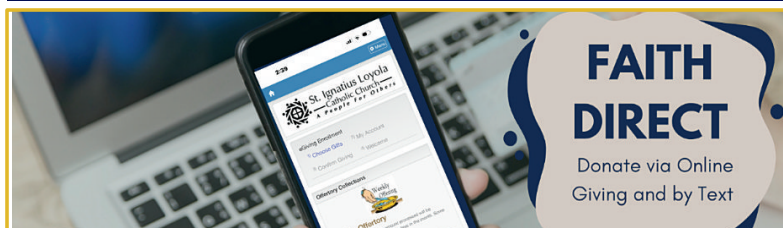

PASTOR'S COLUMN



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Today, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, traditionally known as *Corpus Christi Sunday*. This feast, rich in mystery and devotion, draws our attention to the Real Presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist—Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. You might be wondering, *Why do we celebrate this feast so soon after Easter?* The answer lies in the very heart of our faith. Easter celebrates the victory of Christ over sin and death through His Passion, Death, and Resurrection. Pentecost reveals the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Church. Now, Corpus Christi offers us the opportunity to contemplate the *ongoing presence* of the Risen Lord in our midst—specifically in the Most Blessed Sacrament of the Altar. It is as though the liturgical calendar is guiding us step by step into a deeper awareness: Christ died and rose for us, sent us His Spirit, and remains with us in the Eucharist to nourish us, form us, and send us on mission. Historically, the Solemnity of Corpus Christi dates back to the 13th century. It was inspired by the Eucharistic visions of a Belgian nun, St. Juliana of Liège, and formally established as a universal feast by Pope Urban IV in 1264. The Church, recognizing the centrality of the Eucharist in our lives, instituted this solemnity to invite all the faithful to contemplate and adore the real presence of Christ in a special way.

This feast is especially meaningful this year as we prepare to celebrate the canonization of Blessed Carlo Acutis, a young man who had a profound love for the Eucharist and used his gifts to evangelize in the digital age. Carlo, born in 1991 and died of leukemia in 2006 at the age of 15, lived an ordinary life with extraordinary faith. He created a website cataloging Eucharistic miracles around the world, saying, *"The Eucharist is my highway to heaven."* Carlo Acutis was a teenager, a computer whiz, a soccer player, a friend, a son—and above all, a disciple. From a young age, he had a deep devotion to Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. He attended daily Mass, spent time in Eucharistic adoration, and brought that same love of Christ into his everyday interactions with classmates, friends, and the poor. His life is a powerful reminder that holiness is not reserved for the old or the ordained—it is a universal call, accessible even (and perhaps especially) to the young. His beatification in 2020 and upcoming canonization offer the Church a modern model of sanctity rooted in the Eucharist. Blessed Carlo's example is especially relevant for our times. In an age where many question the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, Carlo reminds us—with youthful clarity and conviction—that Jesus is truly here. Not symbolically. Not metaphorically. But *really, truly, and substantially* present. As our parish continues to focus on Eucharistic renewal and the formation of missionary disciples, Blessed Carlo's witness encourages us to rekindle our love for the Eucharist and to teach this truth with conviction to our children, youth, and families.

Speaking of missionary discipleship, I invite you to keep in prayer our parishioner missionaries who are in the final stages of preparation for their journey to Quiché, Guatemala, where they will spend a week beginning July 5th serving the children and families of "La Escuelita"—the Little School. Their trip is a concrete expression of love and accompaniment, rooted in the Eucharist and lived out in service. Please consider signing up for a time to cover our missionaries in prayer while they are away. This spiritual support is not just symbolic—it is powerful.

On a different note, I know many of you are already preparing to say farewell to Fr. Wayne, who has served our parish faithfully and joyfully over these past few years. His farewell reception will be held on Saturday evening, June 28th, following the Vigil Mass. The bulletin contains all the details. I invite you to bring memories to share—stories that speak of his presence among us as a brother, priest, and friend. You may also email any photos to bulletin@silcc.org for inclusion in a memory slideshow. Your presence that evening will be a gift to Fr. Wayne as he begins a new chapter in his priestly ministry. As I write this letter, I am still awaiting official word from the Vicar of Clergy as to who will be appointed to replace Fr. Wayne as our next Parochial Vicar. I have been assured that a replacement is being sought, but no final announcement has been made yet. In the meantime, I kindly ask for your patience and understanding. Until the new Parochial Vicar arrives, I will be the only priest assigned here at St. Ignatius of Loyola. That will mean adjustments in scheduling, availability, and coverage. I thank you in advance for your support and flexibility as we navigate this temporary period together.

