No, I'm not talking about our age (69), but somehow, despite all my shortcomings, Debra and I will be married 50 years on December 28! (Yes, we were 10 years old when we got married...just joking). God has indeed blessed us "hundredfold" (Matthew 19:29)

Another Blessing: We Taught a Three-Day Concentrated Study

on **Jewish Evangelism** at Norris Bible Baptist Seminary from November 12-14. We had 25+ students each day from 8:00 AM to 12:00 PM (See pictures on the back). Plus, the privilege of feeding them both, spiritually and physically, each day with breakfast, snacks, and lunch. On Friday, they were treated to bagels and lox for breakfast and falafels for lunch. Some of the topics:

1. Traced the rise of Amillennialism that gave rise to antisemitism even to this day.
2. Late 1800s - Zionism, Great Britain's treatment of Israel, the League of Nations, and the UN
3. Jewish contributions to the world and the Ashkenazim and Sephardic branches.
4. Sad story of the "church's" mistreatment of Jews and **how to overcome it**.
5. Conceptual Process of J/E – The Apostle Paul gives us the Biblical example in Acts!
6. Cultural (doctrinal) view of the Jewish people – Reform, Conservative, and Orthodox
7. Covenantal Gospel presentation – Our tract booklet – G-D's **GREATEST PROMISE TO Israel**
8. Famous Jewish believers and their impact!
9. Israel's present-day conflict – Gaza and Psalms 83 – "tabernacles of Edom"

Our Virtual Tour of Israel Zoom Class was Enlightening, Impactful, and Practical!

Our teaching series is on the Seven Feasts of Israel. In our fourth part (almost six hours) on the third Spring Feast, the Feast of First Fruits (Jesus' Resurrection was on that day), we covered the last three Levitical Offerings – the Peace, Sin, and Trespass offerings. It was incredibly insightful to see believers in the Old Testament connect their lives with God through offerings of a Burnt (salvation), Meat (sustenance), and Drink (pour your life in service). The Passover Feast also required the Sin Offering (Jesus, our High Priest – Hebrews 4). The eye-opener was that Christ **fulfilled** all those Levitical Offerings...at the Last Supper! We concluded by showing how giving to Missions through our church continues to connect our lives with Christ.

Years ago, I had the privilege to meet Dr. Clifford Clark. He was one of the early leaders who brought Faith Promise to America. I went to his home in Oklahoma, and he told me that Faith Promise was based on precisely what I was teaching – The Five Levitical Offerings. He also, over the course of his ministry, reached many Jewish people for Christ. It was an honor to get to know him as he went on to Glory several years ago.

In our sixth part of the Feast of First Fruits (in January 2026), we will deal with the tithe and complete the teaching on the Feast of First Fruits. **This series would be great for a Mission Conference or Stewardship meeting. Let me know if you're interested and what dates work for you!**

We pray that your Christmas and New Year celebrations will be special times of worship!

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year!

Our furlough travels are winding down as we prepare to enjoy Christmas with family and start packing our bags to return to Indonesia. We have enjoyed our time here in the US, but we are ready and excited to return home to Indonesia. We begin the long journey back on January 21st. We will spend a week at our sending church in Hawaii before we continue to Indonesia on January 29th. While we are in Hawaii, our girls will both be getting baptized at our home church! We are so thankful for their salvations while we have been in Indonesia and are excited to see them baptized.

When we arrive in Indonesia, we will be jumping right back into a full schedule of activity. We will begin the process of moving to our new home in Purworejo. During this upcoming semester I will be completing my thesis for my master's degree at the Indonesian university. Classes at the Bible college begin on February 10th. I am looking forward to leading the spiritual development of the Bible college students.

Dad's Health Update

Many people have been asking about my dad's health. Thank you very much for praying for him. He completed his chemotherapy in August and had follow-up scans in September. The doctor told him that he is very pleased with the results of the treatment. It appears that the places where the cancer was growing have returned to normal. He will be on a weight limit as his bones remain weak. His PSA level is undetectable. They will continue to monitor it while they continue hormone treatment. We are hoping and praying that the cancer will not begin growing again for a long time. Dad is learning to deal with some of the ongoing side effects of his treatment. The doctor says he has already gone through the worst treatment they can give. Praise the Lord!

