Dear church and friends,

We have BIG news to share: We have finally started construction of the new building for the North Mérida Baptist Church! We applied for building permits in February, 2023. After more than two and a half frustrating years of going back and forth with the local government, doing study after study, making changes to blueprints, haggling over roads and protected trees, etc., we finally have all the permits we need to start building! The permits are only good for a certain amount of time before they expire, so we got to work as soon as we had the papers in hand.

We officially broke ground on July 26th. We have already cleared the land and are in the process of digging into the rock to lay the foundation. Even though we are just getting started on the building, we have already harvested our first fruits from the new property. Two of the engineers supervising the project are faithful church members. Every morning, they start the work day with devotions and prayer. They have already won one of the workers to the Lord. This Sunday, the worker came to

church for the first time and brought his wife!

We need your help to complete this project. This is by far the biggest financial challenge we have ever faced in our ministry. We recognize that this task is well beyond our means or ability to achieve in our own power with our own resources, but we are moving forward in faith, trusting that the Lord will provide all the funds we will need to finish. We have been saving money, our church members have been giving sacrificially, and several of you have already given towards this project. Thank you! We have about 30% of the funds we need to finish the building. We are already using that money to get started. We need to raise the rest of the funds quickly so we can finish building before the permits expire. We will need your help to make it to the finish line.

My parents, Larry and Tammy Allred (also BBFI missionaries), are travelling in the U.S. right now. We are carrying on the work here while they visit their supporting churches and raise funds for the building project. Here are three ways you can help us

get this building project done:

1) Please pray for the work. Pray for the Lord to provide all the funds needed to complete the project. Pray for the safety of the workers and for more of them to get saved. Pray for the Lord to protect us from opposition and from anyone who might try to hinder the work. Pray for the completion of the project.

2) If you would like to give towards this project, please send any contributions to the BBFI Mission Office the same way you send your support. In the memo

line, specify that your contribution is for the new building project.

3) If you would like my parents to visit your church while they are travelling and share the project with you in person, they would be happy to add you to their schedule. Please let us know if you would be interested in having them.

We are blessed to have you as partners in ministry. Asking for money is always humbling, but we bring this need to you confidently because we know we are serving together for the common cause of the Gospel. Thank you for working alongside us over the years. We greatly appreciate anything you can do to help us reach our goal and complete this project! May the Lord continue to bless you as we strive together for His Kingdom's sake!

Camp Ministry - A Summer of Decisions

This year we had three incredible weeks of camp, and God worked in so many hearts!



•Kids Camp (Week 1): We welcomed 25 children and rejoiced as 3 of them trusted Christ as Savior. Our theme was Wild, focusing on animals in the wild and how God's love is "wild" for us—boundless, deep, and full of wonder.

 Teen Camp (Week 2): Once again, we reached capacity with about 60 teens. God blessed us with 4 salvations and 2 young people who surrendered their lives to full-time ministry. Praise the Lord for young lives being called into His service!





•Young Adult Camp/Retreat (Week 3): For the very first time in Belgium, we held a retreat specifically for young adults. We had 24 participants and spent time studying the book of Ruth together. It was such a sweet time of growth and fellowship.

We were especially blessed to have **Corre Meyers** as our speaker for both the teen and young adult weeks. I am so grateful that God has provided faithful friends in ministry to partner with us in this important work.

Rixensart en Fête - Community Outreach

Every year, our city hosts Rixensart en fête, a huge community festival designed to showcase local organizations and opportunities. This year, our church had the privilege of hosting a **triple booth**—and it opened amazing doors!

• One section focused on connecting with teens, offering games and conversations tailored to their interests.





- Another area was set aside for prayer and spiritual conversations, where people could stop by, pray with us, and even request follow-up visits.
- •The final section provided general church information, highlighting our programs, events, and ministries, while

also sharing the Gospel in simple ways. We gave out tracts, pens, and—believe it or not—over 20 pounds of popcorn!



Through these efforts, we were able to interact with thousands of people in our community, planting seeds of truth and showing Christ's love in practical ways.

