Dear Church of the Cross,

For the months of March, April, and May, I will be heading back to the core of our belief. I will be exploring the trinity in these newsletters. Of course, there is no way I can provide a full or filled out explanation in a newsletter. This will be a few thoughts and reflections I have, by no means all encompassing. For the month of March, let us reflect on God.

We have entered Lent. Lent is a season where we are called to reflect, pray, strengthen, and nurture our relationship with God. We remember we are called to love the Lord our God and love our neighbor as ourselves. In Lent we take a season to focus on the first (first part) of this commandment(s). I have found that God is often the first of the trinity for people to talk about, but, in some ways, the hardest for people to connect with.

God, the creator of the heavens and earth. God the producer of miracles, parter of seas, the one who can produce water from rocks and mana from heaven. God, the God of our ancestors, never aging, yet forever eternal. God the essence of being, the I Am. God is so great, so cosmic and wondrous that we as humans sometimes struggle to truly connect with the Lord our God. We get so focused on all these aspects of God, that we miss what God has called us to focus on.

God created the heavens and the earth, then God created humanity. God chose to walk with us. God did not lecture Adam and Eve about the wonders of creation. What we see in scripture is God working to be in true relationship with us as humans. God heard the cry of the Hebrews and lead them out of Egypt as he called Moses. God went with them in the desert, just as God went with Abaraham through the desert.

God was with Samuel when he led the 12 tribes. God was with David when he led as King over Israel. God was with Daniel in Babylonian exile. God was with Esther as she worked to save her people. God was with Ezra as the people returned and they worked to rebuild the temple.

God has worked to always be with us, and continues to be with us today. God connected with Adam and Eve in nature and in the garden. God connected with Moses in isolation, a burning bush, in a cave alone, or a mountain top alone. God connected with Samuel in prayer at the bedside. God connected with David as David worked and was active to care for his people. God connected with Daniel through dreams and prayer. God connected with Esther through prayer and a relationship. God connected with Ezra through worship and prayer. God connected with them all through different ways. Scripture, the Bible, is full of so many ways that God worked, and continues to work, to connect with us. let us not be limited to thinking there is only one or two ways we can connect with God. God has opened, and has always opened, the pathways to relationship.

This Lent let us reflect on our relationship with God. Let us ask, in what way do I connect best with God? What activity, prayer, work, group, idea, do I feel God the best? Do I connect with God and grow my relationship when I pray at the bedside? When I am working and serving a mission or ministry? When I am visiting and sharing God's love with others? When I am singing and playing music, sharing God's love through song? When I am drawing and painting, expressing God's love through art? When I am walking in nature and with God's creation? When I am alone and able to focus and meditate on God? When I read, study, and learn the scripture and its interpretation? Is there another way not listed here that you connect with God? How are you connecting with God this Lent? How are you nurturing your relationship with the Lord?

Have you ever had a time in your life when you felt like you saw the truth of Scripture come alive in front of you? This past weekend, my family really had the chance to watch God at work. So, this past weekend, we had to travel to southeastern North Carolina to pick up our son Aidan due to some health concerns he is having. Our trip down was picture perfect. The weather was great, the temperature was warm and it was just a smooth trip! Our trip home, however, was the polar opposite. On our way home, there was a winter storm warning in 3 of the 4 states that we would be traveling in. When we started our trip, it was windy but sunny and all was ok. We made it through North Carolina and into Virginia with no trouble. However, as we hit the first real mountain slope in Virginia, the flurries started, the wind picked up A LOT, and my car decided it had gone about as far as it cared to go... the engine light came on, it started to spit and sputter, and we slowed down – WAY down! So, the flashers went on and we prayed hard to get to the next exit....then we prayed HARDER to get across the intersection....and then even HARDER to get into a parking spot at the one hotel at that exit. As we pulled into the parking spot (at the top of a hill) my car was done.

I could go on and on about this weekend ... God was in EVERY single detail. Things that we thought were inconveniences before our trip started became answered prayers halfway through our trip. God provided through Christian friends that had family in the area where we broke down...and those family members had church family that are mechanics!

So, although we came home without my car (it apparently needs some quality time in Virginia), God provided safety through some really nasty winter weather and roads in the mountains and got us home safe and sound!

Was this trip fun ...not so much! But let me tell you, we saw God at every twist and turn of it. When we had a need, we prayed and God provided. And I don't mean in abstract ways either. There is no explanation as to why my car made it to the exit, through the intersection and up to the hotel...except that as I prayed out loud God was there with us. God provided a warm, safe, affordable room for my family, food to eat, a safe place for our car to be towed to until the mechanic and my husband can get to it, a tow truck driver that was kind and knew the area, and God's hand was really with us through the snow and the wind on the way home. Although the situation was stressful, God's faithfulness was SO CLEAR! Our Father was in every detail making a way when we couldn't see a way.

I don't share any of this for any other reason than to give God glory for being so real, so present, and so faithful! My grandparents used to tell me that we should pray about everything. They learned that from God's Word and from experiencing God through their prayer lives and God's faithfulness to them as well. What an awesome God we serve, my friends, when we can say that the Creator of all the universes and galaxies cares so intimately about each and every single one of us. He hears us! He sees us! When he says he loves us, he means it. Praise the Lord! Our God is a Good, Good Father!
