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Capay Valley Vision Update

When thinking about the future, the only given is that change is inevitable. Recognizing that the best way to manage change is to have a clear picture of where you're headed, Capay Valley Vision began a regional visioning process two years ago. With strong community participation and steady leadership from a diverse, highly committed board and advisory council, a clear picture of what residents want the Valley's future to be is emerging. Linked to this effort, here's a few of the upcoming events and activities CVV is helping to organize.

Transportation Workshop September 15

On September 15, Capay Valley Vision (CVV) will host the third and final workshop this year to present key concepts for public comment that will be part of a long-range vision for transportation improvements throughout the Capay Valley-Esparto Region. The two-hour Monday workshop will be held at the Esparto Community Hall (aka Scout Cabin) starting at 6:30pm.

A Transportation Action Team diversely comprised of community members has met twice since the last workshop in May. Working with a team of transportation planners, the Action Team has been discussing concepts that improve safety and transit while preserving the Valley's rural character. The primary outcome of the project is a regional (I-505 to the Colusa County line) highway corridor plan that establishes a long-range vision for transportation improvements and enhancements throughout the region. The corridor plan will be presented at a public open house in the fall.

We are fortunate to have the ability to help plan for our future in an organized manner. CVV invites and encourages all residents of the Valley to help make the most of it.

Agriculture Task Force

On August 7, area farmers gathered at the Esparto Library to discuss the draft Agriculture Plan for the Capay Valley-Esparto Region. The draft plan outlines key assets and challenges for agriculture in the region and offers a series of interrelated strategies and activities to strengthen the Valley's farms and ranches and preserve agricultural resources. The third annual Health and Safety Carnival is set for Sunday September 28th in the Esparto Park! Activities are ongoing from 11:00 AM through 4:00 in the afternoon. Don't miss it! Its fun and a great family day... and it is good for your health!

The focus of the Health Carnival is to provide free health screening and preventative information along with safety tips and services. Many important health providers and County agencies participate. These include the Sheriffs Department, CommuniCare, the County Health Department, the "Vision Van" sponsored by our local Lions Club, and the "Child Identification Program" sponsored by the Masons. Children have a great time - they can get free dental or vision screenings mixed with viewings of fire trucks, inside peeks at an ambulance, and observations of a speedy rescue boat. There is something for everyone... and it all free.

Stopping in at a health screening booth run by a health professional is one of the highlights of the Carnival. Dental, vision, and diabetes screenings are main attractions. Many folks find they also benefit from blood pressure checks, glaucoma tests, and immunization information. Many of the services are focused on children - this specialty is much appreciated by par-

ents who often like the informal atmosphere at the Carnival. It all free, part of the Esparto Region's focus on good health for all.

This is a *Carnival*, however, so other fun is available at the event! Watch for special activities for the children, including the gold fish toss sponsored by the Esparto After School Program. Cheerleaders are an annual "kick up the spirit" item at the Carnival and clowns or ponies have been known to appear. The "Ballet Folklorico" has always entertained the attendees with both color costuming and graceful dancing. Good food will be provided as well as a relaxed day in the park with local neighbors and friends. Everyone is welcomed.

This event was first organized by the Esparto Healthy Start Collaborative and is now sponsored by RISE (Rural Innovations in Social Economics) Inc., a local non-profit organization in Esparto. 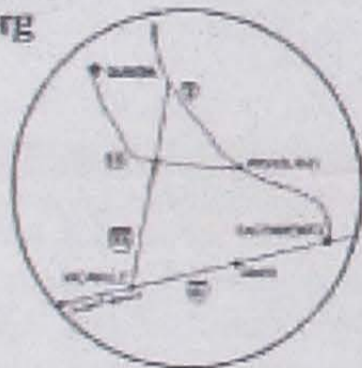

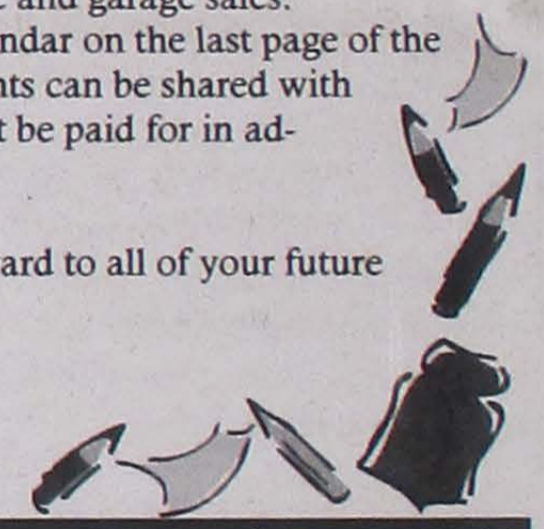
- Calendar entries should contain the name of the event or meeting, date, time and location.

