# Senior Awards Night at Esparto High School The Class of 2017 Honored at Esparto High School Senior Awards Night

On the evening of May 15, 2017 the staff of Esparto High School joined with parents and community members to recognize the outstanding achievements of the graduating class of 2017 at the annual Esparto High School Senior Awards Night.

The evening began with a welcome from Principal Jennifer Wiese, followed by the presentation of local scholarships. Junior Class Vice President Elizabeth Ibarra emceed the scholarship presentations. This year, sixteen individuals and organizations from around the Capay Valley and Yolo County honored graduates with scholarship funds totaling over \$28,000.

Following the presentation of local scholarships, the class of 2017 was recognized by the staff of Esparto High School for academic achievement and involvement on their campus. Honor cords representing grade point average achievement were awarded to 33 seniors.

Katie Yates received the 2017 Valedictorian award for Esparto High School, and Emily Gonsalves was named 2017 Salutatorian. Both will be featured speakers at the EHS graduation ceremony on June 2. Ruby Virgen was named Esparto High School Female Senior of the Year, an honor that is presented by staff to a senior who has demonstrated outstanding achievement in academics, sports and service to community. The 2017 Male Spartan of the Year was Luke Crabbe. Lizette Torres was honored by staff for her incredible work ethic, and citizenship by receiving the Randy Trettenero Outstanding Spartan Citizen Award. Eduardo Aron Rodriguez was honored as the 2017 Male Athlete of the Year, and Fernanda Diaz was named 2017 Female Athlete of the Year.

Congratulations to all of our graduating seniors on all that you have accomplished over these past four years, and thank you to all of our community donors for your generous support of our students. (See page 9 for a list of award winners.)

# Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation Gives \$1.5 Million to Esparto Community Park & Aquatic Center

The Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation is providing \$1.5 million to complete the Esparto Community Park & Aquatic Center. This donation is the first from the "compact credits" now available under Yocha Dehe's 2016 gaming compact with the State of Califor-

"We wanted to be sure our local community is the first to be supported by the "compact credits," which are a powerful new investment tool," said James Kinter, Yocha Dehe Tribal Secretary. "Many people have worked hard for years to make the Esparto Community Park & Aquatic Center project a reality, and we are pleased to help bring it to completion."

In 2012, the project received a \$2.89 million grant from the California Department of Parks and Recreation for construction. Concerns over resources for maintenance and operations slowed progress until the local community, including Yocha Dehe, created and funded an endowment. Area residents also approved a Proposition 218 property tax assessment to assist in covering ongoing costs.

In 2016, environmental challenges on the original project site threatened added delays. In response, a new 8.6 acre site adjacent to Esparto High School was identified. The center will feature a community pool, basketball court, two soccer/football fields, softball/little league field, walking trail and picnic areas.

"The Tribe's remarkable gift of \$1.5 million will provide amenities for the park such as a pedestrian bridge over Lamb Valley Slough, picnic tables, bleachers, lighting and other park amenities identified during area meetings," said Trini Campbell, a partner in Riverdog Farm. "This park project is the culmination of the concerted efforts of many partners working together for over a decade to build new recreation opportunities for the residents of the region."

The "compact credits" that are the source of the Yocha Dehe funding were a key provision in its new tribal-state gaming compact negotiated in 2016. Using "compact credits," the Tribe can specifically allocate a portion of the annual payments it makes to the State directly to select projects and initiatives in the local community.

# Capay Valley Vision to Host Meeting on the Capay Valley Action Plan

Capay Valley Vision will be hosting a facilitated community meeting on Wednesday June 7, 2017 from 6:30 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. at the Alice Marsh Hall, Esparto High School, 26675 Plainfield Street, about the Capay Valley Action Plan, a planning document that identifies and prioritizes regional needs in the areas of Recreation, Infrastructure, Economic Development, Social Services, Ag Tourism, Education, Housing, Water, Traffic, Safety Services, Community Advocacy, and Communications. Four stakeholder meetings, facilitated by Jim Rix, were held from October 2016 to January 2017 to create a draft Capay Valley Action Plan. Representatives from over 20 community groups participated in the creation of the Capay Valley Action Plan. Examples of community needs identified during the planning sessions include: high speed Internet access, a full service health care clinic, county road improvements, community hall upgrades, and increased hours of operation at the Esparto Regional Library.

