All alumnae of the Institute of Notre Dame are eligible for this award, except current members of the INDAA Board of Directors, i.e., officers and committee chairs. Posthumous nominations are welcome. Anyone familiar with a potential nominee's qualifications may submit a nomination. The person who nominates need not have an affiliation with IND or the IND Alumnae Association.

Nominations will be open from July 25<sup>th</sup> to September 15<sup>th</sup> this year. Please complete and submit the nomination form. Supporting documentation is not required, but the nominee's résumé, professional bio, LinkedIn profile, and additional letters of support/endorsement may help the committee in their consideration. Only fully completed nomination forms will be considered.
