

Sorry that this letter was a little late. We were having technical difficulties. Purchased a new laptop and printer.



Bible Distribution

Since the pandemic, God has opened the door to work with our local police in distributing God's Word in schools and gang prevention projects that are held in our region of Honduras. In the past 3 months, police have distributed more than 10,000 New Testaments!

A Wedding and Baptism

Walter and Suyapa have been attending the church in Danli for the past year. Walter received Christ as his Savior during last year's mission's conference. Walter and Suyapa were able to get married last week. The very next day, instead of going on a honeymoon, he and his new wife were in the services and he followed the Lord in believer's baptism.



Heavy Rains Destroy a Bridge

Pastor Pedro Avila is the pastor of the work in Los Robles. The only way in to that community of 3,000 people requires crossing a bridge. Recent heavy rains swept away the only means of entering the area. The church was not able to hold services as there was no way for the pastor to get to the church building. Praise the Lord, local leaders installed a provisional zipline to get supplies into the community. We were able to get a few hundred dollars of provisions to the 12 families cut off from stores. A provisional path across the river is now available but only safe to use if it doesn't rain heavily.

Would you continue to join with us in prayer as we study the possibility of starting a Christian school in Danli? We have had several meetings with the ministry of education to advance toward starting this ministry to reach and educate the children in our area.


Here is how your church can help us encourage our USA missionary families:

Perhaps the most neglected aspect of conversion to the faith is the lack of discipleship of the new believers. As volunteers, we teach these students values education. We also requested the Gideons International to distribute New Testament Tagalog to all graduating students (Grade Six) in all these schools. Victoria and I both graduated from OCES and NEBES respectively. Mr. Lito (on the right) was orienting the students at NEBES the importance of reading the Bible and shared the Gospel as well. We also had the opportunity to share the Gospel to the students through the Christmas Story. **Pray for the students that the Gospel seed**

We were privileged to be able to attend the Fires of Evangelism Conference at Christ Baptist Church in Muntinlupa. This was the church who spearheaded the Zambales: Mahal Ka ng Diyos (God Loves You) evangelistic crusade in our province last May.


Due to the frenzy of All Souls Day remembrance, the cemetery park decided to lower my mother's vault after November 1st. The day arrived. As the cemetery workers prepared the burial site, Victoria shared the Gospel to Fred who worked there. We went to the mission church at Santa Cruz, Zambales. We held our monthly evangelistic meeting for children and adults. I led in opening prayer while the national pastor preached. We distributed rice and clothes from a donor as relief efforts for a recent typhoon. Located in a coastal area, Santa Cruz is vulnerable to typhoons passing through the West Philippine Sea (WPS). WPS is under dispute with China whose Navy ships continue to surveil the place for possible expansion of their territorial waters. **Please pray for China's aggression in WPS to stop. Please pray for the safety and protection of the Philippine Navy stationed there as well as the Filipino fishermen who are often harassed as they make a living.**

When we arrived, we met three men who were ready to hear the Gospel—and ready to be saved. What a blessing to witness their openness to the truth and their desire to place their faith in Christ! One of these men, Abraham, has been a familiar face for many years. He faithfully attended our men's fellowships but had never taken that step of trusting Jesus Christ alone for salvation. 
Light of the World



Dear Friends and Family

Thanksgiving is almost here—our very favorite holiday of the year! There is something special about a celebration with no pressure, no endless parties, no concerts every night, and no frantic gift-buying. Thanksgiving simply means *family, friends, football, and food!*

Although Thanksgiving is a North American tradition, many Dominicans have joined in the joy of setting aside a day to express gratitude and gather around a table filled with good food. When we first moved to the DR, you couldn't find a turkey in any grocery store. And if you happened to stumble across one, the price alone forced you to choose between turkey or a simple chicken! Today, turkeys are more available—still pricey—but worth every peso!

When we pause to reflect, we realize we are never short on reasons to be thankful. Your prayers, encouragement, and generous financial support constantly uplift us. Looking back over 2025, we see a mix of wonderful days, uncertain days, hard moments, laughter, discouragement, and everything in between. But through it all, we found joy—joy in serving the Lord and joy in knowing that we were being faithfully supported by our friends and family back home.

