At that time the Lord appointed seventy-two others whom he sent ahead of him in pairs to every town and place he intended to visit. He said to them, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest. Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves. Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals; and greet no one along the way. DID YOU KNOW? Learning from survivors of abuse

Statistically, one in four children will experience some
form of abuse – sexual, physical, emotional or neglect –
during their childhood. Sadly, most child abuse goes either
unnoticed or unreported, due to fear, a lack of knowledge
in what constitutes abuse, or a reluctance to get involved.
Safe adults have a responsibility to learn from survivors
about abusive situations that went unresolved or
unreported, to protect children from harm. For more
