PASTOR'S COLUMN



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This weekend, as our nation celebrates Independence Day, let us give thanks for the freedoms we enjoy and the responsibilities they bring. May we continue to pray for peace, unity, and the common good. To those who may be visiting our parish this holiday weekend, welcome! We are glad you are here and hope you feel at home among our community of faith.

As we turn the calendar page to July, I want to take a moment to reflect on a season of transitions within our parish community, some bittersweet, others full of hopeful new beginnings. On June 30th, we said good-bye to Fr. Wayne as he concluded his assignment here at St. Ignatius of Loyola and begins a new chapter of priestly ministry at Laurence Parish, Sugarland, in the archdiocese. Fr. Wayne has been a joyful and generous presence among us. He will be deeply missed—not only for his engaging homilies and love for board games and young adult gatherings, but especially for his genuine availability to those in need. His pastoral heart touched many lives. Please continue to keep him in prayer as he embraces this next step in his vocation. It is important to remember that priestly assignments are made by the archbishop, not by the pastor of the parish. We are part of a broader diocesan Church, and our priests are sent to serve where their gifts are most needed, always under the guidance of the Holy Spirit and the wisdom of our Archbishop, Most Rev. Joe Vásquez.

In that same spirit of openness and mission, we now welcome new members to our pastoral staff. This week, we are blessed to welcome two new staff members who will help us carry forward our mission to be *a people for others*. Luis Espada joins us as the Associate Director of Formation for Children and Families. Luis comes to us from the Bronx in New York, where he has spent over two decades in catechetical ministry within the Archdiocese of New York. He has served as Director or Coordinator in three different parishes, and holds every catechetical certificate offered by the archdiocese—along with the experience of training catechists and leading robust programs for OCIA (formerly RCIA) for children and youth, First Eucharist, Penance, and Confirmation. Luis is also a Veteran, having served in the Army Reserve, and received an honorable discharge in April of 1982. His Puerto Rican heritage, his bilingual fluency, and his tireless energy are tremendous gifts that he brings to our community. I am confident he will be a faithful and joyful presence as he accompanies families and children on the journey of faith.

We also welcome Samantha Montalbano as our new Coordinator of Liturgy and Sacraments. Samantha assumes the role recently held by Seth Dalton, who is now serving as Associate Director of Worship for Liturgical Music following Connie Wilson's retirement earlier this summer. Samantha is a recent graduate of the University of St. Mary of the Lake, having completed her Master of Arts in Liturgy. Prior to that, she earned a Bachelor of Arts in Theology from the University of St. Thomas, where she made her mark as the University's first student intern for liturgy. Most recently, she has served as the Assistant to the Department of Liturgy and Worship at Christ the Good Shepherd Parish here in Spring while completing her graduate studies. Samantha brings with her not only strong academic credentials and pastoral experience, but a deep love for the Church's liturgy, a keen organizational sense, and familiarity with tools like Ministry Scheduler Pro (MSP)—which will certainly serve her well as she coordinates our liturgical ministers and sacramental life.

With Luis and Samantha joining our parish team, we are better equipped to grow in our identity as missionary disciples and to form others in the way of Christ. Let us welcome them warmly and offer them our prayers and support as they begin their ministry among us.

As you read this, I am accompanying a group of our parishioners on our annual mission trip to Quiché, Guatemala. Our missionaries are serving once again at "La Escuelita"—the little school we support in partnership with the parish of Santo Tomás Apóstol. The school continues to grow in size and in faith, and the welcome we receive is always overwhelming. It's hard to describe the joy that fills our hearts when we hear children and families calling out from every direction: "*¡Bienvenidos, hermanos y hermanas de Houston!*" Our mission there is more than a project or a trip—it is a mutual encounter, a living expression of God's love that transcends language and borders. We are reminded again and again that we are one body in Christ, called to build up the Kingdom of God through service, solidarity, and joy. Please keep our missionaries in your prayers. They return home on Saturday, July 12, and I will return on Tuesday, July 15.

In this season of transition and renewal, let us recommit ourselves to the mission that Christ entrusts to each of us through baptism: to be disciples and to make disciples. Let us pray for one another, support one another, and remain faithful to our calling as a people for others.

