intermediate 1 teacher, **Hanagaki-sensei**, is high energy and hilarious! She usually makes the class atmosphere fun and keeps us motivated on those hard beginning of the week Mondays.



I trust this update finds you well. I wanted to touch bases with our friends and coworkers to give you a report on what God is doing through our national pastors who are associated with Barnabas1040.

First of all I want to say thank you to those who have contacted me regarding my recovery from the concussion. God has blessed and I am back on the road again. I appreciate very much your concern and prayers.

In the past two months I have had the opportunity to preach in churches in Florida, Alabama and California. The rest of 2025 is pretty much filled with meetings in the United States and at least one trip to Asia.

God is greatly using our national pastors in SE Asia. In the first quarter of 2025, they reported 1,230 professions of faith in Christ and 221 souls who were baptized as a picture of their decision to follow the Lord Jesus Christ.

Baptism is not something that is normally done quickly in Asia. Most of the people trusting Christ in these countries are forsaking the religion that their family has followed for centuries. They are leaving false religions that are engraved into the culture of their family and country. It is often considered a great shame to their family and the entire village to become a follower of Jesus. Also, public baptism can bring great persecution to the new convert as well; especially from the people they love the most. It is not uncommon for wives and children to be beaten and even disowned by the extended family. These dear people need our prayers as they take up their cross and follow Jesus.

As always I want to close this brief report by thanking you for your prayers and financial investment in our efforts to serve those missionaries and pastors who are serving in Asia. I consider it a great privilege that together we can have a small part in what others are doing for our Savior.



"Well, I didn't expect that." It can be hard sometimes to explain what life is like in this part of the world to someone who has never visited. There are unexpected things that happen to all of us irregardless of where we live, but sometimes it feels as though it happens a lot more often here. It is so common for plans to change and the unexpected to happen that we even hear locals telling each other all the time to just be patient.

For example just two days before Jonathan's parents were coming to visit this year a large excavator working to build a new apartment building next to our house put a 9x3 foot hole in our kitchen wall. After examining the damage and talking to the construction crew we found this so normal at this point that we just laughed at the situation. Amazingly we were able to find some builders who worked after hours for two days (it was Ramadan and short notice) and we were able to get the wall fixed before our family arrived.

Meetings can be planned and no one show up or many more than expected. There are vehicle issues at the worst possible moment. Colds and the flu right at the start of a week of intense ministry work. Unexpected visitors that stay for the whole day when you have many other things planned. Lost passports, disputes we have to help settle between our friends and many other things that we really didn't expect.

We share these stories but we have a hundred others (from this year alone) that could illustrate the same point. Life here in North Africa is unpredictable. But what we have learned over our 13 years of living here is that we just have to trust God. With our house church, with our outreaches, with our family, and the many other ministry opportunities we are involved in, we have learned that we will inevitably get to a point where we will say, I didn't expect that. But this no longer stops us or trips us up. We laugh and carry on because honesty, we are starting to expect it.

The great thing to this phase "I didn't expect that" is that there are also the positive moments as well. Divinely orchestrated moments where we have opportunities to share the Gospel with people we never thought we'd have. A church member steps up and fills a need that needs to be filled. Opportunities for ministry that we never planned for. And since

we often try and plan for the unexpected when the occasional day, event, or plan doesn't go unexpectedly it makes us step back, smile and say "we didn't expect that."

When we recognize that God is in control, the unexpected parts of life and ministry in North Africa are nothing more than small bumps in the road that remind us to trust even more in our Savior.

We are thankful for each and every one of you. Your prayers, encouragement and support are such a blessing to us.

Dear Pastor and Church,

May - July 2025

The first week of May we planned to teach up north in the mountains of Chiang Rai at Huey Saa Baptist Church. The goal was to teach Old Testament Survey from morning to late afternoon for four days. In an agrarian society planting starts when the rains fall. And the rain came early this year. Preparation was made but we ended up teaching Friday and Saturday as most church members were out preparing their fields. Everyone was here for Sunday services.

Over 10 years ago a young man accepted Christ in our prison ministry. After getting out of prison he attended our church for a while before moving across town to help in another church and going to Bible school. On May 10th Bro. Gan was married and went on staff at the church where the wedding was performed. What a blessing to see God change people's hearts and call them into the ministry.