Dear Friends at Pleasantview Baptist Church,

July and August were very busy months at *Bearing Precious Seed*. As we have received many requests for Scripture, we are trying to supply as much as we possibly can. Through August of this year, we have printed **9,806,494** copies of the Word of God. Of that number, **2,891,100 were printed in the last two months.** Another 1.5 million Scriptures are scheduled to be printed during September. Praise the Lord for His continued provision and for the ongoing distribution of Scripture around the world. Thank you for your involvement in this ministry.

The **replacement press** for printing covers should be installed in the next six weeks. It will be a tremendous blessing and a much-needed replacement for our current press which is on its last days! God, through his people, has already supplied the funds for this press, and we are very thankful for that!

Pray for **laborers** here at *BPS*. We will be losing two men at the end of the year. Andrew Barbosa will begin deputation to go as a missionary to the Philippines. We anticipate seeing what God will do with him as he goes to minister there. Another employee, Jeff Lerner, is moving to Colombia, South America, to pursue what God has for him going forward. As we seek to replace these faithful men, we desire those who want to be in ministry. This is so much more than just a job, and we need those who understand the importance of getting God's Word around the world as well as those who hold fast the principle of the local church's responsibility in being the custodians of His Word.

God has provided over 40 truckloads of paper so far this year! Paper is our greatest need here in the shop, and we ask that you continue to **pray for God's provision of paper**. We also ask that you pray for safety in the print shop, efficiency as we print, and protection of God's Word as it is shipped all around the world. Right now, there is a **container being held** in a port in India. Please pray the container gets released very soon; each day the container is held, the port charges additional fees for storage.

Thank you for your continued partnership with us as we strive to get more of God's Word around the world. It is all for God's glory and to accomplish His purpose.







The Guenther's Missionaries in New Zealand

Back in Colombia

We returned to Colombia from the United States in March, and immediately jumped back into ministry. God has also granted us a 2-year visa to stay in Colombia. That hasn't happened for over 5 years, so we are so thankful to God and to everyone who has been faithfully praying for that.

Bible Studies Continue

We were worried that having to leave Colombia for a couple months would mean our Bible studies might not go back to normal after we returned, but God is very good. Both of the Bible studies we had going before our trip have gone back to normal. In fact, one of the ladies who attends the Wednesday night study suggested we start up a kids program in her apartment. We were so happy about that idea!

So, now we have the adult Bible study in one apartment, and in the apartment right next door we have the kids Bible study happening at the same time. While we were worried about losing people in our absence, God was expanding the ministry!



Additionally, we've started up a new group on Thursday nights. That group, while very similar to what we've been doing, is actually a ministry of our previous church plant. We've mentioned some "leadership problems" in that church, and this Thursday night group was not only an important step that the church needed to take in order to grow, but it has also allowed the church members to continue reaching new people with the gospel without exposing them to the church's problems.

Trouble at Church

We've been trying to deal patiently with the issues at our previous church plant for 9 months now, and it seems like we might be at the end of this process.

The problem the church has been dealing with has been a lack of leadership on the part of the pastor, and an overabundance of leadership on the part of the pastor's wife. The pastor did not accept the correction we offered. He started to treat the members of the church board with hostility, and refused to meet with them even just talk about the problems.

The problems were obvious to those who have been in the church for many years, but not well accepted or understood by those who were new to the church. In addition to that, many of the people who recognized these problems had already left the church because of them. That made for a difficult and awkward situation when it came to bringing the problem before the church.

The pastor had also not practiced church discipline since taking over the church years ago, so the people didn't have a good understanding of the church's responsibility to confront sin within the church. Because of those factors, the church has lost several people over the past few months. We've lost people because of the problems, we've lost people because we attended to the problems, and we've lost people who recognize the problems, but think we've to the problems in the wrong way.

The pastor is now no longer with the church, but we can't abandon the church. That means that right now, in addition to starting a new church, we are also basically restarting our previous church plant. After all the conflict we've seen lately, we're tired, we need help, and we need your prayers. Please pray for the church and for our family.

2026 Furlough

We need to raise some new support, so we plan to be back in the United States in the fall of 2026. Let us know if you need a visit from us at that time. We need to visit new churches to increase our support, but we also know our current supporters want to hear from us as well.

