#### **Let Every Heart Prepare Him Room**

"While they were there, the time came for Mary to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth and laid him in a manger, because there was no place in the guest room." Luke 2:6-7

"Let every heart prepare Him room..."

The season of Advent usually brims with excitement. I think it's the anticipation of something coming and the hope that fills me as I prepare for the arrival. We observe the Advent Season as a time of preparation to celebrate Christ's birth on Christmas. Simultaneously, we are aware that Christ is already here with us.

I am a person who finds new things and change exhilarating, so I find the Advent vibes of anticipation and preparation exciting. But with all the work that comes with preparing, we can lose sight of the signs of God's in-breaking joy available to us in the here and now. So, I invite you to experience the excitement of anticipation, but also, I invite you to practice being present, as well. In the middle of the flurry of activity, intentionally take time to notice the ways that Christ is already with us. Talk about what you see.

This Advent, our *Seeking Shelter* worship series follows the journey of Mary and Joseph as they search for a place where love can be born. They were away from home in a bustling city that seemed to have no room to welcome them in their situation. They knocked and doors remained closed to them. Their story reminds us that hope is an active kind of waiting. Hope is step after faithful step forward, trusting that God's promise will open doors even when welcome seems out of reach.

The Advent journey teaches us that peace requires preparation, and that joy may involve struggle. But the presence of Christ's promise breaking in is enough to sustain us, even before that promise is fulfilled. As we draw near to Christmas, we will be reminded that love is the open door through which God enters our world. Love can make a home even in the humblest of places, because humility is where God chooses to dwell.

On Christmas Eve, we will celebrate God's choice to make a home with us in Christ. And our New Year's invitation will be to welcome Him into our lives daily.



#### Come, Walk with Me



# **Advent Opportunities**



#### **Advent Arrives**

The Advent season begins on Sunday, November 30th. Advent is a season of waiting, of longing, and of preparing our hearts for the coming of Christ. In the weeks leading to Christmas, we are invited to step into the story of Mary and Joseph, who themselves were travelers seeking shelter, searching for a place where love could be born.

This year, our Advent journey is shaped by the tradition of **Las Posadas**—a beloved practice in Mexican and Latin American communities. Each night of Las Posadas, neighbors reenact

Mary and Joseph's search for lodging, knocking on doors, asking for room, and experiencing both rejection and welcome. At last, the journey ends in celebration when the "inn" is opened, and the Christ child is joyfully received.

In our worship series, Seeking Shelter: An Advent Journey, we will bring this imagery into our sanctuary each week. We will "go to a home" together, standing at closed doors, hearing the knocks of hope, peace, joy, and love. Week by week, the journey will remind us that God comes to us, seeking welcome in our hearts and in our world. The series builds toward Christmas Eve, when the doors of welcome are finally opened, and we encounter the Savior who has come to dwell with us.

We will keep the same schedule, offering a time of worship on Christmas Eve-Eve, December 23rd, at 7:30 p.m. On December 24th, Christmas Eve, we will offer worship times of 5:30 and 8:00 p.m.

These options allow the choice of the day and time that work best for you and your family, and also provide flexibility for all of those that you can invite to be a part of our celebration. All three candlelight services on both nights are similar to one another. On Christmas Eve at the 5:30 p.m. worship, we are planning an especially family-oriented worship experience, with the praise band leading music and Pastor Nikki sharing the message. Pastor Nikki will also provide the message with pipe organ and Chancel Choir leading music at 8:00 on Christmas Eve and 7:30 on Eve-Eve. All the services sing wonderful Christmas carols, and all feature the candlelight singing of "Silent Night" that makes this time of worship so special. Choose a day and time, bring your family and friends, and experience the light of the Christ child as we worship together!

**Serve As a Christmas Usher** Please consider being a part of one of our usher teams at one or more of our Christmas Eve and Christmas Eve-Eve services this year. The usher teams help to provide a welcoming environment as we share the light of Christ with all who come to worship during this wonderful season. The work involves arriving 45 minutes early for the service, greeting worshipers with a smile, handing out bulletins, collecting offering, distributing candles, and staying for a few minutes after the service to help straighten up for the next group. ## Start the New Year Off Right

As you are making your list of New Year's resolutions, consider adding your activities at First UMC into the mix. Now is a great time to consider becoming part of a new ministry at church, increase your commitment to attendance, or add to your own time of devotion and prayer. Start the new year off right by focusing on your relationship with Christ! You will benefit, the church will benefit, and, most importantly, God will be glorified!

#### **Angel Tree Giving**

We want to share the love of Christ generously with our neighbors this Christmas, so we have partnered with Community Action to support five area families. The Angel Tree will be set up in the parlor on November 23 with gift wishes for eleven children. Take the tag/s you choose, purchase only what is listed, to ensure each child is provided for equally, and sign your name by the matching number in the binder by the tree. Return your gifts, or the items you chose to purchase to the parlor in a bag or box with the tag attached by December 10 at noon. We will be delivering the gifts to Community Action along with wrapping items like paper, bows, scissors, boxes, tags, and tape on December 11.





On November 2 in a church conference meeting, FUMC voted unanimously to adopt the One Board model of leadership for this congregation. Starting January 1, a new 12-member leadership board will begin work. This board will be composed of 3 people representing Staff-Parish Relations, 3 people representing Finance, 3 people representing Trustees, 2 members at large, and 1 person acting as

chairperson. Under our current structure, there are multiple committee meetings that often require decisions to be filtered up through other committees before a decision can be made. Under the One Board model, a decision can be made in one meeting since the key committees are all represented in the group.

During the first year, Rev. Bill Lyle from Peace United Methodist Church in Pickerington will serve as our mentor in the One Board process. He has over 20 years working under this format in two different churches. The One Board model will cut back on the time spent in meetings and will free people up to serve in ministry in other ways. The model does not get rid of all committees. For example, the Trustees will still have subcommittees that focus on each of our structures. Their recommendations go directly to One Board instead of channeling through a big Trustees meeting, finance, administration, etc. before a decision is made.

A Nominations Team will present a slate for the 2026 One Board members for the Church Council to vote on in their December 8 meeting. Each year a third of the Board "rolls off" and new members come on board. After the Board has been in existence for a few years, the pattern will be each member serves a term of 3 years.

To promote transparency in this new structure, the Circuit Rider will report major decisions made by the Board. If you have any questions about the One Board model, please contact Pastor Nikki.


