Scripture Insights

The first reading picks up the Exodus story after God's dramatic rescue of Abraham's descendants from slavery in Egypt. Now they are in the desert, on their way to the land God promised to Abraham, and they are thirsty. They are so thirsty that they complain that Moses has brought them out of Egypt and into the desert to die of thirst.



In John's Gospel, Jesus tells a thirsty woman that he has living water that will quench thirst forever. Later in John, we learn that this living water is the Holy Spirit, who will be a river flowing out from all those who believe in Christ and receive the gift of the Spirit. God gives water that quenches all our thirsts, bodily and spiritually. This water is so abundant (rivers of it!) that it overflows from those who have it to all those who are thirsty.

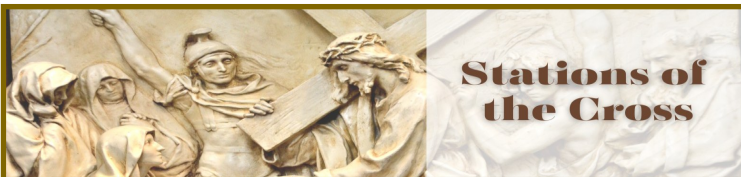

DID YOU KNOW?

What to do when a child discloses abuse
Receiving a disclosure of abuse is a huge responsibility — and one that must be handled properly to ensure the child's safety. First and foremost, it is important to remain calm, and to let the child know that you are listening and taking them seriously. Assure them that you believe their words, and that you want to help. As soon as possible, although not while the child is talking to you, take notes and record details, and then report what was disclosed to you to the proper authorities. 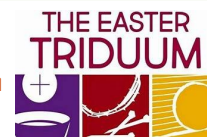