Brothers and sisters, let us draw strength from the mystery we celebrate today. The Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith, the wellspring of our mission, and the food for our journey. As Blessed Carlo Acutis often said, *"We are all born original, but many die as photocopies."* The Eucharist gives us the grace to live as the original masterpieces God created us to be—transformed by Christ and sent to transform the world. May we never take for granted the gift we receive at every Mass. And may our celebration of Corpus Christi renew our reverence, our gratitude, and our desire to become what we receive—the Body of Christ for the life of the world.

Sunday, Jun 22, 2025**Satisfying beyond measure**

Human need doesn't get much more basic than food and drink. But our hunger and thirst go beyond the physical. We also have essential spiritual requirements: We hunger and thirst for God. To our eternal good fortune, God satisfies all of our needs through the Body and Blood of Jesus. The sacrament of the Eucharist is a living reminder that God is with us and provides us with abundance where there was scarcity; presence where there was absence; life where the shadow of death once fell. It is a miraculous level of satisfaction. What more do we need?

SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST (CORPUS CHRISTI)

Genesis 14:18-20; 1 Corinthians 11:23-26; Luke 9:11b-17 (169). "All ate and were satisfied."

Monday, Jun 23, 2025**Take a clear-eyed look at others**

In Matthew's gospel, Jesus warns, "Stop judging, that you may not be judged." While you may have to make some judgments every day, Jesus forbids judging a person's character, worth, intentions, or standing before God on the basis of what you see. Jesus used the word hypocrite, which comes from the Greek word for "actor," someone who wears a mask. The gospel asks that you unmask yourself, be real, and see more clearly. Indeed, "to speak only of the faults of others does not represent total reality," says Saint Maximilian Kolbe, "for every man, in addition to his faults, also has virtues, a good side."

Genesis 12:1-9; Matthew 7:1-5 (371). "You hypocrite, remove the wooden beam from your eye first; then you will see clearly to remove the splinter from your brother's eye."

Tuesday, Jun 24, 2025**His name is John**

John cuts a courageous figure of faith we do well to remember and honor. "His name is John," both his parents insist. And what does that tell us? Saint Pope John Paul II explains: John, "in Hebrew means 'God is benevolent.' God is benevolent to human beings; he wants them to live; he wants them to be saved." So we do well to listen to John as he prepares the way, "towards the land, where peace and justice reign."

SOLEMNITY OF THE NATIVITY OF JOHN THE BAPTIST

Isaiah 49:1-6; Acts 13:22-26; Luke 1:57-66, 80 (587). "Surely the hand of the Lord was with him."

Wednesday, Jun 25, 2025**Leaders we deserve**

"For leadership, there is only one road: service," said Pope Francis. Unfortunately, it is often difficult to trust those in leadership. Some of our leaders resort to deception and concealment to further their own ends or those of the institutions they represent. Our faith, including our biblical tradition, however, offers a reliable guide to tell whether what we're being told is the real deal. Do leaders actually end up doing what they say they are going to do? Do people get to a better place because they followed a particular leader? It may take some time, but outcomes always reveal true intentions. Place your trust in leaders who have shown themselves worthy of serving.

Genesis 15:1-12, 17-18; Matthew 7:15-20 (373). "By their fruits you will know them."

Thursday, Jun 26, 2025**Start with a strong foundation**

In the wake of devastating earthquakes, there often follows review of building codes and criticism that buildings had not been built properly to withstand such events. Jesus uses similar imagery to describe the condition of those who rely only on the facade of doing good as their claim on salvation. He says it's not enough to call him "Lord." It's not even enough only to "drive out demons" and do spectacular deeds in his name. All of that is good showmanship; it's curb appeal, but if that pretty life is not built on the rock-solid gospel values of compassion, forgiveness, justice, and love, then one might rightly worry about the shifting ground below. We cannot control the changes and dangers in the world, but we can choose where we build and on what foundation.

Genesis 16:1-12, 15-16; Matthew 7:21-29 (374). "Be like a wise man who built his house on rock."