Prayer and Praises

Please pray for our visa! We are trying to switch to a different visa for religious workers. Our paperwork must pass through several government agencies, and the men doing the leg work are already very busy with pastoring and/or work. We plan to return in about 7 weeks. We will be able to enter on our old visa as it is still active. Waiting for visas is always nerve-wracking and even more so as our fellow missionaries who have been on this visa for over 5 years recently had their visa application rejected. Please pray that it will all go quickly and smoothly. Thank you for your prayers and support!

Christmas 2025

Dear Friend,

It was just after dark, and I had gathered with our kids, our donors, our staff, and my family at the shelter. We formed a circle to mark the night together in prayer and thanksgiving for one another and the gift of God's love in the world.

Two of our Faith Community volunteers were playing guitar and singing "Silent Night" as a prelude to our service . . .

. . . when a shadow appeared outside the window and lingered.

I can't help but be reminded of this story each holiday season. Kevin Ryan, president emeritus, shared it with me, a parting gift that truly illustrates what Covenant House is all about. As I sat down to write this letter, I heard his words, this story of love and hope, and I knew I needed to share it with you again today.

I pray this story, an embodiment of the spirit of what Covenant House can do, moves you to be a part of blessing our youth this winter.

The lighting was poor and it was hard to see who was there. The figure was hooded and hunched over. He stood there, looking in, for more than 10 minutes.

I left our circle, walked past the manger and the Christmas tree, and went out the front door to see who was standing there. As I approached, I could tell it was a boy, maybe 16 or 17 years old. He had dark circles under his eyes — he looked exhausted.

"Hi there," I said and offered a handshake. "I'm Kevin, what's your name?"

"Jeremiah." His smile was forced, but he was trying.

"Want to come inside, Jeremiah?" I asked.

He hesitated, not making eye contact, just gently shaking his head back and forth. "Nah, I'm alright. I'm fine here," he said tentatively.

"Well, you don't look alright. You look tired. Come inside — we have some hot chocolate and Christmas cookies," I offered. But he didn't move. In my book, something has to be really wrong to turn down cookies and hot chocolate on Christmas Eve.

"Look, they're right there," I said, and I pointed inside to the table with Christmas goodies. "Come in from the dark and take a load off."

"How much you charge?" he asked, his face filled with skepticism. "I only have \$26 on me, and I need it. I have to find a place to stay and something to eat, and I need my money."

"We don't charge anything, Jeremiah. Come inside Covenant House with me, okay?" I turned to walk inside, trusting he'd follow, and he did, but slowly.

I held the door for him as we entered, and we could hear the chorus singing the refrain of "Silent Night." The music stopped Jeremiah in his tracks.

"My momma used to sing that song on Christmas." He appeared lost in the memory.

"Where is your mom, Jeremiah?" I asked.

And he took out his wallet and unfolded a faded, creased Polaroid of a young woman with two small children and a mall Santa in front of a cardboard chimney.

"That's me," he said, pointing to the little boy on Santa's right knee. "That's my brother, Ty," he said, pointing to the other toddler. "And that's Momma." Perfect smiles, all of them, even the little ones.

"She died. She had breast cancer six years ago," he said matter-of-factly, as if he'd said it 100 times before. But something in the way he squinted his eyes betrayed the pain that his words did not.

"How about Ty?" I asked.

"We went into foster care and got split up. He lives in a group house somewhere. I haven't seen him in a while."

"Where have you been staying?" I asked.

But he had stopped listening to me. Jeremiah's gaze was fixed on the circle of kids, donors, and staff singing Christmas hymns. He bowed his head and started to shake a bit. His voice broke.

"I got nobody, Mister. It's Christmas, and I got nobody." His eyes had filled, and the tears were starting to spill down his cheeks.

I asked Jeremiah if he wanted something to eat or whether he needed to rest, but he was intent on the circle and its music.