IBERS is currently walking through a season of transition. Transitions can be discouraging, but they are also necessary. Our calling as missionaries is to raise up leaders, hand over the work, and follow God to the next place He opens. Please continue praying for Pastor Mota and the church family in Ramón Santana as they step into key leadership roles—from worship and sound ministry to Children's Church and discipleship groups.

Las Palmas Christian School began the year with 488 students, and we continue to pray for God's provision in staffing. We are still seeking a Math teacher for grades 7–9, and Lynn has been filling the gap since the first day of school. We will also need a 6th grade teacher in February and a Science teacher for grades 7–9. Looking ahead to the next school year, we will additionally be searching for a first-grade teacher. On top of this, the school has faced electrical challenges requiring a full wiring upgrade across the campus—a costly but essential improvement. We are trusting that the Lord will continue to provide the resources needed to keep the lights on and the fans turning!

Paul reminds us that trials *will* come, but even in those trials we can be joyful. Our joy does not depend on our circumstances because our hope is anchored in a God who supplies all our needs and never fails us. We are deeply grateful for His grace, His mercy, and His faithful provision throughout this year. And we are grateful for *you*. Your prayers, love, and sacrificial giving allow us to continue serving. We could not be here without you.

Still, I willingly wanted to obey God and be His vessel. So, fearfully, I took each ordained step. I made the decision to follow, but maybe not with a joyful, love-filled heart for the place and people to which we were called. Duty and obedience were my driving forces.

As we took the first planning trip to our new place of service, I was both sad and afraid. With tears falling, I followed a veteran missionary as she walked and laughed with these unique people. I was amazed at how she was filled with joy in the journey as she sloshed through mud-filled alleys and paths. I was thinking, "I'll come here but I'll never love it like she does."

When we finally arrived on our field of service, the fear started disappearing while I lived and walked among a people I desperately wanted to know. One monsoon day, while walking to a friend's house to meet her and take her with me to a Bible study, I was soaked by the heavy rain. After much hesitation, my friend decided she would go with me, so we walked arm in arm in the rain, laughing all the way. It is one of my most favorite memories of living among the people God called me to love. The Lord filled my heart with love for her (and many others) and with joy in being with them.

My greatest Christian life lesson is **blessing follows obedience!** God blessed me with a great love for His people - who are now mine too.

describe my God. I believe that God has an infinite and innumerable host of names (descriptions) for Himself, His Son, and the Holy Spirit. My list only amounts to a tiny segment of the number of names that He has and has let us see. However, the main purpose of making the list was to help me understand how big my God is. As a good pastor friend of ours in Jacksonville, FL, Pastor Bill Forde, says, "I serve a BIG God!" If you have any doubt as to God's infinite power, glory, and majesty, look in His Word! In every page, its Author's hand is seen.

Most of the names of God on the list are quotes from the King James Bible where He directly refers to His name. Some additional names are Bible conceptions or descriptions formed into common English or Latin words, like *the Potter*, *the Great Physician*, or *the Omnipotent One*.

God has a name for every walk, every struggle, and every season of life. No matter what you are going through, you will see that God is the God of that trial and tribulation. God is the God and Father of all!

Personally, my favorite names of God are *the Arm of the LORD* and *Jehovah*. The Arm of the LORD is described in the Bible as Jesus Christ being the strength and reach of God. Jehovah or Yahweh is the proper name for God in the Bible and means *the Eternally Existing One* or *the Self-Existing One*. Then, I cannot finish without saying, "Jesus—what a wonderful name!"



Abundant blessings and encouragement are the sentiment of the past couple of months. Since the retirement of our missionary partners in June, the work continues. We still miss them greatly, and they remain a source of help and guidance in our transition to fully lead this ministry forward. **This is a new chapter in our ministry** and for us as a family. At one point, there were three missionary families working together here. As God has moved the others on to other fruitful ministries and callings, we remain. It is my earnest prayer to build upon the strong foundation that has been laid before us and as we follow the Lord's leading, to see more people come to the Lord, the church to become stronger, and for the believers to grow in their walk with the Lord.



