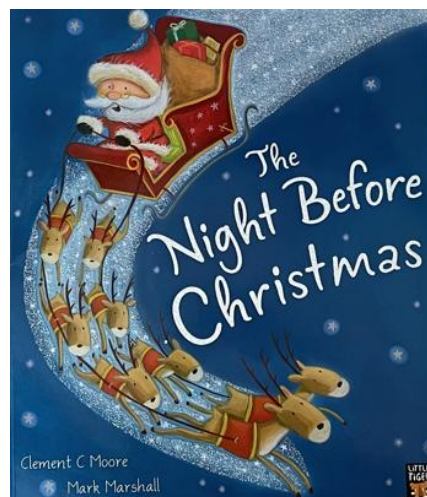
The Night Before Christmas

The Night Before Christmas is a magical introduction to the well-loved stories that are a key part of every childhood. This lovely tactile Touch to See picture book makes this beloved rhyming poem, and its colourful characters, accessible for blind and visually impaired children and it is great to introduce this much anticipated new title into the Living Paintings library later this month.



Our new library addition contains raised illustrations of key characters from the book, all lovingly hand painted by our incredible team of volunteers. We also include braille sheets throughout the book, as well as an audio description which will be completed later this month and the book title will be ready to hit the shelves early December.

Our impact: amazing results from our latest annual Children's Impact Survey

Our Touch to See books and box sets have a far-reaching impact that helps children with severe sight loss fully take their place in our visual world. Here is a little more information

about our latest Children's Impact Survey results, which tells us that for all of the children using our service:

Building confidence

88% say our Touch to See books and box sets have **improved their overall confidence**

Supporting young learners

90% say our service has **increased interest in learning and school work**

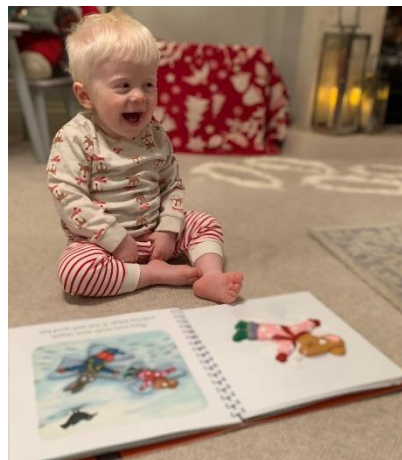
Raising young readers

82% of our young beneficiaries have developed **improved confidence and interest in reading**

Promoting positive wellbeing

78% of our child beneficiaries have experienced a **positive change in socialising and making friends**

87% have benefitted from an **increase in shared experiences with the sighted people** in their lives



In total, we are now transforming the lives of over 5,300 children living with little or no sight in the UK, and we are still seeing weekly growth in our membership. This puts us ahead on our ten-year growth strategy (we've met our target for year five at the end of year three), and our challenge now is to continue building our resources in order to meet unprecedented levels of demand and to ensure that we do not have to turn any child away.

"Interacting with peers in the classroom has always been a struggle mainly because of the level of noise in some activities and visual /physical games have provided barriers. Living Paintings has created a great impact in the inclusion of all. These books have encouraged a love of literacy and an awareness of working together."

"Our son really loves the tactile images with audio – it allows him to 'see' the pictures like his peers do, just in his own way. When doing a topic at school, borrowing the relevant books from Living Paintings allowed him to engage with the school topic and experience it more fully – like his peers.