Friday, Jun 27, 2025**Tend to the heart**

We've all known the ache of a broken heart. Today, as we celebrate the Sacred Heart of Jesus, we remember that God, too, has felt that same pain—in the person of His Son, Jesus Christ. The image of a heart burning with love yet pierced by thorns perfectly mirrors our own experience when life falls apart—when those we love suffer or when we ourselves are overwhelmed by sorrow. But it's also an image of God's own heart, wounded by a world that resists the joy, peace, and wholeness He longs to give. In *Dilexit Nos*, Pope Francis reflects: "If each of us considers his or her own sins and their effect on others, we will realize that repairing the harm done to this world also calls for a desire to mend wounded hearts where the deepest harm was done, and the hurt is most painful." Align yourself with the heart of Jesus by actively trying to repair the broken hearts around you.

SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS

Ezekiel 34:11-16; Romans 5:5b-11; Luke 15:3-7 (172).

"There will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who have no need of repentance."

Saturday, Jun 28, 2025**Welcome Jesus in**

Before Catholics receive Holy Communion at Mass, they pray the simple words, "Lord, I am not worthy for you to enter under my roof, but only say the word and I shall be healed." The words "enter under my roof" take on a deeper meaning when we consider that they are the same ones spoken to Jesus by a Roman centurion who desperately sought healing for his servant. This soldier humbly acknowledged he was not worthy of having Jesus enter into his home yet at the same time boldly asked for Jesus' help. This faith—both humble and courageous—amazed Jesus, who responded by praising the centurion and healing the servant. When next you utter these words, remember the faith of the centurion and welcome Jesus in.

Genesis 18:1-15; Matthew 8:5-17 (376). "Lord, I am not worthy to have you enter under my roof; only say the word and my servant will be healed."

Perpetual Mass Intentions

are celebrated on the first Saturday of
the month at our 5:15 p.m. Mass. The name
of the recipient of the intention is entered
into a special book but not announced or
written in the bulletin. These intentions are
perpetual so there is no ending date.

Daily Mass Intentions

allow you to select a date and Mass time.
These names are in the weekly bulletin and
are usually, but not always, included in the
prayers of the faithful during that Mass.
Please note that Mass dates and times are
first-come, first-served and, the

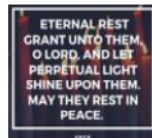

El Poder transformador de la liturgia

Nuestra casa común



United States
Conference of
Catholic Bishops

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Justo antes de la Plegaria eucarística, el sacerdote coloca solemnemente el pan y el vino sobre el altar mientras ora: "Bendito seas, Señor, Dios del universo, por este pan [vino], fruto de la tierra [vid] y del trabajo del hombre, que recibimos de tu generosidad y ahora te presentamos, él será para nosotros pan de vida [bebida de salvación]". Este

elemento ritual manifiesta "la forma eucarística de la vida" y favorece "un auténtico cambio de mentalidad en el modo de ver la historia y el mundo" (Papa Benedicto XVI, *Sacramentum caritatis*, n. 92). La liturgia tiene el poder de transformarnos en personas que cuidan de nuestra casa común.

Teología

El estribillo del primer relato de la creación en el Libro del Génesis es: "fue bueno". Dios, que es bueno, crea, y la creación participa en su bondad y la manifiesta. El sexto día, Dios crea al hombre y a la mujer, y mirando todo lo que ha hecho, Dios lo encuentra "muy bueno". Este "muy bueno" se produce porque la persona humana es creada a imagen de Dios y, como representante de Dios, ejerce un cuidado o "dominio" divino en nombre de la creación. Este dominio se ejerce de dos maneras.

Primero, el hombre y la mujer median en la creatividad de Dios labrando y manteniendo la creación para el bienestar de todos. Gracias a los esfuerzos colaborativos de la humanidad, la naturaleza se convierte en un jardín, el grano en pan y las uvas en vino. Estos dones están destinados a ser disfrutados y celebrados por todos, y esta es la segunda manera en que la humanidad ejerce dominio: mediando conjuntamente en la acción de gracias de la creación, su eucaristía, a Dios. La creación alaba a Dios por su existencia, pero lo hace en silencio; la humanidad da voz a la creación. En la plenitud de los tiempos, el

Verbo se hace carne, tomando para sí toda la creación

y transformándola. La creación sirve al misterio pascual de Cristo el madero de la cruz y la roca del sepulcro, al establecer los sacramentos que comunican su vida divina a los seres humanos, Cristo hace uso de las cosas creadas.

