### Protect Yourself, Family (including pets) and Neighbors in the Heat

Yolo County officials are reminding all county residents to take measures to protect themselves when the temperature is very hot, especially vulnerable populations which include: individuals over 65 years of age, children under 4 years of age, those who work outdoors, people who are overweight and those who are ill or may be on certain medications that can affect their ability to handle fluids.

Fortunately, cooler night time temperatures will bring some relief during this heat spell, but residents who do not have adequate air conditioning may experience heat-related problems during the day. Those residing in homes without adequate air conditioning should find a friend or relative to stay with during the hottest parts of the day, or another location in the community where air conditioning is available, such as a public building, shopping center, restaurant or movie theater. Residents are urged to protect themselves during hot weather by taking the following precautions:

- Drink extra non-alcoholic fluids, especially water
- Stay cool indoors in air-conditioned facilities, especially during the hottest part of the day
- Pace yourself and avoid heavy exertion in the heat
- Wear lightweight, loose fitting clothing, a broad-brimmed hat and sunscreen
- Avoid hot foods and heavy meals
- If you become lightheaded, feel confused or experience any other symptoms of heat exhaustion, get to a cool area until you feel better
- Never leave a person or animal in a parked car; temperatures inside a vehicle can rise to dangerous levels in minutes
- Don't forget pets that also need extra water and shade
- Check on vulnerable neighbors who may need assistance.

### Reglas y Reglamentos del Cementerio de Capay

(En vigor desde el 1 de enero de 2005, revisado el 17 de enero de 2011 y revisado el 12 de julio de 2011)

Por favor ayudenos a mantener la belleza del Cementerio de Capay observando y siguienda esta reglas y regulaciones:

1. Las flores cortadas or artificiales frescas or las plantas envasadas en envases, las cestas o los floreros hechos del plastic o de metal se pueden colocar un pie delante de la lapida o del monument. Las flores artificiales que se desvanezcan, se desgasten, se marchiten o presenten una apariencia desagradable seran removidas y desechadas por el personal del cementerio en el momento de la siege. Los arregios del soporte vertical deben estar a un pie de la parte delantera de la lapida y deben estar pesados o asequrados en el suelo.

Flores y banderas especiales para los siguientes dias festivos; Dio de la Bandera, Dia de los Caidos, Dia de los Veteranos, Dia del Trabajo, Paxcua, 4 de Julio, Dia de Accion de Gracias, Navidad, Dia de Todos los Santos, Cinco de Mayo, Dia de los Muertos, puede ser colocado **una semana antes de la fiesta y debe ser reovido una semana despues las vacaciones**. Si la familia no lo retira dentro del plazo de una semana, el personal del cementerio lo retirara y desechara.

Ni el Distrito del Cementerio ni su personal son responsables de ninguna perdida, robo o dano incurrido en cualquier cosa de naturaleza movil colocada en la tumba por las familias.

- 2. Las banderas en las tumbas estan permitidas **una semana** antes del Memorial Day, el Dia de la Independencia y el Dia de los Veteranos. Las banderas deben estar en buenas condiciones y deben ser removidas dentro de **una semana** del dia festivo. Los banderines dejados en su lugar seran removidos por el personal del cementerio.
- 3. Las velas votivas encerradas en ricipientes de vidrio se permiten durante la semana del Dia de Todos los Santos o el Dia de los Muertos **SOLAMENTE y DEBEN** quitar se una semana despues de las vacaciones. Tambien deben asegurarse para evitar ques las ardillas de tierra las vuelquen.
- 4. **Estan estrictamente prohibidos los siguientes tipos de adornos**: Pinwheeles, Globos Whirly-gigs, Velas, Molinos de Viento, Banners, Juguetes, etc. Todas las formas de contenedores alcoholicos estan prohibidas y seran removidas inmediatamente por el personal de cementerio.
- 5. No se permiten estructuras como arcos, bordes de metal, plastico o ladrillo, cercas, piedras o rocas. Ellos interfieren con el mantenimiento de cementerio.
- 6. Se pide a los clientes que deseen plantar arbustos, arbustos or colocar bancos que asistan a una reunion regular del Distrito y presenten su solicitud a la Junta para su aprobacion. Las reuniones se celebrant el segundo miercoles de cada mes en la Casa de Bomberos. En este momento no estamos permitiendo plantar nuevos arboles hasta que podamos manejar la destruccion causada por los viejos arboles de crecimiento y tambien las condiciones de sequia.
- 7. Se permiten las lapidas que sean compatibles con las lapidas existentes en el cementerio. Cualquier lapida excepcionalmente grande debe tener la aprobacion de la Junta de Cementerio antes de la compra y las instalacion. Las familias seran responsables por los constos de mover piedras dobles para un Segundo entierro si es necesario.
- 8. Su mascota o mascolas son bienvenidas en el cementerio, siempre y cuando limpiar despues de ellos.
- 9. La Junta se reserva el derecho de enmendar, cambiar o revocar estas reglas y regulaciones, en cualquier momento o cuando la occasion se presente.

