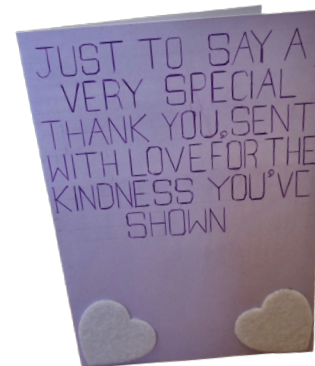
It was also good to hear from a supporter who some months ago asked us to send

August Prayer Points

'N', someone we mentioned last month as having just come into a Bible Study. He was about to be released and make that transition from inside to outside which can be a difficult step. But on this occasion, it gave our chaplain the opportunity to gently nudge 'N' to seek appropriate church connections at the earliest opportunity.

Two encouraging young men who would always be at the weekly Bible Studies have recently been released too, and both have maintained their good church connections outside. Please remember these young men as they readjust and pray that they might have benefited from their time inside.

The role of Community Chaplaincy can be of huge importance in these transitions. Typically, Community Chaplains form connections with prisoners once they reach the outside. As an open prison, 'F' is someone starting to make visits outside prior to a release. These are closely controlled by probation and our chaplain has forged links with Community Chaplains so that 'F' can make church visits on his weekend visits outside. Pray these will be of spiritual blessing to all concerned.

HMP Kirelington Grange (N. Yorkshire) – Give thanks for continued opportunities to run regular evening services at this open prison. A lot of the men there are now able to go out to a nearby church on a Sunday

HMP Chelmsford (Essex) – Please pray Daylight serve here; several of our regulars are coming up for release in the next couple of months. Having just finished the Bible Society's Bible Course, we had the opportunity to encourage them to search for a Bible believing, Bible teaching church as they leave.
