RETURN OF "THE CUP" AT MASSES

Started on Holy Thursday, Apr 17

The *Feast of the Supper of the Lord* on Holy Thursday was the return of *The Cup of the Precious Blood of Christ* to our Eucharistic celebration.

Please note: The stations for the Eucharistic Bread will be a sharp right or left along the

front pew. The Cup will be in the middle. After receiving the Eucharistic Bread, you may continue to your seat, or, go first to The Cup to receive the Precious Blood, and then go to your seat.

How to Receive from The Cup: Approach the Minister with the *The Cup* and respond “Amen” when they say “The Blood of Christ.” Take the cup and then take a sip, and then hand it back. “Intincture,” that is dipping the Eucharistic Bread into the Wine, is not allowed in our diocese and the Minister of The Cup will not allow you to do so.

Collecting on the First Sundays of the Month

Frozen casseroles are collected and distributed to those in need who don't have the means or aren't able to cook for themselves. Trays are available normally the last weekend of the month. And frozen casseroles are then due next weekend on the first Sunday of the month. Instruction sheets are also available next to the trays. The most important thing to keep in mind is that whatever casserole you make, it must be clearly labeled, with date and type of casserole, and be frozen solid.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT COLLECTIONS

Our second collections for “Capital Improvements” is to help pay for new major purchases or to cover the cost of major repairs/replacement. If it wasn’t for the extraordinary expenses, our yearly budget would be nearly balanced. Recent expenditures have been:

- Replacing the parking lot filtration system that protects the surrounding wetlands: \$14,000
- Major appliance replacements/repairs (Parish Center and Parish House freezer, washer, and others): ~\$3,000.
- Changing the high pressure argon light bulbs in the gym – they were not protected from projectiles (we have several sports groups renting our gym), and they’ve been known to explode on their own at the end of their life. Plus, they buzz loudly. Plus other upgrades to lighting around the parish center and church sanctuary. ~\$20,000

Upcoming expenses:

- Upgrading all our fluorescent lighting in the Parish Center hallways and classrooms to LED.
- Minor repairs to the church roof (especially to keep squirrels out!)
- New stove for the parish center (one of the ovens is irreparable, and we definitely need to switch from gas pilot lights to electronic ignition). ~\$1,500.
- Repairing cracks in the parking lot
