*“The believers devoted themselves to the apostles’ teaching, to the community, to their shared meals, and to their prayers...They shared food with gladness and simplicity... The Lord added daily to the community those who were being saved.”*

Acts 2:42–47 (selected)

### **OneBoard** Leadership Model

The One Board met April 21. Pastor Nikki led the board member in an exercise about the Platinum Rule: Treating others as they want to be treated.

Business items included:

- Accepting additional Gale Barry bequest.
- Approving the Green Teams request to turn the Crossroads field into a pollinator bed with donated supplies.
- Beginning the process of Pastor Nikki’s performance review.
- Discussing at length the condition of the ailing main church A/C. Cost to replace the un-repairable system was quoted in the range of \$550,000. To replace the entire aging HVAC system was quoted in the range of \$1,200,000. Discussion as to how to pay for either project is ongoing.

There was no May meeting. Next meeting is scheduled for June 16.