A tremendous and unexpected blessing came in October. Our family car which fit all of us (barely), broke down a while ago. We had been using the church van as our main vehicle in the meantime. As it turned out, **God provided us the money to purchase a van**, through the faithful giving of God's people. What a blessing! Now, we have a vehicle that we all fit in much better!

Another unexpected blessing happened. This one is filed under **God turning a curse into a blessing**. A supporting church in the States had to dissolve. They decided to send their remaining funds to their missionaries. So, we received an unexpected check! At the time it came in, we had a large tax bill due of which we didn't know how to pay, but God provided!



In November we had the privilege of hosting the World Baptist Fellowship Mission Director Joey Bacon and his wife Julie in our home for a week. It was such a wonderful time of fellowship and encouragement, not only for us, but for our church people as well. We truly experienced an adventure while they were here including an earthquake, an almost volcano, a broken-down van on a desert road, **pig brains, fish eyes, chicken hearts**, wind so strong it literally knocked us over, and churros from a Brazilian entrepreneur. Despite all that, God was with us the entire time. Bro. Joey preached for us on Sunday and Wednesday, and they both spoke to our men and ladies Sunday School classes respectively and sang for those services as well. Though we are still tired from that week, we are spiritually refreshed and encouraged to go forward. Bro. Joey Bacon has recently started a podcast, and he interviewed our family for the third episode. You can find it on Spotify, Apple, Amazon and other podcast platforms. It is called "Abounding with Joey Bacon". For more about this story, watch the video update included with this letter.

Please continue to pray for our health. My (Tim) kidney stones and gout have cleared up and I'm feeling normal again. I have an appointment with a specialist in December to go over things. Our son **Isaac is set to have major surgery on December 8th** to remove a scarred portion of his bowels. This is related to his Crohn's. We are praying everything goes smoothly, that his recovery won't be too difficult, and that this will help ease some of the issues he has been having.



Prayers answered...

God has been so good to us. You may recall from our last letter that we had several medical needs. I would like to update you on those needs as well as our return to the field. I am very happy to say that I have made it back to Chile. And it's been an interesting return. First of all, the Chilean leadership did a wonderful job during our absence. There are even a few new faces in the congregation! Many in the church are talking about and asking prayer for those to whom they are witnessing. It is so joyful to see the church move forward without the presence of the missionary.

However, just a few days after our arrival, we received a message from our daughter that Caden, our youngest with Crohn's, was not doing well. As the days progressed, he got progressively worse. He ended up losing twelve pounds in two weeks and considering how small he already was, this was a big concern. He had been bedridden the whole time and throwing up so he hadn't consumed any food in almost two weeks. We decided that Tiffany needed to make an emergency return and fortunately, we had enough miles to get her a free round trip ticket. When she arrived, she talked with the doctor, and they quickly did some lab work. When the results came back, the doctor called and she had to take him to the ER immediately. There, it was determined that he needed to be hospitalized. During his stay in the hospital, more tests were done, and it was discovered that the new medicine that he had been taking was not working. From the outside, it appeared as though it was working because of the steroids that he was on as well. As the steroids decreased, the internal inflammation began to grow and impacted one of his internal organs which was causing the vomiting. He was in the hospital for several days and Tiffany stayed with him the whole time. They increased the steroids to get the inflammation under control and are going to try a different medicine which is incredibly expensive and requires pre-approval from the insurance. Once again, God answered our prayers, and the insurance has approved the medicine. The first three doses must be given intravenously, once a month for three months. Afterwards, it is a bi-monthly injection that he will have to administer himself. We are so grateful to God that Tiffany was able to make the return trip to help him through this difficult time. We are also extremely grateful to you for all the extra financial help that many have sent. When I wrote the last letter, I had no idea that Caden would end up in the hospital for several days, but God did. Please continue to pray for Caden's health. His first infusion is scheduled to happen in the next few days, and this medicine does present the risk of side effects. Pray that all would go well. Pray that God would continue to provide. Pray that Tiffany will have a safe trip back to Chile. Please pray also as I, and eventually Tiffany, get back into the ministry side of things here in Chile and pray that we would continue to see souls come to Christ.



Dear Praying Friends,

Greetings once again from Arlington, Texas.

I wish you all a Happy Thanksgiving.

