Dear Jimmy,

I am here in Jerusalem hosting the leaders of the nation at a summit at your Friends of Zion Center. I will also be hosting the president of Fiji and his cabinet as they open their embassy in Jerusalem. I am also meeting with the president and prime minister of Israel as I work on plans for the Ambassador Summit with 1,000 pastors which will be held in December.

It's hard to believe that almost two years have passed since the Hamas invasion on October 7, 2023. That was the deadliest single day in the history of the modern Jewish state...the deadliest day for Jewish people since the end of the Holocaust.

As I was writing this letter to you, I got an urgent call from Israel asking for our help from two precious mothers who are still hoping and praying for their sons to come home. Guy Gilboa Dalal and Evyatar David were kidnapped on October 7, 2023, and have now been hostages for more than 700 days.

They are literally starving. The video that was released of them showed the shocking weight loss they have endured along with physical torture. All of the hostages and their families need help right now, and they are asking us because of all we have already done.

This tragedy is not history...it's still happening every day. Jewish people still have to rush to bomb shelters. Jewish soldiers still are struggling to recover from their injuries. Jewish widows and orphans are still mourning the loss of husbands and fathers. Jewish families are still hoping and praying for their sons, grandsons, husbands, and brothers to still be alive...and to be released to return home.

The fate of the 50 hostages still held in Gaza (sadly, only 20 or so are believed to still be alive) is a prime demonstration of the demonic brutality of Hamas. These people are being tortured and starved and used for propaganda. But the world

just looks the other way, ignoring the evidence Hamas is happy to spread as a boast of their power.

Yet despite the unmistakable truth that Hamas started the war, much of the world is blaming Israel for responding!

It's an outrage for the victim to be blamed.

Many nations are pushing Israel to end the war without victory over the terrorists who want the Jewish state destroyed.

This is a deadly dangerous threat because if Hamas stays in power, the war will never really end. And if the concession demanded is the establishment of a Palestinian state — something many countries including England, France, Canada, and Australia have announced they will do at the United Nations a few days from now — that would be catastrophic for Israel.

It's tragic that these allies who once stood with Israel are turning their backs on the Jewish state and rewarding the terrorists who are trying to kill innocent Jewish people. Make no mistake, a Palestinian state would simply be another Gaza...a place to launch more and more attacks on Israel from even closer range.

My friend of 45 years, Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu recently highlighted the problem in an interview:

"That's the crux of the problem. The real reason that this conflict persists is not because of the absence of a Palestinian state but because of the persistent Palestinian refusal to recognize a Jewish state in any boundary. If you give them a Palestinian state when they haven't abandoned the goal of destroying the Jewish state, all you're doing is bringing the next war closer."

He's right...but the sad truth is that Israel is losing the propaganda war. The lies being told about Gaza, Hamas, Israel, and the Palestinians are spreading around the world. And the sad truth is those lies are working.

You see, Hamas does not just have a military strategy. While they had great success in their initial surprise attack, Israel's military quickly responded and has been demolishing

Hamas strongholds ever since. There is no question how a straight up fight ends.

That's why Hamas is also trying to break Israel with a campaign of propaganda and lies. They steal food and aid provided by the world and sell it to suffering Gazans at a huge markup...and then blame Israel for the "famine." And the world is happy to go along. One United Nations agency even changed their official definition and characteristics so they could falsely claim there is a famine.

Photos of young children "starving" in Gaza have been proven to be fakes and lies; yet proof doesn't convince those who want to hate the Jews. Debunking the stories isn't changing popular opinion.

Because so much of the liberal media hates Israel, they are happy to go along with the lies. So they are spewing out whatever Hamas sends them without regard to the truth...and people, especially young people, are believing the lie.

Poll after poll shows sharp declines in support for Israel, most prominently among young people. The Muslim oil states have poured billions into funding American universities and colleges and the anti-Semitism being spewed is a direct result.