Then, Father Placid, who was our chaplain for more than 20 years, invited us into the circle by saying, "Let's gather together and make room for everyone in our circle."

We sang, read prayers, and offered one another a "sign of peace," a handshake to express our commitment to one another. Jeremiah took my hand and for the first time made eye contact. "I have nowhere to be right now," he said. "Nowhere. I don't belong in the world."

"Yes, you do, Jeremiah. Right here," I replied. "Peace, son."

"Peace," he whispered.

After the service, we talked and ate cookies and apples and turkey sandwiches (in that order, forgive me!). He started to relax a bit. We watched the kids open presents from our donors. And Jeremiah received some unexpected gifts as well — a backpack, sneakers, and a sweater.

We sang carols, slurped hot chocolate, and felt grateful to be sharing this night inside — in the light and out of the dark of winter.

As Jeremiah, my son John, and I teased each other about who was going to win the Super Bowl, my cell phone rang. Since it was late and the number was from our shelter in New Jersey, I was worried something was amiss. It was.

"Someone stole the kids' Christmas presents," our New Jersey shelter director told me. "They broke in through the back windows and took them all."

God forgive me, but my first reaction was rage. Who steals from homeless kids on Christmas Eve? Where could we find new presents for kids after midnight? How much was it going to cost to fix the broken windows?

It took me a moment to calm down, and Jeremiah noticed how upset I was. I explained the situation to him and made sure he was in the capable care of our shelter team before telling him that I needed to speak with our Covenant House New Jersey team and the police.

"Here," Jeremiah said. "Take this."

He had opened his wallet and taken out the \$26, handing it to me. "They need it more than I do."

My friends sometimes call me Cryin' Ryan for a reason. At that moment, I was undone by the giant generosity of this sweet, broke kid who emptied his pockets to bring

Christmas to other homeless kids he'd never met.

In just a few weeks it will be Christmas Eve again here at our shelter. **And there will be more Jeremiahs peering through our window outside ...**

They will come to us on Christmas Eve (just as they come the other 364 nights) from our biggest cities and the smallest towns. They'll be from down your street and halfway across America. Girls, boys, kids ... in all shapes and sizes.

But as different as they all are, these kids will have one thing in common. **They will be standing outside on Christmas Eve because they are alone.** Without a family. Without anyone who cares what happens to them that night, or any night.

Please ... will you help us provide shelter and love to the droves of homeless kids who will come to our Covenant House crisis shelters this Christmas?

Your Christmas gift today — whatever you can afford — will give kids like Jeremiah food, counseling, medicine, and a safe place to sleep away from the dangerous streets. But most of all, you will be giving them the love and dignity every child deserves. **Please help if you can!**

We simply can't care for the thousands of kids who will come to us this Christmas without the help of good people like you. Thank you for reading this letter, and for bringing kids like Jeremiah the miracle of God's love, if you can. **May you and those you love enjoy a most blessed, and safe, Christmas.**







Bro. Eric Salazar is the founding pastor of the Firm Anchor Baptist Church, located in Camalú B.C. He reports that they celebrated their eighth anniversary in November. They are having regular attendances of over eighty, with new families coming and souls being saved. They were able to preach in a village some 20 minutes away, and have added 12 people from there. He asks for prayer for that new area they are reaching, and new converts that are being discipled. He also asks for prayers for more souls saved, continued construction and his health.

Bro. Samuel Alvarez pastors the church he began in Loreto, B.C.S. They held a family bible conference in November, with eight receiving Christ as savior. They celebrated their sixteenth anniversary that same month. They are having attendances of sixty, and ask for prayer for needed materials for the completion of their building. They have two students in our institute in Tijuana this year.

Bro. Villalpando in Guadalajara shares that they have had ten additions to church in the past two months, and two more members have become active in their door to door evangelism. He asks prayer for a special event that they have planned for indigents and seniors on the 23rd of December, and for the health of him and his wife.