Dear Prayer Partners and Co-Laborers,

I have been in the same type of work for over 30 years. I praise God that he has given me the talent, abilities and opportunities to advance in my career. Beginning in February of 2025, we have added deputation to the workload. I want to have a good testimony at my job because God teaches us that "whatsoever ye do, do it heartily, as to the Lord, and not unto men;". So, as I approach my tasks each day, I should give the attention and work ethic that would be pleasing to God and that would show forth a good testimony. I should work heartily as to the Lord in obedience to His command. There will always be others who watch what we do even in our everyday lives. If I am doing what pleases God, others may notice. When they notice, it is my prayer that they would see that my joy, and everything comes from God.

Matthew 5:48 says Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father which is in Heaven, is perfect. That is a process which begins at salvation and continues throughout our lives. For now, the assignment is to gather the support needed in order to be able to get there and to do the work. We love hearing updates from Huachichil and the surrounding areas such as a new water well for the village and upcoming VBS events in the area. We are excited to meet with more churches in the coming months and to present the ministry and our burden for Mexico. It is our privilege and honor to be the "Go" part of the Great Commission on behalf of those who will partner with us.

I've heard a young man's catch phrase that I like because it points others to Jesus, "He died for us, so live for Him." I think we would do well to follow that in our daily lives, at work, and in service to the Lord. In everything, point others to Christ. In this way, we give direction to the lost and encourage and edify other believers.



All roads lead to Glen Rose for the Dedication of the Scroll Display on Saturday, October 4th.!!! The excitement is not limited to our supporters, friends, and staff that we would expect to be enthusiastic about this project. This amazing event has attracted attention from Israel to Fiji. We received a visit from the local Glen Rose Leadership Group, a committee of business leaders from our community. They were ecstatic about the event and the fact that this world-class treasure would be housed and displayed at CEM!

The first photo shows them gathered around the 500-year-old Torah Scroll with broad smiles. The second photo shows them at our 3D-printed Temple Complex with smiles still radiating. Many in this business group committed to be present for our October 4th Dedication Event. The 3-foot-tall Temple Model is now being printed and colorized by our staff. When it is placed in this Temple Complex, the complete model will be awe-inspiring.

Simultaneous with this display, Dr. Ron Pew is 3D-printing a scale replica of the Tower of the Flock site where Jesus was born. This aw esome display will be placed near the Micah Scroll in fulfillment of Micah 4:8.

We want as many of you - our supporters - to also be present for this event to experience the reward of your faithful commitment!

Our engineers and biologists are working hard to get the Biosphere pressurized by the date of the Scroll Dedication. This Biosphere project has preoccupied over forty-five years of research and dedication for the glory of our Creator - and for the benefit of the global community. This is central in our scientific efforts.

On Saturday, September 6th, I will be giving a special lecture - "Discover the Scriptures: The Jewish People." This will be an appropriate lead-in for the Dedication Event the following month.

Remember, all roads lead to Glen Rose on Saturday, October 4th, and we hope you will be one of them headed our way!!!

Our church held its annual summer Family Film Night and BBQ outreaches with free food and games across two Sundays. Each evening we had over 160 people come through our doors. Every visitor heard a clear gospel presentation along with a further invite to our church before we showed a family friendly film. Please pray for ongoing fruit from these events.

Tarl had the opportunity to host Graceway Baptist Church from Springfield, MO. This missions team did an amazing job helping our church with our high street evangelism as well as participating in our youth club and our summer outreaches. While we've never had 100% support, and unfortunately lose 2% to 3% support a year (mostly due to pastoral change),

we must continually try to partner with new churches or ask existing partners to raise their contributions to simply maintain our ministry finances. This continues to be vital, especially as the cost of living in Greater London soars. Thank you to all the churches and individuals who have recently raised



Faint Not!

For many years now, I have included Galatians 6:9 at the bottom of my emails and other correspondence. What an amazing verse!

"And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not."