That's why our Ambassador Program is so vitally important to Israel's future. The young people of today are the leaders of tomorrow, and we must counter the lies they are being fed with the truth. We already have the first 1,000 pastors and leaders signed up for the program, but that is just the beginning.

It is the great privilege of my life to be your ambassador to Israel. I want to pour my life into 1,000 ambassadors this year, providing them with the curriculum and the resources to be the brightest light of love and comfort...a light that will save a multitude of Jewish lives.

If you invested one dollar in each of these 1,000 ambassadors with a gift of \$1,000, it would be a huge answer to prayer. Even if you invested 10 cents or 20 cents in these 1,000 ambassadors, your gift of \$100 or \$200 would be a huge answer to prayer. I am praying that a few can invest \$10 dollars in 1,000 ambassadors with a gift of \$10,000.

God has given us the vision of enlisting 1,000,000 ambassadors from all over the world. Truly, this a great challenge, but it is also a great opportunity. These pastors and leaders represent a quarter of a billion people. And by reaching those people in their own communities, they will be the front line of defense for Israel from the campaign of lies.

This outreach will change the world. It is the most important thing we can do for Israel. Prime Minister Netanyahu has told me that more than once. We must pass the torch to the next generation.

We cannot...we will not...we must not...turn our backs on Israel. Not now. Not ever. As we cross this tragic two-year milestone of the deadly Hamas attack, we must rise up and say with one voice: "No, Israel, you are not alone. No, we will not believe the lies; we stand with you. We will fight for the truth!"

I'm asking you today to show your support in standing with the people of Israel and doing your part to fight the war they can't win alone. I'm asking you to stand with the Holocaust survivors. Stand with the victims of war. Stand with the hostage families. And confront the lies and evils of anti-Semitism through your support of the Ambassador Program. With your help, this is what your Friends of Zion Center does every single day.

The nation of Israel has never faced a more severe threat since its miraculous rebirth in 1948. God is calling us to join hands as a defense of the Jewish people, and we must answer that call together. Thank you in advance for your generous response.


RICH AND KRISTA VIOCULO MISSIONARIES TO SCOTLAND


Dear Faithful Prayer Warriors,

Here are some of the responses and needs sent by some of our national pastors:

INDIA:

Ning Wungkhai has a growing ministry in Manipur along the border of Myanmar and India. They have a Bible collage with 30 students, and a children's Home with 20 orphans. They are in the process of adding an additional 13 rooms to house more orphans. They need funds for more bricks and concrete. The needs are increasing due to the continued violence in both Myanmar and India.

INDONESIA:

Pastor Duad serves in Sumatra and is in need of finances to complete the building of a place to worship. His men are doing the majority of the building.

Pastor Piltus is on the Indonesian island of Nias and asks for prayer for the Lord to supply building materials to finish their church building. Pastor Piltus teaches school to supplement his income and also asked prayers for his students and himself. Some of his students are demon possessed and are continually interrupting his classes.

Pastor Suprianto in Kalimantan asked prayer for his wife as she is expecting their fourth child on October 1st. They are also praying for finances to expand their church building.

VIETNAM:

Greetings from the Campana's your representatives to Juarez, Mexico.

Family News – Praise the Lord, Sylvia and I are going to be grand parents! Our beloved daughter, Becky is pregnant, and is due to give birth in February. Our son, Daniel has moved back home with us, and is working as a youth pastor to our teens.