El Camino Baptist Church just held its annual ladies conference this month. They had 903 ladies attending, coming from El Camino and 44 other churches. There were at least ten saved in the conference. The addition to the auditorium is almost completed, lacking finishing the restrooms. It was used in the conference to seat 150 ladies. Sarita Leon, the young lady with brain cancer that I wrote of in our last letter, went home to be with her Lord in November. Please be in prayer for her dear husband Jaime and her family during this time.

We are grateful to each of you for the vital part you have in the lives of us and our people, through your faithful intercession. We pray that you will have a richly blessed Christmas and New Year, as we listen for the shout.

As the end of the year draws near, **this is to be the last letter** from the mission of Inter-Australia Baptist Mission. As stated in the September update, **after 31 December 2025 funds will no longer be accepted for this ministry, and any funds received after this date for IABM will be returned.** The time for me to retire and for the mission to close has come. In 2026 all funds left in this account will be distributed between the four churches we currently support. The Lord has blessed in many ways over the time since this mission was begun in 1989. **In the days ahead I will be considered a retired missionary by CMC.** My personal support account will remain open, and for those of you who are already giving to this account, you do not need to do anything differently. For you and any others who choose to support me in retirement, please add a note for "personal support for E. Napier" to your Central Missionary Clearinghouse (CMC) giving in 2026. Of course, your help is appreciated. If you have any questions about this, please contact me through one of the above personal contact details.

All of the four churches for which we have been praying and are currently supporting have written notes of thanks for the care and prayers given to them over these last years. Lives have been touched and encouraged, ones have come to the Lord by the help of your prayers, and practical assistance with projects and outreaches has been given. Over the years youth camps have been subsidized and some youth have been given the fees to enable for them to attend camp and to hear and to be among ones to respond to the gospel. **Perhaps you remember praying for the lists of campers coming for those weeks of youth camps years back?** Pastors and their families have been helped in practical ways and strengthened and encouraged by your prayers. All of these churches have been so touched that ones in America have partnered with their churches. **For myself it has been a joy being closely connected to these ones in Australia as they spread the gospel through their outreaches, within their local churches, and beyond.** This letter is to thank you for your faithfulness in helping the Aussies through this ministry.

Dear Team Member,

IT'S CHRISTMASTIME, AND OUR RECEPTIVE HEARTS ARE OVERFLOWING! The mission of this ministry has remained the same, but our scope has enlarged tremendously. The **Scroll Project** and the progress on the **Biosphere** have enhanced our evidence demonstrating Creation to be factual. In the Scrolls we have 316 specific prophecies that were fulfilled by Jesus during His first appearance. This is beyond the potential of natural circumstances to accomplish, and demonstrates that *He was the Messiah, the Creator in the flesh*. In the prototype of the Biosphere we have already performed scientific experiments demonstrating *longer life-spans and enhanced protein expressions*. We're eager to complete the projects and demonstrate Creation Truth on a global scale.

The first photo was taken by the parents of **little Adah Mize** as she and the Museum Director peered through the "Gate Beautiful" of the Temple Model. We could see the distant High Priest model lifting his hand on Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement.

The second photo shows her grandmother, **Mary Ann Mize** (who donated the Scrolls to CEM), along with the Museum Director and Messianic Jewish leader **Joel Chernoff** (Founder of the Joseph Project in Israel). This partnership has been blessed of the Lord.

The third photo is also very special. **Drs. Ron and Melissa Pew** are shown by the scale model of the *Tower of the Flock* at Bethlehem. Ron 3D-printed the model and understands the significance of each detail where prophecies were fulfilled. David's well is shown nearby. *Micah 4:8 and 5:2* state that the Messiah was to be born here. All our Team need to visit this display and discover the tremendous significance of the site.

I haven't ever had a huge "bucket list." I guess I have lived a very fulfilling life. Many of you are aware that I enjoy fishing and hunting. There are a couple of hunts I've always wanted to do. I had dreamed of a Cape buffalo hunt in Africa and an elk hunt in Colorado. I had pretty much given up on either one of them ever happening at this stage in my life.

