Wisdom 9:13-18b
Psalm 90:3-4, 5-6, 12-13, 14-17
Philemon 9-10, 12-17
Luke 14:25-33

In chapter 14 of Luke's Gospel, Jesus is speaking to people gathered at the table about the difficulties of following him. This group of people is suspicious about Jesus, looking to catch him doing something wrong. Jesus speaks to them in parables, emphasizing that although there is a right way to be a disciple and enter the kingdom of his Father, it is a difficult path to follow. Many, even some of the guests of the table, reject the invitation. So, Jesus turns to the crowds and speaks to them of discipleship. Jesus explains that, when it comes to making a choice for the Kingdom of God, nothing can get in the way. When Jesus describes "hating" one's father and mother, he is not talking about feelings. Rather, he is emphasizing very strongly that choosing to be a disciple means that everything else — family, money, your own life — must come second. In Matthew's version of the story (Matthew 10:37), Jesus refers not to "hating" father or mother, but to loving them more than Jesus. Jesus makes it very clear that being a disciple is not easy. It means to bear one's own cross. These difficult sayings of Jesus are followed by two brief parables (a person constructing a tower and a king marching into battle) that makes an obvious point — don't start what you cannot finish. Discipleship is difficult and is something we can commit to only if we are prepared to put the Kingdom of God before everything else.



Our CCSF Adult Day Centers Offer Hope and Compassion for Seniors and their Families

Catholic Charities Adult Day Services (San Francisco and San Mateo) offers seniors with memory loss and adults with disabilities a safe place to gather, socialize, and have fun. A typical day for our seniors might include anything from chair exercise to watercolor painting, from ring toss to volleyball.

Staff provides a supervised, safe, and friendly environment where seniors can interact with friends, increase their independence, and improve the quality of their lives.

The Caregiver Support Group (Adult Day San Mateo) is a monthly gathering for family members with a loved one diagnosed with cognitive impairment. Co-sponsored by the Alzheimer's Association, the support group provides a safe place for caregivers to share their feelings, frustrations, needs, and concerns, and discuss the inherent challenges of the caregiving journey. The group also provides coping methods, practical caregiving strategies, resources, and support for one another.

The Memory Café (Adult Day San Mateo) provides an accepting and accessible environment where recently diagnosed individuals with cognitive impairments and their care partners can enjoy time together socializing, connecting, and creating new memories. Participants enjoy meaningful, joyful activities that enhance the ability for individuals and families to navigate more effectively through their journey of care.





Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Even though I couldn't celebrate Mass with you today, August 28th, and was unable to join some of the weeklong jubilee festivities, I was very much united with you in spirit and deep prayer. My dialysis treatment has been going well in recent days and it has allowed me to serve you and fulfill some of my pastoral duties. Thank you for your love and continued prayers as well as for the dedication of the Parish Leaderships in carrying out the plans for a joyful celebration of our parish's 55th Founding Anniversary.

A few days ago, I experienced a small setback with my catheter that resulted to some complications and which prevented me from doing any treatments. But thanks be to God, its impact was controlled. My doctors, care team and I are now exploring new treatment options that will best work for me with my current health situation.

I find myself walking with you as Pilgrims of Hope during this Jubilee Year, my hope remains alive and steadfast. I felt Father Greg Heidenblut's homily today on the feast of Saint Augustine when he highlighted the fear of the saint for becoming a priest and later on as a bishop. Saint Augustine said in his classic book, the Confessions, "With you I am a Christian and for you I'm terrified because I'm responsible for the salvation of your souls..." It has been my prayer and burning desire to care for the souls entrusted in my priestly ministry. But I also fear for that day when I'd be unable to do to care souls. The burning call to care for souls through the Sacraments, especially the Holy Eucharist, remains in my heart and it strengthens me each day.

My family, care team and I have been asked with love by those who expressed interest in becoming a living donor, not only for me but for others in the same situation. If you feel moved to consider helping me as I have recently been placed in the waiting list for kidney transplant, please apply on my behalf using my information, Raymund M.