Ministry news – To God be the glory, great things he has done during the summer months. Sunday morning services are averaging 90 in attendance, with high days of over 100 present. Eleven precious souls have been saved and baptized, giving us a total of 23 baptisms for 2025! Among the baptized, is brother Elias Santillan who prayed to receive the Lord on his death bed, God then healed him, and he has been faithfully attending church for the past month. Another is Jesus Rangel who I led to the Lord on a street corner. Soon after he was baptized and has become a faithful soul winner and helper in the church. Currently, I am discipling six families. In other news, the Lord blessed us with 89 kids attending our July VBS, with several of them praying to receive Jesus as their Lord and Savior. During our first ever, Mini-Youth Camp, titled "He is a chosen vessel unto me," the Lord gave us 33 teens in attendance with 10 teens surrendering to full-time Christian service. Lastly, during our Sunday, August 6th evening service, our men prayed for six of our young and women who have since left to prepare for the ministry at Bible colleges in San Luis Potosi and Mexico City (see foto).

Project Juarez 120. During the month of August the property for which we have been praying for was sold to a supermarket chain and the buyers have since built a store. Disappointed, but not in despair, we have begun looking for other properties. This month Sylvia and I submitted a petition to the mayor of Juarez requesting property in our area to be used to reach the drug addicts, alchoholics and orphans. Financially, we are at 97% of our goal. Once again, thank you to all of you who have sacrificed to purchase property for a future church and school so as to reach precious souls in Juarez.

Please pray for God's <u>guidance</u> as to where to buy property, for more souls to be <u>saved</u> and baptized, for God's blessing upon our son Daniel who is pastoring our church teens, and for our daughter Becky who is due to give birth this February.



Thank you for your interest and financial investment in worldwide missions. Your gift is very much appreciated and will be used to glorify God as souls are saved throughout the world.

The work of missionaries does not stop after a church is planted. An indigenous church continues to have souls saved and discipled long after the missionary has moved on. Rick Martin recently told an amazing story of how God worked in the life of a blind man through a graduate of the Bible college (Iloilo Baptist College) started by Brother Martin. Here is a shortened version of the story:

Samson Clorion was born Christmas Eve 1960. . . . When Samson was five years old, he got the measles and lost his sight. When he reached his teenage years, he tried to fill his days by making friends. However, these

friends influenced him to smoke and drink. One day while he was alone, he realized how foolish he must look—a blind drunkard. That day he quit, but his life was still empty. He kept asking himself over and over "Why am I blind? What can I do with my life?" One thing that Samson could do was listen to the radio. One day, he just happened to tune in to a Baptist preacher talking about salvation by grace through faith in Jesus alone. He listened intently to every word. That day (in 1979) Samson received Jesus as his Savior. . . . One day one of the graduates of Iloilo Baptist College, Pastor Reymundo Porras, started a church in the village where Samson lived. Soon, Brother Porras saw the great love Samson had for Jesus. No one needed to accompany Samson to church. . . . Samson owned a cow, and so Brother Porras and Samson taught the cow to take him to church. So, he would climb on her back, and she would take him to church! Because of his desire to serve the Lord, Samson would try to visit people in his village. He would memorize the way to certain people's homes. Although he would often fall while trying to walk on the slippery dikes between rice fields, he kept on. . . . Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We wonder where the year has gone and after a rather warm and very wet summer autumn is now upon with storm systems and high winds leaving us with a mess, but of course it could have been much worse. Already we are planning for our Christmas Play!

Healthwise, we previously reported that Ian continues to regain his "Puff" following removal of part of his lung earlier this year caused breathlessness. Although the specialist who gave him a lung function test said the lungs were compensating nicely, the breathlessness seemingly is returning. Cynthia is becoming remarkably mobile following her hip replacement operation and this is a wonderful relief after a long haul.

Our Church family continues to grow and lack of space is becoming problematical, particularly in the area facilitating our Children's ministry. Cynthia has two ladies, namely, Grace and Kornelia as Children's Sunday school workers who enthusiastically engage in their calling. It is a joy for us to see them growing spiritually in preparing for the classes. English Classes too are at capacity.

