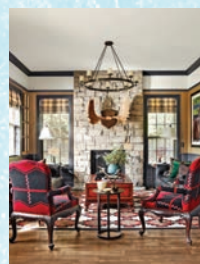


# COUNTRY FROM Coast TO Coast