In this verse, we see both a direction and a promise. First, the direction. It's been a long day. You've spent days passing out Gospel tracts, but it seems like nothing is happening. You finally have an opportunity to eat a good meal or enjoy a snack—and then it happens. The phone rings, and you are off to help someone in your congregation. After that incredibly long day, just as you begin to settle in for the night, you hear the small, quiet voice coming from the bedroom of your sick or frightened child.

Why do we get up and respond to the sound of need? Well, it's because of the promise. Our responsibility is turned into the joy of seeing the outcome: the helped family, the comforted child, or the interested individual. As Christians—especially as missionaries—we soon learn that what God has called us to is hard, but amazingly worth it! We get to see God working in the hearts of people.

Let's break this verse down a little further by looking at what comes before it in Galatians 6. Verse 1 talks about restoring someone overtaken in a fault. Verse 2 speaks of bearing one another's burdens. Verse 3 reminds us not to think more highly of ourselves than we should. Verses 4 and 5 instruct us to examine our own work—in other words, to check ourselves before focusing on others. Verse 6 directs us to live out and share what we have been taught by those who instruct us in the Word. Verses 7 and 8 warn us to be very careful about what we do—or "sow"—in our Christian walk. Truly, we will reap what we sow.

All these verses point to the fact that we can't do these things in our own strength. We need God working on us and in us—to: help us not be weary, keep going, and finish what He has begun in us.

"Sometimes I When someone asks prayer for think we spend more requests, do unspoken sometimes wonder what they are? time praying people out Sometimes, my curious side comes of heaven than we do up and I wonder. Yet, I believe those praying people out unspoken requests are the nearest and deepest requests in our heart. Dear Brethren.

Thank you for your faithful prayers and support. A lot has happened over the last two months. I witnessed to one of our neighbors Ariel while Abishai and I were sitting at a gas station close to us. Pray for him and everyone who heard me witnessing to him. I asked for prayer about getting tracts out at the expo. Praise God 1,800 tracts were passed out at the expo this year. Pray for everyone who received a gospel tract.

There were many things that happened to us leading up to the expo and during the expo. First of all during the first week of June I was hospitalized. I woke up with slurred speech, extreme pain in my head, and difficulty walking. After a lot of tests on my heart, head, neck and spine we found out that I have a bulging disk close to my spinal cord and a nerve that is pinched between discs C5 and C6. I saw a neurosurgeon and thank God it is not serious enough to need surgery but it does at times cause's tremendous pain and I have been given medicine to help control it. Pray that this issue can heal naturally. Even with having this by God's grace and taking pain meds I was able to mark 1,800 tracts and go out almost every evening during the expo. Some other things that happened are, as I was walking home after passing out tracts I slipped and fell hurting my right knee and the right side of my hip. Three people also thanked me, addressing me as "Father" thinking I was a priest. I gave tracts not only to those going and coming but military personnel, police and the paramilitary Lince group. One of them took me aside and questioned what I was doing, and how much I was selling the tracts for. I have never been pulled aside and questioned by paramilitary before. So, I kindly explained that I was giving out the gospel of the Lord Jesus Christ and that the tracts are free. On the last Friday of the expo after we left and getting out tracts inside, April and Manna went to look at a cosmetic store and on the way there Manna was hit by a car. It was at a crosswalk that is a very busy one and April checked to make sure it was safe when the light was red but someone just went through. April said that she heard a THUD and turned to see our daughter lying on the road. Thank God she survived with bumps and bruises. She went to the ER and had a cat scan done on her neck and it showed no injuries, just inflammation. Recently her face has been swelling and she has been complaining about pain in the back of her head. April took her to the doctor yesterday and the doctor said that Manna has a hematoma and a concussion. Pray for her to fully recover. Never in the time we have been here has giving out tracts at the expo been so eventful.

