Tuli Mem Park and Aquatic Center Ribbon Cutting Ceremony on May 21

The ceremony was held at 4:00 p.m. and included guest speakers, light refreshments and an opportunity for the community present to explore the park and aquatics center. "This new park and aquatic center in Esparto is the result of community members and agencies working together to create a space for residents to engage in health and wellness activities in their local community," said Yolo County Board of Supervisors Chair Don Saylor. "We were delighted to celebrate the opening of this community asset."

In 2001, a group of community volunteers, formally known as the **Western Yolo Recreation Center Association** (WYORCA), envisioned building a public swimming pool and recreational facility to serve the communities of the Capay Valley. The project gained footing in March 2012 with a \$2.9 million grant from the California Department of Parks and Recreation. In 2015, via Proposition 218 the community approved an assessment to help fund and support the park's maintenance and operations. Now, with additional monetary contributions from Yolo County, the Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation and the Esparto Unified School District, and through the dedication and hard work of local residents and volunteers in collaboration with WYORCA, the park will soon be open.

"The Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation is incredibly honored to be able to partner with the leaders and volunteers of the Esparto and Capay Valley communities to provide funding to help bring the vision of a recreation and swim center here to reality as the **Tuli Mem Park and Aquatic Center**," said Yocha Dehe Tribal Chairman, Anthony Roberts. "By coming together to create projects and community resources like this, we show just how much we can do as neighbors to make this an even better place to live and to raise our children in a healthy environment."

Speakers for the event included Yolo County officials, Tribal officials, local officials, and those who had an important and ongoing role in this project.

The park sits on 8.67 acres in Esparto, off State Highway 16 at the corner of Yolo Avenue, and is within walking distance of the high school and the elementary and middle schools.

The center boasts a wide array of amenities such as: a youth baseball/softball field, a soccer/football field and a full outdoor basketball court; a pedestrian bridge, walking trail and a central gathering area with picnic tables; a wading pool, eight-lane swimming pool and an aquatics building with restrooms, changing rooms, a meeting room, snack bar and indoor and outdoor showers.

The aquatic center's programming will be run by the YMCA and will provide lifeguards and swim lessons for youth and adults, as well as lap swim, water exercises and recreational swim. The aquatic center will be open starting this Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day. The Esparto Community Services District will be responsible for the operation and maintenance of the entire site. 

Yolo County Cannabis Interim Ordinance and **Land Use Ordinance**

Cannabis cultivation in unincorporated Yolo County is currently governed by the cannabis interim ordinance (Chapter 20, Title 5 of the Yolo County Code). The licensing program was initiated in 2016, with the licensed cultivations limited to 78 licensees based on a moratorium established by the Board of Supervisors in October 2016.

The eligible licensees are required to apply for a license renewal each year. The annual license renewals are issued based on good standing and compliance with the cannabis interim ordinance. Not all of the 78 eligible licensees submitted applications for 2019 licenses. As of today, the County currently has 52 licensed cultivators.

In 2018, the County embarked on the development of a Cannabis Land Use Ordinance (CLUO), which is still under way. The CLUO will require that all cultivators obtain a Use Permit to cultivate in Yolo County. The CLUO will be a zoning-based program that will include a discretionary permitting process for obtaining a Use Permit. This will be a public process which will include public notification and opportunities for public participation.

As part of the CLUO development, a Program Environmental Impact Report (PEIR) is being prepared to address, analyze, and disclose the potential environmental impacts associated with cannabis operations in unincorporated Yolo County.

If the proposed CLUO is adopted, all licensees will be required to apply for and obtain a Use Permit to continue operations in compliance with the new set of regulations. Annual licensing will continue to be required for cannabis operators. The schedule for development of the CLUO is as follows:

- June 2019 Release of Draft PEIR
- July 2019 Public outreach and comment period
- September 2019 Final PEIR
- October 2019 Public outreach; Planning Commission hearing(s)

Highlights of 2018-19 at EMS

This year has been full of growth, maturity, and learning for EMS students. I am so proud of the learning they have accomplished and the educations our fabulous staff have facilitated.

This year, staff worked tirelessly to align lessons, activities, and assessments to the California Common Core Standards to better prepare our students for college and career. The staff designed and implemented cross-curricular inquiry based lessons, allowing students to dive into interesting topics that are relevant to them. As a result students were excited about learning. The honors teachers were also honored at Excellence in Education for their work in improving the middle school honors program.

Our improved school attendance and reduction of chronic absenteeism is a significant achievement for all of our students and staff. We all believe that our students must attend today to achieve tomorrow. We worked closely with students and families, often conducting home visits and learning about their barriers to attendance. The district was able to add an additional bus stop/route as a response to community feedback.

Esparto Middle School Saturday Enrichment classes have nearly doubled. We are able to provide 1-2 classes a month to students on topics that range from horticulture to Fibonacci. Often activities and lessons are based on GATE standards. These classes are a healthy, fun, and educational option for students in our community.

Many improvements have been made across the campus as a result of the Yocha Dehe Wintun Nation grant to EUSD, as well as additional grants earned by the district. Students are utilizing the new filtered water bottle filling stations. They are loving the new lockers! Students no longer have to haul around heavy backpacks because they have a secure place to store materials. The new greenhouse, garden boxes, and shed are utilized by students in our horticulture elective as they earn Junior Master Gardener certifications. We look forward to the installation of an electronic marquee to share pertinent information with community members.

With summer here we encourage all families to enroll children in a summer experience. Some options include the Esparto Library Summer Reading Program, swim team/lessons, Academic Talent Search class at Sac State, Woodland Opera House workshop, 4-H camp, karate classes at Kuk Sool Won (Esparto PTO fundraiser), or activities at Woodland Community College. There are many more options in Yolo county. Students greatly benefit from fun summer learning opportunities.

We look forward to the rejuvenation and professional development of summer break and in the fall a brand new school year!

A Rainfall Update

Apparently, a dry April did not indicate the end of the rainy season. Here at Taber's Corner we have gotten almost two inches in May, which has brought the seasonal total up to 36.62 inches. That makes this the ninth wettest year in our 130 years of records. We'll need a little over three-quarters of an inch by the end of September to jump up to sixth. There have been five years of over forty-one inches, and then a cluster of nine seasons between thirty-five and a half and thirty-seven and a half. The record for May is 3.61 inches, which came in 1998, the last time we had a season of forty-one plus inches. Earlier that year, in February, it had rained at a rate of sixtenths of an inch per day.