WYORCA Receives Anonymous Donation

The Western Yolo Recreation Center Association (WYORCA) received a \$500.00 grant from an anonymous donor via the Philadelphia Foundation. The grant funds were given to WYORCA for general operating support. WYORCA President Anna Brait stated that the grant "helps WYORCA take steps towards realizing the goal of a community swimming pool in Esparto. The funds act as seed money, enabling WYORCA to sponsor classes such as Water Safety Awareness. In addition, WYORCA will use the funds to develop architectural concept drawings of the planned swimming pool and multi-purpose room so that residents can visualize the facility."

The Philadelphia Foundation is a pool of several hundred permanent, charitable trust funds that have been created since 1918 for one purpose: to improve the quality of life of communities. For more than three generations, people of modest and magnificent means have been turning to The Philadelphia Foundation as their philanthropic partner for investing their charitable dollars. 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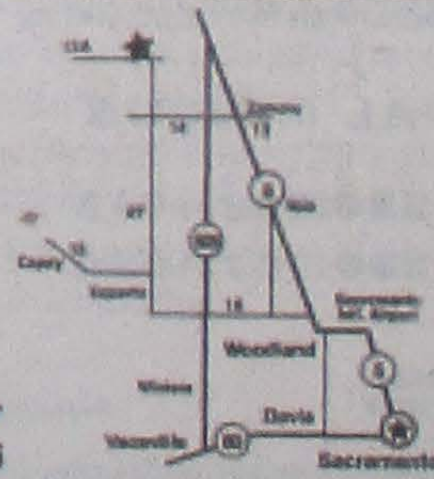

Hoes Down Harvest Celebration set for October 4th & 5th

On the **first weekend of October**, the **Hoes Down Harvest Celebration** in the **Capay Valley** (Yolo County) will promote **sustainable agriculture and rural living** through two fun-filled days of workshops and events. Located within two hours of San Francisco and Sacramento’s busy metropolitan areas, the rural Capay Valley region is home to many **small farms** which supply Northern California’s families, restaurants, and neighborhood grocery stores with fresh organic produce. The Celebration will offer the public a special chance to enjoy rural life and deepen their **understanding and connection to the local food system**.

On **Saturday, October 4th**, the **Harvest Festival at Full Belly Farm** will feature educational farm tours, a magical children’s area, games, live music, local farm products and an abundance of fresh, organic food! **Hay rides**, pulled by a team of draft horses, will continuously tour the farm. **Workshops** will be offered on an array of agriculturally-related topics such as tree pruning, herb gardening, compost-making and more! A **craft marketplace** will showcase farm-made products and an all-organic **farmers’ market** boasts the bounty of the season: fresh picked almonds and walnuts, a huge variety of melons, apples and, of course, pumpkins! The **children’s area** has been described as the “Best in the State” with arts and crafts, storytelling and music, a petting zoo, pony rides, and lots of games and contests -- all with an agricultural theme. Kids will have a chance to watch a cow being milked, make felt out of wool and grind their own corn. Adults also have a chance to join in games and contests; be sure not to miss the **Manure Pitch-Off**, which really lets you get your hands dirty! Over 3,000 people from across the state attended our last Harvest Festival, **California’s premier sustainable agriculture festival**. Admission: \$15 Adults, \$5 Kids (ages 2-17), under 2 free. Camping on Saturday night: \$15 per car. Full Belly Farm is off of State Highway 16, just past Guinda in the Capay Valley.

On **Sunday, October 5th**, a variety of in-depth workshops will be offered on various farms and locations throughout the **Capay Valley**. Workshops will include a tour and tasting at a local vineyard, a guided raft trip down Cache Creek with a focus on regional wildlife, a Slow Food cooking class, gourd decorating, wreath-making, small orchard care and more! The day will conclude with a **Slow Food lunch** prepared by a celebrated local chef, allowing for an appreciation of **fresh, local seasonal food** eaten in community. Admission for individual workshops and the Slow Food lunch is separate and varied. Pre-registration is required. Space is limited so register early!

The mission of the Hoes Down Harvest Celebration is to honor and promote the knowledge of sustainable rural living through inspiration and education. All proceeds from the event will go to benefit sustainable agriculture, local organizations and worthy projects benefiting the environment and rural communities. 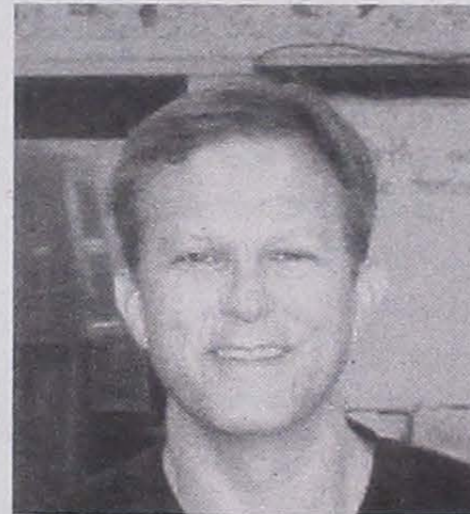
