

In our most recent issue this past winter, I speculated about how we got here and why - how we went from an alumnae association with no school to a non-profit that is now providing tens of thousands of dollars of support each year. I posited that perhaps there was something intangible within the building of IND that made us a bit more driven and fiery than our Baltimore peers. (I know that sounds weird, so maybe just read the whole thing $\underline{\text{here}}$.)

But there is another reason we're here that I didn't mention in the last issue. There is a small group of about fifteen women that have spent countless hours over the last five years getting this thing off the ground. I'm not going to list them (even though I want to) because I will inevitably forget someone, and can you imagine how terrible that would be?! But you likely know who they are. Their names have been (and continue to be) all over our Facebook page, this newsletter, and our website. They were (and are) board members, committee participants, and dedicated volunteers running our events and our Heritage Room. They have taken this school-less alumnae association and turned it into a functioning non-profit. But this small but mighty group of women is tired. Having done so much work over these last five years, they are getting burned out, as anyone would. They have carried us this far and they shouldn't have to continue to carry us as we move forward. They deserve to kick their feet up at the crab feast and enjoy the fruits of their labor! But they can't. Because we don't have anyone to fill their place.

I happened to be on the Board of Trustees when IND closed. And when it was announced we were closing, so many people came out of the woodwork to express their outrage. (Many of the most vocal, ironically, had not recently donated to the school or volunteered their time at any events.) We were asked, "Why didn't you say something? Why didn't you tell us we were in such dire straits so that we could DO something?!" Well, the main reason is that publicizing the fact that we were on the brink of closure doesn't exactly help when trying to attract new students.

We currently find ourselves in a similar position, but now I can actually say it: We are heading down the same road as IND. We ARE in dire straits. We need help. Thankfully, this issue isn't as complex as the ones that faced IND-- we simply need volunteers. The time commitment per year is minimal. Whether you have one hour a month or four hours a year, we have a place for you. And more than just your time, we need new ideas and fresh perspectives. The lack of diversity – both in age and race – in our committees and our volunteer pool is a problem.

I agreed to take this position not because I had a bunch of free time to spare, but because the education I received and the experience I had at IND made me a better person. And I want more girls to have that same experience. Watching this group come together to put a little more "good" into our community — whether it's through tuition support or turkey dinners — helps bolster my faith in humanity. What a different world we would live in, if everyone took a little bit of their spare time to do some good. So if you believe in the work we are doing, and if you believe IND made you a better version of yourself, please reach out and help us keep this ship afloat.

Sr. Kathleen Engers turns 100!

Sr. Kathleen Marie Engers has been a School Sister of Notre
Dame for 74 years. Sister Kathleen graduated from IND in 1943
and professed her final vows as an SSND in 1951. She taught at
Notre Dame of Maryland University for 62 years and was a
communications and drama professor at the University until
her retirement in 2012. She founded Pumpkin Theatre of
Baltimore at the college in 1967 with the mission to "entertain,
empower, and educate" young children. In 1982, following the
dissolution of Notre Dame's drama department, the theater
moved off-campus and became a non-profit organization. Sister
Kathleen remains on the Board of Directors as an Emeritus
member. She was a fervent supporter of the theater programs
offered at NDMU and worked to make her students stronger




The Survey Results Are In!


Almost exactly 300 of you responded to our survey this winter! We don't have the space to show a full summary of responses to every question, but here are some of the highlights.

The results of the survey were discussed at length by the board at our spring meeting. During our first few years as a nonprofit, we were frequently asked why we were raising money and what we were doing with it, so we were glad to see that most now understand our mission. Given the responses provided, we agreed there was no reason to change our approach or frequency of communication. That said, it's important to note the lack of age diversity in the responses. About half of the survey responses were from the classes that graduated in the 60's and 70's. And while those responses are of course important, we don't want to assume that members from other classes would have responded to these questions in the same way. And though it's only a small sliver of the chart shown below, we have been told (both in the open feedback portion of this survey and in person) that we need to do a better job at engaging young alumnae. Moving forward, we will be having more events that we believe will attract younger alumnae, but if you have thoughts or ideas for an event, please reach out! Additionally, we learned that we may not have been doing a good job soliciting for volunteers. Our asks were too broad – people were hesitant to raise their hand to help because they didn't know exactly what they were signing up for. We will be correcting that, with the hope that we will get some more people to help with events and sit on our committees. Lastly, as a reminder, know that we would love to hear from you at any time – not just when we put out a survey. "Do you get enough communication (via email and social media) from us?"





"Do you feel you have a good understanding of the INDAA's mission?"

CURRENT COMMITTEES

Below are very brief and simple descriptions of our current committees. All committees meet virtually via Google Meets or Zoom, so distance is not a barrier to participation! Many of these committees only meet once a quarter, and all of these committees need additional members. MISSION COMMITTEE

This committee ensures our operations and charitable giving are aligned with our existing mission.

EVENTS COMMITTEE

This committee plans and runs our events throughout the year. Signing up for this committee does not mean you need to work at every event. We have some volunteers that only work one event a year.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

This committee oversees the spending and investments of the alumnae association, prepares budgets, and works with our bookkeeper to ensure the accuracy of our financial statements.

MARKETING COMMITTEE

This committee creates The Slate, develops advertisements and graphics, and manages all of our social media content.

NOMINATIONS COMMITTEE

This committee solicits and reviews nominations for awards that are given by the alumnae association. It also oversees the elections of executive committee members on a bi-annual basis.

HERITAGE ROOM COMMITTEE

This committee runs our Heritage Room at NDMU by collecting, curating, and displaying donated items. They also coordinate the open houses and other visits as necessary.

ALUMNAE RELATIONS COMMITTEE

This committee oversees our class agent program, general alumnae outreach, and reunions.

Your Rights as a Donor to the INDAA and The Responsibility of the INDAA Mission Committee

The purpose of the INDAA Mission Committee is to honor the legacy of our alma mater by celebrating our abiding sisterhood, championing education in the SSND tradition, transforming our communities through service and stewarding its financial resources in accordance with the mission.

The INDAA is a public charity that depends on donations from alumnae and friends to sustain its mission. As a donor to the INDAA, you have the right to:

- Be assured that the gifts you make to the INDAA are used to fulfill its mission.
- Be informed of how your donations are used and be aware of the organizations being supported.
- Deduct your contribution from your federal and/or state income taxes, with proper documentation.
- Review the INDAA's most recent financial statements.
- Have confidence that your personal information is kept confidential and is not sold or shared with anyone.
- Ask questions when making a donation and receive a prompt and truthful answer.

As a 501(c)(3) organization, the INDAA has the responsibility to:

- Maintain its charitable purpose and operate to fulfill its stated mission.
- Refrain from benefiting any individual or private entity. This means that the INDAA cannot use funds to benefit an alumna, a family member of an alumna, or any other particular individual.
- Engage in activities that reflect its mission, but not lobby or make contributions to lobbying activities.
- Refrain from endorsing or opposing any political candidates or making political contributions.

The Mission Committee is grateful for the generosity of the alumnae and friends of the INDAA.

Accounting Officer's Report

Our financial position remains strong and we continue to be thankful for the generosity of our alumnae. We are excited to share that a Finance Committee has been established.