We appreciate all of your prayers for us. Please pray for souls to be saved, and more opportunities to witness to people. I have another 1,400 tracts marked and ready to go. Pray for our situation with our van. We found out that there were other issues besides the main repairs that needed attention along with electrical wire issues. Pray that God will keep providing what we need and that we can get the van back before Christmas. Keep my family and I in prayer for safety as we walk to go shopping and walk our youngest daughter Lydia to and from school. As many of you know we started a church in Grants, NM about six years ago working primarily with Native Americans. A old retired pastor's church had gone down to zero members and he was considering selling the property. The Lord put me in contact with him, and he graciously allowed us to use his building, gym, and property free of charge to start a new church. The Lord blessed and before long we were averaging between 20-25 people and had special meetings and teen meetings averaging 25-35 with a high of 78. We held Vacation Bible Schools every year averaging 50 with a high of over 80 children. Many folks esp children and teens were saved and many baptized. A special thanks to the two churches that helped us with VBS over the years Central Park Baptist Church of Carrolton, Texas and Southside Baptist Church of Trussville, Alabama.

As the church grew, the Lord impressed on our hearts that it was time to turn the church over to a pastor. We have always felt called to start ministries, help them grow, and then find the right leader rather than remain. The Lord led us to merge the church with Mt. Taylor Baptist Church, which had been meeting in a storefront and praying for a permanent building for over 20 years. The merger was successful, and we are grateful that the property will continue to be used for God's work and that the ministry we started will continue to move forward. We worked our way out of a job. Started the church, got it going and handed it over to a pastor.

As the Lord has guided us through the years, we feel He is leading us into a "Helps" ministry. With decades of experience, we are now in a position to assist new, struggling, and smaller churches in many ways such as evangelism, preaching, teaching, music, providing Bibles, and encouragement—with a special emphasis on youth ministry. We believe reaching children and teens is vital for the growth of the church. Young people are especially open to the Gospel, and they are the future of the the church. We ask for your prayers as we follow God's direction in this ministry. As David said in 1 Samuel 17:29, "What have I now done? Is there not a cause?"

God has blessed us tremendously ever since I answered His call to missions in 1981 at Grace Baptist Church in Jacksonville, North Carolina, while serving in the Marine Corp. We have mutually agreed to part ways with World Baptist Fellowship, our mission board. This is an amicable decision—we love them, wish them the very best, and know they feel the

same toward us. You should be receiving a letter from them soon. They will continue to process funds for us until November 18.

I have always said—and still believe—that we have the best supporting and praying churches on the planet! We also understand that some churches have new pastors who do not know us personally, and that some churches support a particular field rather than individual missionaries.

I was extremely encouraged after the service. I noticed two of our ladies talking with a young single girl who had come back to visit the church for a second time. She had questions about baptism, because what she heard during the baptism of the Yohani and Sari didn't correspond with what she had learned in her church. Grace didn't make sense to her. You see, it is rare that a Dominican becomes a Christian the first time they hear the Gospel. What they have learned in church and in school their entire life is that you have to be a good person, and get saved every day. Hopefully, at the end your good works will be enough to get you across the line. So every moment like this one, where we get to unpack and explain the Gospel brings a person that much closer to salvation. And its exciting to see our people taking advantage of the opportunities God gives them to minister to others.

Last month, I asked you to pray for our Solar Panel project. Obviously, our goal is to make disciples and establish self-sustaining churches. By eliminating electric costs in the future, we can put a few more pesos into the church budget each month for a future pastor. The large majority of pastors in the DR work a full time job and pastor when they can. That is one of the many obstacles to the Gospel in our country. 

Although they were recognized by the government they are restricted to win Malay Muslims for the Lord. Noticeably. there were no Malay Muslims who are members of these two churches. Mostly are Chinese and other Asian ethnicities like Indian. There were nine professions of faith




neighbor at a funeral service while I witnessed to my former college instructor, Atty. Noel who has just been re-elected as a city councilor in Olongapo City.



