Dr. Angelo D. Moore is the Assistant Director, Community Outreach, Engagement, and Equity (COEE), Duke Cancer Institute, where he provides overall direction, coordination, and implementation of DCI's community impact-designed projects to reduce cancer outcomes disparities. He is an Adjunct Associate Professor at University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill School of Nursing, serves on the America250 Health & Wellness Advisory Council, National Black Nurses Association Board of Directors, UNC-CH School of Nursing Alumni Board of Directors, and numerous other committees. He received his BSN in 1995 from Winston-Salem State University, MSN in 2002 from Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences, and PhD in 2010 from the University of North Carolina at

Chapel Hill. He served 25 years in the U.S. Army and retired as a Lieutenant Colonel. Dr. Moore was awarded the Presidential Award from Duke University in 2021.

Virginia Bradford has been an RN in the community for 47 years, including various aspects of nursing, as well as Community Health Educator. She has been recognized for her work and community service from organizations such as the National Council of Negro Women /Women of Vision, AKA's Outstanding Achievement in Health, County Judge Executive's Millennium Maker Award Nurse of the Year, Barnetta T. Cosby Medicine Award from St Stephen Church. Instrumental in the Kentucky African Americans Against Cancer, a volunteer community-based organization part of the

Kentucky Cancer Program, she is the Coordinator/Cancer Control Specialist for KAAAC and the Coordinator for the Harriett B. Porter Cancer Education & Research Endowment.





Keith Crawford, MD

Dr. Crawford joined PHEN in 2019. As Director of Clinical Trials and Patient Education he is responsible for implementing programs in these areas working with patients and PHEN partners. Dr. Crawford has over 20 years in the Life Sciences. He completed his graduate and post graduate training at Harvard Medical School; was selected by Robert Wood Johnson Foundation as a Harold Amos Fellow and was funded by the Department of Defense, to develop antidotes for chemical and biological weapons exposure, as well as, creating a high throughput platform for the

detection of biological weapons and emerging infectious agents. Dr. Crawford is a graduate of Prairie View University, University of Texas Medical School in Houston (Medical Doctorate) and Harvard University (Doctor Philosophy) studying cell biology and immunology.

Victor J. Taylor currently works as a Security Guard for FRC East Cherry Point, NC. He is a US Army Veteran, retired from the North Carolina Department of Public Safety (Prisons), and served as the former Alderman for the City of New Bern. He is the founder and Chairman of Men Empowered for Christ Group, member of the Old North State Medical Foundation, member of Zero Tolerance to Prostate Cancer, and Zero /Us Too Group. Victor serves as Chairman of the Salvation Army Advisory Board, member of the Department of Social Services Advisory Board, and member of the

State Employees Credit Union Advisory Board. He has received the John A. Larkins Award (Highest Human Services Award for a State Employee), Craven County MLK Humanitarian Award, NC Special Olympic Humanitarian Award, Craven County NAACP Community Service Award, and the Craven County Unsung Hero Award. His goal is to ensure No Man has to die from Prostate Cancer by Educating them on the importance of Early Screening and Early Detection Saves Lives. His Motto is U-Can-Cer-Vive.
