The vision to go into all the world is indeed coming to fruition. In the last ten years, at least **1,122,817 souls have accepted Christ** through BBFI missionaries, and more than **21,000 churches outside the United States are actively participating in the Great Commission.**

Our mission has been advancing for 75 years. The missionaries we train, approve, and send have been faithfully serving in their respective fields, diligently winning souls, baptizing believers, building churches, and training national leaders. They are effectively accomplishing what we sent them to do. Often this service comes with unforeseen circumstances, situations and challenges that they are unable to navigate alone.

The **Missionary Care Offering** serves as a vital resource to address many of these needs, some of which we might not even be aware of, or financially able to handle as individual churches. Thanks to your past generous participation, missionaries have received security training, assistance with family issues, counseling, emergency-related travel funds, and more. In 2024 alone, the Mission Office was able to minister at ten missionary funerals, assist in two medical evacuations and maintain the relationship with Fort Sherman Academy for security training support. An understanding of a biblical missionary mindset may prevent or clear up many confusions about Scripture, godly music, and a host of other issues often argued from a somewhat worldly standpoint.

When a God called and dedicated missionary is sent out of a New Testament church, he finds many different situations, often unprepared. Yet, if he allows the Holy Spirit to guide him, he will find solace in the simplicity of the Great Commission (Matthew 28:18-20). He will not find it easy. He cannot expect everyone to understand his way. But, for him, the command is simple, energizing, and glorious!

On the mission field, his main objective is to carry the Gospel, but he quickly realizes that carrying and giving is pointless without the receiving. He may find a man that has no water, and he will give him water and help him with a source of water. If he finds a hungry man, he will first satisfy that need and so on. If he is called to a people group that does not have a written language, he will want to talk about the Lord Jesus Christ verbally. To do that, he will need to learn the language and the culture. He will live his relationship with Christ while he learns but he will learn because he cannot teach before he learns and his commission is, "Go ye therefore and teach all nations." With a good grasp of the language and culture, he will work to develop a written form of their language. He will also evaluate the language and culture in light of Scripture. His intent is not to change the culture, but all cultures contain unbiblical practices, music, and language.

The missionary will begin as soon as possible to translate the scriptures into their language. (He will evaluate the Scriptures they have, if available.) He may, for their sake, one day teach them English, but this is not his calling.

They need a copy of the Word of God so they can see it and meditate on it in their own home. The missionary may desire to translate the scriptures so that even the functionally illiterate can read it. Yet, his calling is to teach them, not to lower the Word of God to their level. They need "all the counsel of God" (Acts 20:27). So the missionary will bring the Word of God to them and teach them – bringing them up to the Word of God.

The missionary will bring the Gospel simply at first, explaining to them what Christ has done for him personally. This is only the first step as he must, "teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I [Christ] have commanded you." A copy of the word of God is essential for the new believer but he is not to be left alone with it whether he understands it or not. The missionary knows his calling is to teach the Word of God. Therefore, he will translate faithfully to the best of his ability and teach while he is translating. Eventually, the new Christian will be able to read the Word of God for himself and carry it to his own disciples as he continues to be discipled.

In our technically advanced world, we might say there is little need for a missionary. After all, we have electronic translators, proofreaders, etc. that can do the job more quickly and cost effectively. However, it is a disobedient people that will not go, will not teach, will not observe all things commanded. The missionary must go, and Christ will go with him. We must choose God's way over the world's way. If God has placed a desire to go in your heart, talk to your pastor then give us a call. We would love to help you!

**The Sin of Silence

Many of our parents taught us some really great lessons about controlling our tongues. For instance, "if you have nothing nice to say don't say anything," or "think before you speak." Using our words to say hurtful things to others or about others is definitely a sin we for which we should be watchful. This is why I believe the Bible warned us about the tongue in over 120 Scriptures, and taught us about the power of the tongue. "Death and life are in the power of the tongue: and they

that love it shall eat the fruit thereof" (Prov. 18:21). For the most part, we do a good job of being silent and refraining from speaking. However, being silent also can be sinful and hurtful. Psalms 39:2 states, "I was dumb with silence, I held my peace, even from good; and my sorrow was stirred." I'm sure over the course of your life you can remember when you know you should have spoken up, and you didn't. You may also remember when someone should have spoken to you, and they didn't.

Tomorrow's leaders must be taught principles of living and leading as children of light. The truth brings them in, and edifying keeps them. Remember, you can only stay ahead of them if you are growing. Yet never be afraid of them teaching you – if you listen you may learn something today! This is not a decision we have come to lightly, but one that has become necessary due to ongoing health concerns. Ernie has recently been diagnosed with Alzheimer's and is now in a Nursing Home Memory Care Unit. He has been struggling with a gradual memory loss, but things took a **drastic change on June 14th**, and he was admitted to the hospital. He was treated for 5 days and released for home care by me, Monoka. I soon realized he was so weak that he could not help with his transfers or care. So he is now placed into a full-time care facility under the compassionate care of Hospice. Only God knows the time and day he will leave for his Heavenly home. Through all of this, his unwavering desire has remained the same — to be found a faithful servant of God. When others might have quit, He did not. Through all his heart surgeries he just kept on serving! I Cor. 4:2 "Moreover it is required in stewards, that a man be found faithful". This was and is Ernie!