On the medical front, I've had some more unexpected positive progress. I was diagnosed with Type 2 Diabetes about 8 years ago, but medications were proving to be ineffective. My doctor recently prescribed some antibody tests that confirmed I actually have a form of Type 1 Diabetes known as LADA (Latent Autoimmune Diabetes in Adults). This leads to a more aggressive approach to treatment including insulin to help get it under control, which will be a huge help going forward.

Regarding my need for a surgery to repair the incisions from the surgery I had in Croatia, we're finally approaching the end of that journey.

The surgery was delayed due to me getting a stent after finding a 99% blockage in a major artery. Since I had to start taking blood thinners, any further procedures were delayed by a minimum of two months.

One more unpleasant procedure is needed in preparation for the surgery and that has now been scheduled for December 11th. I'm hoping to get the surgery done very soon after. Please pray for that. It's the last thing on the list that I need to have done, and I can finally see the finish line. Praise God!!

Next, I need to tell you about a great blessing. A friend recently loaned me his car and as I was running some errands I reached a certain intersection near our church at precisely 3:05. That's when I saw a mass of humanity crossing the street from a local high school - an enormous group of teenagers that were gathering at Walgreens to await rides from relatives. I immediately realized they constituted a captive audience! Knowing they must do this every day, I returned the following day and spent time preaching on that street corner as they crossed over. The day after I went back to pass Gospel tracts and talk to them about Jesus as they walked by.

Would you believe there are over 150 of these precious high school kids there every single day! I went back again a couple of days later to give out a different Gospel tract and speak to them some more. I've now ordered more tracts of different types so I'll be ready for them on December 1st when they return to school. I'm praying the Lord will enable me to reach some of these precious souls while I'm here. At the very least, the Lord is giving me the chance to plant a lot of Seed! Glory to God!

Thank you so much for your prayers, understanding and continued support as I near the finish line on this medical journey. Please continue to pray that God will be glorified through it all.

Greetings from the Dominican Republic!

We have reached the holiday season which means there is always something going on! I appreciate everyone who checked on me during Hurricane Melissa. Fortunately, it was only a tropical storm when it hit us so the damage was minimal. We did, however, have multiple days off from school due to heavy rain. That extra rest was a blessing, and I am thankful for it.

We recently finished the first quarter of the school year at Las Palmas. I was able to meet with the parents of several of my students and I walked away from each meeting with a slightly heavy heart. The thing about the Dominican Republic is that it is a very religious country. Some might even call it legalistic. Many believe God's grace is only granted to those who can work hard enough to "earn" it. Others associate anything religious with a long list of do's and don'ts that they will never be able to follow so why should they even try? As I met with parents and listened to their concerns, I was saddened to hear that they believed their child's issues were due in part to a lack of faith on their part. Maybe if they were better God wouldn't be punishing their kids. I watched their shoulders sag with undue shame and the hopelessness that flashed in their eyes.

A friend of mine recently asked me, "What is your higher calling: missionary or teacher?" This question rushed to my mind as I met with these parents. My ministry is not simply to teach English to a bunch of little niños. It is to share the truth of the gospel with them. To show them that God's grace and love does not change when they fall short of perfection. It is to minister to the hearts of their parents who have entrusted me with their kids. I am a missionary first and teacher second.


Speaking of kids, our youth group is thriving! On any given Friday night, we can have anywhere from eighty to a hundred kids. These kids are searching for truth. Many are even asking to be discipled without us having to seek them out. We have several who have gone from timid new believers to bold leaders in their friend groups, and it has been a joy to watch. However, with such great things inevitably comes great opposition from the enemy. We have faced some major battles in the last few weeks. Most of the time I return home from youth group absolutely exhausted because it feels as though I have been in a battle for hours. Sometimes when I read of the compassion Paul had for the people he was ministering to, I can relate. When he talks about being willing to endure hard things so they can have a chance to understand the mystery of the gospel, I get it. My circumstances cannot be compared to Paul's. But I understand his desire for them to know Christ like he does so they can have the same kind of hope and peace that he experienced.