About three months ago, an organization called "God's Country for Our Heroes" contacted me. My name had been recommended to this wonderful organization. Each year, they choose a veteran for a free elk hunt, and they had chosen me. I was blown away! Our son Brian assisted me on this special hunt. On Thursday, November 30th, I was able to get a huge bull elk! You can read more on my Facebook page.

On Friday, November 7th, I was privileged to preach in a Kansas prison via video. These men were eager to hear the gospel, **and four of them responded by receiving Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Savior.** They were set free from their sin!

Because it was close to Veterans Day, I conducted numerous radio interviews to discuss the importance of observing and honoring our veterans in America.

On Sunday, November 9th, I was privileged to be back with Pastor Gordon Godfrey and the wonderful folks of the great Marcus Pointe Baptist Church in Pensacola, Florida. They honored their veterans in both services, which included an honor guard presenting the colors. **Forty-three were saved in the first service, and forty-five were saved in the second service! To God be the glory!**

On Tuesday and Wednesday, Connie and I returned to where we were born and raised in southern Illinois for several special Veterans Day events. On Tuesday morning, I spoke at a VFW-sponsored event in Mt. Vernon, Illinois. I was able to give my story and invite them to a special event that evening. The evening event was hosted by the Salem South Baptist Association, headed by Director Bob Burton. It was held at the Cedarhurst Museum in Mt. Vernon, and the building was full. **Ten came for salvation at this special event.**

The next morning, I had the honor of speaking at the high school I graduated from in 1968. Actually, the junior high and high school students were in this special assembly. I usually plan to speak for about thirty minutes in school assemblies; however, they asked me to speak for the entire hour. It was a great time, and I was able to share a significant portion of my testimony. They were super attentive.

That evening, I had another honor. I preached at the church where Connie and I were married and where I surrendered to preach. My dad pastored Belle Rive Baptist Church for over a decade. Again, they had a great crowd. **Four came for salvation, and three young men surrendered to preach the gospel!**

I serve on a committee at the request of Senator Ted Cruz that helps to select appointments to our service academies, which includes the Naval Academy, the Air Force Academy, and West Point. We met on Friday, November 14th in Round Rock, Texas, from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. I take this job seriously. We must have the right people leading our military. We don't need "woke" people giving orders to our men and women wearing the uniform of our nation.

Saturday, Connie and I flew to Charlotte, North Carolina, and then drove to Williamston, North Carolina, where I spoke on Sunday morning at Trinity Baptist Church. Pastor Robbie Roberson and his folks had prepared a special day honoring their veterans. **Nine came for salvation, and there were numerous other decisions.**

Connie and I were to fly back to Dallas Sunday evening. We experienced numerous delays, but we finally arrived at our home and were in bed by 4:00 a.m. The week was hard but very rewarding, **with well over 100 lost souls saved!** It was worth it all, and you had a part in it!


The New Year looms ahead and we anticipate another great year because of our great God and you our partners!




School of Missions

Missionaries to Honduras

Dear Pastor and Prayer Supporter,

Throughout the past few years, we have asked you to partner with us through prayer over many things - whether it be health, safety, language learning, or discernment. But one particular request that has continually weighed on our mind is the matter of our residency - or rather, the lack thereof. This January will mark four years of being compelled to leave every three months. We've asked in the past for prayer that God will continue to work in His exact timing, and our prayer remains unchanged. We want nothing more than His perfect will for our family, and we pray we remain malleable to His working hand, wherever it may lead.

We have just arrived back a few days ago to Honduras from a month's long trip in the states. As proved again and again, God made a time that could be mundane and meaningless to be purposeful through personal connection and spiritual encouragement. We had the blessing of being at several missions conferences this past month, including Colorado Springs Baptist Church and Bethel Baptist Church in Washington. Both churches were a new connection and proved to be an immense blessing and encouragement to our family. We praise the Lord that they chose to partner with our ministry here in Honduras.