We are so blessed to have been a part of your "Mission Family" and are so grateful for "your part" in this ministry. The fruit of this long journey is shared with you, as you have played a vital role in the work the Lord has accomplished through our ministry. 

Dear Prayer Partners:

It's always a blessing to be able to share with you good reports from the field of Mexico; and we have been getting just that from El Camino Baptist and her ministries, as well as from the graduates of the Bible Institute.

In my last letter I mentioned that the church in Zamora, Michoacán had celebrated their 9th anniversary. They have a mission in another area; they had a special service there in April, with 270 attending and 60 professions of faith.

This year marks 30 years that the institute has been training and preparing workers for the Lord's harvest. There will be 5 graduates this month. There are now graduates serving in three countries, Mexico, USA, and Ecuador. What a blessing that institute has been and continues to be; please keep it in your prayers, as it produces soul-winning workers, church planters for Christ.

El Camino Baptist Church celebrated its 22nd anniversary, with 830 attending the morning service; there were 25 first time visitors, and souls accepting Christ. In 2024, the church baptized 136, and had 917 first time visitors. The expansion project continues, with the steel structure part nearing completion. This addition will allow additional seating for approximately 250. Thank the Lord that they are needing that additional space.

I lost my older brother Alton, on May 13th, just a few days before his 89th birthday. He had retired as an aeronautical engineer, and was living in Hiawasse, Ga. Please pray for his dear widow, Irena.

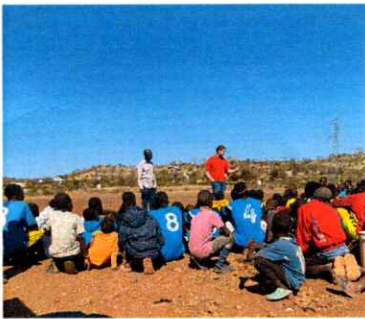


Missionaries to Zambia, Africa 📍

Dear Pastor & Friends,

This year seems to be flying by! As we enter into the month of August we are grateful to have watched everything God has done over the past five months here in Zambia. We have been able to make new friends and get to know different people in the city of Livingstone. God has continued to show us His goodness as many of the people we have been able to build a relationship with live in the part of town in which we are praying about starting a Bible study. Please continue to pray for us and the people that we are reaching!



In June we helped a national pastor host a soccer tournament next to his church building. Halfway through the tournament I preached a short Gospel message and taught the people in attendance about who Jesus is, how they can know Him as their personal Saviour, and about eternal security. We had a good number of people claim to accept Christ as their Saviour that day. Please pray for these who did and those who heard the Gospel, but still need to accept Christ.

I would like to conclude this letter by asking you to be in prayer for a few different things. The biggest prayer request that we currently have is the approval of our work permit. It has sat stagnant for a long time without making any progress. We received word this past week that they might be working on our paperwork now. They are flying to Zambia this week to visit us and will get to spend a few weeks here. Please pray for safe travels and for them as they experience a new culture.

Dear Prayer Partners,

June 30, 2025

Greetings from Brazil. May was not only a busy month but one of new ministerial experiences. The month of May is Family Month in Brazil and so emphasis was placed on the family in all the preaching. However, on Mother's Day, Atalias and I had a unique experience. We were already half way home after the evening service when we got called to return to Vargem Grande for an emergency. One of our members was in a panic about a relative who was demonstrating extreme signs of being demon oppressed. We found that to be the case along with it being a battle to get this individual to pray in as much as she had been constantly hearing voices awakening her during the night telling her to do things robbing her of much needed sleep. I will admit she was a mess. We kept telling her she needed to pray, and she kept saying "I can't do it". We finally forced her to repeat a prayer I led her in. Finally, with the help of the Holy Spirit, she was able to repeat the prayer, but it was a struggle. After about 15 minutes of prayer, we could start to see the results, and that night was the first one in a long time that she was able to sleep through the night. We know that this battle is just beginning but we are trying to stay on top of things. The family told me that they noticed a big difference in this individual during the following week, but we feel there is still a long battle ahead. Whoever says that demon oppression of a Christian is a farce, don't know what they are talking about. It is very real and still prevalent in many places in the world. Just recently this individual was present for a Sunday evening service and what a difference. No more voices, a peace that had been absent was now present and a greatly improved appearance. You would surmise that she was a totally different person. Please pray that she will continue to return to our services.

