Shahnjayla Connors, PhD – Assistant Professor of Health & Behavioral Sciences - University of Houston – Downtown

Dr. Connors is a transdisciplinary educator and researcher with training in cancer biology and public health. She has professional experience in molecular biology, implementation of clinical trials, health disparities research, and increasing diversity in science, technology engineering, and math (STEM). The overall goal of her research program is to develop and disseminate culturally relevant interventions to ensure equitable access to cancer treatment in minority populations. Her current research project explores breast reconstruction determinants and decision-making in African American women.



Rayne Rouce, MD – African Americans and Clinical Trials

Dr. Rayne Rouce is a physician at Texas Children's Hospital in the Texas Medical Center in Houston. She completed her residency training in Pediatrics at UTMB, where she was honored as the Resident of the Year from 2008-2010, and was also recognized as the Outstanding Overall Resident in 2010. She remained at UTMB, later completing a Chief Residency there, where she also worked as a hospitalist and received an award for excellence in resident teaching. Dr. Rouce then relocated to Houston and graduated from Baylor College of Medicine after completing the Fellowship Program in Pediatric Hematology/Oncology at Texas Children's Cancer

Center. Dr. Rayne Rouce is an avid volunteer, and has volunteered for several years for programs for children with cancer and other life-threatening diseases.



Triple Negative Breast Cancer Among African American Women

Dr. Teshome is an Associate Professor of Breast Surgical Oncology at the University of Texas M.D. Anderson Cancer Center where she is a clinical breast surgeon with expertise in the surgical and multidisciplinary management of breast cancer. She serves as the Program Director of the Breast Surgical Oncology Fellowship Program and committed to training the next generation of leaders in Breast Surgical Oncology. Her research interests are in the surgical management

of breast cancer, the impact of neoadjuvant treatments on local therapy in breast cancer and disparities in cancer care.

Paula Johnson is the Bureau Chief for the Harris County Area Agency on Aging (HCAAA), an agency imbedded within the Houston Health Department. Dr. Bennett received her doctorate from the University of Houston. She loves math. She has spoken all over the country and in Canada and has co-authored mathematics textbooks. She has written many articles and contributed to chapters in various mathematics periodicals and textbooks. She was featured in MD Anderson's first commercial ad campaign, "Making Cancer History". Dr. Bennett was the only MD Anderson patient who did the groundbreaking for the Mays Clinic Breast Center. She has serves on the Department of Defense's Breast

Cancer Research Panels as a breast advocate. She is the founder of Reconstruction of a Survivor serving the greater Houston-area. The mission of the organization is to improve the lives of those impacted by breast cancer through support group sessions that address the spiritual, emotional and physical wellbeing of breast cancer patients.