We had several of our young people attend Summer Christian Camp during the School Holidays in both the junior and senior groups. We are concerned that some of our children are now hitting the "Cool Years" of thirteen plus and our experience it's this is when the world gets them. Grace, the Lady aforementioned, volunteered as a worker at the Camp.(Camping in the UK is kipping under Canvas). Her participation has kindled an infectious enthusiasm and we have an ambassador in Grace who will no doubt recruit some of our number to be camp workers next year. This past Saturday we hosted a conference for the Society for the Distribution of Hebrew Scriptures; a group with whom we have followed for many years. This of course coincides with the attack on the Synagogue in Manchester last week. Hopefully we can make this an annual event and foster interest in this neck of the woods. We had some followers of the Society travel from Leicester who were encouraged to see a conference and would like some more please. Another lady who supports our weekly Bible Reading Hour at our local hospital attended and brought some friends, who similarly would wish people from their own church to know of future events. One visitor asked if we were the church pushing New Testaments through letter boxes as she had received a copy.

Last year we attended a meeting Hosted by Prayer for Israel (A U K Christian Charity) in nearby Coventry. In conversation afterwards with the speaker, he lamented that Coventry was hard work with seemingly most churches holding to "Replacement Theology" and knowing little on the premillennial position. Ian said that we were not in that camp and that he spoke for the Prophetic Witness Movement International and also; when we had our Church in Devon we had a group of believers where we had specific Prayer for Israel before having our mid week outreach meeting with Bible Study and lunch time soup and sandwich. Some months elapsed and this gentleman Kaleb, turned up at church with his extended family and have become regular in attendance. Whilst they are feeling us out they certainly engage and are fitting in nicely. A pity they have to travel quite a distance to be with us. The Prayer for Israel Podcast of last Friday certainly slams UK Prime Minister Kier Starmer in his recognition of the Palestinian State. Surely the government in the UK are bringing condemnation on our land. In 1066 these Isles succumbed to the Norman Invasion and is it not significant to note that 40 years prior, Britain had expelled the Jews?

A large Gypsy family came our way and whilst warmly received by our folk, their background is one of being blown around by every wind of doctrine. We think most of them loved being with us but for one strong "Diotrephes!"Sadly we see them no more.







The church welcomed us all "home" with a love feast! This was done for Krista, me, Matt, and his family. It was a packed Sunday, and we were so **blessed** by everyone who came to welcome us all.



We were **blessed** to be able to stay with my parents upon arriving in the country. It was nice and "cozy" with eight people, one dog, and one bathroom. My brother, Matt, and his family returned to the mission field the week before Krista arrived, and we were all staying together for a month. Matt and his family were able to find a home in the Aberdeen area (two and a half hours east of Grantown), and we were able to help them move to their new home.

Because of your support, we have been **blessed** with a reliable vehicle to get us around. Unless you are living in a big city, a vehicle is needed in Scotland. We have been able to give rides to church members, including the chance to take a lady to see her son play football (soccer) for the first time. It was fun to support him, watch him play, and give that gift to his mom. We are enjoying reconnecting with people in the church as well as getting to know new people. The high school had a talent show, and we were able to attend and support a few of our youth at the event.





Krista has been busy helping my mom and taking turns teaching children's church. We have been averaging nine kids a Sunday! Krista and I have also been teaching the youth group on Sunday mornings. We have been going through an apologetics series. We are so **blessed** to have great conversations, and one of our teens has had the opportunity to have discussions with other classmates in the high school. The children's ministry and teen ministry are so exciting for me, as there weren't any kids or teens to have this going when I left just over two years ago.

We were able to participate in an outreach in Grantown during Thunder in the Glens. Thousands of people were out and about for the event. We passed out water, passed out tracks, and opened up the church doors for the use of the toilets. My mom was able to share the Gospel with a gal, and many people were invited to church.

Our hearts have been broken over recent events occurring back home in the US. 


