Dear Friends,

As we begin a new year I am always reminded of John Wesley. John, along with his brother Charles, are largely credited with founding the "Methodist" movement during their time at Oxford in the mid-1700s. The result is that they are also counted among the founders of Methodism as a denomination. It is a strange thing and we can discuss how this happened at another time but for our purposes here it's important to remember that Wesley was an Anglican.

His Methodism set him apart from a lot of his peers. Rather than cloistered in the pews, Wesley and his followers were out in the prisons and the pubs sharing the gospel teaching literacy and numeracy and teaching the working classes about their rights. Rather than staid Sunday services Wesley could be found "field preaching" to thousands any day of the week. Rather than limiting participation in the sacramental life of the church Wesley argued the sacraments were converting ordinances and that the church should not limit anyone from participating in them. He famously said "the whole world is my parish", a sentiment that sometimes put him at odds with the Bishops and the leaders of his church.

Wesley remained undaunted because of the relationship with Christ he was devoted and all in, he believed Christ could not only redeem individuals but indeed society itself he was an early proponent of the social gospel at a time when Christianity was seen largely as a way to maintain order rather than promote change and healing. He maintained a strong prayer life and his piety was fueled by study and action.

One of Wesley's most famous prayers is his Covenant Prayer. Those who claim a Methodist Spiritual Heritage often share and say this prayer at the beginning of a new year to remind themselves of Wesley and his strong and inspirational faith and as a way to invite their own deeper faith. In these days like Wesley, our faith is tested, and we yearn for God's direction. Let's share Wesley's words as we seek to build God's commonwealth in the year that is unfolding.

"I am no longer my own, but thine.

Put me to what thou wilt, rank me with whom thou wilt.

Put me to doing, put me to suffering.

Let me be employed by thee or laid aside for thee,

exalted for thee or brought low for thee.

Creating Connecting Caring

Let me be full, let me be empty.
Let me have all things, let me have nothing.
I freely and heartily yield all things
to thy pleasure and disposal.
And now, O glorious and blessed God,
Father, Son, and Holy Spirit,
thou art mine, and I am thine. So be it.
And the covenant which I have made on earth,
let it be ratified in heaven. Amen.”

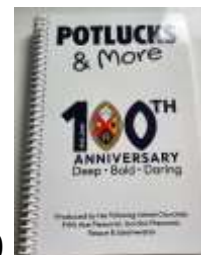

YOUR HELP IS NEEDED

This coming Sunday, Jan 4, we are looking for people to help take down the Christmas Decorations right after Sunday Service.

Important message from the Property Steward

Many of you may remember the building conservation efforts undertaken in the past, including the Capital Project Planning Report prepared by PH McNally in 2018, following the Luxton Conservation Plan from 2016. With your help, several of the recommended projects were completed, including LED light substitution, some ventilation work, repair of the boulevard, and removal of vegetation on the north side of the building. Yet the major projects of drainage rehabilitation, foundation protections, storm window installation, tower masonry repairs, and efficient attic ventilation have not yet been pursued, likely because the roof work had just been completed and the boiler was the next major requirement.

In February of this year, I began looking into what could be done about the damage in the NE tower, as it was the most visible problem. With the help of valued tradespeople, I have arrived at the conclusion that the drainage rehabilitation, in coordination with the attic ventilation repairs, are the next item that require our focus and investment.

As we enter this season of budget preparations, the Board will be considering all possibilities, and as the Property Steward, I hope to keep you informed of the current needs of our beloved building. As we are a designated Municipal Heritage Resource, we are able to access matching grants of up to 50% from the provincial government. The grant application is due at the end of January, and in the meantime, we have hired PH McNally to design the systems and coordinate the contractors that will be needed to implement connection to the underground drain system, installation of a larger drainage system on the roof, and making the changes needed to keep the attic cold. This does not mean we are fully committed to the project yet, but the decision will be a major factor in our budget and priorities.

We must give consideration to the consequences of not completing this project. They are, but are not limited to, things we can already see happening: water creep up the walls from the ground, leading to minerals pushing through an interior wall, collapsing plaster in walls and ceilings, and heat loss, as well as damage to the masonry, clogged drain spouts, and ice damming leading to roof damage. There are other things that may be happening out of sight, such as black mold, undermining of the foundation and surrounding land, and condensation in the attic.