Songwriter Gene Bartlett got it right when he likened the connection of the Living Word of God to the very soul being set "afire." "Set my soul afire, Lord, for thy holy Word. Burn it deep within me; let thy voice be heard." God's Word brings regeneration to the sinner, sparks repentance in the strayed, and kindles revival in the Saint. Not only does the beloved hymn acknowledge the life-changing effects of Scripture in our lives, but also the prayer of a Believer to have a burning desire to see the lost saved. "Set my soul afire, Lord, for the lost in sin." May we have that kind of burden! While the lyrics are all beautiful, "Millions grope in darkness, waiting for God's Word," is unfortunately inaccurate. With half the world never hearing a clear presentation of the Gospel and almost seventy percent of the world without a Bible, the correct lyric would be. "BILLIONS grope in darkness, waiting for thy Word." Here at BLMF, we are grateful to see the flames of God's Word spread one container at a time! A very special shipment of 23,000 French Bibles just left the Bible Barn today headed to Togo, West Africa. Missionary Ed Stanley has had a burden for this area for many years due to their unavailability of French Scriptures. Four million people – almost half of Togo's population – read French. This will be the first 40,000-pound container of French Bibles ever sent to these precious people in need! What a tremendous impact! Even the right to print this French translation is a miraculous answer to prayers prayed for years! In April, missionaries were able to dig a well in the Togo area that will be receiving the container. Since then, people have been meeting at the well to hold church services, where 128 souls have been saved! They are so very excited about the Scriptures now en route to them! May the Lord send an abundant harvest of souls saved from this container! Thank YOU for being part of the Lord's work around the world! It is the faithful support and love offerings given by caring local Churches that set the world aflame with the printed Scriptures! Let's ask the Lord to burn within us an even stronger vision to reach the world with the Word so we may "FIRE up the presses!" -Dr. Shannon Lemmon, Director

AMAZING ANNOUNCEMENT!!!

The Christian Heritage Foundation has now GIFTED THIS EXTREMELY RARE COMPLETE SET OF OLD TESTAMENT HEBREW SCROLLS TO THE CREATION EVIDENCE MUSEUM! We are overwhelmed and heartfully indebted to Maryanne Mize, the Christian Heritage Foundation Owner, and Charles Garrett, the entity's President, for carrying out the wishes of Walter Mize, the entity's Founder, to see that Israel continues to be blessed with the ongoing display of these priceless scrolls for public viewing. Our gratitude will be shown by displaying these treasures in the most effective way possible.

Retired career professional with 26 years of service in US Space Command, Air Combat Command, The Air Force Institute of Technology, The White House Communications Agency, and Naval Research Labs CHF Messianic Jewish Associate Ted Vanlandeghem was emotionally moved by the simultaneous convergence of the delivery of the Hebrew Scrolls to CEM and the Shiloh Tabernacle sacrificial bones we are DNA-sequencing in our Lab. He wrote, "What a powerful moment that was to carry into the Museum the Ancient Treasury of God's Word and then hold in my hands the bone of this ancient sacrifice that Eli and Samuel would have likely gazed upon. This bone is a powerful prophetic picture of Yeshua / Jesus... the final sacrificial Lamb who takes away the sin of the world."

In their public presentations CHF President Charles Garrett appropriately explains the Hebrew "kanaf" ("wing, corner, or hem" referred to in Malachi 4:2): "But unto you that fear my name shall the Sun of righteousness arise with healing in his wings" as a prophesy of the coming Messiah. He then demonstrates the Jewish "Tallit" garment as having "wing hems" that could be touched by the woman with an issue of blood in Matthew 9:20. This seeking Jewish woman recognized that her Hebrew Scriptures were fulfilled by Jesus of Nazareth.



With these pointers from CHF in mind, here is our plan for public display of these priceless Scroll Treasures to bless Jews and Gentiles alike:

- 1. The two-inch thick LED-lighted acrylic support foundation will run around the entire parameter of the museum's second level banisters, and will match the supports under the Ark model. An additional heavy acrylic structure will form a representation of the twelve foundations of the New Jerusalem with the names of the twelve Apostles, with Gates of Pearl including the names of the Twelve Tribes of Israel. LED lighting will match the colors of the stones listed on the High Priest's Breastplate and in the New Jerusalem.
- 2. Above the foundations will rest the LED-lighted base for the Scrolls. The Scrolls will be encased in UV-filtered acrylic cases for long-term protection.
- 3. Near the center of the open Scroll arrangement will be placed a large replica of the Breastplate worn by the High Priest. The names of the Twelve Tribes and their representative stones will be embedded in the LED-lighted Breastplate.
- 4. At appropriate passages in the open Scrolls will appear displays of prophecies relating to the promised Messiah's first coming.
- 5. Adjacent to each Scroll will be placed a New Testament Bible with passage notations showing where Jesus Christ fulfilled all these prophecies. Electronic software will also be installed to permit scholars and lay-people to read all the passages in Hebrew, Greek, and English.
- 6. At the appropriate position in the foundation will be a large acrylic LED-lighted Cornerstone embedded with "Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and today, and for ever." (Hebrews 13:8) and "...a Priest forever after the order of Melchizedek" (Psalm 110:4).