Dear Supporters and Prayer Partners,


God continually makes Himself known during this time of deputation. This month I enjoyed attending the BBFI conference. I was blessed with the opportunity to



Dear IABM partners and friends, Pasts Monail and Pleasant view Byther family

August was a time for me to make a personal trip to Adelaide, South Australia to be with our daughter to celebrate her fiftieth birthday. This was a precious time with family and friends for me. Upon returning in September, six days later, on 10 September, I had a mild stroke. It is a blessing that this was not debilatating. I am in recovery mode with hopes of full recovery and doing PT and OT regularly. The Lord has been gracious to me, and ones have been kind and helpful during all of this. The time has come for a change. The Lord has given me peace that it is time to retire from IABM, and this will mean CLOSING the MISSION of IABM. After 31 December 2025 funds will no longer be accepted for this ministry. Any funds received after this date will be returned. All the remaining funds in this mission account will be distributed to the churches we currently support in 2026: Dalwallinu Baptist Church, Open Door Baptist Church, Wesburn Baptist Church, and Gospel City Church.

Some of you have been helping and praying since 1989, at the time of the inception of IABM, and others have come along in the years following. A big thank you goes to each of you. I am thankful to have been able to continue this ministry since my husband -John's going home to be with the Lord in 2008. This has been a privilege and joy to me. My heart has not changed in the love and care for these Aussies and for the need for the gospel to go out there. At 76 it is just time for me to make this change. A special thank you to our Australian field director, Brenton Honeychurch, and to Dr. Don Crain, our USA director. These men have been key in guidance, prayer, help, and encouragement through the years to me. More than you could know! We arrived in Adelaide, SA, Australia in May 1984 as missionaries, and at that time there no were agencies there to assist nationals planting fundamental Baptist, Bible believing churches and the need was great for these pastors and churches and outreaches. My husband John, seeing this need, with the Lord's guidance, founded this ministry of IABM in 1989. Thank you to each of you for your prayers and support and encouragement along the way.

In Australia our four churches are on firm footing, as IABM steps back from financial support. What a privilege over these years to be able to assist these churches...more than twenty churches over the years. Prayers have been answered and victories won.

Pastors have been encourgaged and helped in their ministries, outreaches have been supported, commitments have been made and lives changed! We give thanks to the Lord for all of this. You have been a part of all of this. My aims for the days ahead are developing. I will be considered a retired missionary in the days ahead. Although the regular quarterly letters about the Aussie churches will not be continued, please remember to lift these churches and pastors up in prayer in the days ahead. Your prayers for me in the coming days would also be appreciated. You are part of my missions and real family. Your care for me over these years has been a huge blessing and much appreciated. This decision has been prayerful and is timely. There has been good advice from our USA director and the CMC team in all of this, and this decision of closing IABM and becoming a retired missionary was made before leaving for my time in Australia in August. It is a new stage in my life where I will continue to serve and love the Lord. To God be the glory, great things He has done!



We are in a growth period in our ministry. In the church in Starke, God is moving in peoples hearts. The attendance has increased. The spirit of the congregation has improved and new families are coming.

We now have a larger variety of nationalities in the congregation. It is beautiful to see the people work together to accomplish a church activity. Celebrations after services for special days have been successful and very well attended. Also several workers that work in an Alligator Farm nearby are coming and participating in the services and activities. Three of these men have accepted Christ recently. **Pray the others will surrender soon**.

Greetings from the UK.

We have finished our first session of twelve weeks to freedom, and plan on starting our second session once we return to the UK after our furlough. Although twelve weeks to freedom is over, our work is not. We were able to transition two of our men from twelve weeks to freedom, to the "Continue" series by Paul Chappel. Continue takes new Christians through basic doctrine over fourteen weeks. While I am gone, my co-laborer, Donovan, will take these men through lessons week after week.

Please keep these men in your prayers, as one is certainly lost. A couple of weeks ago, I had the opportunity to sit down with these men and spend two and a half hours going over salvation. At the end of our conversation, he said he didn't know if he could believe, but he is still coming to church, and still coming to Continue. As long as he is willing to listen, we will continue giving him the gospel, and we pray that he comes to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ.

