The committee met formally 10 times after the February AGM.

The 2026 AGM is to be held Tuesday, February 17th at 6 pm in the Theatre at Hazelhurst Gallery.

Our purpose is to support, stimulate, and sustain public interest in Hazelhurst Regional Gallery and Arts Centre, Cottage and Gardens. We aim to promote the arts in the Sutherland Shire and Southern Sydney region. Funds raised support projects for the gallery and help ensure the Cottage and Gardens are preserved for community use.

In 2025, the environment at Hazelhurst continued to change. Our main challenge now is to foster committee and event participation for members while expanding our membership. We must address these issues urgently to secure our future.

## **Financial**

Our funds support the gallery, either in gallery programs and projects or in art awards such as HSC awards and Art on Paper. We also have the usual expenses associated with administration.

Thank you to Myriam Pulgar, our hard working treasurer for all her excellent work.

It is crucial to acknowledge that a decline in membership numbers has concurrently resulted in a reduction in our income. Most of our revenue is derived from membership fees. So, our revenue has dropped noticeably in the last 2 years.

## **Secretary**

The position of secretary within a volunteer organization presents significant challenges. The secretary is a pivotal member of the leadership team and a valuable contributor to the organization's success. Tony Buckley has managed this position in an expert manner.

## **Membership**

Numbers continued to decline in 2025. There has been a 50% decline from the beginning of 2024 which, as noted before, is related to the discontinuation of the previous discount for classes.

David Coles, our membership manager, monitors renewals and reminders and manages the database. He works closely with the gallery administration team. Thank you to the Visitor Services team from the Gallery who assist in this operation.

## **Events**

FOH continues to offer attractive benefits and opportunities to members. We appreciate Karen O'Toole and the committee's efforts in bringing these events to you in 2025.

Current Hazelhurst Board Chair, Byron Hurst, has been integral in presenting our events. Byron has been involved with Hazelhurst since its inception and is a member of the friends. He is an ex-shire councillor and a respected art educator. Byron's talks are always super informative and engaging.

We presented seven events in 2025 with over 470 attendees. These comprised 4 artztalks, 2 excursions and the friends on show opening event.
