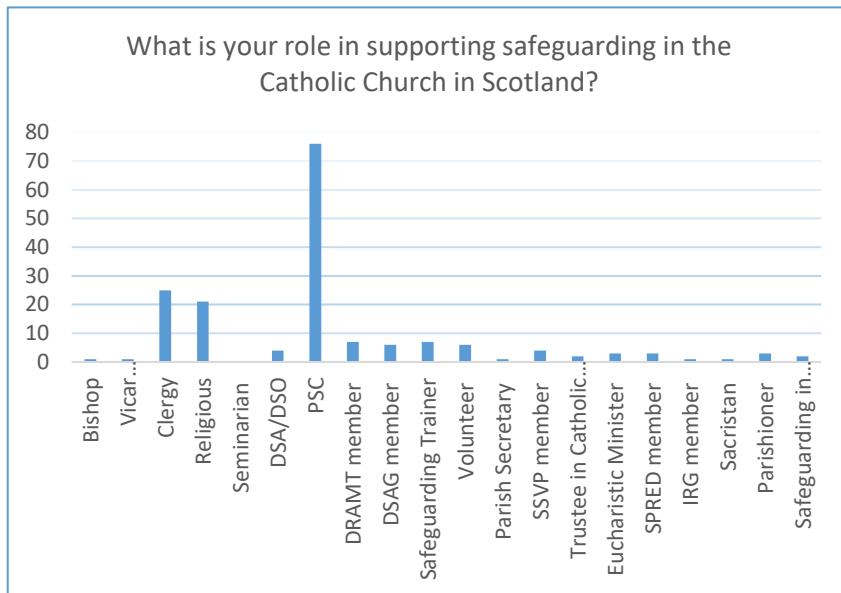

## EVALUATION OVERVIEW NATIONAL SAFEGUARDING WEBINAR 02.10.2021

### WEBINAR PARTICIPANTS

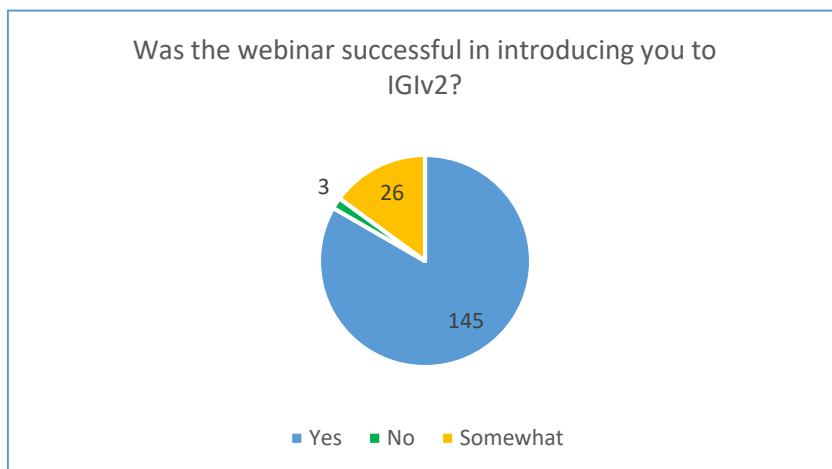


Out of the 399 people who joined the webinar, 176 evaluations were completed and a further 12 comments were received by email. This represents approximately a 47% evaluation response rate.

The breakdown of webinar participants who completed the evaluation highlights that Parish Safeguarding Co-Ordinators were by far the largest group of attendees.

Clergy and Religious were also well represented.

### INTRODUCING IGLv2



62% of participants said they were somewhat familiar with IGLv2 prior to the webinar.

31% were unfamiliar with IGLv2 and 7% felt they were very familiar with IGLv2 prior to the webinar.

More than 98% of participants reported that the webinar was successful or somewhat successful in introducing them to IGLv2.

The webinar addressed the ethos of 'looking with hope towards the future'. Participants scored the various reflections from practitioners 8 out of 10 in helping to demonstrate how IGLv2 can help to grow a culture of care.

There were several iterations of the point that safeguarding is everyone's responsibility and throughout a sense of respectful inclusion and consideration for those who have experienced abuse

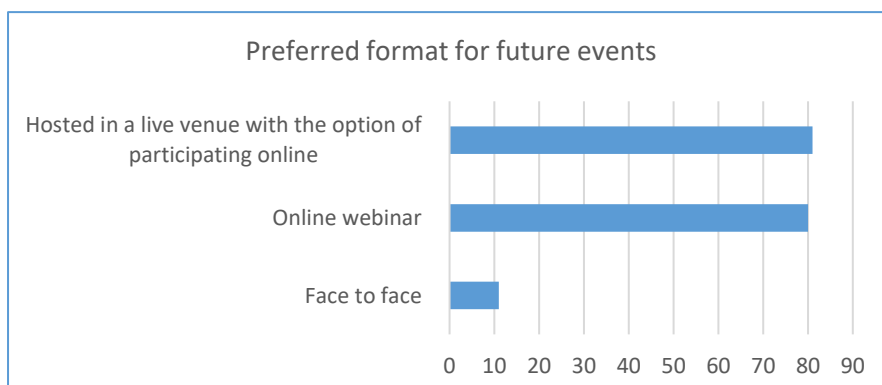
I was very encouraged to hear from such an informed and dedicated group of people

### PLANNING FOR FUTURE EVENTS



The online format of the webinar worked well with over 98% of participants who completed the evaluation highlighting that they found the webinar easy to access.

Only 5 comments citing difficulties accessing the webinar or polls were received.



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### Specific Topics requested for inclusion within future events:

PSC's highlighted the following as topics they feel should be covered in future events:

1. How to more effectively support survivors of abuse
2. Safe Recruitment
3. How to engage better with the Parish community around safeguarding

Clergy and Religious highlighted the following topics they feel should be covered in future events:

1. How to more effectively support survivors of abuse
2. Safe Recruitment
3. Safeguarding Risk Assessments
4. How to maximise the impact of safeguarding audits and action plans

DSAG members and Safeguarding Trainers highlighted a strong desire for a focus on updating training and more supports around delivery of training.

DRAMT members expressed a desire for further information on how to more effectively support survivors of abuse.