We have scheduled a *Special Dedication Event for Saturday, October 4, 2025* the week of Yom Kippur, the Jewish Day of Atonement. Present on that day will be Jewish archaeologist Eli Shukrun who discovered the Pool of Siloam, the Altar of Melchizedek, and the Golden Bell from the hem of the High Priest's garment in Jerusalem. Archaeologist Scott Stripling will describe sacrificial bones discovered at Shiloh in Israel. Present from Fiji - the uttermost distance from Jerusalem on earth - will be special guests. Special guest speaker will be Messianic Jewish Pastor Mark Robinson. His message will be "Jesus and Yom Kippur - the Day of Atonement." Maryanne Mize, Charles Garrett, and Ted Vanlandeghem will give testimonies. Pastor Jim Scudder will offer the Dedicatory Prayer. A special guest vocalist will sing "The Holy City", "I Bowed On My Knees and Cried Holy", and "My Heart Will Thrill." And, a concert Violinist will close with "The Hallelujah Chorus"!

We need your presence to make this a day of Glorious Victory in the Messiah! Every person attending will receive a Commemorative Half-Shekel coin!

We traveled to Budapest with them and had a nice time even while sick. The kids soaked up every minute of their visit. Reese really missed family and this was just what she and we needed. Wes and Sergej also started a "Fifa club" with the young men in the











Spring 2025 We had our Easter clubs and some of Rebekah's friends attended. We continued working hard with language learning. We visited Roma families and just got to know our community. We celebrated Beau's 1st Birthday in March! Wes started a pickleball club with the Roma men it is currently going well!



Summer 2025 This summer we had a team from Switzerland and two from America. We went on a mission trip to Sisak which is about 1.5hrs away. We stayed there one week and did VBS-style ministries in two Roma villages with one of the teams from America that came. We had a blast at "Camp Sisak" which is what we called it for our kids. This trip was truly special; we were able to minister to kids who have no Christian influence in their lives. To end the summer, we had our annual school preparation week, aka "preschool". This class

is for all the kids entering school for the first time this year. These children are usually 7 or 8 years old and have very little readiness for school. Most of the Roma kids are held back at least once due to being unprepared. We teach them how to wait their turn, wash their hands, trace, we do some letters and numbers, and play games with them. The team has been doing this for 10 years now and parents have seen an incredible difference in their children since!

A Look Back At Our First Year

Personal thoughts over the year: When we stepped out of the plane last July, we came here with two main goals: share Jesus with others, and be "learners". We have thankfully been able to do both and we strive to keep these two goals always. There is really no way to be totally prepared to jump into a new life overseas. We have had some really tough problems and spiritual warfare since we arrived, probably the least expected was the sickness. As you saw in our updates, we have been sick 2 to 3 times a month and that average is continuing. This drove our energy down but not our motivation! Another tough unknown we still currently face is the Croatian children themselves. We were not prepared to see our sociable Reese be snubbed by children under the age of 5 at the park almost daily. This weighs a lot on us as parents and is very confusing to our friendly daughter. This has been frustrating as we learned firsthand how unfriendly the majority of the Croatian children are to outsiders. Thankfully, the Roma kids have accepted Reese as one of them, and she enjoys being with them as well!

We learned this year that you communicate all the time, even without words. People watch us a lot; we are outsiders and strange to them. We are different without even trying to stand out. One way we stand out among the Roma is how we raise our children. We had one young Roma woman open up a little to us about her traumatic childhood simply because she saw how we treated our kids with love and she had never experienced that.