As He is in times of our travels, God has proved gracious in times of hardship as well. During our stay in Washington, we received news that a very close family friend - both a wonderful mother and grandmother figure to our family - had been unexpectedly called home to glory. As unforeseen as the news was, we could not help but recognize God's hand of tenderness and provision to allow us to be there to support the family and attend the memorial service.

Even as we labored in the States, progress continued several thousand miles away in Honduras. Trenches for storm water were dug, a new septic tank was built, and much-needed insulation and drop ceiling were installed in the staff cabins and dining hall. Now that we have returned, we are eager to jump back into the many responsibilities that God has given us. As we acclimate again to our schedule here, we will be making the necessary preparations for several large events in the coming days. In late December, we will be hosting a Christmas service at the conference center, and a short few weeks later in the new year, several churches will bring their teenagers for a several day youth camp. And of course, only six months span between now and the rapidly approaching pastors' conference, and we are excited to progress in the much planning and preparing needed.

Please continue to pray that God's will be done in and through our family. As we labor in our weekly ministries of outreach and soul winning, please pray we stay sensitive to His leading and make those vital personal relationships with people who are hurting. We never want to forget what this ministry is about - to love people, to touch souls, and to share the hope of God's incredible merciful love. 



In the lights and the gifts... **These will all pass away.***


*But instead, help me think of that Gift beyond measure,

Even though she had never made cranberry sauce from scratch before, it turned out great!


You may wonder why we carved pumpkins again this month. Due to illness we had to put off our home activity, but it ended up working out better for several of our local friends so that they were able to attend.

M was one of my more advanced English students who always excitedly greets me when she sees me. We have to be very careful about how we share with these students, especially since we don't really know their family background. Despite a bit more risk, we invited M and her family. They really enjoyed their time with us, and we got to share the good news with them for the first time. May these seeds take root and grow!

We had an extremely pleasant surprise this month. We received a message from RQ, one of the college students that faithfully attended our studies when we were "stuck" in the USA during the Covid years. Some of you have specifically been lifting her and her family up after her family was devastated by a flash flood in the mountains. She lost an aunt and a cousin. Her uncle is paralyzed, and her other cousin is still in a coma. She has since been helping run her uncle's business and has not been able to return to the USA to finish her last year of college. She explained to me how she has been contemplating what we had been teaching her and had several very thoughtful questions.

Although I filled several pages answering her questions, there was one question that is best answered in person. She wanted to know if we had any personal experience with loss or suffering and how our worldview actually made a difference. Although it was short notice, we invited her to join us for Thanksgiving, and she did!

We spent an incredible three days with RQ. We had lots of fun and ate delicious American food. We also had deep meaningful conversations which stretched past midnight most of the nights she was with us. We shared some of our emotional stories, Kaitlyn shared how our father worked even through her losing her dad when she was a teenager, and RQ also shared her story in greater detail. We were all crying together.



This year we were able to find an imported 8 kg (17 lbs) turkey for Thanksgiving!



Since homes in China don't have ovens, all we have for baking is a big toaster oven that would have a hard time fitting a turkey. Thankfully, a western restaurant near our home was willing to roast our turkey for us. They roasted it along with little potatoes and stuffed it with chestnuts.

It was so delicious!

Dear Pastor McNeil and Pleasantview Baptist Church ,

What a season of thanksgiving and testimony we've experienced here in Brussels! God has been moving in powerful ways, and we're excited to share what He's been doing through Église Baptiste Biblique.

Thanksgiving Celebration

For the first time, we rented an outside venue to host our Thanksgiving celebration—and what a day it was! Despite the cold and snowy weather, we gathered with abundant food and even more abundant laughter. We welcomed several visitors, including one of my neighbors and some returning young adults. What blessed me most was watching our church family truly take ownership of this event, diving into the planning and preparation together. It was a beautiful picture of the body of Christ working in unity.

A Decade of Faith Rewarded

This month we lost one of our church members, but his story is a beautiful testimony to God's faithfulness and our church family's perseverance in love.

