‘UNDERSTANDING THE MASS’ WORKSHOP

Several years ago, when I was teaching Catechism at a public school in Manila, I asked my 6th grade students, “Why do you go to Mass on Sundays?” One girl raised her hand and said, “So I can wear my pretty dress and see my friends in church.” Her response may sound appalling to many but in reality, some Catholics consider going to Mass a social event. Some Catholics attend Mass regularly but may not understand it fully. And according to a new survey by Pew Research Center, only one-third of Catholics believe in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

The above observations and data do not bode well for the future of our Church. Bishop Robert Barron, arguably the most well-known Catholic apologist of our day, considers the Pew data to confirm the sad realities about the present state of evangelization in the Catholic Church. This may be true in general, but our own St. Augustine parish may be considered an exception. With the resumption of the obligatory Sunday Mass in-person attendance (except for the sick and those with infirmity), the Clergy and the Liturgy Ministers at St. Augustine Church decided now is the best time to launch a parish-wide workshop on “UNDERSTANDING THE MASS.” The 2-hour workshop held last Sunday afternoon inside church was indeed an excellent way to evangelize and welcome back parishioners to worship in person. More importantly, it provided an avenue for a deeper and richer connection to the Holy Eucharist.

“The heart of our Catholic religion is **WORSHIP**, and at the heart of our worship is the **SACRIFICE of the MASS.**” This was the opening statement of Deacon Nes Fernandez as he laid down the foundation for understanding the inner workings of the Mass. The Mass is a sacrifice because it makes present our Lord’s own offering of Himself on the Cross to His Father. Deacon Nes emphasized that when a priest celebrates Mass, he is in **Persona Christi**, meaning he does not represent himself and does not speak expressing himself but speaks for Christ.

Father Martin demonstrated the different vestments worn by priests and deacons during Mass and explained that the colors of the vestments (white, green, red, purple and rose) have meanings associated with the various seasons of the liturgical calendar. Deacon Nes, Charity Garcia, Father Martin, Deacon Virgil, and Father Ray took turns in explaining the four parts of the Mass: The Introductory Rites, the Liturgy of the Word, the Liturgy of the Eucharist, and the Concluding Rites. Charity discussed the order of procession before the Mass begins. In the [Introductory Rites](#), Father Martin explained that every posture we do during Mass ([genuflecting, bowing, standing, kneeling, sitting](#)) has a special meaning. He also reminded us that whenever we make the Sign of the Cross, we should do it slowly and always with reverence and decorum. During the Penitential Act, Father Martin reminded us that the Absolution in the Mass is not sacramental and does not replace the absolution in the Sacrament of Confession.

Deacon Nes and Deacon Virgil explained that the [Liturgy of the Word](#) is made up of readings from Scripture. Through the readings, we hear directly from God who speaks to us. The reading of the Gospel is the most important aspect of the Liturgy of the Word. As the Gospel is read, we make the sign of the cross on our forehead, mouth, and chest to symbolize that we receive the Word of God in our mind, we confess it with our mouth, and we keep it in our heart. After the Scripture readings, the celebrant preaches the homily.

Father Ray explained that the [Liturgy of the Eucharist](#) is the center and summit of the entire celebration. The major part of the Eucharistic prayer is the epiclesis. In the epiclesis, the priest asks God the Father to send the Holy Spirit on the gifts of bread and wine so that, through the power of the Holy Spirit, they may become the Body and Blood of Christ. This is the great miracle of [Transubstantiation](#). The Church teaches that in the Eucharist, Jesus is truly and substantially present in His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity.

The [Concluding Rites](#) consist of Announcements, Benediction, Dismissal, and Sending Forth. The Mass ends as we begin it, with the Sign of the Cross. Then the congregation is sent forth to continue to glorify God. Father Ray thanked the Children’s Choir, Christine Adiaz and Sr. Nona Barairo for providing the music throughout the workshop. He also thanked the Communication Ministry for actively promoting the event and all those who attended the workshop.

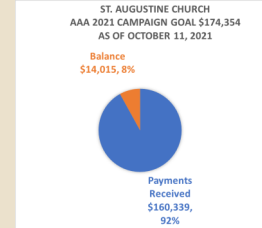
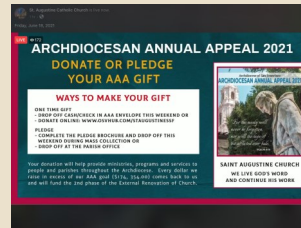