10. El Cementerio de Capay está planeando un día de limpieza comunitaria para el 22 de julio del 2017 a partir de las 9:00 de la mañana y todo el día".

### Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation "Breaks Pavement" on Hotel Expansion at Cache Creek Casino Resort

With community members, neighbors and local leaders looking on, leaders of the Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation "broke pavement" for the long-needed expansion of the hotel at their Cache Creek Casino Resort. Up to 459 new rooms will be added, as well as a pool, restaurant, additional meeting space and a multipurpose ballroom. "This expansion is an incredible opportunity for our entire community," said Leland Kinter, Yocha Dehe Tribal Chairman. "We will finally be able to invite more of our guests to stay, saving trips on the road, and offer more rooms and amenities for our neighbors and other local visitors."

The ceremonial "pavement breaking" took place on a small portion of the south parking lot, where the new building will rise. The expanded hotel will be built totally within the existing developed footprint of the Resort, on the site of the original casino and bingo hall. "This is an investment, not just in our resort, but in our region," added Chairman Kinter. "It will generate up to 500 construction jobs over the two year building period, and more than 200 ongoing hospitality jobs when fully operational. Plus, it will be a significant long term community asset as Capay Valley grows as an agri-tourism destination."

"We welcome this important investment in our community by Yocha Dehe and the Cache Creek Casino Resort," said Duane Chamberlain, Chair of the Yolo County Board of Supervisors who represents District 5, which includes the Capay Valley. "Already the largest private employer in our County, the Tribe has been and continues to be an incredibly active community partner, supporting many important programs and initiatives."

Since the Cache Creek Casino Resort opened in 2004, it has consistently enjoyed strong customer support. But, a shortage of hotel rooms to offer guests has been a consistent challenge. "The expansion is a first class project that will help meet longstanding demand of many guests who want to stay overnight rather than drive home," said Tim Bryant, General Manager and COO of Cache Creek Casino Resort. "The addition of new rooms, an event venue, and food and beverage spaces will enhance the Cache Creek experience, better serve our customers and be an attraction for many Capay Valley visitors."

The architecture of the expansion will match the aesthetics of the existing hotel, fit the natural backdrop of the Capay Valley, and incorporate the high quality finish standards demonstrated in the Yocha Dehe Golf Club and Séka Hills Olive Mill and Tasting Room.

### EUSD sets 2017-18 and 2018-19 School Calendars

The Esparto Unified School District Board of Trustees has set dates for the 2017-2018 and 2018-2019 School Calendars. The adopted calendars will allow students to participate in the Yolo County Fair, without missing school and to take courses in the Woodland Community College Summer Sessions.

• Last Day of School: June 8, 2018

The tribal-state gaming compact between the State of California and Yocha Dehe requires the Tribe to negotiate and mitigate off-reservation impacts that result from this expansion project. In addition to mitigating these impacts, the Tribe and County have renewed and extended their historic, voluntary Memorandum of Understanding/Intergovernmental Agreement (MOU/IGA). The original MOU/IGA was signed by both parties in 2002, and served as a model for the rest of Indian Country in working cooperatively with local governments.

The renegotiated agreement will provide Yolo County with \$6.2 million dollars in unrestricted funds annually for the 22-year life of the agreement, and will be adjusted for inflation. These funds can be used for critical county government programs, including rural law enforcement services in the Capay Valley. It also provides a framework for cooperation among the Tribe, County and local community on projects and programs that benefit all.

In addition, the Tribe will pay for two additional County Sheriff's deputies and their vehicles, provide annual funding for enhanced fire service for the area, and commit \$5 million towards road improvements. Also, under the new IGA, the Tribe will provide the local Capay Valley community a direct and annual \$300,000 commitment for enhancements to the area.

The approximately \$200 million dollar hotel project is expected to be complete by December 2018. Further information and ongoing project updates can be found at www.yochadehe.org and www.cachecreek.com.







### **Grilling Safety Tips**

There's nothing like outdoor grilling. It's one of the most popular ways to cook. But a grill placed too close to anything that can catch fire is dangerous. Grills can be very hot and cause serious burn injuries.

### Follow these simple tips and you will be on the way to safe grilling:

- Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.
- The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings, and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area.
- Keep your grill clean by removing grease or fat buildup from the grills and in trays below the grill.
- Never leave your grill unattended.
- Always make sure your gas grill lid is open before lighting it.

### **Charcoal Grills:**

- There are several ways to get the charcoal ready to use. Charcoal chimney starters allow you to start the charcoal using newspaper as a fuel.
- If you use a starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to a fire that is already lit.
- Keep charcoal lighter fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.
- There are also electric charcoal starters, which do not use open flame. Be sure to use an extension cord for outdoor use.
- When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool before disposing in a metal container.

### Facts:

- July is the peak month for grill fires.
- Roughly half of the injuries involving grills are thermal burns.