As for our furlough, we leave for the US on July 30th and we will be landing in Tucson, Arizona. We recently received word that Pastors Kelvin and Alex held a crusade in Turukana and thirty precious souls came to know our Jesus as their own Lord and Savior!





Day after day we are reminded of God's love and provision for us. As the month of September gets under way, please allow me to share with you some praise items and prayer requests.

Praise items:

- 1. We now have the funds needed to finish phase 3 of the construction project for the church here in New City. This will include: a small "fellowship hall", two classrooms, three bathrooms, a kitchen, and a roof over the entire building. Hopefully we will be able to move into the already finished part of the building by the end of November, while construction continues on the rest.
- We are now at roughly 63.50% of the funds needed to completely finish the building! Our heartfelt thanks go out to each church that has partnered with us in the matching funds building campaign for the church here in New City!



4. We just finished our 2025 Faith Promise Mission's conference. Despite the loss of a large family since last year, our people made a pretty outstanding commitment to missions for this year!

Prayer Requests:

- 1. For the remainder of the building project, we are praying for \$67,500.00 from our U.S. partners, and \$13,500 from our congregation here. If the Lord touches your heart to help us reach our goal of \$67,500.00, please consider sending an offering to us through our mission agency, designated the Matching Funds Building Campaign.
- In September, the ladies host an "evangelistic tea," inviting ladies from all over the community to a time of tea and coffee, conversation, and hearing the Good News.
- 3. Please pray for our first neighborhood house meeting of the semester, when our church members will be inviting their unsaved neighbors, family, and friends to their homes for an informal time of getting to know who we are, having some coffee, and hearing the Gospel.
- Please pray as we canvass, invite people to church, and seek other methods of spreading the Gospel. We are looking forward to doing what we can to share God's love with the lost of our community.

Partners in Training

Since the pandemic hit in 2020, for a lack of online class setup, as well as a scarcity of willing and qualified teachers in the years following, our Bible Institute has been unable to operate. However, during this time, we have been praying that the Lord would open the door for us to start having classes again. Then, in June of this year, through a phone call from fellow missionary Frank Brim in the state of Bahia, we have been given the opportunity to once again offer full-time institute classes to our students. His ministry includes a fully online Bible institute (the Fundamental Bible Baptist Institute of Arembepe) offering live and recorded classes for churches of like faith and practice throughout Brazil. He offered a partnership with our Institute. I will be able to help with the teaching responsibilities, and in return, our new and existing students will be able to get their much-needed Bible training and degrees. They will still get together for classes here, but they will have the privilege of being taught by qualified teachers of like faith, as well as be in a much larger online Zoom classroom with students in other parts of Brazil. This is a wonderful opportunity for all involved! Please pray for me as I get used to teaching into a computer camera! Even more importantly, please pray that God-called men and women will answer God's call and overcome the obstacles they face in order to prepare for the ministry. Thank you for praying for us!

On July 19th, John's father passed quietly into eternity to be with the Lord. We praise God that we were able to be there before he departed. The funeral took place on August 7th, and John and one of his brothers gave eulogies about their dad. We're so grateful that we had a father that left us a great legacy, but above all, that he knew the Lord!

We had to cut our trip to Kentucky, and our remaining time Stateside didn't allow to reschedule it. We were able to go to our two other destinations at a later date.

Our return flights to Brazil were originally purchased for August 27th, but due to the situation, we remarked them for September 3rd. Most of our packing was done two weeks ago, and we're heading back with six full footlockers! Please be in prayer that all goes well with our trip, and also that our flights will be without difficulties nor lost luggage. We're currently at the airport, waiting to board the first leg of our trip!

