Dr. Sun Yat-Sen Classical Chinese Garden

Located in Vancouver's Chinatown. Dr. Sun Yat-Sen Classical Chinese Garden is a registered museum and one of Vancouver's top tourist attractions. It is a unique venue for cultural programming including guided tours, concerts, festivals, exhibitions, receptions, and educational programs.

English Bay & Vancouver's West End

Vancouver's premier urban beach and the West End is perfectly situated between the city's best-loved and most popular destinations. The world-famous Stanley Park (and its wrap-around seawall) is literally the West End's backyard. English Bay makes the Pacific Ocean accessible to everyone, year-round.

False Creek

An exceptional region to walk and cycle around, and home to some of Vancouver's top attractions. Take the Skytrain to Science World station and walk the south side of False Creek all the way to Granville Island. Take the False Creek Ferry boat back.

An exciting 30-minute unique 4D flight simulation ride & film experience located at Canada Place.

Rent a kavak or paddleboard at Vancouver Water Adventures (www. vancouverwateradventures. com) and finish your day with a wonderful dinner at the Dockside Restaurant within the Granville Island Hotel.



















Grouse Mountain

Grouse Mountain - the best year-round mountain attraction offering downhill skiing, mountaintop skating, and snowshoe trails in the winter, along with its Refuge for Endangered Wildlife with resident Grizzly bears, world-famous Lumberjack Show, and Birds in Motion demonstrations in the summer, and year-round gondola rides, Theatre in the Sky, restaurants, and unparalleled views of Vancouver. New this year, the Blue Grouse Gondola features 15 towers, 27 eightperson cabins and an average trip time of 5.5 minutes, allowing the new lift to operate at a capacity of 1,000 people per hour. In addition, the North Shore's only lift-accessed Mountain Bike Park, and a new alpine, gravityfed Mountain Coaster are both set to open in spring and summer, respectively. www.grousemountain.com

Stanley Park

One of the largest and famous public parks in the world, surrounded by a beautiful 10-kilometre seawall with stunning views. 

Georgia Street

Georgia Street was named in 1886 after the Strait of Georgia, and ran between Chilco and Beatty Streets. After the first Georgia Viaduct opened in 1915, the street's eastern end was connected to Harris Street, and Harris Street was subsequently renamed East Georgia Street.

In recent years, Georgia Street features the Paradox Hotel, home to Mott 32, one of the world's top Chinese restaurants, and The Shangri-La Hotel (the city's tallest building), Vancouver Centre Mall, Fairmont Hotel Vancouver and upscale shops like Lululemon, Gucci, the HSBC Canada Building, the Vancouver Art Gallery, the Hotel Georgia, Pacific Centre Mall, Vancouver Centre Mall, the Granville Entertainment District, Scotia Tower, and the 1.1 million square foot office space for Amazon.com Inc. 

Stanley Park



The gem of Vancouver, this 1,000-acre park was established in 1896 smack-dab in the centre of the city (Map B). Spanning 404 hectares (1,000 acres), Stanley Park is home to a variety of wildlife and tree species including towering hemlock, fir and cedar. Beyond the spectacular scenery, the park offers attractions for the entire family. vancouver.ca/parks/parks/stanley (Map A)




Stanley Park has been Vancouver's favourite urban playground for as long as the city itself has been in exis- tence. When members of city council convened for their second meeting on May 12, 1886, just five weeks after the city was incorporated, high on the agenda was the matter of a civic park. Council drafted a petition asking

the government of Canada to hand over the 1,000-acre military reserve located on the peninsula of land jutting into Burrard Inlet at the "First Narrows". The federal government complied, and in October, 1888, Governor General Lord Stanley came to town to dedicate the park. In the rest of the country, Stanley is best known for donating the silverware that became the National Hockey League's championship trophy. Here in Vancouver, he is known for the park that bears his name.



The city's founders prided themselves on their farsight-edness. Urban parks were, and still are, considered the hallmark of a progressive community. But more than community spirit motivated these pioneer politicians, who were mainly merchants and land speculators. By forestalling the possibility that the military reserve might ever be sold off as real estate, they were protecting the value of their own property investments elsewhere in the city.




Then, the park was designated a Government Military Reserve in 1859 in preparation for an expected American attack. Horses would have been used for related logging and building.

Between the 1860s and the 1880s extensive private logging took place in Stanley Park. Some of the trails in the park were first cleared for logging. Oxen were used to remove the logs, but horses carried humans and supplies.

Touring The Park Now

Discovering Stanley Park by horse-drawn tram (an open carriage, easily accessible from both sides, with rows of seats facing forward) is a unique and memorable experience. Sitting in the open air, protected from rain by the tram's forest-green canopy and from cold by red plaid, wool blankets, the visitor relaxes while learning about the historical and natural features of the area, listening to the clip clop of the Gentle Giants' hooves and inhaling the fresh scent of cedar and the sea.

In the early 1980s, AAA Horse & Carriage, then a fledgling company, reintroduced horses to the park after a thirty year absence. Through the fifties, sixties and seventies, transportation around Stanley Park was limited to cars and buses. Gerry O'Neil, recently moved from Quebec City, where horse-drawn carriages are popular among both tourists and locals, and his wife, Kathryn, saw the need for an alternative.

Feature Story: Mosaics

Art Under Foot

hether a long-time resident or a visitor, the next time you are walking in downtown Vancouver, take a moment to look down. An exciting discovery is literally at your feet and provides an impressive visual tour of historical and contemporary Vancouver through beautiful mosaic tiles.