In June we saw an increase in new visitors at the church. Irmão Enrique came because he was disgusted about the way that the church he had been attending was doctrinally going astray placing more emphasis on doctrines of man than the doctrines of GOD found in the Bible. He was commenting about why can't churches just follow what the Bible teaches to a friend at a work establishment where one of our ladies was employed. She spoke up to say, that's what my pastor teaches at our church. He inquired as to what church she attended. Well the following Sunday evening he attended our services and has been faithful ever since. A few weeks later he even brought a friend who had been complaining about the changes doctrinally that had been taking place at his church along with Sunday morning services being completely cancelled and done away with. Now Irmão Claudio is starting to attend our services. Irmão Enrique's wife is also starting to come but she needs a little time yet. Although she too has been noticing the changes at her church which upsets her, their children and their families are members there and thus the conflict. We are praying for her and Giving GOD time to do a work in her heart because she has expressed how much she likes our church family. We ended the month of June in Jd. Varginha with a Missions Conference which was a blessing.

We would ask that you would please continue to pray for irmão Gabriel. Due to the hostility towards believers by his boss, irmão Gabriel was let go and is now driving a UBER vehicle to try to make ends meet. He worked in the field of technology. Please pray that he can find another job in this area so as to be able to better provide for his family.

Lastly we would ask that you pray for God to send more laborers into His field. There are many Brazilian churches currently in need of a pastor and have been without a pastor for over a year. We are also asking GOD in particular for a Brazilian couple with a calling to the ministry to not only help us in the work in Vargem Grande but also with the hope of one day becoming its new pastor. Their presence will also allow us to come home for a long overdue furlough to report to our supporting churches. We know that GOD has a purpose in us delaying our furlough so in the mean time we will remain faithful to do the work to which He has called us.

Once again, as always, thank you for your faithfulness in supporting us financially and/or prayerfully through the years. The churches in Jardim Varginha and Vargem Grande are here today because you prayed and invested in God's work. Please continue to pray with us that we will see an even greater Harvest of souls for the honor and glory of our Lord Jesus Christ in 2025.

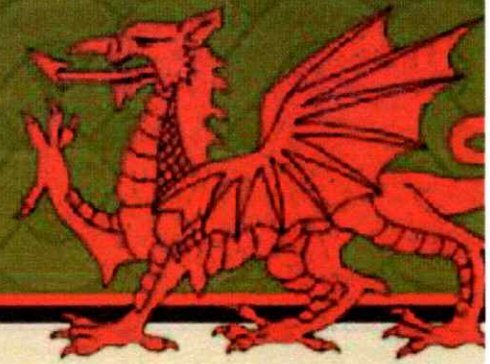

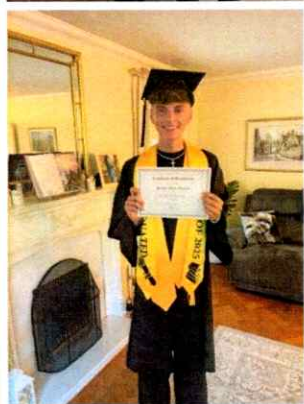

Greetings in the name above every name, the name of Jesus! As I type this newsletter I am in the middle of a revival in Louisville, Kentucky. We are experiencing a move of God and it is very exciting. I will tell you all about it in our next newsletter.

Let me say upfront, I sincerely appreciate you and I'm so grateful for all that you do to help us. Our needs are great at this time. Please continue to pray for this ministry and for Connie and I in particular as we travel across this great land. One of our biggest needs is for regular monthly support.

The last Sunday of April, we were in Chillicothe, Ohio at Lighthouse Baptist Church. We have been with Pastor Ryan Bevan on several occasions. **We saw twenty-two people come for salvation!** There were a number of other important decisions as well. Pastor Ryan has a brother that pastors in Xenia, Ohio, and we will be with him this coming month. His church is also named Lighthouse Baptist Church. Two great churches pastored by two great brothers! Both churches support Tim Lee Ministries from their mission budget. We are very grateful for both pastors and both churches!

Our church hosted a special Q&A evening where Tarl, Justin, and Jonathan answered pressing questions from the Bible. On another night, Tarl taught on church-wide evangelism and gospel outreach as we continually emphasize sharing Christ with our community in everything we do.

We were blessed to travel to Ireland in May to help kick off the missions month for our friends and fellow missionaries Josh and Denise Steward at their church. We had a wonderful time of fellowship and ministry as we witnessed all that God is doing in Ireland. Please pray for God's hand upon this work.

As the cost of living in Greater London continues to climb, we're always seeking to establish new financial partnerships. We've never had 100% support, and we lose about 2% to 3% support a year (mostly due to pastoral change). To simply maintain our missions support, we must continually partner with new churches or ask existing partners to raise their support. Please pray that we can retain and grow our support levels.

"If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land." 2 Chronicles 7:14

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We Brits always start our conversations talking about the weather as we usually are so wet and windy and now both Britain and Europe are enduring record heat waves.

Found Cynthia praying with many in her hospital ward who welcomed her encouragement and gratefully received our customized New Testaments. Cynthia's Ward nurse hails from Zimbabwe and was so happy to have someone speak her native African tongue and treated Cynthia as she would her own Mother.

With all these detractors of late it has been so heartening to see Grace and Kornelia throw themselves into working with our ever increasing Children's Sunday school. Better still is to see their own personal growth as a result of lesson preparations. The Lord is rewarding their diligence and our children love them.
