




MILITARY WIVES CHOIRS

The Military Wives Choirs are a symbol of strength, solidarity, and sisterhood among women connected to the Armed Forces.
Following the 2010 BBC Gareth Malone documentary series, Military Wives choirs were formed across military bases aiming to support the wives and girlfriends of servicemen deployed to Afghanistan. Within a year, the choir was number one with the Christmas hit 'Wherever You Are'. A number one album, In My Dreams, followed. The charity was established in 2012.

Today the Military Wives Choirs are a network of 71 choirs across the UK, Northern Ireland and internationally, following the global footprint of the Armed Forces, including a Virtual Choir for those without access to a local group. The choirs welcome not just wives but all women with a military connection - including partners, widows, serving women, reservists, veterans, mothers, daughters and sisters. They offer a supportive network of women who understand the unique challenges faced by military families and provide a space to connect and uplift one another.

Today's performance features a selection of songs from our core repertoire common to all of our choirs, including 'Wherever You Are' and our latest single 'November Sunday' released last year.



CONDUCTOR JOANNA TOMLINSON

Joanna Tomlinson has established an outstanding reputation for her work as conductor, singer and vocal coach with choirs of all ages and sizes.

As Principal Conductor of National Youth Choir's Female/Non-Binary choir for five years, she made numerous recordings and conducted at venues including the Royal Albert Hall in London.

In her time as Artistic Director of the internationally renowned Farnham Youth Choir they were winners of two gold medals in the 2019 European Choir Games and featured in the live final of ITV's X-Factor in 2018.

Choirs that Joanna works with regularly include Constanza Chorus and Whitehall Choir in London, and she often features as guest conductor with the BBC Symphony Chorus, Epiphoni and at the Royal Opera House on their Sing at the ROH programme. She has also delivered workshops and community singing programmes for Glyndebourne Opera, the Association of British Choral Directors and Association of Teachers of Singing.

Having gained a Distinction in Singing from the Royal College of Music, Joanna brings to her work the knowledge and experience of singing with world class professional choral groups such as the BBC Singers, London Voices, Gabrieli Consort, Philharmonia Voices and Sonoro.

She is Artistic Director of the Military Wives Choirs, and conductor of Constanza Chorus and Whitehall Choir in London.



ACCOMPANIST DAN MORIYAMA

Dan Moriyama is a London based pianist, arranger, producer and cross-genre multi-instrumentalist, performing across the UK and internationally.

An accomplished classical pianist, he specialises in playing with singers and choirs including London Youth Choirs where he is an arranger and resident pianist, Military Wives Choirs, singer Laura Wright, Ark Schools Inspiring Excellence programme, and previously for many years with National Youth Choirs of Great Britain. He performs regularly with Orchestra of the Swan, renowned British composer Harvey Brough, and comedian/conductor Rainer Hersch.

In the popular music world he plays piano & Hammond organ with Tennessee blues/gospel singer, Earl Thomas, and has played keyboards and sung backing vocals with many artists including Dr Hook, the late Donna Summer, and members of Madness. Dan led his own band as writer, bassist and front man for many years, and continues to write and produce original music.

Dan won a music scholarship to Wells Cathedral School aged 8, and was a BBC Young Musician piano finalist at 15. He studied accompaniment at Junior Royal Academy of Music, and then jazz and classical piano at the Guildhall School of Music, winning several awards. He is now a deputy jazz professor at Junior Guildhall.






We are a successful recording artist with a number of popular releases.

Our albums can be downloaded and purchased via our website and available on all music streaming platforms.






JOIN US!