We have seen God work in our language learning process and our visa process in incredible ways. God has been answering prayer after prayer with these. We have had a rollercoaster ride with both these things and God always made a way. Thank you to so many of you for joining us in prayer for these things.

We do have one big prayer request, since being here just over a year, we have lost quite a few financial supporters. We also quickly learned we were underbudgeted for multiple things, and unknown required costs came up. We have been dipping into savings every month since we arrived. We must raise more support and soon. We need to raise almost \$2,000 more a month. This is a little discouraging to us as we feel we just spent so much time raising funds, but we know God has us here and He will provide. Please join us in prayer as we try to raise support. If you have any questions about this please reach out and ask.

Thank you for your prayers and support! We have had lots of ups and downs since being here and we remember that we are not alone. Thank you for holding the ropes!!!

Thank the Lord for your continued prayers and offerings and God's continued blessings.

The months of June and July were unusual. Within six weeks, there were ten funerals of people of our acquaintance. Several people we dearly loved were promoted to heaven, including Dr. Raymond Barber, pastor emeritus of our sending church, Worth Baptist in Fort Worth, TX on June 25. Five days later our beloved friend and co-worker, Gloria King, former missionary to Spain and secretary of Mt. Abarim Baptist Mission, went to be with the Lord.

On June 19, Ingrid Neuwahl, a Jewish holocaust survivor who trusted Christ over fifty years ago, entered into His presence as well. She was buried in a Jewish cemetery—but by God's grace, we were given permission to do a Christian funeral and preached the Gospel there! We celebrated her life at Templo Batista de Indianópolis on Sunday, the 29th, and sang her favorite hymn, "Saved by the blood of the crucified One. . . Glory, I'm Saved...!" When asked what convinced her that Jesus was the Messiah, "Isaiah 53!" she would say.

A few weeks later another believing Jewess with some Arab mixture, Maria da Glória Abbud, also passed away. At the funeral site, while awaiting the arrival of other family members and friends, her anti-Semitic, anti-Zionist, Muslim sister and I had several hours to talk. The following Sunday, this same sister came to Templo Batista de Indianópolis, bringing a sizable group of friends to a service in which Maria da Glória was remembered with a Scripture reading and song. The Gospel was presented very clearly. There were no open decisions for salvation, but the Seed of the Word was planted.

Cliff and Ruth Hammond, our son-in-law and daughter, have been in Christian education, but Cliff recently accepted the call to pastor a church in a small town in Pennsylvania. Daniel, their seventh child, was invited to study at an Ivy League University because he is a home-schooled student with two years of college, online, with high grades and honors. He begins his studies as a junior in college on September 2 in Economics. Samuel, their youngest, has improved physically and his condition is no longer considered life-threatening. He is beginning college online.

Praise the Lord for the opportunity to serve Him and make a difference in the lives of others for eternity. May God continue to bless.

It's been a long wait with new requirements popping up ever once in a while causing delay after delay, but finally we are back to doing the work. We also continued to have some more new visitors arriving and have been requested to make some personal in house visits. Please pray that this will continue.

August brought news of a blessing from the new work in São Gonçalo dos Campos that Pr. Jarbas began. He is one of our preacher boys that we trained in Vargem Grande and is doing a good work with the help of his family. They have already experienced growth with many trusting Jesus as Savior with many already following the Lord in Baptism. Pr. Jarbas has also been discipling these young converts, which in turn is producing spiritual growth in these new believers. Just recently they celebrated their first Lord's Supper. Please pray for Pr. Jarbas and his family as they strive to plant this new church in Bahia.

Recently, classes began again for the second semester at school. We ask that you pray for our young people as they return to their studies that they will continue to be a testimony in front of the other students. That their testimonies will reach out to the other students with the Gospel of Christ before it is eternally too late.

I would also like to ask you to pray for our health. Just recently I came down with sinusitis and bronchitis. Either one is not pleasant but to get both at the same time puts a strain on the body. Fortunately the medication I am taking is helping and I am almost back to 100%.

The churches in Jardim Varginha and Vargem Grande are here today because you prayed and invested in God's work. 