Sunday, Jul 06, 2025**Do some heavy lifting**

A homilist once said, "The church serves the kingdom of God. It is not the kingdom of God." The church is not all of the kingdom but the best way to it. And God's kingdom is already here. Jesus taught it is among us but not quite complete. God plays a central role in bringing the kingdom to its fullness, of course, but we disciples have to do some of the heavy lifting, too, to move toward a time when evil does not get the last word; sinners who seek it receive forgiveness; the suffering of those who are poor wanes; and everyone takes up God's offer of new life forever. It's a pretty good deal. How are you proclaiming and working toward it?

Isaiah 66:10-14c; Galatians 6:14-18; Luke 10:1-12, 17-20 or 10:1-9 (102). "Yet know this: the kingdom of God is at hand."

Monday, Jul 07, 2025**When in doubt**

Some people seem to be born with the gift of deep faith. They appear to have an intuitive grasp of the spiritual side of life and to know God is always with them. The rest of us must endure long periods of doubt and uncertainty that are only occasionally interrupted by brief moments of spiritual clarity. Saint John of the Cross advises us to "Live in faith and hope, though it be in darkness, for in this darkness God protects the soul." Ask yourself, "Where am I on the continuum between faith and doubt?" Is it possible that the Lord is with you and you don't know it? Ask God to shine his light into your darkness.

Genesis 28:10-22a; Matthew 9:18-26 (383). "Truly, the Lord is in this spot, although I did not know it!"

Tuesday, Jul 08, 2025**Wrestle with your fears and doubts**

When you think of an encounter with God, what's the first image that comes to mind? Wrestling? Maybe not, but it's a powerful biblical image. Think of Jacob, who grappled with the angel of God. At the time, Jacob feared for his life because he was in dangerous territory. Would God remain with him in his hour of need? For Jacob, a crisis of faith followed. So did a wrestling match. How often do we wrestle with God? In illness, financial hardship, and other troubles, we may try to lash out at God or try to negotiate. A monk once told author Nikos Kazantzakis that he wrestled with God. "With God!" Kazantzakis exclaimed. "And you hope to win?" The monk replied. "I hope to lose." Pray that in your next battle with God, despite feeling bruised and battered, you emerge with greater self-knowledge and stronger faith.

Genesis 32:23-33; Matthew 9:32-38 (384). "But Jacob said, 'I will not let you go until you bless me.'"

Wednesday, Jul 09, 2025**A tough job but everyone has to do it**

We tend to think that the word apostle—which means "one who is sent"—appears only in the gospels, yet the term is also used in Saint Paul's letters to mean "one who has seen the risen Lord and has been commissioned to proclaim the Resurrection." And in fact all believers in Christ are commissioned to evangelize. As Pope Saint John Paul II says, "No believer in Christ, no institution of the Church can avoid this supreme duty: to proclaim Christ to all peoples." But spreading the Good News is no easy task. The early disciples

were scoffed at, scolded, beaten, and tortured for delivering a message that frightened and confused many even as it liberated and heartened a few. Prepare for blowback as you fight the good fight.

Genesis 41:55-57; 42:5-7a, 17-24a; Matthew 10:1-7 (385). "Jesus sent out these Twelve after instructing them."

Thursday, Jul 10, 2025**Turn the tables**

The Israelite Joseph had it tough as the second youngest in a family of 12 brothers. Picked on and resented because he was his dad Jacob's favorite, Joseph is sold into slavery by his brothers. The next time he meets up with his brothers, years later, the tables are turned. Joseph is in a position of power, and his brothers are the vulnerable ones. It wouldn't have taken much for Joseph to tap into feelings of hurt, betrayal, and rage and respond measure for measure. But instead, he draws on love and reacts with kindness and an outpouring of generosity. We, too, have that capacity for a love that is bigger than hurt. Remember that the next time a family resentment challenges you.

Genesis 44:18-21, 23b-29; 45:1-5; Matthew 10:7-15 (386). "It was really for the sake of saving lives that God sent me here ahead of you."

Friday, Jul 11, 2025**What it takes to follow the Rule**

Saint Benedict's famous Rule was originally written as a guide for those living in monastic communities he had founded or had gathered around him. Ever since, though, the Rule of St. Benedict has been a source of guidance and inspiration for many people seeking to live more faithful Christian lives. "This message of mine is for you," Benedict wrote in the prologue to the Rule, "if you are ready to give up your own will, once and for all, and armed with the strong and noble weapons of obedience to do battle for Christ the Lord." All it takes is a simple, "Here I am, Lord" to be ready to follow the rule.

