

ARRIVAL OF THE BISHOP AT THE DOOR OF THE CATHEDRAL

When the organ fanfare sounds the congregation turns to face the main entrance of the Cathedral.

The Bishop enters the church and kneels in prayer. He is presented by the Apostolic Nuncio to the Administrator of the Cathedral and a representative of the Chapter of Canons.

After the Bishop venerates a crucifix, he receives holy water and sprinkles himself and those gathered around him.

During the procession, the congregation sings 'Ninian of Galloway'.

THE APOSTOLIC MANDATE AND THE GREETING OF THE BISHOP

The Apostolic Nuncio greets the people and bids the Apostolic Mandate to be shown and read.

All sit while the Mandate is shown and read.

After this, Bishop Dougan says:

With faith in Jesus Christ, and with love in my heart, I accept the pastoral care of the people of God in the Diocese of Galloway.

I promise to serve faithfully the Church in this Diocese, to preach the Gospel and celebrate the Eucharist.

Thereafter, Bishop Dougan is led to his Cathedra by the Apostolic Nuncio, His Excellency Archbishop Maury Buendía. The Archbishop says:

Almighty and eternal God, from the highest heavens you sent your Son among us to teach us and guide us: we earnestly pray that this your servant, in whom you have given the fullness of the priesthood, may grow in humility as he approaches the chair of his office. Let him come among us as one who serves, and make his heart the throne of your comforting Spirit. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

The Bishop sits in his Cathedra.

Then some members of the diocesan clergy, religious, members of the faithful, and representatives of other Christian denominations go to the new Bishop and offer a sign of welcome and reverence.