May 24th we put on an all day English program at the Bangkok Accounting College for over 150 students. We split them into groups and the last hour and a half they interview us (where we are from, family, favorite things, ect..). The last question is, What is the most important decision you have ever made? This is where we tell them the Gospel. Then each group elects one person as their spokesman and we all assemble in the auditorium. The spokesman then introduces the English speaking person of their group going through the interview questions. And the last thing they talk about is the most important decision...accepting Christ as their Saviour. This is repeated another 10 times.

The school even invited us to start an after school English club that meets Monday after school. Around 15 attending regularly. Bro Adam Cottrel and Peach are in charge of this endeavor. Peach is a student at the school who was saved two years ago through this English outreach. Two students from the school have been attending Bro. Adams youth group on a regular basis with their parents coming to the services ever so often. Please continue to pray for this endeavor.

Since June we have had three saved including a Syrian teenager through the Pakistani ministry.

August 11 - 14 we will be working with a medical team (45 doctors and nurses) from the States. We will be in the Province of Surin. We will be helping with the translating and witnessing. Kannika will also be teaching the children each day. There are still many displaced people from the fighting between Thailand and Cambodia in this area. Please pray for fruit from this outreach.

Thank you for your faithfulness in praying for Gloria and me. Our return to the field after our medical furlough has been very fruitful. We were met with joy and excitement from our church folk and as soon as we got over our jet lag, we immediately jumped into the work. Gloria and I are currently working with 3 families. Six family members have already accepted the Lord as their Savior while the others are still learning and considering. Often we have to go all the way back to Genesis to explain the proof of who God is and the origins of our sinful world before they will even understand their need for a Savior.

I met the **Borja family** at the Saturday market and started witnessing to them as we were eating the goodies we bought there. The dad said that he had "done that" several times before but it never worked on him, however he encouraged his son and nephew to listen carefully. They both prayed and got saved that day! Frank (Dad) is Chamorro and Heather (Mom) is Palauan and we immediately began home Bible studies with them twice a week. I brought another young man from church to be my silent partner and he found it amazing how hungry the whole family was for the Word of God. I reminded him that this is what we'd been praying for. He agreed but sadly admitted that he'd never seen this kind of response. Please keep the Borja's in your prayers as we hope Frank (the Dad) will understand what he did wrong the many times he prayed as a younger man when "it didn't work". Simply put he didn't get truly saved, yet. Also pray for families like the Borjas who are from two different cultural backgrounds. This makes explaining away their wrong ideas they've grown up with seem like a competition in the family (it's a spiritual battle) with "he says" and "she says" leading to long explanations to help them understand clearly what the Bible says and means.

Here in Saipan, we are trying to get our folk in church over their nervous fear to go soul winning. After dividing everyone into teams of two to three members, we have started going house to house to introduce ourselves to all of the neighbors in our village on the south side of the island. None of our folk are from this area so their inhibitions rose due to the stigma and reputation of the village around us. This is where I met my second family who we've started home Bible studies with, Mary and her family. She is Catholic but that's just because the family she's married into is Catholic and as a lady in a wheel chair she relies on them to take her everywhere. When I showed up, she begged us to come back weekly to help her read and study the Bible. Please pray for Mary, James, John and Mario because all but her were "high" on drugs during our first two visits. Now they're having a "Custom" for the death of a family member so we won't be able to return for about 6 weeks. Traditionally lots of people have the names of many of Jesus' family and followers, but their addictive habits may keep their hearts and minds from truly getting to know Him. Please pray for their soberness during the days we visit.

My name is Juan Cruz and I attend Brother Thomas' weekly Spanish Bible Study at Columbia Correctional Institution. I have been attending his Bible Study for about 3 years now and not only have I learned about God's Word by Brother Thomas verbally teaching it to us but by demonstrating it through his actions and the way he carries himself. Hebrews 13:3 states "continue to remember those in prison as if you were together with them in prison, and those who are mistreated as if you yourselves were suffering." (NIV). Whenever Brother Thomas confesses to us that he had a difficult time checking into the prison due to the prison officials or any other mishap, he demonstrates not only humility but patience.

I personally want to thank him and his ministry for the love they show towards us. I also want to thank you on behalf of the Spanish speaking brothers who greatly appreciate Brother Thomas' effort in teaching God's Word in Spanish. That is another way he demonstrates Christ's love toward us.

I myself am very fortunate to be able to speak both languages, that is why I decided to write this thank you letter in English.