Our truck has been sold, and the trailer is now in storage. The trailer will be available for family usage as necessary, and ready for our next furlough. Our 37,750 miles of travel over the past year allowed us to minister and report to 61 supporting churches, 10 "new to us" churches, and 7 partnering individuals. Dear Pastor and Praying Friends,

September 9, 2025

In July and August, we had the joy of celebrating 35 years in the ministry! During that time, we traveled from São Paulo to Manaus to join Pastor Chad and the men from his church in North Carolina. Pastor Chad and his church have a special heart for the Transforming Lives Institute (TLI) in Manaus, a ministry founded by Pastor Paulo and his wife Eloina to reach the children and teens of one of the poorest areas of the city. We praise the Lord that they are part of our Apoio Family. When Pastor Chad first visited this ministry last year, he fell in love with the people. His church has since committed to return each year for the next five years to support the work.

Their team blesses the children in countless ways—bringing candy, gifts, games, and above all, genuine love. But even more than that, Pastor Chad challenged Pastor Paulo to have his people pray that God would raise up a pastor to begin a new church, with his church supplying the funds for monthly support. God answered! Pastor Plinio and Simone surrendered to the call, and a church was born. Pastor Plinio soon launched a campaign to plant this new church at ITV. To help further, Pastor Chad's church donated all the funds needed to host a special dinner for the children and their families at the Institute. More than 500 people were fed that day, and most importantly, 13 precious souls gave their lives to Christ on July 30th. It was an unforgettable event! That following Thursday, 3 teens and 3 men from the Campo Sales work asked Jesus to be their Savior! This is a powerful reminder of what God can do when His people work together in unity.



In August, we returned to the States to celebrate (a little early) our 45th wedding anniversary. Our two adult children desired for us to take a 7-day cruise to Alaska. However, shortly after our return from Manaus, both Dana and I tested positive for Covid. The recovery took some time, and sadly, our trip had to be canceled. Yet, in God's goodness, we were able to reschedule for next year—another reminder of His faithfulness even in setbacks.

As I write this letter, we are preparing to board our flight back to Brazil today (Tuesday). We can hardly wait to be reunited with our people! God is stirring their hearts, and we rejoice to see them not only growing but also passing on what they've learned to the youth. Truly, it is a joy to witness lives being transformed and vessels being prepared for His service.

We were the answer to their requests, and they uprooted their family and moved here just to honor our father with their children's education. Others knew about the school, but were taken on a journey by our father where they decided to walk the narrow road.

However, I most think about a certain mother who explained the difficulty she had with putting her son into preschool. He was rejected by several schools. He is a bit hyperactive and definitely had struggles following instructions. In fact, you might remember that several months ago, I mentioned how we had a difficult conversation with this family. We told them that we also would not be able to accept their son unless there was some major improvement. We gave the family a book about what our father teaches about raising children, and told them we would give E another trial period after the winter break.

After the winter break, he was still quite a handful, and although my heart went out to him and his family, I said that we cannot accept him. However, his teacher, Ms. A, has such a loving tender heart, and she insisted on having more time to work with him. As long as she was not overwhelmed, I was willing to give her more time. Day by day, E is doing better and better to the point that Ms. G even mentioned considering letting him join his age group in Kindergarten.

During the Parent Orientation, Ms. G was introducing the teachers. As she introduced Ms. A, she shared how much she loves those children. She mentioned how Ms. A talks to our father about E every single day. As E's mother heard how much her son is loved, tears welled up in her eyes and streamed down her face. It's all the love of the father.

I know that when you give, it is also because of your great love for our father. However, you often don't know their names (maybe just their initials). You don't see their faces. You don't see their tears. You don't often see their smiles. You don't see the tears in my eyes as I write this, the tears that are there because we do get to see it. It's beautiful, and we are so grateful that we get to help you represent our father here. One day, you too will see it with your own eyes.

Dear Praying Friends:

Bro. José Reyes and family have been laboring in the small town of Triumph, Chiapas for 15 years this month. They have been faithfully witnessing door to door, in spite of rain 7 months of the year and problems with health. Their adult attendance is 40, but there have been many more saved and baptized. Due to lack of employment there, folks move to larger cities for work. They ask for your prayers for them and for more souls for salvation and discipleship; his wife is afflicted with asthma and serious thyroid problems.