As we approach the holiday season, my calendar is already full. I ask that you be in prayer for the spiritual emphasis week that is coming up at Las Palmas. Pray for open hearts as the gospel is shared with our students. I also ask that you pray for protection for our youth group from the things that are coming against us. And please pray for our missionaries at DR Vision. There are many who are sick, many who are facing difficult situations with family in the States, and many who are simply discouraged. We know God is greater. But that discouragement can certainly be loud at times. Thank you for your continued partnership with these ministries! May God continue to bless you!

The past weeks have held a mix of transition and travel. We have been grateful for how the Lord has sustained our family despite some unexpected turns as we prepare to return to Japan in about seven weeks.

After our apartment flooded last month, an air quality test revealed toxic black mold growing in the air resulting in **a sudden need to move**. We were able to move into an open unit in the same apartment complex. Since our home assignment time is short, we have kept our setup lightweight. This made things much easier for the move!

Meanwhile, our stateside efforts are still going full force. We continue to have **conversations with people pursuing ministry in Japan** and are working to develop more relationships with churches in the Atlanta area for partnership. Recently, we were very encouraged by meaningful interactions at the International Conference on Missions in Atlanta (Nov 20-22). Kris Wilson who helps us in the U.S. has been instrumental in getting us into this conference, allowing us to connect with many people that are learning about the mission field.

We are continuing to focus on stateside work (recruiting, fundraising, and reconnecting) and looking forward to **spending Thanksgiving and Christmas with stateside family** for the first time in seven years. At the same time, friends and church people in Nagoya have been messaging us in anticipation of our January 5th return to Japan. We feel torn between two worlds. There will be many details to figure out after we get back including

relocating the church and assisting in my mom's transition. Please be praying for us as we are in the "in between" that we can stay focused on the work at hand while adequately planning for the next season of ministry.

This is the next phase of our 16×30 initiative: planting a church in each of the 16 wards by 2030. Our prayer is that this new location will become **a hub for ministry activity and future church plants across Nagoya** to see lives transformed by the Gospel.

To launch this downtown work, we are praying for a **Church Re-Launch & Outreach Fund of about \$108,000¹** to position this downtown church for long-term impact. This is above our regular monthly support and will be used for:

- **Expanded first-year outreach and support (about \$50,000):** media and video ministry, evangelistic events, gospel materials, and discipleship resources.





Happy Thanksgiving, Prayer Warriors!!





Thank you, Pastor, for your generosity and faithfulness to our ministry!!





"A neighbor (Joey) invited me to go to church and listen to the sermons. As I went, I gained more understanding, faith, and confidence.

Dear Ministry Partners,

Although we live and serve outside the U.S.A., where the climate, holidays and customs are sometimes different than in the States, Thanksgiving and Christmas continue to be special times of the year for Antonia and me. We are thankful for our salvation, as well as all that God does for us, and we celebrate the entrance into this world of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, that made our lives and ministry possible. Of course, we look forward to virtual online celebrations with our family in the States, but we also look forward to a wonderful Christmas celebration with Antonia's family, as well as our church family, here. Indeed, it will be a sweet time, because it is all about Jesus Christ, regardless of where we live. Having said that, please allow me to share some specific blessings we are thankful for right now:

Personal blessings:

- ◆ Last month we had a health scare as we thought that I had been diagnosed with melanoma cancer. However, the doctor confirmed that the mole that she removed was not yet malignant. **We are thankful** for the health God continues to give us as we serve Him here.
- ◆ **We are thankful** to still have Antonia's parents with us. They are both in poor health, but it looks like we will spend another Christmas with them, if the Lord permits. Please pray for them.
- ◆ **We are thankful** that my parents are still somewhat healthy and serving, although at a much more limited capacity, in their retirement. I ask that you pray for their financial situation, since they lost quite a bit of support since they left the field.