Sammy started attending with his wife about 10 years ago. He would faithfully announce, "I'm Jewish and don't really believe in God," yet he kept coming to make his wife happy. Our church simply kept loving him. Over the years, he painted our church, participated in outreaches, contributed to our Christmas offering for the Bethesda Home in Ivory Coast, had his baby dedicated here, and never missed a Sunday. When asked if he was ready to get saved, he'd smile and say, "I'm getting there."

Two years ago, Sammy was diagnosed with stage 4 colon cancer. We prayed him through surgery and multiple rounds of chemo, but especially that he would surrender to Christ. This September, with no treatment options left, he came to say goodbye before we left for furlough.

While we were in the States, my dad developed a serious infection that threatened to delay their return. I called to tell them Sammy was failing, praying they'd make it back in time for one more conversation. Then Saturday afternoon came the call we'd been praying for: **Sammy had accepted Christ as his Savior!** His wife wanted to share the news at our Thanksgiving celebration so the whole church could rejoice after a decade of prayers.

Dad recovered just enough to fly home. They went straight to see Sammy in the hospital before he was transferred home for hospice. He passed away the Wednesday before Thanksgiving.

His funeral filled our church beyond capacity—people sat upstairs, in the fellowship hall, even watched from the nursery. The church family prepared food, cleaned, decorated, and served his family with such love and grace. After ten years of faithfully loving Sammy toward Christ, they got to celebrate his salvation and minister to his grieving family. I have never been prouder of our church.

Looking Ahead: Christmas Family Experience

We're now preparing for our Christmas Family Experience with the theme "Jesus is the Greatest Gift." We'll present a play alongside various activities, games, and crafts to celebrate the birth of Christ with families in our community.

CROSS-CULTURAL MISSIONARIES TO SPAIN AND LATINOS

December 11, 2025

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year from the Roses!

We've had a record number of salvations in 2025 through the various ministries, both in the US and in Spain! As we've detailed in other letters this year (*please let us know if you don't receive our email updates!*), we continue to work faithfully with the Spanish speaking people in St Joseph and Cass County, Michigan. We average around 20 people on any given Sunday and feel strongly that we can't leave this flock without a shepherd in order to return to the other side of the world and to start over again. **Please pray with us that God will help us develop leadership for the ministry in Michigan.** We are thankful that God has kept the door open in Spain for us for the next 10 years through the successful renewal of our residence cards and trust that He will allow us to finish this work before beginning another. The church we planted in Cartama, Spain continues strong and is one of the ministries that benefits from the mission groups that we take over to serve periodically throughout the year. For 2026 we already have a group from Michigan scheduled for June with the possibility of three other future groups as well! We have seen God use these group trips in the lives of participants who come from the US to **further their love and burden for missions**, and not only that but **also to encourage and strengthen the nationals** and their churches in Spain. In addition to other activities, there are important ministries that our groups do including:

***Evangelistic sports tournaments** with decisions handed over to church plants for follow-up

***VBS programs** which the church plants often don't have the resources or workers to do, yet they receive the contacts of the participants and work to pull them into the church.

***Tract/flyer distribution** After one of our groups handed out flyers/tracts in the streets of a target town, the local worker had three new visitors in their service the very next Sunday and within months was holding their very first baptism service and renting their first location! It would have taken the missionary weeks, if not months, of work to canvas the town with the literature that our group handed out in a matter of hours. We also distribute tracts in completely unreached towns to seed for future church plants.

The group we hosted this past summer was our 5th group so far and not only has this ministry had a great impact but it is also something we feel we will be able to continue to facilitate in the future, whether from a "home base" of Michigan or Spain.

As we enter into 2026 with challenges and opportunities, we ask that you would continue to pray for our family and ministry. Especially pray for our planning and preparation for the mission group that we are bringing to Spain in June, the possibility of taking a group from the US to Senegal for a basketball camp outreach, and the opportunity we have to do an evangelistic soccer tournament for migrant workers in northern Michigan that could possibly reach up to 1500 farm workers in the month of August- date TBD based on the harvest! One of our current challenges is a low support level and **we appreciate your partnership with us through prayer and financial support now more than ever**. God always provides for our needs. Thank you for the part you play!
