46th PPC Meeting Minutes | Summary and Action Plans:

Thursday, 26 June 2025

Vivian facilitated the meeting in Father Ray and John Paes' absence.

1. Building Update on Bathroom Renovation

- The PPC meeting was held with Father's absence and four main agenda items, including the Parish Hall bathroom renovation update. Deacon Nestor reported that Architect Greg Roja submitted a fee proposal for renovating the men's and women's restrooms in the parish hall, which was scaled down due to budget limitations. The proposal was deemed reasonable by Rico, and Deacon Nestor is waiting for Steve Bowers' approval before proceeding with the project.
- o There's back-and-forth communication between Steve Bowers and Greg, and we're just waiting for Steve to sort of give it the thumbs up. Looks like it's going to move forward.

Action Plan(s):

o Before the final presentation to the committee, Father Ray will need to sign and issue a \$5,000 deposit.

2. Formation Update on Eucharistic Ministers & Readers

- Deacon Nes presented to the Parish Council that he is revising the Eucharistic Ministry (EM) training
 and Reader training so that it meets the archdiocese' guidelines to continue this and do our own
 training. He also had many conversations with Deacon Fred about what's going to happen regarding
 commissioning or regarding training for Readers and EMs in the Archdiocese, as there was nobody
 to replace Laura Bertone, so the parishes were advised to continue with ongoing faith, formation
 training.
- We had 75 new and returning and current ministers who came to the Readers and EM Workshops.
 Deacon Nestor provided the Readers workshop and also talked about the basics of the gestures. This is the hidden language of worship. Fr. Ray also wanted to make sure that our homebound ministers were managing the Blessed Sacrament and consecrated the host properly.
- They also pursued the Legion of Mary, who tends to do most of the homebound ministry, and they had 10 people show up. A lot of them are brand new and need homebound training. We're also standardizing the homebound ministry kit and the process of how to do it. Discussed with Charity and about what each homebound minister should have when they go to do that. There is also a "blue book" to use for homebound ministry that costs around \$5.
- Deacon Fred led the EM Workshop and managed to answer all questions and got valuable feedback from the people who attended, and they seemed to enjoy Deacon Fred.
- Deacon Nes led the Readers Workshop with 14 new readers in attendance and gave everybody an opportunity to do some reading within a small group and bigger group afterwards. The Readers' workshop received exceptional feedback.

Action Plan(s):

- To schedule a "make-up" workshop for those who were not able to attend.
- Targeting the month of August for their commissioning the new Eucharistic Ministers/Readers.