The draft Capay Valley Action Plan will be available for review at www.capayvalleyvision.org and at the Esparto Regional Library. The planning project is funded by a grant from the Yolo County Rural Initiative Fund, the Heitman Foundation, and Capay Valley Vision. At the June meeting, community members will have an opportunity to provide input on the priority projects outlined in the Capay Valley Action Plan. The completed document will provide a planning tool for local, state, tribal and federal governments to direct resources to the region. Un documento de planificación que identifica y prioriza las necesidades regionales en las áreas de Recreación, Infraestructura, Desarrollo Económico, Servicios Sociales, Turismo de Agricultura, Educación, Vivienda, Agua, Tráfico, Servicios de Seguridad, Defensa Comunitaria y Comunicaciones. Cuatro reuniones de las partes interesadas, facilitadas por Jim Rix, se llevaron a cabo desde octubre de 2016 hasta enero de 2017 para crear un proyecto de Plan de Acción del Valle de Capay. Representantes de más de 20 grupos comunitarios participaron en la creación del Plan de Acción del Valle de Capay. Ejemplos de necesidades de la comunidad identificadas durante las sesiones de planificación incluyen: acceso al Internet de alta velocidad, una clínica de servicios completos de salud, mejoras en las carreteras del condado, mejoras en los salones comunitarios y un aumento de horas de operación en la Biblioteca Regional de Esparto.

El proyecto de Plan de Acción de Capay Valley estará disponible para revisión en www.capayvalleyvision.org y en la Biblioteca Regional de Esparto. El proyecto de planificación está financiado por una subvención del Fondo de Iniciativa Rural del Condado de Yolo, la Fundación Heitman y Capay Valley Vision. En la reunión de junio, los miembros de la comunidad tendrán la oportunidad de dar su opinión sobre los proyectos prioritarios esbozados en el Plan de Acción de Capay Valley. The Yocha Dehe Community Fund saluted the achievements of its local partners at its ninth annual Partners Philanthropy Luncheon at the Yocha Dehe Community Center in Brooks on May 11.

**Certificates of Recognition** commending on-going excellence in service were presented to:

- •Cristo Rey High School: Cristo Rey delivers an effective and rigorous high school curriculum that shapes under served students into faith filled, educated, professional and service oriented adults
- •Special Olympics Northern California: Special Olympics offers general and special education students the ability to participate athletically on the same playing field encouraging good health and promoting acceptance and respect for all.

The Tahtimihn Award was presented to:

•Sacramento Loaves & Fishes: Founded in 1963, Loaves & Fishes serves as many as 800 homeless people daily offering food, shelter, medical assistance, social services, advocacy, veterinary care, job training, an accredited children's school and more.

The Community Fund is governed by a Board of Directors made up of tribal citizens and supported by government staff. The fund uses philanthropy to enhance the quality of life for Yolo County residents and Native American people, focusing on six funding priorities: Education, Helping People Help Themselves, Native Arts and Culture, Native Health and Wellness, Native Rights and Tribal Sovereignty, and Steward the Natural Environment.

Since 2000, the Community Fund has provided grants totaling more than \$30 million to more than 370 diverse organizations.

# NEW (FREE) JOB READINESS PROGRAM FOR YOUNG ADULTS IN THE ESPARTO AREA



**ALL Leaders Must Serve (ALMS)** is a mentoring organization for young adults age 15-25 with a focus on job readiness and leadership skills

ALMS just completed 2 pilot programs in the Esparto area: a daytime program at Madison High School and an evening program at the RISE Community Services building located at 17313 Fremont St., Esparto. A recognition ceremony was held on May 11 at the RISE building to celebrate the success of the program students in completing the Job Readiness course.

The ALMS program helps young adults learn the soft skills they need to get the job they want and succeed and move up on the job. Our Job Readiness Essentials course starts with career coaching to help students discover the career that is best suited to their unique design of personality, strengths, weaknesses and interests. The program helps students to build confidence in their communication skills and includes workshops on practical skills needed for a successful adult life including personal finances, resume building and interpersonal skills. Students will be introduced to work experience opportunities through volunteerism and internships in their field of interest. ALMS Mentors and staff continue to encourage and support students after the initial course as they work towards their personal and career goals.

This program is designed for any young adult age 15-25 who are no longer in school, recently graduated or currently in high school. 
# **Summer Recreation Activities For Youth in Madison**



# Volunteers needed for the "Alley CCCats" – Community Clean-up Crew June 3 from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.

**Esparto's alleys are a unique aspect of our town.** They have the potential to be a charming asset for our community, but in many areas they have been neglected and have become less-than beautiful. For years, residents have complained about potholes, garbage, and over growth in the alleys. For more than a year New Season Community Development Corporation, a local community non-profit, in conjunction with Yolo County, the Esparto Community Service District and others, have been planning a project to clean up and revive the alleys in Esparto.

In April, a group of volunteers walked through all the alleys in town to see what work needs to be done. The focus was on general appearance and public safety. We found that some alleys are well kept, while others are littered with trash, overgrown with weeds and bushes, and needed general tree pruning. In some cases there are obstacles that could obstruct emergency vehicles' access. The group then set the date for a cleanup.

After this general cleanup, a 12-month timeline will be created to systematically grade and gravel all the alleys. The Esparto Community Service District is working with Yolo County to take over maintenance once they are cleaned. So there will be a plan for ongoing maintenance and upkeep. This will allow for better access by fire and emergency vehicles, pedestrians and school children, and those who have homes whose only access is through the alleys.

We can't wait for County workers or others to care for our community spaces, so we are joining together to create change for ourselves. Bring your tools and join in!