Back for its 15th year anniversary, the Downtown Vancouver Business Improvement Association (DVBIA) launched the mosaic public art project aimed at beautifying downtown streetscapes.



n partnership with the City of Vancouver and the Creating Employment Through Art co-op (CETA), the DVBIA commissioned accomplished mosaic artists - Liz Calvin and Bruce Walther - to spearhead the design and production of the mosaics. Calvin became passionate about mosaics traveling through Europe where she attended a mosaic art school in Italy for one year.

alther, a self-employed artisan for more than 15 years, has done numerous stained glass commissions for private residences as well as public art projects, residential tile work, and community mosaic workshops.

The concepts behind the twelve original tile mosaics - each measuring nine square feet and containing between 3500 and 4500 hand cut ceramic pieces - reflects the culture, history and geography of downtown Vancouver.





ach mosaic took approximately 160 hours to create. Calvin and Walther worked with CETA, a collective of artists who are residents of the Downtown Eastside, some of whom are challenged with addictions or mental illness, to develop the mosaics. The group's purpose and philosophy is explained on its website: "Just as CETA pieces broken tile together into a beautiful mosaic, CETA also strives to act as a catalyst for putting lives back together through art and enterprise."

ne of the mosaics tributes Dal Richards; a Vancouver legend. With a career spanning over a half century, and with all of the charisma and style it takes to be a Big Band leader, Dal is an icon of Vancouver's music scene. The success of his impressive orchestra, boasting an amazing five night-a-week 25-year run at the Panorama Roof of the Hotel Vancouver and 25 years of live CBC National Radio broadcasts has led to friends and fans affectionately dubbing him Dr. Swing.



Some of the other mosaics feature historic Granville Street's entertainment district awash in the neon glow of the 1950s, The Hudson Bay Company circa 1670, tributes to notable architecture including the 1929 nurse from the Art Deco Georgia Medical Dental Building, and the Princess Marguerite II, a historic steamship, passing under the Lions Gate Bridge.

Vancouver's West Side


Point Grev

Stanley Park

The crown jewel of Vancouver's nearly 200 city parks, Stanley Park is a 400-hectare (1,000-acre) evergreen oasis connected to the city's West End by a narrow strip of land. An 8.8-kilometre (5.5-mile) seawall surrounds the park's perimeter offering breathtaking views at every turn and making it a hotspot for cyclists, runners, walkers and rollerbladers. Recently named the world's best city park by TripAdvisor, Stanley Park is home to wildlife, beaches, the Vancouver Aquarium, a pitch & putt, water park and miniature railway. Other landmarks worth visiting include the Stanley Park Rose Garden, Prospect Point Lookout, the 9 O'Clock Gun, Siwash Rock, Lost Lagoon, the nine totem poles at Brockton Point and the Stanley Park Hollow Tree, a 700 to 800-year-old western red cedar tree stump. Designated a National Historic Site of Canada, Stanley Park is deserving of an itinerary unto itself.

VanDusen Botanical Garden

This Vancouver garden will inspire you with 22 hectares (54.4 acres) of elegant landscapes representing a range of ecosystems found in such places as the Himalayas, the Mediterranean, the Louisiana swamps and the Pacific Northwest. VanDusen Botanical Garden's stunning Visitor Centre, with its orchid-inspired design, is an iconic building and a model of sustainability.



Queen Elizabeth Park

Queen Elizabeth Park, Vancouver's horticultural jewel, is a major draw for floral display enthusiasts and view-seekers. At 152 metres (499 feet) above sea level, it's the highest point in Vancouver and allows for spectacular views of the park, city and North Shore Mountains. The 52-hectare (128-acre) park is home to an arboretum, and a gorgeous quarry garden with a collection of exotic and native trees and sculptures, including one by internationally renowned artist Henry Moore. If that isn't enough to keep you entertained, the park also features the stunning Bloedel Conservatory and a variety of recreational offerings.

Dr. Sun Yat-Sen

Classical Chinese Garden This garden in Vancouver is the first of its kind outside of China, and is representative of the private spaces within a Ming scholar's residence. With its asymmetrical arrangement of rocks and plants, winding paths and corridors, and views that overlook its courtyards, the garden emulates the rhythms of nature and offers quiet moments for contemplation in Vancouver's historic Chinatown





UBC Botanical Garden & Nitobe Memorial Garden

GImmerse yourself in a world of wild plants at the University of British Columbia in Vancouver. Stroll through the impressive Asian garden with over 400 kinds of rhododendrons, travel the continents in the alpine garden, explore the native rainforest garden, discover food growing techniques, and visit the internationally recognized collections of magnolias and maples. For a unique vantage point take the Greenheart Canopy Walkway, a 308-metre (1,010-foot) aerial trail system which gives you a bird's eye view of the forest canopy ecosystem.

Queen's Park

Queen's Park in New Westminster provides visitors with a wide range of outdoor pursuits. Stay active with a game of tennis, run along the trails, take your dog for a walk to the offleash dog area, enjoy a picnic, or stop and smell the roses in the garden featuring over 600 floribunda and hybrid roses, a gazebo and decorative entrance trellises.





Rocky Point Park

Rocky Point Park is Port Moody's best-known park. A popular destination for hikers of the Shoreline Trail, or a starting point for boaters using the boat launch, Rocky Point has a large variety of amenities including a seasonal outdoor pool, skateboard park and biking trails.



Located in Langley, Sendall Gardens features 1.9 hectares (3.67 acres) of beautiful and unique plants, shrubs and trees. Walk along the nature trails and stop at the two ponds, where several varieties of birds can be found. 
