


Dr. Lester Singleton, Invocation and Graduate

His clinical and research interests include early detection and screening for all cancers, local and advanced lung cancers and benign hematology. He has published research on the hypertension, advanced lung cancer therapy and side effects as well as acute Leukemia. A dedicated advocate for cancer patients, he derives a great sense of fulfillment from helping patients and their families navigate the therapies and complications.



Dr. Jose Bordon is the CEO and founding chair of Washington Health Institute.

Dr. Bordon's main interests are focused on the holistic health needs of patients, physician education and research. Dr. Pim Suwannarat, Chief Medical Group Genetics Institute




Dr. Grace A. Loudd, Associate Professor of Social Work Texas Southern University