Liturgia

Además del servicio de la creación en la liturgia y los sacramentos, una relación adecuada con las cosas creadas prepara el camino para una auténtica participación litúrgica. En *Laudato si'*, el Papa Francisco describió el paso de una comprensión superficial de la creación a una comprensión integral, que percibe la forma en que las criaturas manifiestan la bondad de Dios (cfr. nn. 233-234). El Santo Padre describió algo similar en la liturgia, que requiere que los cristianos lean los símbolos, pasando del signo exterior a la realidad interior (cfr. *Desiderio desideravi*, nn. 44-46). Leer la creación nos facilita leer la liturgia, y esta auténtica participación litúrgica nos prepara para ser personas que cuidan de nuestra casa común.

En 2015, el Papa Francisco estableció para la Iglesia Católica la Jornada mundial de oración por el

cuidado de la creación el 1º de septiembre de cada año, celebración que se observa en este día desde 1989 por las Iglesias Ortodoxas. En 2007, el Consejo Mundial de Iglesias estableció el período comprendido entre el 1 de septiembre y el memorial de san Francisco de Asís, el 4 de octubre, como un "Tiempo de la Creación" ecuménico. Las comunidades pueden celebrar este día o tiempo litúrgicamente de diversas formas, especialmente en la homilía, la Oración universal y las selecciones musicales.

El Misal Romano también contiene Misas y oraciones por varias necesidades y para diversas circunstancias que están relacionadas con el tema de la creación:

- "Por la santificación del trabajo humano" (n. 2G)
- "En el tiempo de la siembra" (n. 27)
- "Para después de la cosecha" (n. 28)
- "En el tiempo de hambre o por los que padecen hambre" (n. 33)
- "Para pedir la lluvia" (n. 35)
- "Para pedir buen tiempo" (n. 3G)
- "Para alejar las tempestades" (n. 37)

Las oraciones de estos formularios de Misa expresan: el origen divino de la creación para el sustento de todas las personas; el origen, dirección y consumación de la obra humana por la gracia divina; la acción de gracias y la alabanza como los fines del trabajo humano, y la fecundidad terrenal como un llamado a la fecundidad espiritual.

Acción

Una forma de actuar es estudiar la encíclica del Papa Francisco sobre el cuidado de nuestra casa común, *Laudato si'*; puede encontrarse una guía de discusión útil en [USCCB.org/environment](https://usccb.org/environment). Los "simples gestos cotidianos" realizados en común también pueden tener un enorme impacto (*Laudato si'*, n. 230): reducir el uso de servicios públicos y la basura o reciclar y hacer composta. Además, a la luz de la enseñanza de la Iglesia sobre el destino universal de los bienes (cfr. Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, nn. 2402-2403), es importante preguntarse quiénes no tienen acceso a los bienes de la creación que necesitan para su bienestar. A menudo son las poblaciones vulnerables las que más sufren la distribución desigual de los recursos (cfr. *Laudato si'*, n. 230).





Queridos hermanos:

Hoy celebramos la Solemnidad del Santísimo Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo, tradicionalmente conocida como *el Domingo de Corpus Christi*. Esta fiesta, rica en misterio y devoción, nos lleva a la Presencia Real de Cristo en la Sagrada Eucaristía: Cuerpo, Sangre, Alma y Divinidad. Quizás se pregunten: *¿Por qué celebramos esta fiesta tan pronto después de la Pascua?* La respuesta reside en el corazón mismo de nuestra fe. La Pascua celebra la victoria de Cristo sobre el pecado y la muerte mediante su Pasión, Muerte y Resurrección. Pentecostés revela el don del Espíritu Santo y el nacimiento de la Iglesia. Ahora, el Corpus Christi nos ofrece la oportunidad de contemplar *la presencia continua* del Señor Resucitado en medio de nosotros, específicamente en el Santísimo Sacramento del Altar. Es como si el calendario litúrgico nos guiara paso a paso hacia una conciencia más profunda: Cristo murió y resucitó por nosotros, nos envió su Espíritu y permanece con nosotros en la Eucaristía para nutrirnos, formarnos y enviarnos en misión. Históricamente, la Solemnidad del Corpus Christi se remonta al siglo XIII. Se inspiró en las visiones eucarísticas de una monja belga, Santa Juliana de Lieja, conocida también como Santa Juliana de Cornillon y fue establecida formalmente como fiesta universal por el Papa Urbano IV en 1264. La Iglesia, reconociendo la centralidad de la Eucaristía en nuestras vidas, instituyó esta solemnidad para invitar a todos los fieles a contemplar y adorar la presencia real de Cristo de una manera especial.

