Wis 12:13, 16-19 Ps 86:5-6, 9-10, 15-16 Rom 8:26-27 Mt 13:24-43 or 13:24-30

We are in the midst of hearing a string of parables from Matthew's Gospel. Today we hear three about the kingdom of heaven. The passage ends with these words: *'Whoever has ears ought to hear.'* The meaning of Jesus' parables is often difficult to grasp. It is why the disciples repeatedly asked Jesus for clarification. His explanation of the parable of the weeds in the field is chilling. Take the time before Mass to read only the explanation of the parable, beginning with the words, *"Then dismissing the crowds..."* Knowing the meaning will help set the context for hearing the cluster of parables about the kingdom of God proclaimed today. Let us pray that the meanings of these parables will sink in and strengthen us as children of the Kingdom.

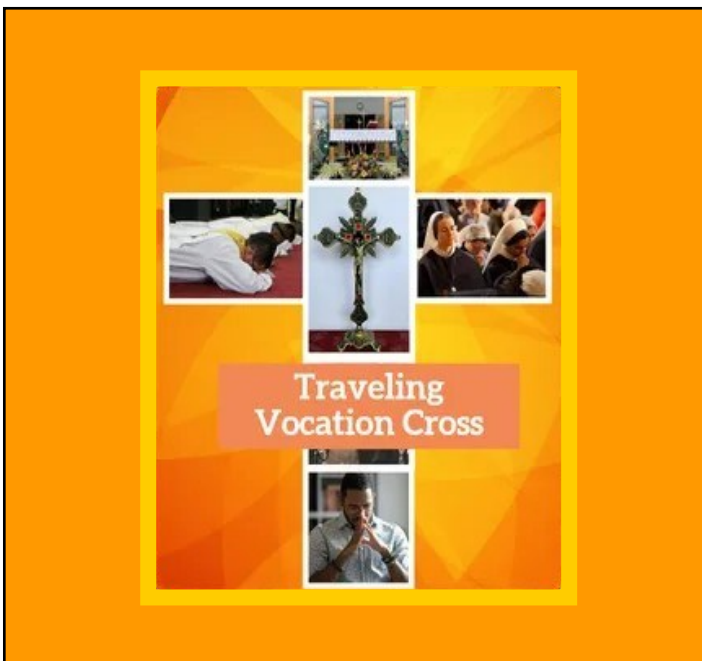
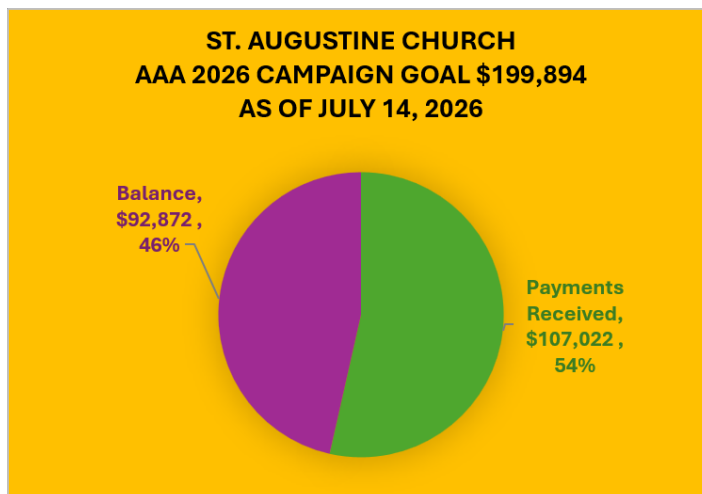

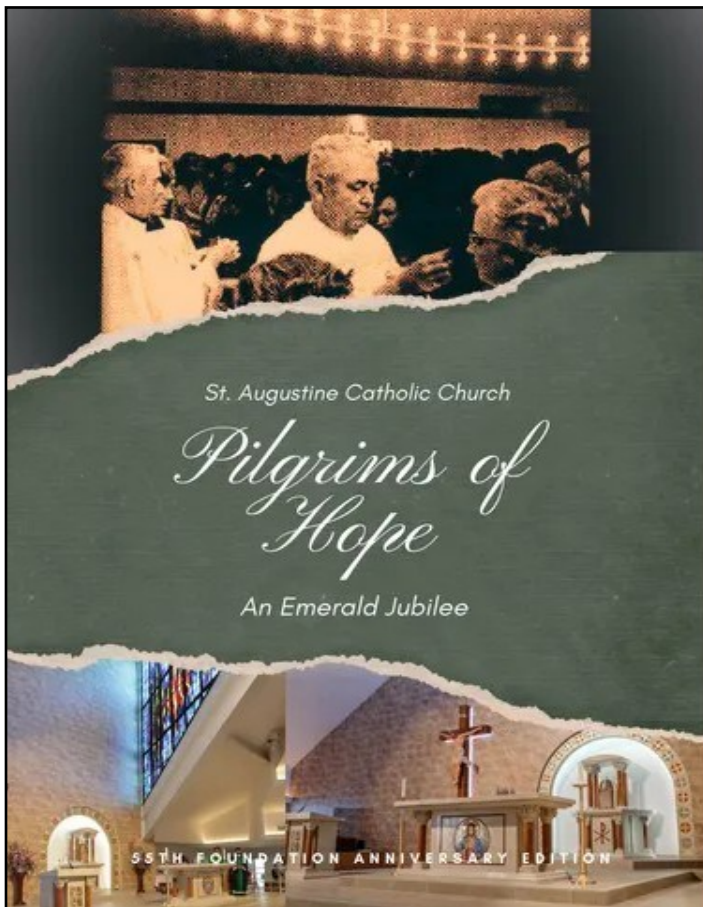

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Day 1 - Saturday, October 3, 2026
DEPART USA
Our journey begins as we depart San Francisco on Turkish Airlines flight # TK080 to Istanbul at 6:45pm.

