Community members also had the opportunity to participate in fitness classes led by SL8 Fitness, a local gym that partnered in the event to promote health and wellness through movement and community engagement.

Adding to the vibrant atmosphere was a live performance by Mariachi Los Claveles, a talented youth mariachi group from Woodland, dedicated to preserving and promoting the tradition of mariachi music through education, performance, and cultural enrichment. Their music brought energy, culture, and celebration to the event and was enjoyed by attendees of all ages.

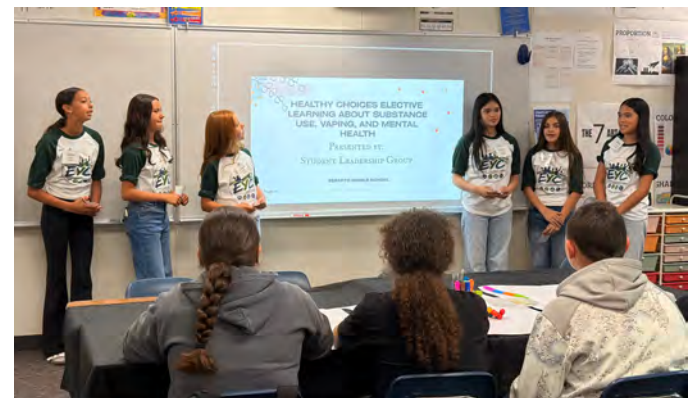
RISE Leadership Group Hosted Their First Community Forum!

Capay Valley Business Spotlight



Rooted in Family: Circle Z Floral & Farms blooms

There's a building on Yolo Avenue in Esparto with a history as layered as the arrangements inside it. Opened in 1913 as a bank, it has since served as a doctor's office, a salon and a home décor shop. Today, it's home to Circle Z Floral & Farms — and for owner Kelly Currywood, stepping into the space feels like something that was always meant to happen.

“We would come here with our grandmothers when it was a salon,” Currywood said. That sense of memory and continuity runs deep at Circle Z, where nearly everything traces back to family.

The name itself tells the story. Circle Z was the branding iron used by Currywood's grandparents, the Zentners, when they ran livestock on their farm. Her grandmother, Judge Myrtle Zentner — bronc rider, model, county judge and, by all accounts, a force of nature — first used the brand for Circle Z Candy, which Currywood's mother still carries on today. When Myrtle passed, Currywood and her mother decided they were done waiting. The floral farm came next.

Currywood spent years as a wedding planner in Southern California before later working in Napa and Sonoma. When she and her husband returned to the area and started a family, she wanted work that didn't pull her away every weekend. Flowers, it turned out, were the answer. She began growing specialty blooms — peonies, lilies and dahlias — and selling them at farmers markets. Soon, customers began asking if she could create arrangements. The business quickly grew from there.

The storefront has been open just under two years, but it reflects work Currywood has been building for much longer. Inside, visitors find fresh floral arrangements alongside hand-made goods from local makers — wood pieces crafted by her father, hand-painted silk handkerchiefs, artwork and other one-of-a-kind items. Currywood makes a point of featuring products from community members and works with other local flower farms, sourcing California-grown blooms whenever possible.

The shop also has a playful side. At Halloween, the building's original bank vault becomes a haunted attraction. At Christmas, the entire space transforms for the season. Currywood describes the aesthetic as a kind of wonderland — a nod to the way she and her family experienced her grandparents' farmhouse growing up.

For Currywood, the throughline is simple: her grandparents kept their door open, neighbors dropped by and the community was always welcome. That's the spirit she's trying to carry forward.

“If they have a vision, we can make that come true,” she said of her customers — whether it's a last-minute Mother's Day bouquet or a custom arrangement for a special event. Walk-ins are welcome, and Currywood is also available by appointment for off-site events and occasions.

Circle Z Floral & Farms is open Tuesday through Friday from 10 a.m. to 3 or 4 p.m., and Saturdays all day.

As the school year comes to a close, we are proud to celebrate several outstanding members of the RISE team for reaching incredible educational milestones. These graduates have not only dedicated years of service to supporting youth in our community, but they have also shown tremendous commitment to their own personal and professional growth. 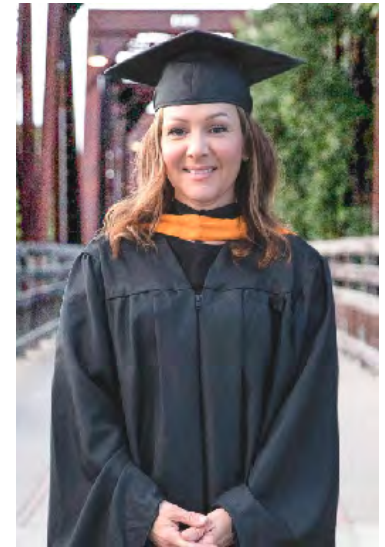

Seasonal Recipes

Using ingredients sourced from farms in the Capay Valley
From the kitchen of Pamela Bateman

Boysenberries with Rose Geranium Custard Sauce

- 3/4 cup milk
- 1/4 cup heavy cream
- 3 or 4 fresh Rose Geranium leaves
Pelargonium graveolens *
- 2 1/2 tablespoons raw honey
- Pinch salt
- 2 eggs
- 2 cups fresh boysenberries



In a small saucepan over medium heat scald the milk and heavy cream then remove from the heat. Add the Rose Geranium leaves and let steep for 5 minutes. Remove the Rose Geranium leaves and discard. Add the honey and pinch of salt stirring until the honey is dissolved.

In a separate small bowl beat the eggs until slightly frothy and then add them to the milk mixture. Return the pan to medium low heat and cook the mixture, stirring with a wooden spoon, until the mixture thickens and lightly coats the back of the spoon or until the temperature reaches 170-175 degrees. Do not allow the mixture to boil. If it starts to heat too quickly move the pan off and back onto the heat stirring continually. The custard will thicken but should still be pourable. Remove from heat and strain the custard into a bowl to remove any small lumps.

Serve the custard warm or chilled over the boysenberries.

* Rose Geranium, *Pelargonium graveolens*, is a rose scented geranium that will add a delightful floral note to the custard.