Esta fiesta toma un significado especial este año, ya que nos preparamos para celebrar la canonización del beato Carlo Acutis, un joven que sentía un profundo amor por la Eucaristía y utilizó sus dones para evangelizar en la era digital. Carlo, nacido en 1991 y fallecido de leucemia en 2006 a los 15 años, vivió una vida normal con una fe extraordinaria. Creó un sitio web que cataloga los milagros eucarísticos de todo el mundo, afirmando: *"La Eucaristía es mi autopista al cielo"*. Carlo Acutis fue adolescente, un genio de la informática, futbolista, amigo, hijo y, sobre todo, discípulo. Desde pequeño, tuvo una profunda devoción a Jesús en el Santísimo Sacramento. Asistía a misa a diario, dedicaba tiempo a la adoración eucarística y transmitía ese mismo amor de Cristo a sus interacciones cotidianas con compañeros de clase, amigos y los pobres. Su vida es un poderoso recordatorio de que la santidad no está reservada para los ancianos ni para los ordenados; es una llamada universal, accesible incluso (y quizás especialmente) a los jóvenes. Su beatificación en 2020 y su próxima canonización ofrecen a la Iglesia un modelo moderno de santidad arraigada en la Eucaristía. El ejemplo del Beato Carlo es especialmente relevante para nuestros tiempos. En una época en la que muchos cuestionan la presencia real de Jesús en la Eucaristía, Carlo nos recuerda, con una claridad y convicción juvenil, que Jesús está verdaderamente aquí. No simbólicamente. No metafóricamente. *Sino real, verdadera y sustancialmente* presente. Mientras nuestra parroquia continúa enfocándose en la renovación eucarística y la formación de discípulos misioneros, el testimonio del Beato Carlo nos anima a reavivar nuestro amor por la Eucaristía y a enseñar esta verdad con convicción a nuestros niños, jóvenes y familias.

Hablando de discipulado misionero, los invito a orar por nuestros feligreses misioneros que se encuentran en la etapa final de preparación para su viaje a Quiché, Guatemala, donde pasarán una semana a partir del 5 de julio sirviendo a los niños y familias de "La Escuelita". Su viaje es una expresión concreta de amor y acompañamiento, arraigado en la Eucaristía y vivido en el servicio. Por favor, considere inscribirse para un tiempo de oración por nuestros misioneros durante su ausencia. Este apoyo espiritual no es solo simbólico, sino también poderoso.

Por otra parte, sé que muchos de ustedes ya se están preparando para despedir al Padre Wayne, quien ha servido a nuestra parroquia con fidelidad y alegría durante estos últimos años. Su recepción de despedida se celebrará la noche del sábado 28 de junio, después de la Misa de Vigilia. El boletín contiene todos los detalles. Los invito a compartir recuerdos: historias que hablen de su presencia entre nosotros como hermano, sacerdote y amigo. También pueden enviar fotos por correo electrónico a bulletin@silcc.org para incluirlas en una presentación de recuerdos. Su presencia esa noche será un regalo para el Padre Wayne en este nuevo capítulo de su ministerio sacerdotal. Mientras escribo esta carta, sigo esperando la confirmación oficial del Vicario del Clero sobre quién será nombrado para reemplazar al Padre Wayne como nuestro próximo Vicario Parroquial. Me han asegurado que se está buscando un reemplazo, pero aún no se ha hecho un anuncio definitivo. Mientras tanto, les pido su paciencia y comprensión. Hasta la llegada del nuevo Vicario Parroquial, seré el único sacerdote asignado aquí en San Ignacio de Loyola. Esto implicará ajustes en la programación, la disponibilidad y la cobertura. Les agradezco de antemano su apoyo y flexibilidad mientras navegamos juntos por este período temporal.

Hermanos y hermanas, adquiramos fuerza del misterio que celebramos hoy. La Eucaristía es fuente y cumbre de nuestra fe, el manantial de nuestra misión y el alimento de nuestro camino. Como solía decir el beato Carlo Acutis: *"Todos nacemos originales, pero muchos mueren como fotocopias"*. La Eucaristía nos da la gracia de vivir como las obras maestras originales que Dios nos creó para ser: transformados por Cristo y enviados a transformar el mundo. Que nunca demos por sentado el don que recibimos en cada misa. Y que nuestra celebración del Corpus Christi renueve nuestra reverencia, nuestra gratitud y nuestro deseo de convertirnos en lo que recibimos: el Cuerpo de Cristo para la vida del mundo.

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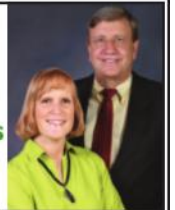
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
