A Tribute to Motherhood



There is no manual that comes with motherhood but the moment a woman becomes a mother, she becomes the pillar of strength and leadership in her family. Amid the chaotic and challenging times around the world, mothers are thrust into never-ending family responsibilities for caring, planning, budgeting, disciplining their children, and for those who are in the workforce, the pressure is more than doubled.

Mothers, including those who have taken the role of caring for others, have been blessed with the ability to multi-task. Working mothers have had a tougher time juggling the jobs of being mothers at home and career women in the corporate world. Most mothers do not have the luxury of having a support system of friends and relatives that are close to them, who can take care of their children while they are away from home earning a living. In the United States, finding affordable childcare is extremely difficult and frustrating. Many mothers make the ultimate sacrifice to leave their own children to take care of other people's children. In the Philippines, thousands of migrant women leave their families behind to become Overseas Foreign Workers (OFWs) so they can provide a better life for their children. Thanks to the advent of technology and social media, migrant mothers can now virtually be with their family and converse with them on Zoom and other platforms. But the long physical separation creates emotional scars that cannot be healed by money and material comfort.

For migrant mothers, the Church plays an important role in their lives. Being separated from their own family for a long period of time, their church friends have now become their family. Their devotion to the Blessed Mother intensifies while they are working abroad as they identify their suffering with that of the Blessed Virgin Mary who endured the ultimate suffering while watching her Son died on the Cross. Countless mothers from south of the border brave the harsh elements and travel on foot with their children in hopes of making better lives in this country. These mothers are strong because of their faith. They truly believe that no matter what, God will be there for them. That is God's greatest gifts to mothers: tenacity, resilience, and strong faith in the midst of adversity.

Mothers are important, and we should celebrate them every day, not just on Mother's Day. God recognized this when He chose women to bring life into the world. A prime example of a mother's devotion is St. Monica, the patron saint of mothers. Her faith and dedication to motherhood played a pivotal role in the spiritual formation of one of the most brilliant philosophers and well-known saints of all time – Saint Augustine, her son. Let us honor all the mothers in the world. They are truly God's gifts to all of us.

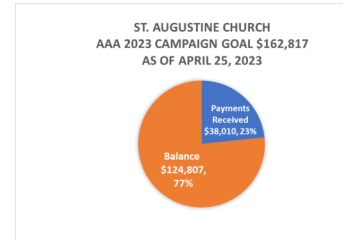
