

## Mondavi Center & Arts for Esparto Sherrie Vann - Principal

In 2016 our small school district had big opportunity! The Mondavi Center School Outreach Committee led by then-chairperson Lynette Ertel, selected the Esparto Unified School District for special attention by the Mondavi Center. Esparto Elementary and Esparto Middle School students were able to visit the UC Davis Mondavi Center for school matinees performed by touring artists.

Over the past few years Ruth Rosenberg, Director of Arts Education and Artist Engagement, has led the project. The field trips to the Mondavi Center to see live performances has largely been funded by California Arts Council grants received by the Mondavi Center. The art education has been enhanced by pre-matinee school assemblies, classroom talks by Mondavi Center volunteer Bob Gonzalez, art workshops, and talks with artists.

In 2019 EMS students were enthralled when speaking to NASA Astronaut Terry Virts, who took more that 300,000 photos in space. They were filled with questions about his experience in space and his art work. Students were also thrilled to share their own artwork from the photography workshop on the huge screen with Astronaut Virts.

The variety of performances and visual arts students have been exposed to has been tremendous. Often performances integrate with existing curriculum in classes like World History by showcasing the culture and customs of world cultures.

2020 will look a little different from previous years, however we will still bring arts to our students! Ruth Rosenberg has worked with artists to launch the Mondavi Center Virtual Events series. In November 4th-8th grade students experience Black Violin with a high energy performance that takes a unique blend of classical music, hip-hop, jazz and pop to new heights. Coming soon for kindergarten through 6th grade is Calidanza Mexican Dance Music and for 7th and 8th grade students Dahlak Brathwaite-Adaptive History.

It has an incredible gift to be able to provide our students with these amazing cultural experiences and exposure to the arts. We are grateful to the Mondavi Center and UC Davis for making these opportunities a reality.

# Valley Clean Energy completes repayment to SMUD

DAVIS, Calif. (November 9,2020) - Valley Clean Energy (VCE), Yolo County's local public electric generation service provider, continues to make significant fiscal strides just 2 1/2 years after its founding.

In October, VCE made its final installment payment to the Sacramento Municipal Utility District (SMUD), reimbursing the utility for its assistance with operating services during VCE's launch in 2018. The \$1.5 million in deferred chares and interest were paid off on schedule, which demonstrates VCE's financial discipline while continuing to offer clean electricity at competitive rates.

"It is with tremendous pride that our board announces the repayment of SMUD's deferred fees," said Don Saylor, chair of VCE's board of directors. "SMUD continues to assist us in our business operations and we are grateful for their partnership."

"Paying off these charges on time is a testament to VCE's fiscal stability and to the wise decisions made by the VCE board in the best interest of our customers."

Added Tracy Carlson, director of customer services and operations for SMUD, "SMUD is proud of our partnership with VCE, and we believe that partnership can continue to bring benefits to VCE's and SMUD's customers for many years to come. We congratulate VCE on meeting this financial milestone."

The SMUD payback is the second major financial commitment met by VCE during its start-up. VCE began its operations in 2018 with \$1.5 million seed loan from its three founding jurisdictions: Woodland, Davis, and Yolo County. Saylor noted that these funds, with interest, were paid back in October 2019, years ahead of schedule.

### Yolo Services to Continue Under New Limited Stay at **Home Order**

As an essential service, Yolobus will continue to provide transit for essential travel and trips.

Woodland, Calif. - The State of California has announced a new limited stay at home order, effective for all counties under the Tier One (Purple) COVID-19 category, which included Yolo and Sacramento Counties. This order covers 10pm-5am and is effective on Saturday, November 21st through Monday morning, December 21st. The intent is to limit travel during these hours to essential workers, and for essential purposes, such as trips for groceries, medicines, and other essential needs.

The Yolo County Transportation District (YCTD) has announced that the current Yolobus public bus service levels will continue to operate. Service already runs at a reduced level between 10pm and 5am and is generally restricted to Yolobus routes 215, 42A and 42B. Under the new limited stay at home order, Yolobus currently does not have plans to reduce service any further than what already exists.


According to the Califronia Department of Public Health, the State's "Limited Stay at Home Order will reduce opportunities for disease transmission with the goal of decreasing the number of hours individuals are in the community and mixing with indviduals outside of their household."

Since late March, Yolobus service levels were modified three times because of COVID-19 to help address changes in available drivers and reduced demand, both due to COVID-19, as well as to help ensure the health and safety of its customers and employees. Services currently being operated are in place to help our customers continue to make their essential trips and travel. All Yolobus services feature enhanced health and safety features, including required face coverings for all travel, driver barriers, and hand sanitizer dispenser on every bus.

YCTD is not ancitipating further reductions in available Yolobus transit services at this time, though there may be a need to make modifications and adapt to future health and safety orders. ## Capay Valley Flora, Fuana, and Farms series From Capay Valley Regeneration

Natural History Lesson from Cedar Waxwings and Toyon Berries: Do Not Mix Drinking and Driving on Highway 16

Winters are generally thought to be gray and colorless, but here in Capay these colder months bring some welcome splashes of color, much of it around our native bush, Toyon. Toyon bushes, which live throughout the Valley but particularly near oak trees, have clusters of berries. They begin to form in the summer, but it is only in the late fall and winter that they ripen and take on a strikingly bright red color. Before this time the berries are toxic to birds, but when they are ripe, the bright color calls for the birds to come sample (and spread the seed). Toyon has had many uses for Native Americans and has been appreciated as a harbinger of the Christmas season, when it looks like (and has been mistaken) for holly.

One avid appreciator of Toyon are Cedar Waxwing birds that migrate into the area also in the fall and winter. These are elegant birds, mostly pinkish-brown and a smooth lemon yellow, but with a rakish black mask, traces of blue in the wings and tail, and bright red waxy droplets on the wingtips. We don't really know the purpose of the these waxy bits, but they seem to attract mates.

Cedar Waxwings are elegant, but their eating habits may be anything but. Margaret Millar in her charming book, "The Birds and Beasts Were There: The Joys of Birdwatching and Wildlife Observation in California's Richest Habitat" describes how cedar waxwings came to her bird feeders and "wolfed" down a mixture of raisins and beef fat, a mixture intended to attract birds like warblers, not vegetarian, berry-eating Waxwings. We have also found, late in the season as Toyon berries start to rot and ferment on the bush, they will gorge on these and then fly erratically, as if slightly drunk. We've been saddened to find a few killed on Highway 16; normally they would not fly into oncoming traffic, but their judgement might have slipped after eating fermented berries. So, the lesson is clear: don not mix drinking and driving!