# At least 50 volunteers are needed to make this happen!!

We will also be needing tools: shovels, rakes, brooms, gas weed eaters, chain saws, wheel barrows, wagons, and pruning shears. We will supply gloves, water, and lunch. Waste management will provide dumpsters for green waste, trash, and recyclables.

# What we will be doing?

- General weeding and trimming overgrown foliage
- Picking up trash
- Removing abandoned items large and small
- Pruning trees and bushes that could be in the way of pedestrians or vehicles

# What we will NOT be doing:

- Trespassing or removing things on private property
- Blocking access to anyone's home, driveway or gate **How can you help?**
- Move anything that is in the public alley that you don't want to have removed.
- Make sure that any dogs are secured.



### **Capay Cemetery Rules and Regulations**

# (Effective January 1, 2005; revised January 17, 2011; revised July 12, 2011)

Please help us maintain the beauty of the Capay Cemetery by observing and following these rules and regulations:

- 1. Fresh cut or artificial flowers or potted plants in containers, baskets or vases made from plastic or metal may be placed one foot in front of the headstone or monument. Artificial flowers that become faded, worn, wilted or otherwise present an unsightly appearance will be removed and disposed of by cemetery personnel at time of mowing. Upright stand arrangements must be within one foot of the front of the headstone and be weighted down or secured in ground.
- 2. Specialty flowers and flags for the following holidays; Flag Day, Memorial Day, Veterans Day, Labor Day, Easter, 4th of July, Thanksgiving, Christmas, All Souls Day, Cinco de Mayo, Dio de los Muertos, may be placed one week before the holiday and must be removed one week after the holiday. If not removed by the family within the one week time frame, cemetery staff will remove and dispose of them.
- 3. Neither Cemetery District nor its staff is responsible for any loss, theft or damage incurred to anything of movable nature placed at gravesite by families.
- 4. Flags at the gravesites are permitted one week before Memorial Day, Independence Day and Veterans Day. Flags must be in good condition and must be removed within one week of the holiday. Flags left in place will be removed by cemetery staff.
- 5. Votive candles enclosed in glass containers are permitted during the week of All Souls Day or el Dio de los Muertos ONLY and MUST be removed one week after the holiday. They must also be secured to prevent tipping by the ground squirrels.
- 6. The following types of decorations are strictly prohibited: Pinwheels, Balloons, Whirly-gigs, Candles, Windmills, Banners, Toys, etc. All forms of alcoholic containers are prohibited and will be removed immediately by cemetery personnel.
- 7. No structures, such as arches, metal, plastic or brick edging, fences, stones or rocks are permitted. They interfere with cemetery maintenance.
- 8. Patrons wishing to plant shrubs, bushes or to place benches are asked to attend a regular District meeting and present their request to the Board for approval. Meetings are held the second Wednesday of every month at the Fire House. At this time we are not allowing new trees to be planted until we can get a handle on the destruction caused by the old growth trees and also the drought conditions.
- 9. Headstones which are compatible with existing headstones in the cemetery are permitted. Any unusually large headstones must have approval from the Cemetery Board before purchase and installation. Families will be liable for the costs of moving double headstones for a second burial if necessary.
- 10. Your pet or pets are welcome at the cemetery as long as you clean up after them.
- 11. The Board reserves the right to amend, change or revoke these rules and regulations, at any time or when the occasion presents itself.
- 12. Beginning July 1, 2017 the forgoing rules will be enforced. Anything placed at a gravesite that is not consistent with the Rules will be removed and bagged up and will be stored in the shop. If you find your decorations missing, please call Barbara at (530) 207-7732 and arrangements will be made for you to pick up your decorations.
- 13. The Capay Cemetery is planning a Community Clean-up day for July 22, 2017 starting at 9:00 a.m. and going all day.





This year the normal method to sign up your child, volunteer, and pay is on a new website http://ayso.bluesombrero.com/region1312. Please be sure to attend one of our registration events. At registration you can pay cash or check for registration (if not already paid with credit card), buy a uniform and confirm your child's registration by volunteering in one of many positions: coach, team parent, referee, board member, secretary, field painting, repair goals, field set-up or repair. It is the responsibility and expectation of each parent to volunteer for a position.

Many changes have been made this year in AYSO. AYSO will be changing from a school year registration to a birth year registration in order to align with other American youth soccer program providers interpretation of the U.S. Soccer Player Development Initiatives. The effective date of age determination for registration shall be the player's age as of December 31 looking ahead of the Membership Year. Example: For MY2017 the division the child will be placed in will be determined based on their age on December 31, 2018.

Instead of U6 (under 6), 8 etc. its now 6U (6 and under), 8U, etc. For example if your child was born between 1 Jan 2008 and 31 Dec 2008, then your child is 10 or under at the end of the membership year ahead (2018 for the upcoming signups) and placed in 10U. In other words, determine the age of your child on December 31 2018 and your child will play in the even age division. The old way used July 31 as the date to determine age and the division was under 10 not the current 10 and under.

There are also several rules of the game changes which will be covered later.