Day 2 - Sunday, October 4, 2026
ISTANBUL / ALGERIA
Arrive Istanbul at 5:40pm. Connect on flight # TK655 at 8:20pm to Algeria, arriving 10:05pm. After proceeding thru customs, meet our guide and driver for transit to the hotel for overnight.

Day 3 - Monday, October 5, 2026
ALGERIA / ANNABA
After breakfast, we depart Algeria to Annaba (Hippo Regius) (~6 hr bus ride, with lunch break en-route). In Annaba, we visit the Basilica of St. Augustine to celebrate Mass. This Basilica overlooks the ruins, and houses a relic of the Saint. We see the Archaeological Site of Hippo Regius, which is more ancient than Carthage, and the city of adoption of St. Augustine, where he became Bishop, and where he died in 430AD. Continue to the hotel, for dinner and overnight.

Day 4 - Tuesday, October 6, 2026
ANNABA / SOUK AHRAS / ANNABA
After breakfast, we check out and drive to Thagaste, to see Augustine's birthplace, the homeland of Saint Monique, the mother of St. Augustine. We see the olive tree of St. Augustine, the souks and museum. We enjoy a group restaurant lunch, before returning to Annaba for dinner and overnight.

Day 5 - Wednesday, October 7, 2026
ANNABA / TUNIS
We depart after breakfast to Tunis, the capital city of Tunisia. Upon arrival, we enjoy a group lunch before beginning a guided tour that includes the Museums, where we can admire the most beautiful mosaics in the world. Continue to the hotel, for dinner and overnight.

Day 6 - Thursday, October 8, 2026
TUNIS / MILAN
We have an early morning start today to checkout and head to the airport for our flight to Milan. Flight TBS. After arrival in Milan, we are welcomed by our guide and driver. We enjoy a half day panoramic tour of Milan, including the Duomo, and celebrate Mass. We then visit the Baptistry of where St. Augustine was baptized by Ambrose, before heading to our hotel for dinner and overnight.

Day 7 - Friday, October 9, 2026
MILAN / PAVIA / MILAN
After breakfast, we visit the church of St. Ambrogio, one of Milan's oldest and most important churches. Afternoon, we drive to Pavia to visit the Basilica of San Pietro in Ciel d'Oro, where the tomb of St. Augustine lies and his relics are preserved in a marble reliquary on the upper floor of the church. Return to Milan for dinner and overnight.

Day 8 - Saturday, October 10, 2026
MILAN / CASSAGO BRANZZA / PADUA
After breakfast, we depart Milan and drive to Cassago Branzza to visit the sites associated with St. Augustine. Between 386-387AD, Augustine stayed in a country house in the village of Cassiacio. He was a guest of his friend Verecondo. Augustine had come to Cassiacum seeking hours of rest and peace to prepare himself for his baptism. Cassago Branzza is also where St. Augustine sought to live a retired life. Continue to Padua for dinner and overnight.

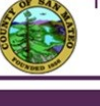






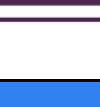
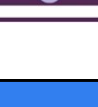

Updates on the Bankruptcy Settlement

Chapter 11 Reorganization

July 16, 2026

Dear SAC Parishioners, Family and Friends,

Last July 6th, we received a letter from Archbishop Cordileone to follow-up on the next step as we exit the nearly three years Chapter 11 Reorganization of Bankruptcy. Archbishop asked that all parishes, schools and other archdiocesan entities help fund the Survivors' Trust that would facilitate for a fair compensation for victims of sexual abuse related to society and from within the Church. At the same time, this settlement would permit us to resume the ministry for the spiritual needs of the faithful and support to those in the community who rely so much on our services.

Archbishop emphasized that no financial settlement could erase this plague from our society and from within the Church. He continues to ask us to work together in bringing some level of reconciliation and closure to those who have carried this burden for decades.

To ensure fair and equitable treatment, our parish assessment was carefully determined by a third-party financial advisory that analyzed our parish financial data over two years. The assessment to contribute to the Survivors' Trust for our parish is **\$1,000,000**. To avoid any adverse effects of market volatility, it'd be prudent and highly recommended that we submit the requested assessment by **August 15, 2026**.

After several meetings and consultations with our Parish Manager, Patricia Abdelalim, and the Parish Finance Council, chaired by Essie Claveria, we were able to determine and understand how the third-party financial advisory came up with their assessment of \$1M for SAC. The third-party financial advisory assessed the amount from our non-restricted assets in our parish savings and checking accounts. The designated or restricted assets for our major parish hall project and the church canopy (sunshade) project found in our parish accounts as well as in our Deposit and Loan Account in the Capital Assets Support Corporation (CASC) of the Archdiocese have remained intact. ***This is definitely good news!*** We have the money to meet the parish assessment as well as the initial funds that we could use to begin our major project of renovating and expanding our parish hall as well as the needed sunshade in front of the Church. In fact, to date, we have already invited 5 General Contractors to a site-visit necessary for submitting their respective bids for the Bathroom Renovation project in our parish hall. We hope to choose the General Contractor in two weeks and witness the beginning of the construction not too long after. The selected General Contractor is expected to begin work on August 15, 2026, and complete the project no later than November 20, 2026. The bathroom project is part of the overall master plan for the renovation and expansion of our parish hall.

Know that we, the Clergy and Staff, are deeply grateful for your understanding, patience and faithful stewardship that sustains SAC's vibrancy and relevance for its many parishioners.
