

Loving Our Neighbor Through Dialogue

Highlights from the February 26 Synod In-person Session

Last Saturday's session was an opportunity to put our 'listening and dialogue' skills to use. We entered the sacred time together by invoking the Holy Spirit in the Opening prayer, and honored the spirit of synodality by embracing and modeling the presented "norms" for a fruitful experience. Breaking into small groups of 4-6 people, we began our preparation for authentic listening and sharing by reflecting on a selected Scripture reading (Acts 4:8-12), followed by answering the reflection questions. Our synodal dialogue focused on three topics: (1) Joys and Concerns about the Church from the people of God; (2) Listening Aspect of the Church; (3) Accompaniment/Journey. The overall experience was indeed fruitful. Through the sharing, participants were afforded a chance to experience a deeper listening and openness to sharing on what fills one with joy about the Church; concerns about the Church; moments the Church encouraged one to speak up, and how Church listened or heard what was said; how the Church can help one to grow in their relationship with Jesus and with the Church, and what the Church can do to support one on their faith journey.

What is the next step? To move to a more synodal Church, we need to create more 'dialogue opportunities', where a true, honest dialogue commits us to love of God, neighbor and self, and helps us to deepen the experience of encounter with others. FASTING AND ABSTINENCE DURING LENT

ABSTINENCE - Everyone, 14 years old and older, is bound to abstain from meat and meat products on Ash Wednesday, the FRIDAYS of Lent and GOOD FRIDAY.

FASTING - Everyone, 18 through 59 years old, is bound to FAST on Ash Wednesday & GOOD FRIDAY.

On these two days, the law of fast allows only one full meal a day, but does not prohibit taking some food during the day, so long as this does not constitute another full meal. Drinking liquids during the day is permitted.

When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. In doubt concerning fast or abstinence, a priest assigned to pastoral ministry or confessor should be consulted.

In the spirit of penance, the faithful should not lightly excuse themselves from this obligation.



WHAT IS LENT?

Lent is a 40 day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ.

Many know of the tradition of abstaining from meat on Fridays during Lent, but we are also called to practice self-discipline and fast in other ways throughout the season. Contemplate the meaning and origins of the Lenten fasting tradition in this <u>reflection</u>. In addition, the giving of alms is one way to share God's gifts—not only through the distribution of money, but through the sharing of our time and talents. As St. John Chrysostom reminds us: "Not to enable the poor to share in our goods is to steal from them and deprive them of life. The goods we possess are not ours, but theirs." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, no. 2446).

In Lent, the baptized are called to renew their baptismal commitment as others prepare to be baptized through the <u>Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults</u>, a period of learning and discernment for individuals who have declared their desire to become Catholics.





