\$330 Million Dollar Bill for Rural Broadband Heads to Governor's Desk

The California Advanced Services Fund (CASF) nicknamed Internet for All Now Act of 2017 (AB 1665), passed with overwhelming bipartisan support in both houses. This bill is the result of the successful negotiation of a \$330 million bill package to expand broadband access and digital literacy in communities deprived of a reliable internet connection.

Several past efforts to increase funding to close the connectivity gap between the "haves" and the "have-nots," known as the "Digital Divide," were intensely opposed by the largest telecommunications and cable companies. After a three-year stalemate, this bill represents a cooperative effort between legislators of both houses and both parties, consumer advocates, and representatives from the telecommunications and cable industries to invest in broadband access and rural development.

The CASF does not depend upon General Fund dollars, but instead is funded by a small, existing surcharge on in-state phone bills. The current goal of this program is to incentivize the expansion of broadband infrastructure to 98% of California households. AB 1665 expands this goal to 98% of households in every geographic region of the state. This new

goal creates a target that cannot be achieved by serving urban and suburban areas alone; it will ensure broadband infrastructure projects funded by AB 1665 are focused in rural California.

"Legislative success for the 'Internet for All Now Act of 2017' will help increase connectivity to Californians stuck on the wrong side of the Digital Divide" said Assemblymember Eduardo Garcia. "Internet access has become a passport to health, economic, and educational opportunities. By extending funding into the California Advanced Services Fund we can provide access to this modern day necessity for our state's most vulnerable communities."

AB 1665 is now on the Governor's desk, where the joint-authors will fight to ensure the bill is signed into law. "This is 2017. In today's global economy, having internet access is not an option; it is a necessity. People don't start businesses in areas where they can't even send an email. When we invest in providing internet for all, we are investing in education for all, access to health care for all, and economic development for every community in our State" said Assembly member Aguiar-Curry who represents the 4th Assembly District.

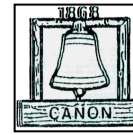

California to debut the California Science Test (CAST)

The CAST is a new exam being included in the California state testing system referred to as the California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP). This new exam will be "field-tested" in April 2018. Principals, teachers, and students will get the opportunity to see this new exam and understand how the exam works. The exam will then be administered in April 2019 as a permanent aspect of the CAASPP exams.

This new exam measures how students perform on Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS). The areas included on the exam are life science, earth science, space, and physical science. Our wonderful teachers have been implementing high-quality science instruction that we believe will prepare our students for this new exam.

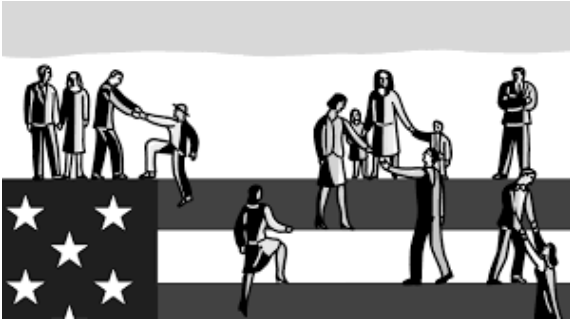

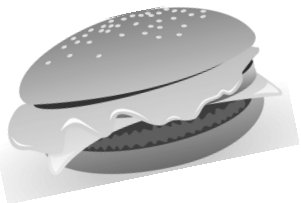

Capay Valley and its People, Mural Project

New Season Community Development Corporation of Esparto is making progress on the community art project “Capay Valley and its People”. The project will engage local artists to submit their artistic interpretations of the Capay Valley with subthemes of History and Culture; Farmers and Ranchers at Work; Families at Play and Scenic Beauty. The chosen art will be transformed into murals on buildings in Esparto under the tutelage of Eduardo Pineda of California College of the Arts and an internationally renowned muralist. New Season and community volunteers will help prepare and maintain the finished art projects.

Muralist Eduardo Pineda conducted a workshop on September 9 which was attended by New Season and other locals. The workshop covered how to prepare buildings for murals. Pictures of the winning murals will be sent for future publications along with bios about the winners. Mural work is beginning now with the artists and the painting of murals to begin early spring.

New Season Community Development Corporation was awarded funding from the California Arts Council which works to advance California through the arts and creativity, www.arts.ca.gov. Supporting funds for this project came from Yolo County Rural Initiative Funds and the Heitman Foundation. Yolo Arts is also supporting the project. 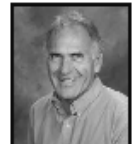

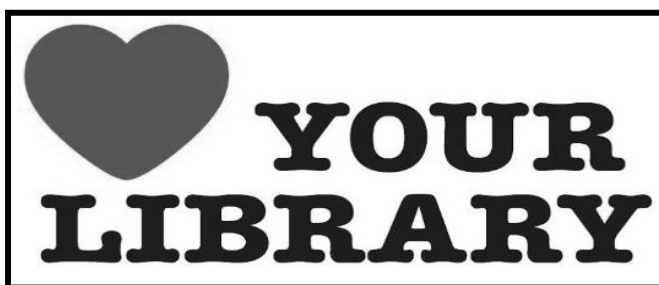

Library Cards Access More Than Books

The value of today's libraries goes beyond books. Libraries help people of any age find what they need to help improve their quality of life. "Our library provides access and programs for students of all ages," says Yolo County Library Early Learning Coordinator Laura Benn. "There is something for everyone and it is all free with a library card."

Early literacy resources and storytimes are offered at all eight branch libraries to encourage school readiness for children ages 0-5 and their families. The education of older children and teens is supplemented with science, technology, engineering, arts, and math (STEAM) based-programs; homework help services; and the encouragement of reading success with the read to a therapy dog programs. The libraries also provide GED resources, including online test preparation resources, for nontraditional students.

Libraries build a foundation for children's future success starting from the earliest stages of development. Librarians play a key role in helping children develop the basic tools for school readiness by teaching families the components of early literacy. Older students can also find tools for success at their local libraries, where they can access high-speed Internet and digital tools, as well as work with trained professionals on how best to use these resources.

As new technologies evolve, libraries continue to lead the way in providing equity of access to digital tools and media, which has become increasingly important in high-poverty areas where students are less likely to have a computer or internet service at home. One way Yolo County Library is trying to bridge the digital divide is by offering mobile Wi-Fi hotspots and chromebooks for 7-day loan. The library also provides free access to high-speed internet both wirelessly and on computers, and offers technology assistance and computer classes at various locations.

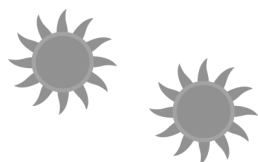
