2 Kings 5:14-17
Psalm 98: 1, 2-3, 3-4
2 Timothy 2:8-13
Luke 17: 11-19

Today we hear about how Jesus, continuing his journey to Jerusalem, heals 10 lepers. This story is a lesson about faith and reminds us that faith is sometimes found in unlikely places. Ten people afflicted with leprosy cry out to Jesus. Struck with pity, Jesus heals all 10. However, only one is described as glorifying God and returning to thank Jesus. The one who returns is a Samaritan, a foreigner. In the Jewish circles in which Jesus lived, Samaritans were looked down upon because of the differences between the two communities in their observance of Judaism. It is significant, therefore, that Jesus commends the Samaritan for his faith, which has been his salvation. Throughout Luke's Gospel, faith is found in surprising places.

Another lesson for us in this Gospel has to do with salvation. All 10 of the lepers were given the gift of healing, but in his gratitude to God for this gift, the Samaritan found salvation. Our salvation is found in recognizing the gifts we have been given and knowing to whom we must offer our thanks.

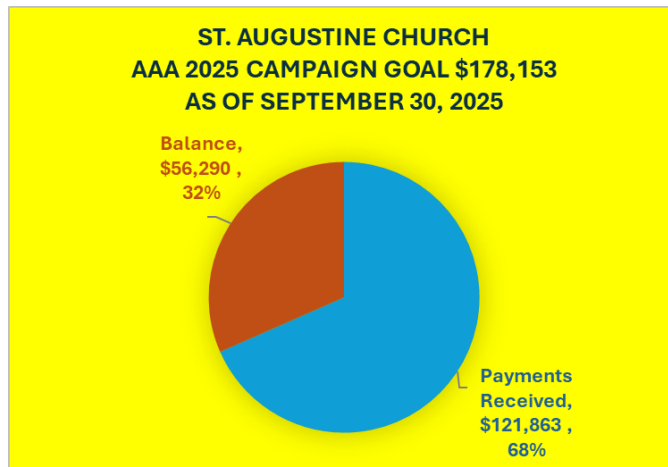

Our CCSF Adult Day Centers Offer Hope and Compassion for Seniors and their Families

Catholic Charities Adult Day Services ([San Francisco](#) and [San Mateo](#)) offers seniors with memory loss and adults with disabilities a safe place to gather, socialize, and have fun. A typical day for our seniors might include anything from chair exercise to watercolor painting, from ring toss to volleyball.

Staff provides a supervised, safe, and friendly environment where seniors can interact with friends, increase their independence, and improve the quality of their lives.

The Caregiver Support Group ([Adult Day San Mateo](#)) is a monthly gathering for family members with a loved one diagnosed with cognitive impairment. Co-sponsored by the Alzheimer's Association, the support group provides a safe place for caregivers to share their feelings, frustrations, needs, and concerns, and discuss the inherent challenges of the caregiving journey. The group also provides coping methods, practical caregiving strategies, resources, and support for one another.

The Memory Café ([Adult Day San Mateo](#)) provides an accepting and accessible environment where recently diagnosed individuals with cognitive impairments and their care partners can enjoy time together socializing, connecting, and creating new memories. Participants enjoy meaningful, joyful activities that enhance the ability for individuals and families to navigate more effectively through their journey of care.



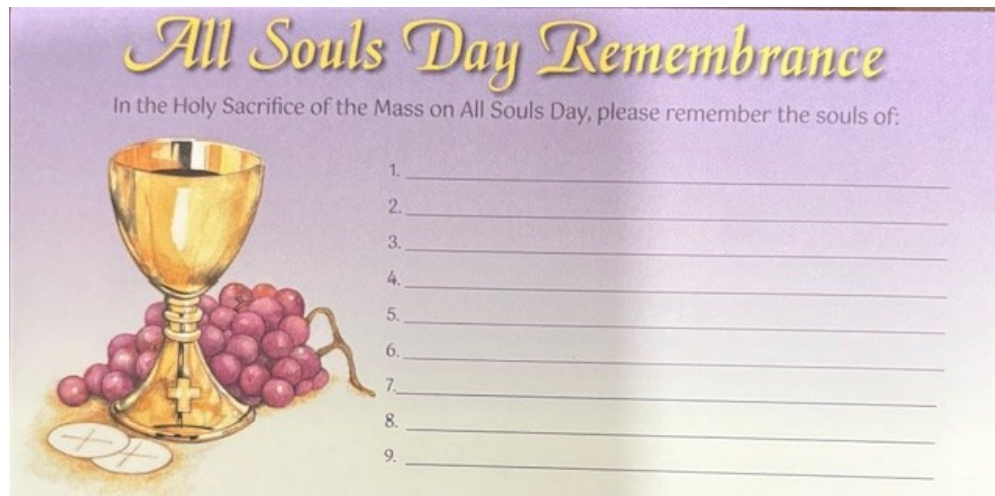

The magnificent reliquary of St. Thérèse, containing some of her bones, has visited more than 70 countries around the world since 1994. There have been great crowds and great blessings everywhere. Such continued worldwide acclaim is unprecedented in the history of the Church. St. Thérèse continues to be loved as “the greatest saint of modern times.” She wrote in her autobiography, *Story of a Soul*: “I would like to travel over the whole earth to preach the Gospel...”

In 1999-2000 the reliquary of St. Thérèse first came to the United States. More than one million people came to venerate her relics in 25 states. Now, twenty-five years later, it is a special blessing that the reliquary will be visiting our country during the 100th anniversary year of her Canonization and for the Jubilee Year of the Church.
