Ashland family,

There are so many exciting updates to share this month as we move forward together in ministry! On January 5, I met again with a team to continue planning an intentional shepherding system for the congregation. This is not quick work! Progress continues behind the scenes, and I look forward to sharing more information in the months to come. A huge thank you goes out to Bob Borom, Herman Lightsey, Sally Lowery, Rosemary Sanders, and Cindy Ward for their participation and input!

We continue to make progress toward the installation of a new digital sign. Late last year, we were approved for a \$10,000 grant from the Columbia District Board of Congregational Development. We are waiting to learn how large a grant we will receive from the South Carolina Conference Committee of Congregational Development. A huge thank you to Kim Gordon for her hard work on this!

I would also like to update you about children's and youth ministry and technology. At its January 5 meeting, Ashland's Staff-Parish Relations Committee agreed to split the full-time Director of Programs role into two part-time positions: Director of Children and Youth Ministry and Director of Technology and Communications. These positions have been advertised on school and conference job boards and shared directly with individuals who have the gifts for these positions. We have heard back from several interested candidates.

In the meantime, volunteers have been leading all tasks related to technology and children's and youth ministry. The children are learning ways to practice prayer on Sunday evenings, and the youth have several upcoming events including Revolution (Jan. 30-Feb. 1), Home Works (Feb. 28), and a summer mission trip that is in the works! Marissa Harris has also begun teaching the kids music on Sunday afternoons!

I would also like to share good news about the Path service. As many of you know, I have been coordinating music and musicians for that service for the past 6-7 months. One of the musicians who has consistently shared her time and gifts in recent months, Alena Crowley, will be stepping into the role of Path Music Director beginning February 1!

Finally, Ashland was founded on the belief that at least 10% of what the church spends should be spent on missions. Some of this mission work is through the budget, while much of it occurs through special offerings and collections from Sunday School classes and other groups. In order to track our progress toward this goal and to affirm and celebrate the numerous ways Ashland is in mission, please make sure to report any missional giving by your Sunday school class, circle, or other group to Karen Zobel, Ashland's financial secretary. We will report monthly how we are making progress towards this mission's goal!

Making a Gift Tax-Free With an IRA

If you are 70 ½ years old or older, you can take advantage of a simple way to donate to Ashland and receive tax benefits in return. You can give any amount up to \$111,000 per year from your IRA directly to a qualified charity such as Ashland without having to pay income taxes on the money. This is called a qualified charitable distribution (QCD). A QCD counts toward satisfying your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) for the year.