Saturday, Jul 12, 2025**Keep it simple**

Today is National Simplicity Day in honor of the birth of Henry David Thoreau, a 19th-century U.S. transcendental philosopher and author. "Our life is frittered away by detail," says Thoreau in *Walden*, "Simplify, simplify, simplify!" As we enter into the dog days of summer that advice is welcome. But remember that same advice as work and family obligations heat up come fall. Living simply takes effort and strict attention. As Carmelite nun Saint Thérèse of Lisieux insists, "Our Lord needs from us neither great deeds nor profound thoughts. Neither intelligence nor talents. He cherishes simplicity." Where will simplicity lead you? Perhaps where it led Saint Oscar Romero: to live "simply and justly in solidarity with the poor."

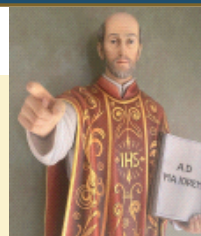

Perpetual Mass Intentions

are celebrated on the first Saturday of
the month at our 5:15 p.m. Mass. The name
of the recipient of the intention is entered
into a special book but not announced or
written in the bulletin. These intentions are
perpetual so there is no ending date.

Daily Mass Intentions

allow you to select a date and Mass time.
These names are in the weekly bulletin and
are usually, but not always, included in the
prayers of the faithful during that Mass.
Please note that Mass dates and times are
first-come, first-served and, the
intention(s) of only one donor is allowed
per Mass.

The Non-Specified Date Intentions

is an option that allows our Priests to
celebrate your Mass when he
concelebrates a Mass, is off-campus,
while on pilgrimage, on retreat, etc.
You will not be notified of the date or
time of this Mass or be able to attend, but
your intentions will be offered as soon as

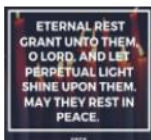

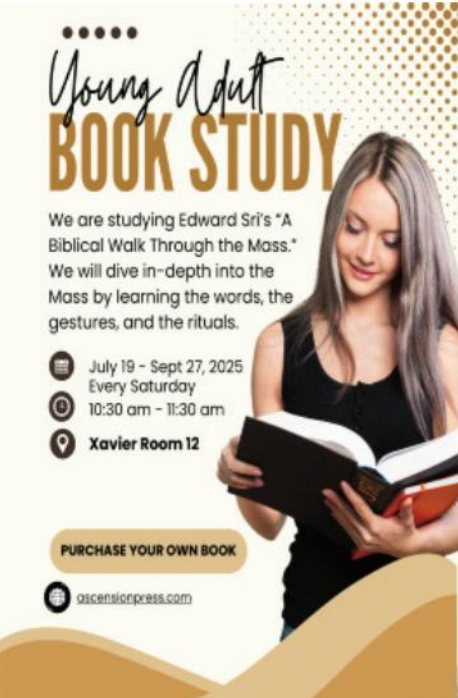

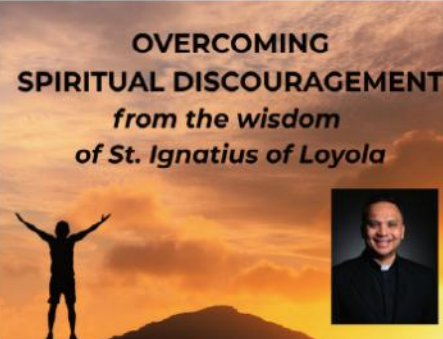

El Poder transformador de la liturgia

Los Migrantes, Refugiados y Pobres

Al examinar las formas en que la liturgia nos transforma en personas que cuidan de los enfermos y moribundos, que llevan el Evangelio a quienes están en los márgenes y periferias de la sociedad, y que defienden la dignidad de todas las razas y etnias, también reflexionamos sobre las formas en que la liturgia nos prepara para ser personas que reciben gustosamente a los migrantes, los refugiados y los pobres.

