and knows the depths of the heart.
God has shot them with his arrow
and dealt them sudden wounds.
Their own tongue has brought them to ruin

They will understand God's deeds.
The just will rejoice in the Lord
and fly to him for refuge.
All the upright hearts will glory.

L: Christ, Son of the living God, through baptism we were buried with you,

ALL: Risen also with you in baptism, may we walk in newness of life.

PRAYER

L: All-powerful and ever-living God,
your only Son went down among the dead
and rose again in glory.

In your goodness
raise up your faithful people,
buried with him in baptism,
to be one with him
in the eternal life of heaven,