Bro. Francisco Villalpando and wife have been in Guadalajara for 15 years. He is severe diabetic and has lost one leg to the disease. However, he and others are visiting door to door at least three days a week. He recently had a severe angina attack, but seemingly has recovered. They have 80 members now, and just told me they had 5 saved last Sunday. Please pray for them and that church; Guadalajara is a strong catholic center.

A new mission has been opened in an area called Las Granjas, a new suburb of Tijuana. Bro. Natanael Aguilar began work there a few months ago. He and Bro. Emmanuel Cayetano are working together there, and reaching that colonia and an adjacent one. They are both grads of the bible institute in Tijuana. Although they went 2 months without seeing fruit, for the last 2 they have had someone saved every Sunday, in answer to their prayer. They had 37 in attendance last Sunday. They are meeting in a garage type building, and are praying to be able to buy a lot before they are all sold; this is a rapidly settling area. Please pray for this new work, that they may be able to do so, and to also get a large van for the work.

In the past 3 months, El Camino Baptist in Tijuana has had 170 1st time visitors and 30 baptized. They held 2 youth camps, with over 100 attending teen camp and 80 for junior camp. Bro. Jaime Leon, institute grad, has been serving as youth pastor and doing a great job. However, he has stepped down from that busy position, due to his precious wife's health. One month ago, Sarita was discovered to have terminal brain cancer; at that time, doctors said she may have a few months to live. She is 27 years old. Please pray for this precious couple.

Prayers needed...

We certainly should always rely on the promises of God, but have you ever been in a stuation where it seemed even more critical? We have found ourselves over our heads with life in the last several weeks. You might recall in our last letter, I mentioned that I had to do a second surgery due to some complications from the first surgery that I had in November. We thank the Lord that the surgery went well and I was able to schedule it during a time when we had a few weeks off from traveling. The recovery has been painful but not as bad as the previous surgery. I am still not back to normal, but getting there. The difficulty is the fact that I had to do this surgery in the United States where our international insurance has a \$3,000 per person deductible, plus a co-pay after that. We were told up front that we would certainly meet our deductible. Pray that God would provide for this need.

Second, a few weeks ago, Tiffany began having strange light arcs appear in her vision which is usually a sign of a detached retina. The eye doctor confirmed that she had had a previous retinal detachment but that she also had a hole in her retina that could only be repaired with laser surgery. The surgery went well and she has fully recovered, but once again, a \$3,000 deductible and co-pay. Once again, pleae pray for this need to be met.

Third, I have to share with you a more difficult health situation. Our youngest son, Caden (19 years old) has been losing blood off and on for several months. After several different medications, the doctor sent him in for a colonoscopy. We have discovered that he has Crohn's disease. He has been so sick for the last few weeks that he hasn't left his bed. For several days, he was not able to keep down any food. We have been getting several tests done to determine the severity of the disease and at this point, we are still waiting on some important tests to be done. The delay has been due to insurance. In Chile, we can get tests done very quickly but not here in the US. So he has not even been able to begin any medication. He has not been able to go to work nor attend any of his classes in person. This disease will require a lifetime of health care for him but we know God is in control and this is not a surprise for Him. Please pray for Caden. Pray that we can get the necessary tests done soon. Pray that he can get the medication that he needs. Some of the medications are very new with a lot of side effects, but the doctor wants to be aggresive with the treatment once it starts to get him into remission as quickly as possible. Pray also that God would provide for this as the cost will certainly reach the deductible. In all, our medical bills will be over \$9,000. Our home church has sent us \$5,000 to help with the costs. Would you consider helping as well? You all have been so generous over the last few years with our building program in Chile and I certainly do not like asking again, but we need your help.