Teología

Las personas que migran, buscan refugio o carecen de lo necesario para la vida están creadas a imagen de Dios. Si bien cada persona lleva esta imagen en una identidad nacional, étnica y social particular, la imagen de Dios es la primordial, y cada ser humano la lleva igual y plenamente. Los hechos de la migración, la búsqueda de refugio o la falta de lo necesario para la vida no comprometen la imagen de Dios, sino que la manifiestan de maneras únicas. De hecho, como nos recordó el Papa Francisco: “Los pobres son sacramento de Cristo, representan su persona y remiten a él” (Mensaje, V Jornada mundial de los pobres, 13 de junio de 2021). Cristo habita en los “más pequeños” (cfr. Mt 25, 31-46), y se revela a través de ellos de manera especial. Este concepto de dignidad humana es el fundamento del cuidado que se debe brindar a los migrantes, los refugiados y los pobres, así como el fundamento de la política económica y migratoria. También es importante reconocer que la persona humana es miembro de una familia, la “célula básica de la sociedad, el lugar donde se aprende a convivir en la diferencia” (Papa Francisco, *Evangelii gaudium*, n. 58). Por lo tanto, se debe brindar cuidado a los individuos y también a las familias, y las políticas o prácticas que perjudican a las familias deben evaluarse a la luz de sus derechos inherentes a permanecer juntas.

Además, las realidades humanas de la migración y la pobreza revelan algo sobre Dios y sobre nosotros mismos. Al crear el mundo, Dios sale de sí mismo en amor y, al restaurarlo, llama a las personas a migrar hacia él (por ejemplo, el llamado de Abraham). En la plenitud de los tiempos, Cristo salió del Padre, despojándose de sí mismo y haciéndose pobre por nosotros (Jn 16, 28; Flp 2, 7; 2 Co 8, 9). El llamado al discipulado es un llamado a hacerse pobres (Mt 5, 3) y a transitar de un modo de vida a otro (Lc 9, 57-62). En la Gran Comisión, Cristo manda a los apóstoles que emigren (Mt 28, 19) y anuncien a Dios, pues “la misericordia y el amor de Dios son muy grandes” (Ef 2, 4).

Liturgia

Cada año boreal, la Iglesia universal observa días dedicados a los migrantes, los refugiados y los pobres. La Jornada mundial del migrante y del refugiado se lleva a cabo el último domingo de septiembre, y la Semana nacional de la migración se

celebra en los Estados Unidos en la última semana completa del mismo mes. La Jornada mundial de los pobres tiene lugar en noviembre, en el trigésimo tercer domingo del Tiempo Ordinario, día en el que también se lleva a cabo la colecta anual para la Campaña Católica para el Desarrollo Humano (CCHD) de los obispos de los Estados Unidos. Además, los días festivos de santa Josefina Bakhita (8 de febrero) y Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe (12 de diciembre)

se observan con frecuencia como días de oración por los migrantes y los refugiados, y se pueden encontrar otras oraciones por los migrantes en [JusticeForImmigrants.org/engage/prayer](https://www.justiceformigrants.org/engage/prayer) (en inglés).

Entre sus Misas y oraciones por varias necesidades y para diversas circunstancias, el Misal Romano contiene una Misa “Por los prófugos y exiliados” (n. 32). La Plegaria eucarística que puede usarse en las Misas para diversas circunstancias IV, titulada “Jesús, que pasó haciendo el bien”, se utiliza apropiadamente con este formulario de Misa.

Además, existen formularios de Misa que están relacionados con las realidades de la pobreza así como con las causas de la migración:

- “Por los cristianos perseguidos” (n. 19)
- “Por el progreso de los pueblos” (n. 29)
- “Por la paz y la justicia” (n. 30)
- “En tiempo de guerra o de desorden” (n. 31)
- “En el tiempo de hambre o por los que padecen hambre” (n. 33)

Acción

Un buen lugar para comenzar es la cartapastoral conjunta de las Conferencias Episcopales de los Estados Unidos y México, “Juntos en el camino de la esperanza: Ya no somos extranjeros”, disponible en español y en inglés en [USCCB.org/migration](https://usccb.org/migration). Los individuos y las comunidades pueden actuar ofreciendo hospitalidad a los migrantes, los refugiados y los pobres: dándoles la bienvenida en las parroquias de la iglesia, satisfaciendo sus necesidades materiales y espirituales e invitándolos a compartir sus experiencias. Los miembros de estas comunidades no son sólo receptores de cuidados sino personas que enriquecen mutuamente a aquellos de quienes los reciben.

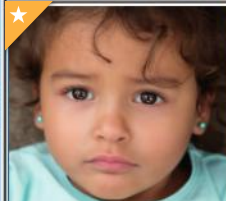

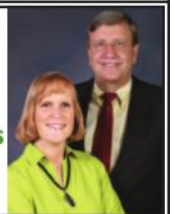