Ministry blessings:

- ◆ **We are thankful** for the different opportunities that God gives us to share the Good News of salvation with the lost. Besides our personal witnessing and canvassing, in October the ladies at the church held their **Pink October Breast Cancer Awareness Campaign** at the city park, handing out useful medical flyers as well as Gospel tracts to the many people that regularly come there. The ladies also recently had an evangelistic "tea gathering" at the church, to be a blessing and witness to many ladies in the neighborhood. Then In December, the men of the church will be hosting an evangelistic barbecue for professionals and business owners in the area, where we will offer not only a free barbecue, but also the plan of salvation to all who come. Please pray for these evangelistic projects that we are doing to spread the good news of salvation. And pray that souls will be saved. We have had a bit of a dry spell as far as apparent decisions, but we trust the Lord's promise in Galatians 6:9, "...in due season we shall reap, if we faint not."
- ◆ **We are thankful** for the funds that God has provided through many of you toward the Matching Funds Building Campaign for the church here in New City. Construction goes on and it looks like we will be moving into the back part of the building by January. - ◆ **We are thankful** for the opportunity God has given us to be able to teach online classes in the Fundamental Bible Baptist Institute in Arembepe, in the State of Bahia. What a privilege and awesome responsibility to train and prepare laborers for the ministry! Please pray for more students, laborers, and qualified teachers.

Of course, **we are thankful** that God has continued to provide the regular financial and prayer support that we need, and for your important partnership in this work. May the Lord bless you as we continue to serve Him together, and may He grant you a blessed Thanksgiving celebration!



This year has gone by so fast! We have been on the field now for over nine months, and at times we feel as though we have just arrived here. God has done many incredible works over the past nine months, and it has been beautiful to watch Him do so. In October, the people who attended our Thursday night Bible Study started asking and unanimously voted to start meeting on Sunday mornings as well. We were thrilled to hear that they desired this and began meeting on Sunday mornings November 9th. The owner of the lodge and his family are some of our most faithful attendees. In October, I met with him about what it might cost to add a Sunday meeting, to which we agreed on a total \$300 a month rent. During that meeting we discussed a question that I asked during the Bible Study: "If you were to die today, where would you spend eternity?" He was unsure of the answer and had been asking himself the question over and over for a couple of weeks. I explained to him how he could know for sure that he would be in Heaven when he died. He then prayed and asked Jesus to save him from his sins. Please keep him and his family in your prayers!

WHBM Partners,

On October 1st, I headed to South Asia for the month. Our first stops were Abu Dhabi and then Delhi, India, where we met with the staff. After some briefings, we moved on to Manipur to try to visit our headquarters there, as well as our Myanmar staff. This was a tricky trip since we had to cross the DMZ between the hill people and Imphal.

We flew into Nagaland first and immediately ran into trouble over alleged P.A.P. violations. After being detained for 11 hours, we were finally released—for about 15,000 rupees. Once we got out, we continued toward Manipur, only to be detained again at the border. This time, we were held in a rooftop holding cell under armed guard for half a day. Once again, our wallets saved the day. Thankfully, that was the last checkpoint we had to report to. From there, we went around the checkpoints through the jungle while the staff drove.

After five long days of travel, we finally arrived at the WHBM headquarters in Manipur. We held our first camp there and saw 187 people trust Jesus Christ as their Savior—praise the Lord! We were only able to stay three days before receiving word of potential fighting, so we left early and began a dangerous road trip to Assam. After three more days of travel, we reached our WHBM headquarters in Assam. Following staff meetings and camp prep, we headed deep into the jungles along the Bhutan border. Two days of jeep travel and several mud-bogging adventures later, we reached the point where vehicles couldn't go any farther. From there, we hiked 12 miles into our first village. Only about 80 people live in this remote area, and we were able to share the gospel with all of them.

After finishing our village camps in Assam, we made our way to Sikkim. A three-hour flight and two days of driving brought us there. Once we met with the staff, we began

Nepali camps among Nepal Buddhists. The Lord blessed our efforts, and we saw many come to faith! After four camps and several ministry expansion projects, the month was over and it was time to head back to the States.

God blessed us with 11 new church plants and many salvations. Our staff is now doing one-on-one follow-up with those who responded to the invitations. We were also able to organize three more WHBBC campuses, open three more APFG Children's Homes, and add nine new members to the evangelism staff.

We arrived home safely—praise the Lord!—though I spent most of November battling Dengue fever. Thankfully, that's behind me now. We've also been able to retrace our route and deliver Bibles to all the new believers in the villages we visited.

After the holiday season, I plan to hit the road to report and share a video of our trip. Thank you for your faithful support of WHBM. We love y'all!
